**PERIODICAL REPORTS BY THE MINISTERS ON THE  
RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE STANDING COMMITTEES AND THE  
MATTERS REFERRED BY THE HOUSE  
(Under Rule 265A)**

**Minister for Information, Broadcasting and National Heritage** to report under rule 265A of the Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business in the Senate, 2012, on the following thirteen recommendations made by the Standing Committee concerned:-

- i. The PTV should be run as a State Channel instead of Government Channel.
- ii. Number of DSNGS should be increased from 6 to 25 and these should be update as well.
- iii. The Committee advised to bring the reservations of the Standing Communities into the notice of the Prime Minister regarding purchasing of one time Duty Free items.
- iv. High Power Transmission should be established at the Border Area with India.
- v. The Committee advised to stop the pilferage/wastage of all procurements and the same may be made through centralized system.
- vi. The Committee emphasized to launch expeditiously the DTH Service which is too important not only for the increase of PTV coverage but also for alleviation of the monopoly of Cable operators.
- vii. Release/issue the pending salaries of the employees of PTV, especially serving in the Quetta, Balochistan.
- viii. The Committee advised to run special channels in FATA, Gilgit-Baltistan and AJK which have been suffering in the sense of deprivation and as well as in the national interest.
- ix. The Committee noted serious and bad mismanagement in the revenue of PTV and recommended that there should be accountability, the system of check and balance and watchdog upon the accounting procedure of PTV, to protect the Organization from corruption and malpractices.
- x. On the information given by the incumbent MD PTV relating to the misappropriation in showing wrong documentary records regarding the successive profits in PTV instead of its loss, the Committee recommended that the previous MDs and its abettors may be called for in the next meeting of the Standing Committee to explain their stance as to why they have depicted in documentations the revenue of the PTV as increased instead its downfall.

- xi. Ministry of Information, Broadcasting and National Heritage to initiate a Summary for the Cabinet requesting the Prime Minister to take notice of the violations of the Centralized Advertisement Policy by the Federal entities and APNS and issue directions for the compliance of the Policy in letter and spirit in the public interest.
- xii. PTV should ensure full payment of pending Pensions, Benevolent Fund and Commutation Fund to the employees of PTV, within fifteen days.
- xiii. Ministry of Information, Broadcasting and National Heritage to again take-up the matter of Code of Conduct with Supreme Court of Pakistan highlighting the work done by the Parliamentarians on the Code of Conduct providing all the minutes of the meetings of the Standing Committee wherein the Code of Conduct was discussed and finalized and report to the Committee within fifteen days.

**Minister for States and Frontier Regions** to report under rule 265A of the Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business in the Senate, 2012, on the following thirty-seven recommendations made by the Standing Committee concerned:-

- i. There should be separate Development Budget for FATA in the Annual Budget Grant of the Ministry of States and Frontier Regions.
- ii. Amendment may be made in the Rules of Business of the Federal Government to such extent that Ministry of States and Frontier Regions can issue directions to the FATA Secretariat.
- iii. Efforts should be made both by the Government and public representatives to develop Bill payment (Electricity) culture and Electricity Meters should be installed in the Tribal Areas.
- iv. The practice of issuing illegal Tax Permit on purchase of food items for domestic purpose should be stopped.
- v. Extra funds should be allocated for the repair of damaged Schools and Hospitals and also for building new ones.
- vi. Development schemes in the Tribal Areas, which are being opened after the Army operation, should be implemented through the recommendations of local people and their representatives. The TDPs of Tehsil Tiarza SWA are scheduled to go back to their areas in July 2015, the ADP approved schemes in Tehsil Tiarza SWA should be executed through local contractors.

- vii. It should be ensured that savings of funds from any sector/scheme should be spent in the same Agency and not outside the said Agency.
- viii. FATA should not be ignored in the development schemes/ projects being run by RAHA. They should include development schemes for FATA in their next year work plan and allocate special funds for the development of refugees affected areas of FATA.
- ix. Those students of the Tribal Areas, who have educational Certificates/Degrees of the Schools/Colleges (specially SSC degree) and having domicile of the Tribal Areas and have obtained upto 33% marks should be given priority in any recruitment process for FATA Secretariat., Political Administration, FATA Projects and TESCO (NTS or self conducted).
- x. Levies Regulation 2013 should be implemented in letter and spirit and levies having the status of Civil Servants should be dealt with according to the Levies Regulation 2013.
- xi. Shuhada-i-FATA should be given the same financial package which is being given to the Shuhada of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Province.
- xii. The Political Agent, Mohmand Agency and Chief Executive (TESCO), Peshawar should ensure that the Furnace Plants of Mohmand Agency were established after fulfilling the required parameters and codal formalities. They should also ensure that these Furnace Plants are not causing any kind of pollution, including water and environmental pollution.
- xiii. The Committee was of the opinion that Jirga is a Pakhtun tradition of solving disputes of the peoples of FATA but due to its inactive role, the situation of FATA is being aggravated. The Committee recommended that frequent meetings of the Jirga / Council of Elders may be held to give relief to the people of FATA.
- xiv. The Committee unanimously recommended that all SNE proposals for newly established schools forwarded for creation of 2700 posts of Teachers to the Finance Department, FATA Secretariat may be approved at the earliest.
- xv. Report of D.G.(Monitoring), FATA Secretariat regarding Ghost Schools may be provided to the Committee.
- xvi. The Committee unanimously recommended that educational degrees of all the employees of the FATA Secretariat should be got verified.

- xvii. For recruitment of employees in the Frontier Corps the condition of having Matric Certificate may be changed as Middle Pass.
- xviii. Audit observations/paras pending for the years 2012-13, 2013-14, & 2014-15, should be settled at the earliest by the FATA Secretariat.
- xix. FATA Secretariat should scrutinize the issue of payment of excess pay and allowances to the project employees of various projects in FATA and fix responsibility in this regard.
- xx. The Committee Members observed that the facilities/ services of the Hospitals should be improved first instead of making investment on Mobile Health Units.
- xxi. The provisions of the Act passed by the Provincial Assembly of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa regarding compulsory duty by the Doctors at the districts of their domicile for a period of 02 years should be implemented in letter and spirit.
- xxii. Policy may be made so that FATA domicile holder Specialist Doctors should serve in FATA areas for 2-3 years.
- xxiii. The Committee recommended that TESCO should supply un-interrupted electricity supply with full voltage to all hospitals in FATA
- xxiv. The FATA Secretariat should look into the possibility of making an amendment in the Presidential Regulation Order, 1972, so that FATA Secretariat could fill the technical posts of FATA. The Chairman Committee directed the Secretary Finance to submit their view point in this regard.
- xxv. A Proper Regulatory Frame Work for the establishment of Public and Private Medical Services in FATA may be made.
- xxvi. On a query raised by the Chairman Committee about the presence of any Board under the Education Foundation Regulation, 12008, the Secretary Finance stated that he was not aware of it and assured the Committee that he will look into this and provide the information to the Committee.
- xxvii. The draft of Educational Rationalization Policy of FATA Secretariat should be shared with the members of the Committee before its finalization.
- xxviii. The Committee expressed its dissatisfaction over the inquiry made by the FATA Secretariat regarding cancellation of recruitment of Levies Constables and directed Additional Chief Secretary to conduct a proper inquiry in the matter and responsibility should be fixed for cancellation of the recruitment process. This inquiry report should be presented to the Committee within thirty days.

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- xxix. People belonging to five Tehsils of North Waziristan Agency namely Dossali, Garyum, Shiwa, Razmak and Spinwam, who left their houses due to operation Zarab-e-Azb should be paid financial assistance and monthly food rashan.
- xxx. People of the following villages of Kurram Agency, whose houses were damaged due to sectarian clashes should be included in the registration process for financial assistance:-

- xxxii. FDMA, which is being run as a project from ADP Funds of FATA, should be regularized as full-fledged Authority.
- xxxiii. Action may be taken against illegal holders of FATA domiciles and those Government officials who found involved in the issuance of illegal FATA domiciles should be taken to task.
- xxxiv. Senator Taj Muhammad Afridi inquired as to how the electricity charges of Government departments in the FATA are being met because there are no electricity meters in these departments.
- xxxv. Compensation of damaged houses / property in the Army operation hit areas of FATA pending for the last three years may be made without further delay.
- xxxvi. The Committee recommended to stop the recruitment of 157 Levies in PA Khyber until and unless inquiry regarding previous recruitments is not finalized.
- xxxvii. The Committee recommended that the Additional PA (Judicial) should not be under the supervision of Political Agent.
- xxxviii. The Committee also recommended to inform it that how many cases of corruption have been sent to NAB by FATA Secretariat.



**Minister for Kashmir Affairs and Gilgit-Baltistan** to report under rule 265A of the Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business in the Senate, 2012, on the following five recommendations made by the Standing Committee concerned:-

- i. All stakeholders i.e., Government of Pakistan, Government of AJK, AJK Council, Parliamentarians, Kashmir Committee of National Assembly, Intellectuals and Standing Committees on AK & GB should work together to enlighten the issue of Jammu & Kashmir vigorously at International Forums for its settlement according to ambitions of Kashmiri peoples.
- ii. Discussion on controversial/un-necessary matters should be avoided to develop harmony among peoples of Pakistan and Azad Jammu and Kashmir.
- iii. The Senate may be given representation in Kashmir Committee of NA and this matter may be taken up on appropriate level. This committee may be renamed as "*Joint Parliamentary Committee on Kashmir*".
- iv. In the next meeting a senior representative from Foreign Office should be invited to brief the committee regarding the present status of Kashmir issue.
- v. In any ensuing meeting of the committee, Four (04) subjects of AJK being dealt by the Federal Government i.e., Responsibilities under UNCIP Resolutions, Defence and Security, Currency & Foreign Affairs including Foreign aid and trade may be included in agenda for discussion.

**Minister for Interior and Narcotics Control** to report under rule 265A of the Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business in the Senate, 2012, on the following matters of public importance referred by the House and recommendations made by the Standing Committee concerned:-

- i. The Committee recommended that a Committee comprising of Federal Secretary Finance, Federal Secretary Interior and Chief Secretary Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Home Secretary Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, IG Khyber Pakhtunkhwa should meet and examine the proposals of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Government. It will report within fifteen days to the Standing Committee.
- ii. The Committee also felt need of an in-camera briefing on the counter terrorism measures and future plans made by the KPK Government justifying the demand of Rs.66 billion to combat the menace of terrorism. The IG Police, Chief Secretary and Home Secretary of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Government will brief the Committee so that the Committee is in a position to make recommendations to the Senate in this regard.

- iii. Nominate a DIG to investigate the issue in detail in consultation with Senator Shahi Syed.
  - iv. The Committee also recommended for a detailed inquiry in connection with the frequent use of Section -7(ATA) Anti-terrorism Act so that blatant violation of law, if any, be avoided.
  - v. Measures be taken to avoid the registration of FIRs maliciously crafted against anyone in Karachi.
  - vi. The Committee also directed that a stern action should be taken against the Police officers involved in the crimes especially extra-judicial killings.
  - vii. The Committee also directed IG Sindh to report in the next meeting on the issues of:
    - a. Depoliticizing the Sindh Police.
    - b. De-weaponization in Karachi.
    - c. Action against militant wings
  - viii. The Committee also directed that there should be no access of TV Channels in the Police Stations for telecasting live interviews of accused persons. If necessary, proper permission may be taken from the higher authorities.
  - ix. The Committee also observed that the identity and affiliation with political parties of the culprits should be revealed while presenting them in front of the media.
  - x. The Committee took a serious note of the state murder of patriotic Pakistanis executed by Bangladesh Government. The Committee recommended that the bodies of two *Shaheeds* should be brought to Pakistan and buried with a cannon salute funeral.
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
