SUMMARY

4. The Committee had invited and heard all stakeholders i.e. Officials and representatives from the Ministry of Housing & Works and representatives of Federal Government Employees Housing Authority (FGEHA). Senator Mushtaq Ahmed, the mover of the starred Question, did not attend the meeting.

5. DG (FGEHA) apprised the Committee that FGEHA has launched 13. housing/apartment projects from January 2001 to July 2023 and against these schemes an amount of Rs. 56.63 billion has been collected so far. Details of the projects/schemes are as under:-

- 6.. The Committee expressed concerns on slow pace of work on different residential projects being executed by FHEHA. It was highlighted that residential project located at G-15/3 could not progress beyond 29.27% even after lapse of 20 years and situation of development work at other projects is no different. Huge amounts have been collected from the applicants and in return applicants have got nothing. DG (FGEHA) clarified that delay in development work is mainly due to Built up Properties (BoP) and litigation.
- 7. The Committee, after taking into consideration the details provided by the Ministry, H&W, disposed of the instant starred Question, with directions to Ministry, H&W/FGEHA to launch residential projects on undisputed lands and complete the projects within stipulated time.
