Annexure-I

**SNGPL's PROCEDURE FOR PROVISION OF A NEW CONNECTION
OF NATURAL GAS**

Domestic Gas Connection

The applicant has to apply on application form for domestic gas connection alongwith copy of CNIC. After receipt of application an acknowledgement receipt is issued to the applicant, wherein it is mentioned that survey of his premises will be carried out after completion of the waiting period. Survey, of the applicant's premises is carried out and if SNGPL's distribution network exists in front of the applicant's premises the Proposal letter/Demand Note is issued to the applicant. After completion of the contractual formalities by the applicant, gas connection is provided on turn/merit basis.

Commercial Gas Connection

The applicant has to apply on application form and deposit Rs.1000/- (For processing fee) for commercial gas connection alongwith copy of CNIC and documents relating to property and business. After receipt of application, acknowledgement receipt is issued to the applicant, wherein it is mentioned that survey of his premises will be carried out after completion of the waiting period. Survey of the applicant's premises is carried and if SNGPL's distribution network exists in front of the applicant's premises subject to availability of load, then the Proposal letter/Demand Note is issued to the applicant. After completion of the contractual formalities by the applicant, gas connection is provided strictly on turn/merit basis.

Industrial Gas Connection

The applicant has to apply on application form and deposit Rs.10,000/- (processing fee) for industrial gas connection alongwith copy of CNIC, property documents and other related documents. After receipt of application an acknowledgement receipt is issued to the applicant. Survey of the applicant's premises is carried out subject to availability of load. If our distribution network exists in front of the applicant's premises and load is available, the Proposal letter/Demand Note is issued to the applicant. After completion of the contractual formalities by the applicant, gas connection is provided on turn/merit basis.

Annexure-II

SSGCL's PROCEDURE FOR PROVISION OF A NEW CONNECTION OF NATURAL GAS

Domestic Gas Connection

Applications on prescribed form for new domestic gas connection are received at Sales Receiving counter through SSGC's Registered Low Pressure Gas Piping Contractors.

The new applications are physically surveyed on random basis to confirm address as per physical position. Only those applications are considered and processed which are located on distribution main. Each application is registered in Sales Computer database on daily basis.

On commissioning of gas supply, the utilization section of distribution department will survey the premises to ensure that natural gas can be safely supplied and test the in house pipelines for leakages using the technical standards for testing. The above will be carried out in line with the requirement of license condition no. 41. The time frame for commissioning of gas will be in line with license condition no. 33.

MULTISTOREY BUILDINGS

An executive of Sales Department who will go through the documents submitted by the applicant will scrutinize building cases consisting of more than ten flats.

On receiving the above Documents, the concerned Sales Executive will visit the Site personally and conduct a detail survey to ascertain size/route of pipeline, confirmation of gas main, location of meter points and any other relevant information. After conducting physical survey, permission will be granted to the contractor to carry out the internal house line fitting. This houseline will be finally checked on secondary survey at the time of submission of individual gas connection form.

COMMERCIAL

Applications on prescribed form for new commercial gas connection are received at Sales Receiving counter through SSGC's registered Low Pressure Gas Piping Contractors:

On receiving the sketch (form), premises is surveyed to ascertain the possibility of providing gas connection, connected gas load, size and route of internal house line and nature of business. If the sketch is found in proper order, Survey Engineer authorizes the contractor to carry out internal house line. Only those applications are considered and processed which are located on distribution Main. Each application is registered in Sales Computer Database/ Customer Care and Billing (CC&B) on daily basis.

On commissioning of gas supply, the utilization section of distribution department carries out the survey of the premise to ensure that natural gas can be safely supplied and test the in house pipelines for leakages using the technical standards for testing. The above will be carried out in line with the requirement of license condition no. 41. The time frame for commissioning of gas will be in line with license condition no. 33. 9 (45 days after payment)

CNG

Applications on prescribed form for new CNG gas connection are received from Consumers:—

- ✱ Entering Data in Sales Computer Database/ Customer Care and Billing (CC&B) and collection of processing fees Rs. 10,000.
- ✱ Case referred to Distribution (Planning) for mains confirmation / extension proposal on the basis of load for CNG connection.
- ✱ Layout plan is referred to Health safety and Environment department to check and give input, whether it meets Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) or not.
- ✱ New CNG gas connection at 8 PSIG, (a) If the extension proposal cost is within 1.00 million then proposal is treated feasible and its management approval is obtained. (b) If the extension proposal cost is greater than 1.00 million, financial feasibility is worked out by the finance department and quotation issue accordingly. (c) New CNG gas connection at 15 PSIG, then extension proposal is treated at 100% customer cost, as per policy.
- ✱ After receipt of payment for main extension, case processed for issuance of Job card and sent to Distribution for execution alongwith management approval.
- ✱ Sales Engineer conduct visit to design house line and confirm the customer load to prepare material sheet and load sheets and process case for internal quotation.
- ✱ Case is referred to Health Safety and Environment (HSE) department to conduct visit for clearance / confirmation of Customer Meter Station (CMS) room as per Standard Operating Procedure (SOP).
- ✱ After receiving payment against internal quotation and related documents (like contract form, load undertaking, bank guarantee etc.) Finance department, issue Job

card, which is send to Distribution department alongwith material, load sheet and layout plans for execution.

- ✱ After receiving Gas Supply Deposit (GSD) and OGRA clearance letter (HDIP's third party inspection report) advice is send to Distribution for commissioning of gas.

INDUSTRIAL

Applications on prescribed form for new gas connection are received at Sales Department:—

- ✱ Receiving of application alongwith duly filled Enquiry Form and documents, drawings.
- ✱ Entering Data in Sales Computer, Database/ Customer Care and Billing (CC&B).
- ✱ Gas Load and location referred to Distribution Department for Gas mains proposal.
- ✱ If main extension is involved case is prepared for Management approval for cost upto Rs. 1 Million.
- ✱ For cost above Rs. 1 Million, case is sent to Finance Department for feasibility.
- ✱ After receiving financial feasibility, quotation is issued to customer for payment.
- ✱ After receiving of payment for main extension, Finance department issues Job card, which is dispatched to Distribution alongwith Management approval.
- ✱ Physical survey conducted to design house line and work out material for internal house line and asses the proposed location of gas meter room etc.
- ✱ If proposed location is found feasible, case is referred to Health Safety and Environment (HSE) for evaluation.
- ✱ After costing of internal houseline including cost of service quotation is issued to customer alongwith Gas Supply Deposit amount to be borne by the customer. Gas supply deposit is based on 3 months estimated gas consumption calculated on current tariff by OGRA.
- ✱ After receiving payment against quotation and related documents (like contract form, load undertaking, bank guarantee etc.). Payment is deposited in Bank, and receipt sent to Finance Department for issuance of job card.
- ✱ Finance department issues Job card, which is sent to Distribution along with material, load sheet and layout plans for execution for installation of houseline and Customer Meter Station (CMS).
- ✱ Gas load information is sent to Measurement department for Meter approval,

Will the Minister for Zakat and Ushr be pleased to state:

- (a) the number of Zakat Committees in the country; and*
- (b) the procedure laid down for selection of members of those committees?*

Mr. Noor-ul-Haq Qadri: (a) The total number of Zakat Committees in the country is 40,069. Details of these committees is as under:—

District Zakat Committees (DZC)	124
Local Zakat Committees (LZC)	39945

(b) District Zakat Committee:

In each District a District Zakat and Ushr Committee is established, consisting of a Chairman, two women, one non official member from each Tehsil, Taluqa or sub-Division District Officer (Revenue) and District Zakat Officer. Its detail is as under:—

- (i) Chairman a non official person, to be nominated by Provincial Zakat Council (PZC).
- (ii) two women from within the District who shall not be less than forty-five years of age (to be nominated by PZC).
- (iii) one non-official member from each tehsil, taluqa or sub-Division (to be nominated by PZC).
- (iv) District Officer (Revenue).
- (v) District Zakat Officer.
- (vi) District Social Welfare Officer (may be co-opted member).

The Chairman is nominated by PZC while the members are nominated by PZC in consultation with the Chairman of DZC. The Chairman and members of DZC shall adult Muslim, resident of the concerned district, have good moral character, not commonly known who violate Islamic injunctions/financial integrity and do not engage in political activities.

Local Zakat Committee

In each revenue estate, deh, village and ward, a local Zakat Committee (LZC) is established, consisting of nine members including the Chairman. The LZC is constituted through a selection process, organized by DZC. The DZC constitutes a team of three or more persons to organize a public gathering of adult Muslims. Teacher and Ulema, residents of a locality, to select the following categories of members:—

- (i) Seven male members to be selected by a male gathering of adult Muslims, teachers and Ulema of the locality.
- (ii) Two women, to be selected by a female gathering of adult Muslims of the locality.

- (iii) Chairman: the members of Local Zakat Committee shall elect one of their members as Chairman of the Committee from among themselves.
- (iv) A member of LZC should be adult Muslim of that locality to be pious, offers five times prayers daily and has sound moral and financial integrity and not engaged in political activity.

Will the Minister for Water and Power be pleased to state:

(a) the time by which construction work of Chashma Right Bank Canal will be completed; and

(b) whether it is a fact that first lift of the said project has been excluded by the planning commissions from P.S.D.P 2009-10, if so, its reasons?

Raja Pervaiz Ashraf: (a) Main Chashma Right Bank Canal has been completed in December, 2003 in three stages.

However, remedial works as recommended by Grievance Redress and Settlement Committee (GRSC) for the redressed of post construction impact of CRBC are being executed by WAPDA, Provincial Irrigation Departments, Works and Services Department of NWFP and Punjab Provinces through ADB loan. These works are anticipated to be completed upto 31- 12- 2009 (loan closing date.)

(b) WAPDA submitted demand of Rs.550 million for CRBC First Lift Project under PSDP2009-10. However the project could not be included in PSDP2009-10.

Mr. Rehmatullah Kakar: (a) Yes. It is a fact that Rs.258.089 million was allocated by the Government in the PSDP for the year 2008-09 for acquisition of land to execute the Pilot Project of construction of 1000 apartments for low paid Federal Government employees (BS-1 to 16). The revised allocation was, however, 258.09 million but the actual amount released was Rs.127.357 million which was fully utilized in the same Financial Year.

Raja Pervaiz Ashraf: Actually, no possible methods like sluicing, flushing and bypassing the sediments from reservoirs has been evolved so far, which could be technically/economically acceptable to WAPDA/GOP. However, studies are underway to determine viable/workable solution for this purpose.

Considering the facts, removal of silt from Khanpur, Warsak, Tarbela and Mangla Dams has not been carried out during the last 10 years.
