***Question No. 13 Senator Rana Mahmood Ul Hassan:**

(Notice Received on 22/09/2020 at 10:20 AM) QID: 37245

Will the Minister for Housing and Works be pleased to refer to Senate starred Question No. 19, replied on 26th August, 2020 and state whether any inquiry was conducted regarding the incident of burning of the record of Estate Office, Islamabad in 2014, if so, the details and findings thereof and if not, the reasons thereof?

Chaudhary Tariq Bashir Cheema: An FIR No. 142/14 was registered with Kohsar Police Station, Islamabad on 03-03-2014. An inquiry was also conducted by FIA, however, no evidence / clue / information about accused was received and the case was closed accordingly.

***Question No. 14 Senator Sana Jamali:**

(Notice Received on 23/09/2020 at 9:35 AM) QID: 37359

Will the Minister for Housing and Works be pleased to state whether it is a fact that the residents of PHAF flats in sector G-10/2 Islamabad, have not been provided the facilities of gas and clean drinking water so far, if so, the reasons thereof and the time by which the same will be provided to them?

Chaudhary Tariq Bashir Cheema: It is apprised that CDA has provided two (02) connections of water supply. Moreover, three (03) Nos, of micro Tube wells have also been installed by PHA-F at G-10/2 Project, Islamabad to meet the water demand of the project.

In addition, for the facilitation of allottees / residents of the scheme, the PHA-F management is installing a tube well in order, to meet the requirement of water supply for which CDA has granted NOC *vide* letter No. CDA/MCI/DD(Prod-II)-1(4)/2020/541 dated September 8, 2020 regarding provision of land for installation of tube well. The tube well estimation is in process.

Gas Supply network has already been laid and is fully functional and operational.

***Question No. 15 Senator Mushtaq Ahmed:**

(Notice Received on 25/09/2020 at 3:10 PM) QID: 37453

Will the Minister Incharge of the Aviation Division be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of PIA's fare from Pakistan to Saudi Arabia at present; and*
- (b) whether it is a fact that increase has recently been made in PIA's fares on the said route, if so, the reasons thereof?*

Mr. Ghulam Sarwar Khan: (a) Existing Ex PAK-KSA fares are PKR 64,100 inclusive of all taxes *i.e.* PKR 14,000.

(b) It is fact that PIA had to increase its fares from 16th Sep. to 30th Sep. from Pakistan to Saudi Arabia due to following reasons:-

- As per Saudi Authorities directives all those Pakistanis who were holding valid Aqama Visa till 30th Sep. 2020 could travel back to Saudi Arabia within the given time period *i.e.*, 16th Sep.-30 Sep.
- In order to accommodate the passengers whose visas were expiring on 30th Sep. PIA mounted extra section flights for which permission was granted by Saudi Authorities with condition of maintaining social distancing by restricting Aircraft capacity to 75 percent and all Ex KSA flights shall be operated as ferry flights (Zero passengers load).

- Keeping in view the above mentioned facts, PIA reluctantly increased its fares in order to meet at least operational cost.
- It is pertinent to mentioned here that PIA remained the lowest carrier as compare to direct and even indirect carriers from 16th Sep. to 30th Sep. 2020.
- As stated in point 'A', PIA gradually decreased its fares on all Ex PAK-KSA sectors.

***Question No.16 Senator Bahramand Khan Tangi:**

Will the Minister for Housing and Works be pleased to state the details of Naya Pakistan Housing Scheme indicating also the progress made on the same so far?

The Establishment Division has transferred this question to the Ministry of Finance and Revenue. But the Ministry of Finance and Revenue has not accepted it so far.

***Question No. 18 Senator Mushtaq Ahmed:**

Will the Minister Incharge for Cabinet Division be pleased to state:

- (a) *whether it is a fact that the post of Managing Director, Printing Corporation of Pakistan (PCP) is lying vacant for the last three and a half months, if so, the reasons thereof; and*
- (b) *whether it is also a fact that apart from the post of M.D. the posts of Director Finance and Audit Officer in the said corporation are also lying vacant, if so, the time by which all these posts will be filled in?*

Minister Incharge of the Cabinet Division: (a) The post of Managing Director, PCP remained vacant for four (04) months from 29th May to 28th September, 2020. Now Dr. Nadeem Shafiq Malik, a BS-22 Officer of the Secretariat Group has assumed the charge of the post of MD, PCP on 29th September, 2020, in compliance with Establishment Division's Notification No. F. 41/473/2016-E-I dated 28-09-2020

(b) Yes, the post of Director Finance and Audit Officer are lying vacant in the Corporation. PCP / Cabinet Division have been trying hard to fill these posts on regular basis. The Controller General of Accounts and Auditor General of Pakistan have been requested time and again to provide services of some suitable officers, however, the nomination is still awaited.

***Question No. 19 Senator Mushtaq Ahmed:**

(Notice Received on 29/09/2020 at 9:30 AM) QID: 37382

Will the Minister Incharge of the Aviation Division be pleased to state:

- (a) *whether it is a fact that the post of Director General, Civil Aviation Authority (CAA) has been laying vacant since August, 2018 and appointment has not been made against the same so far, if so, the reasons thereof indicating also the time by which appointment will be made against that post; and*

(b) the criteria including qualifications and procedure laid down for appointment against the said post?

Mr. Ghulam Sarwar Khan: (a) Yes, the post of DG CAA became vacant due to the termination of contract of Air Marshal (Retd.) Asim Suleman in 2018. The advertisements for the post of DG CAA were earlier published in National Dailies on 13/3/2018, 29/11/2018 (also published in International Newspaper) and 20/11/2019 however, no suitable candidates could be found as none met the required criteria. The post of DGCAA was again advertised in National Dailies on 4th and 5th July, 2020. The Selection Committee headed by Minister for Aviation has held several meetings in September. Moreover, the meeting of Selection Committee was held on 14th October 2020 and shortlisted candidates were interviewed. The final selection of the candidate for the post of DG CAA, is under process and same will be shared with the Senate of Pakistan, once finalized.

(b) According to section 9 of CAA Ordinance 1982, the Federal Government shall appoint the Director General who shall be the executive head of the Authority and shall exercise such powers and perform such functions as may be specified under sub-section (7) of section 5 or delegated to him by the Board from time to time. The Establishment Division *vide* its O.M. dated 28th March, 2019 has clearly laid down the procedure for appointment of selection procedure of chief executives in key public sector enterprises. The same is being followed for appointment of DGCAA. The criteria including qualification for the post of DGCAA are explicitly defined in the advertisement published on 4th and 5th July, 2020. Will the Minister Incharge of the Aviation Division be pleased to state:

- (a) *whether it is fact that PIA has recently reduced the number of flights to Multan from various cities of the country with particular reference to Islamabad, if so, the reasons thereof; and*
- (b) *the steps being taken by the Government to increase the number of flights to Multan from various cities of the country?*

Mr. Ghulam Sarwar Khan: (a) COVID-19 Pandemic has affected travel industry the most globally and Pakistan has been no exception. Travel restrictions placed during pandemic internationally and within Pakistan brought PIA flight operations to halt in March, 2020.

The operation was partially resumed in May, 2020 and number of flights has been increasing gradually since then; where demand is building up. However, due to the level of 45% of its normal operation (pre-COVID).

(b) The same trend prevails for Multan, where PIA is now offering 04 international flights to KSA and 03 to UAE, similarly PIA is offering 03 weekly domestic flights to Karachi and 02 to Islamabad in the current winter schedule.

It is assured that PIA is closely monitoring the market and additional flights will be added with the improvement in demand.

Will the Minister for Information Technology and Telecommunications be pleased to state whether it is a fact that signals of telecom towers installed by different cellular companies in various villages in Tehsil Narowal, District Narowal and Tehsil Pasrur, District Sialkot are very weak, if so, the steps being taken by the Government to resolve this issue?

Syed Amin Ul Haque: Four Cellular Mobile Operators (CMOs) are operating in District Narowal and Sialkot having adequate coverage for voice calls and data consumption. The Cellular Infrastructure of CMOs serving the inhabitants of District Narowal and District Sialkot is attached as Table 1 of Annex-I.

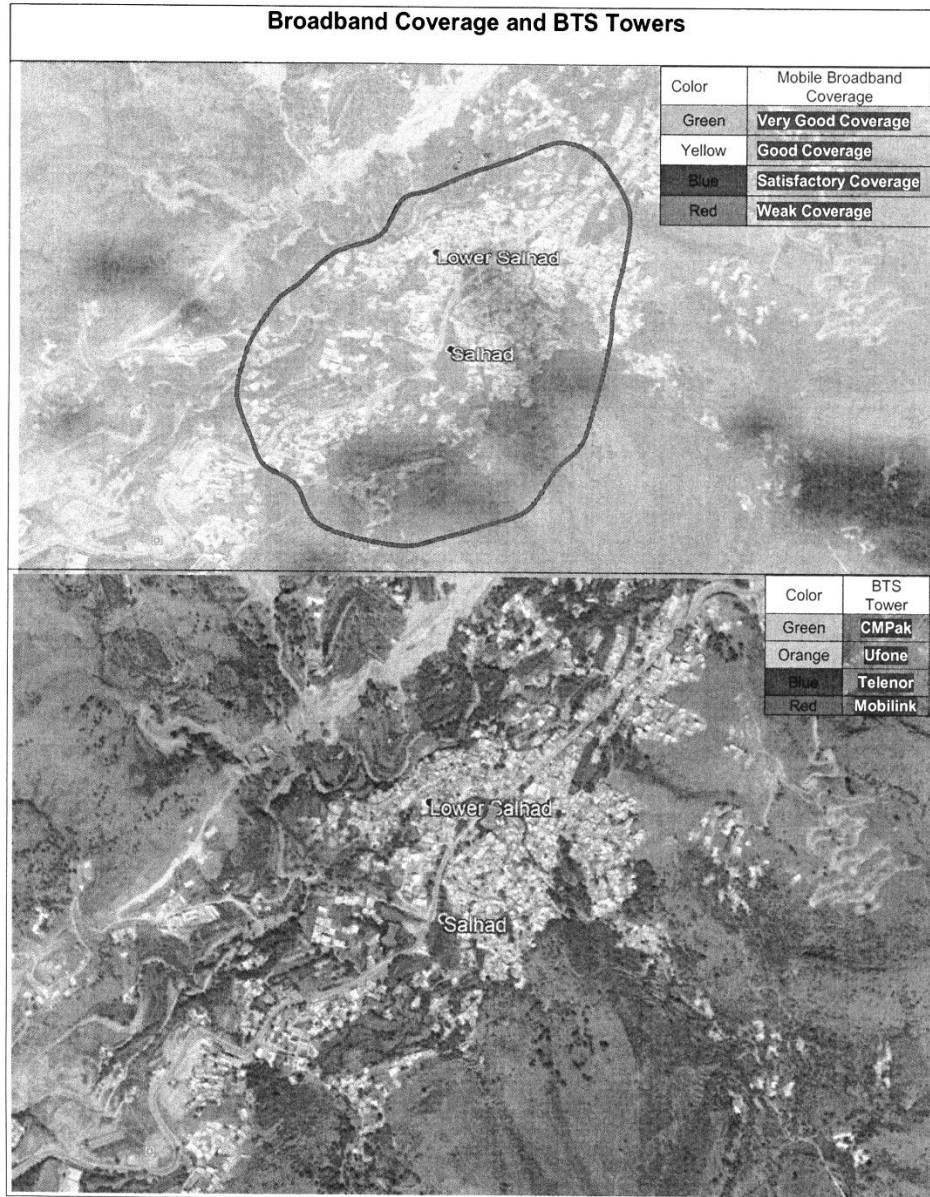

(b) A claim complete in all respects is processed at the earliest on first come first serve basis and is disposed off within 45 working days. However, claims with incomplete documents / information cannot be finalized until the requirements are completed, therefore, no specific time period can be determined in such like cases.

SUPPLEMENTRIES /EXAMPLE

The claims of fee re-imbursement are converted into education stipend due to the following reasons:-

- a. Where the beneficiary submit application for conversion of his fee re-imbursement claim into education stipend due to the reasons that the amount of stipend is higher then the fee.
- b. The case of fee re-imbursement in which payment has not yet been made to the beneficiary, the claim is converted into the education stipend keeping in the view the request of the beneficiary.
- c. The cases of fee re-imbursement in which payment has already been made to the beneficiary, the claim is converted into the education stipend subject to refund of fee amount which already received by the beneficiary in the shape of Pay Order and after clearance of the payment from the bank and confirmation from the F&A branch.
- d. The cases of fee re-imbursement in which the beneficiary could not provide the original fee challan or any other required documents and he request for conversion of his fee re-imbursement claim in to education stipend.

Example

2. Mr Tariq Khurshid, Assistant Director (Reporting) Senate Secretariat applied for fee-reimbursement of her daughter Miss Urooj Tariq who was studying in D pharmacy in Quaid-e-Azam University in the year 2016 and he got an amount of Rs. 61,260/- on the basis of Fall -16 and Sp-17 challan. Later his daughter left the Quaid-e-Azam University and got admission in Federal Medical and Dental College in MBBS in the year 2018. He requested for conversion of his case from fee-re-imbursement to education stipend due to the reasons that fee of Federal Medical and Dental College is less then the education stipend. Accordingly he was requested to refund the amount of Rs. 61,260/- in the shape of Pay order which he provided. The Pay order was forwarded to F&A Branch for clearance of amount. F&A Branch confirmed the receipt of amount and a request was made to IT department for disablement of the fee-reimbursement claim. Finally the claim has been converted into education stipend and processed on 15.9.2020. However, due to change of policy in the year 2017, claims have been objected for want of verified result and latest pay slip of the officer. The claims will be settled on receipt of the required documents from the officer.

3. Since the beneficiary has already availed the benefits and now again the case has been re-opened on his request, it involves various verifications i.e from Bank, IT Department and therefore, it took time, otherwise the fresh/clear claims are being finalized in 6-8 week time period.
