(Def.) *Question No. 1 Senator Professor Sajid Mir: (Notice Received on 1/10/2021 at 3:15 PM) QID: 38351

> Will the Minister In-charge of the Aviation Division be pleased to state the time by which the PIA flights will be resumed between Lahore-Islamabad?

Mr. Ghulam Sarwar Khan: To facilitate passengers, PIA had resumed Lahore-Islamabad operations *w.e.f.* 5th March, 2021. Three weekly flights were mounted *i.e.* Friday, Monday and Wednesday at convenient timings. These flights operated at an average Seat Factor of 45%, whereas at least 85% Seat Factor is required to meeting Variable Operating Cost, therefore, PIA had to cancel flights to save operating cost and finally the operation on the route was suspended in August, 2021. Currently as per station feedback and upcoming foggy season, Lahore-Islamabad (vv) route is not feasible till end of winter.

Will the Minister Incharge of the Aviation Division be pleased to state:

- (a) how many personal staff are posted with the current DG Civil Aviation Authority, their grade wise details and mode of appointment;
- (b) how many appointments have been made in the CAA in the last one year and what is the total staff strength of CAA; and
- (c) the details of the annual income and expenditure of CAA for the last five years with separate breakup of the expenditure of the office of DG CAA?

Mr. Ghulam Sarwar Khan: (a) Two drivers are attached with Director General CAA as per entitlement. In addition, details of Officers/ Staff detailed with DG CAA Secretariat are attached as Annexure-A.

(b) Currently, 8,212 employees are associated with Pakistan Civil Aviation Authority among which one hundred and seven (107) resources were appointed during July 1st, 2020 till date.

(c) Details of annual income and expenditure of CAA for the last five years with separate breakup of the expenditure of the office of DG CAA are attached as Annexure-B.

(Def.) *Question No. 90 Senator Mushtaq Ahmed: (Notice Received on 15/10/2021 at 9:25 AM) QID: 38437

Will the Minister Incharge of the Aviation Division be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that PIA has dismissed the services of 1500 employees on the basis of fake documents / certificate, if so, the names of the persons dismissed and cases registered against them and number of persons arrested; and
- (b) the steps / actions taken against the concerned staff responsible for the recruitment process of these 1500 persons with fake degrees / certificates?

Mr. Ghulam Sarwar Khan: (a) As of now, total 819 PIA employees have been dismissed from service on the basis of fake / bogus/ tempered academic documents (Annex-A). Cases of these 819 employees have been referred to FIA for criminal proceeding. Cases against the 21 employees are under process (Annex-B).

(b) All the officers / staffs responsible for recruitment of these 840 employees have been retired from the services so no disciplinary proceeding can be initiated against them under PIA service rules.

> Will the Minister Incharge of the Aviation Division be pleased to state whether it is a fact that PIA flights to Australia and New Zealand are not being operated, if so, the time since then these flights are not being operated and tentative time frame for operations of flights to the said destinations?

Mr. Ghulam Sarwar Khan: PIA has never operated flights to Australia and New Zealand. However, during Covid-19 PIA operated special flights to Australia to facilitate stranded Pakistanis by bringing them back to their homeland. All routs on PIA network are evaluated on a regular basis to establish operational and economic viability. PIA is keeping constant eye on the market indicators and traffic trend and will take necessary steps to mountain flights at any stage it is found economically viable and subject to availability of aircraft.

(Def.) *Question No. 92 Senator Kamran Murtaza: (Notice Received on 29/10/2021 at 11:20 AM) QID: 38467

Will the Minister for Incharge of the Aviation Division be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that Khuzdar Airport is dysfunctional since long, if so, the details thereof;
- *(b) the number of flights that have been operated therefrom since its inception; and*
- (c) the steps being taken by the Government to make this airport functional?

Mr. Ghulam Sarwar Khan: (a) Current Status of Khuzdar Airport is scaled down. Scheduled Flight Operations at Khuzdar were initiated on October, 15, 1987 and the same was suspended on August 17, 2001.

(b) Since the inception of flight operations *i.e.* from 1987 up until the suspension in 2001, total number of flights to/from Khuzdar stood at 5070 flights.

(c) The operationalization of the Airport is dictated by the commercial viability of the operators, at present due to lack of demand the destination is deemed commercially non-viable by the Airlines. The Government will take appropriate measures when and if the destination deemed commercially viable by the operators.

- (a) the details of amount, presently outstanding against Pakistan Bait-uI-Mall of every organization under the head of aid grant especially for 'Free Nominated Center for Kidney Dialysis' and 'Free Nominated Center for Eye Care' alongwith reasons thereof; and

Minister Incharge of the Poverty Alleviation and Social Safety Division: (a) It is stated that no claim/ amount of any NGO enrolled by Pakistan Bait-ul-Mal (PBM) for grant in aid for "Free Nominated Centre for Kidney Dialysis" and 'Free Nominated Centre for Eye Care' is outstanding against PBM. As per policy NGOs have to submit their claims on quarterly basis. All the received claims of NGOs are cleared within a month period subject to availability of budget after fulfilment all codal formalities. It is also pertinent to mention here that PBM has a separate branch called WE/CS Branch to deal with such cases.

(b) The claims of all NGOs (complete in all respect) are processed in PBM and timely payments are made to these NGOs.

Mr. Ghulam Sarwar Khan: (a) The resumption of operation on Domestic Airports, Saidu Sharif (SDT) operation was resumed in 2021 but later suspended due to poor demand on the route. Additionally to promote domestic tourism and improve connectivity following new domestic routes were initiated during 2021:—

- 1. Karachi-Skardu-Karachi
- 2. Lahore-Skardu-Lahore
- 3. Lahore-Saidu Sharif-Lahore
- 4. Lahore-Gilgit-Lahore
- 5. Islamabad-Saidu Sharif- Islamabad
- 6. Multan-Skardu-Multan
- 7. Faisalabad-Skardu-Multan
- 8. Sialkot-Skardu-Sialkot
- 9. Peshawar-Quetta-Peshawar

Furthermore, operation from the following airports/routes operating during 2017 were suspended due to COVID-19 Pandemic and will resume with the lifting of international travel restrictions especially Umrah:—

- 1. Zhob (PZH)
- 2. Dera Ghazi Khan (DEA)

- 3. Mohanjo Daro (MJD)
- 4. Panjgur (PJG)
- 5. Dalbandin (DBA)

- (a) the purpose of establishing Pakistan Bait-ul-Mall School for Rehabilitation of Child Labor; and
- (b) the number of such schools presently functional in all over the country with province-wise breakup and details?

Minister Incharge of the Poverty Alleviation and Social Safety Division: (a) The Pakistan Bait-ul-Mal (PBM) has established Schools for Rehabilitation of Child Labor (SRCLs) to pull out the children from bonded labor and imparting them education, in line with Government of the UN and International Labor Organization.

(b) Presently, 159 SRCLs are functional all over the country. The children involved in labor are enrolled in these schools and are imparted free education up to primary level. They are provided with free books, stationery, uniform/ shoes and Rs.10/- daily stipend alongside subsistence allowance of Rs.300/- per month for their parents. Minister Incharge of the Poverty Alleviation and Social Safety Division: • The details of Individual Financial Assistance (IFA) disbursement (Project-wise) *w.e.f* July 2018 to November 2021 is at <u>Annex-A.</u>

- The IFA disbursement (Orphan) *w.e.f* July 2018 to November 2021 is at <u>Annex-B.</u>
- The IFA disbursement (Gender wise) *w.e.f* July 2018 to November 2021 is at <u>Annex-C.</u>

<u>PROCEDURE:</u> IFA – SPECIAL FRIEND / DISABLED

Pakistan Bait-ul-Mal (PBM) is providing financial assistance to special persons (disabled) throughout the country. Families having two or more disables are being provided Rs. 25,000/- and families with one disable person are being provided Rs. 10,000/- per annum. PBM is providing financial assistance to disabled persons on provision of

application on prescribed proforma along-with the copy of valid CNIC/ B-Form in case of minors and disability certificate.

<u>IFA – GENERAL</u>

As per PBM policy a person having monthly income up to Rs.17,500/- (excluding government employees/ Semi-Government/ Autonomous Bodies) is eligible for grant of financial assistance (General). Applicant submits his/ her request on plain paper along-with valid copy of CNIC at the concerned District Office PBM, if applicant fulfills laid down criteria, he/ she will be provided financial assistance on first come first serve basis subject to availability of budget.

<u>IFA — MEDICAL</u>

As per PBM Policy a person having monthly income up to Rs.17,500/- (excluding government employees/ Semi-Government/ Autonomous Bodies) is eligible for grant of financial assistance (Medical). Applicant submit his/ her request on plain paper along-with the copy of valid CNIC and estimate of government hospital on PBM prescribed format and apply as per PBM policy at concerned District Office of PBM.

IFA – EDUCATION

As per PBM Policy a person having monthly income up to Rs. 17,500/- (excluding government employees/ Semi Government/ Autonomous Bodies) is eligible for grant of financial assistance (Education). Applicant submits his/ her request on plain paper along-with the copy of valid CNIC, *Bonafide* certificate at concerned District Office of PBM. If the applicant fulfills the requisite criteria the case is approved for processing of this financial assistance.

- (a) whether it is a fact that the Government has conducted audit of data breach incidents and cyber attacks on the FBR I.T. system as reported in February 2019, 23rd March, 2021 and 19th August, 2021, if so, details thereof; and
- (b) the steps taken by the Government to check incidents of data breach and cyber attacks?

Syed Amin Ul Haque: (a) Response/Brief of FBR is attached at Annex-A.

(b) "National Cyber Security Policy 2021" has been issued and notified by the Ministry of IT & Telecommunication on 6th December, 2021. Steps taken by GoP to check such kind of incidents are placed at Annex-B.

"Annex-A"

Like every other system connected to the Internet, FBR's systems are constantly subjected to cyber-attacks on a regular basis on average, approximately 71,000 times a month. This volume has increased sharply over the past few of years, as the tools and methods available to the hacking community have become more powrful and sophisiticated.

The recent cyber-attack on FBR's data-center occurred on 14th August 2021, a continuation of the tend observed over many years that frequently of cyberattacks increases manifold on days of national significance.

However, because of the security protocol aleady in place, the cyber-attack was restricted only to the font end of the data-center and, only the virtual machines were disrupted, which affected day-to-day operations for a few days. The initial forensic analysis conducted by the security team concluded that the SAN (Storage Area Network), on which data is stored, has not been compromised, and to date, there is no indication or evidence that any taxpayer data was stolen, altered or accessed on any way.

FBR took immediate action to restore the network and regular operations. There is an ongoing investigation into the current breach with the help of an international renowned cyber-security firm. This firm is helping to deep scan the entie FBR network, including all machines located in the field formations, in order to determine the possible point of initial breach. Once this has been determined and remedial actions have been taken, a full third-party security audit will be carried out to determine any remaining vulnerabilities. A comprehensive action plan to counter the vulnerabilities is being put together and its execution will be monitored closely.

The Federal Cabinet has endorsed the operational emergenbcy declared by the Chairman FBR/Security Finance, under which FBR has been unthorized to undertake emergency procurement of cyber-space & information security-related hardware, software and services to protect the organization from such futue attacks. ECC has already approved bridge-financing of Rs.3,860 million for emergency procurement of the requicite software, hardware and services for FBR data-centers.

Having said that, the threat landscape is always evolving at a faster pace than the organizations trying to protect themselves. Therefore, while this initial procurement may protect FBR for the immediate & medium-term futue, continued investment into the IT systems is required in order to protect and allow the organization to evolve into a true datadriven digital organization in the longer term.

Annex-B

National CERT Project:

Ministry of Information Technology and Telecommunication has approved National Computer Emergency Response Team (CERT) project titled "Cyber Security for Digital Pakistan" worth 1.92 billion rupees. Hiring of the same has been advertised and the project will be operational by June, 2022. The project has the following notable components:

- CERT & Security Operation Center setup
- IT Security audit, Coordination and Capacity building
- Incident detection, prevention and management facility
- Supporting digital Forensic and screening labs

The National CERT Project will enable a single national point of contact for cybersecurity and provide desired technical and operational facility & capacity. It will work with sectoral stakeholders to enablesecure cyber ecosystem in Pakistan.

CERT Rules:

Computer emergency response team rules (CERT Rules) are in the process in Ministry of IT&Telecom. These rules, integration and coordination of various sectoral CERT is intended to be achieved. Through these rules Ministry of IT&Telecom will specify the role and responsibility of stake holders (Ministries and other relavent offices/Sectors), the key delieverables, processes, tools which need to be enabled for cyber secure ecosystem in Pakistan. Consultatives sessions with stake holders is in the process on CERT rules. It is the sole responsibility of the digital asset owner to ensure the safety, security and privacy of the data and the digital system. Said CERT rules will outline the boundaries of those responsibilities, their response mechanism and coordination in line with the international benchmarks. It is the core responsibility of Secretaries/CEOs/head of organizations to ensure the delievery of key compliance parameters outlined in the rules which include devising Cyber security strategy for the organizations/ministries ensuring requied human and financial resources find deployment of adequate tools and technologies. Ministry of IT & Telecom will ensure its full support to hand hold these organizations through national and government CERT.

Digital Pakistan Cybersecurity Hackathon 2021:

 To create awareness and enable a cyber-secure eco-system, Pakistan's first National Cybersecurity Competition is being executed by Ignite.

Demand Driven Industry Quality and Capacity Enhancement Program:
