Will the Minister for Interior be pleased to state whether it is a fact that Korang Bridge Underpass Project on Islamabad Express way has not been completed within the initial project completion period of 15 months, if so, the details indicating the initial project cost, revised project cost, reasons of delay and tentative completion date of the project?

Rana Sana Ullah Khan: Yes, it is fact that the Korang Bridge project on Islamabad Expressway has not been completed in the stipulated time period. The requested details are as under;

- i. **Contract Cost** — Rs. 659,268,696/
- ii. **Revised Contract Cost** — Rs. 562,865,962/
- iii. **Reason of delay** — Due to un-precedented price escalation in construction material *i.e* steel, Cement etc. the Contractor Slow down the work. Now the Contract is assigned to M/s FWO under clause 3.1 at the same cost.
- iv. **Tentative completion date of the project—**

The Contract has been awarded to M/s FWO without change in cost with completion period of 4 months.

Will the Minister for Interior be pleased to state whether it is a fact that the ranking of Pakistan's green passport has decreased in international rankings of passports during the last three years, if so, the reasons thereof and steps taken by the Government in this regard?

Rana Sana Ullah Khan: According to Henley Passport Index, Passport ranking of Pakistan has remained consistently third last in the list of countries for the last three year, as per details below:—

International ranking of passport is based upon visa free score of a country (number of destinations for which no visa is required). The Government of Islamic Republic of Pakistan has made Visa Abolition Agreement with 46 countries across the world for its different categories of Passport *i.e.* Diplomatic, Official and Ordinary (**Annex-A**). Visa abolition Agreement is made between two countries, on reciprocal basis to Facilitate passport holders (official / diplomatic or ordinary) for visa free entry for a specific time period.

Will the Minister for Interior be pleased to state:

- (a) the steps being taken by the Government to control the increase in organized and professional beggary under the patronage of groups and mafias in majority of which are women and children;*
- (b) the number of groups against which legal action has been taken during the year 2020-2022 indicating the number of persons punished so far; and*
- (c) the details of centers established by the Government of Pakistan for the rehabilitation and shelter of women and children involved in beggary?*

Rana Sana Ullah Khan:

- Within ICT, 02 Anti-Beggary Squads have been established to apprehend the beggars including the minor children loitering in the area of Federal Capital at various points. These squads comprise of 02 Upper sub-ordinate 06 Jawans/officials and 02 Lady Constables under the personal supervision of Additional SP Operations and DSP/Rescue-15, Islamabad.
- The patrolling system within ICT has been revamped and SHO's of all the Police Stations within ICT have been strictly directed to utilize their mobiles as well as staff from Rescue 15 to curb this menace.
- It is further mentioned that a control room has also been established at Rescue-15 under the supervision of a gazetted officer and progress regarding the performance of Nakas is being monitored on daily basis.
- Special deployments of Jawans/Officials have also been made in Market Areas of Islamabad beside Anti-beggary Squads and Mobile Patrolling.

- The Federal Capital has been divided in different beats and experienced officers have been deputed in each beat to watch the activities of beggars.
- There is one Falcon (Vehicle) patrolling in each beat and the officers/officials deployed on patrolling duty have also been briefed for checking of the beggars while moving in the areas.
- For the elimination/control on beggary within Islamabad, a monthly security duty program is properly being issued.
- The personnel from Traffic Division have also been deployed at different signals with the directions to arrest the beggars male/female/children found bagging at the signals.
- Officials from Special Branch have also been deployed at different Markets/places in civvies to eliminate this social evil.

For the elimination/control of beggary, the concerned zonal Ssp and supervisory duty Magistrate are directly supervising the campaign against this social evil.

During the last 3 years the action against the following gang's leaders of beggars were taken.

(c) The Government has established shelter homes in Islamabad for poor and needy people. Moreover, a child protection centre has been

established at Humak Model Town Sihalla Islamabad and a child centre and Edhi Home is also established in H-9 Islamabad for rehabilitation of women and children.

(Def.) *Question No. 45 **Senator Rana Mahmood Ul Hassan:**

Will the Minister for Interior be pleased to state the salient features of policy / rules that govern the regulation of VIP and VVIP routes / traffic in Islamabad indicating the dignitaries who are entitled to such facility and whether emergency route clearance is available to ambulances during deployment of VIP route?

Rana Sana Ullah Khan: Route clearance/security duties for VVIPs/VIPs are being provided as per Blue Book Chapter-VI. The salient features of VVIP/VIP routes/traffic deployment are given below as mentioned in Blue Book Chapter-VI:

Part: “A JOURNEY BY ROAD — Protection of the route and conveyance”. The important points are as under:

- i. Protective arrangements will vary accordingly to whether the VVIP visit is ordinary or ceremonial.
- ii. Police force will be posted to control the crowd and keep the road free for the VVIP party.
- iii. Traffic Lights on the VVIP route should be so manipulated that the motorcade/cavalcade is not held up, in case it is not possible to do so the traffic lights should be switched off as soon as the advance pilot appears and the control of traffic taken over by Police Officer.
- iv. A police guard shall be provided over all conveyances that VVIP may use in the course of his tour. The guard shall prevent any un-authorized person from having access to such conveyance.
- v. Protective measure to be taken during journey are given below:

- (a) Prevention of outrage.
- (b) Keeping the route clear for the journey.
- (c) Avoidance of incidents likely to be embarrassing and.
- (d) Control of public generally.

Part: “B Journey by motor car — Escort”. The significant points regarding Escort duty is given below:

- i. The VVIP car should be bullet proof which will be preceded at a reasonable distance by an advance pilot.
- ii. The car shall be closely followed by a uniform escort car. A protection car (one gazetted and two other plain clothes Police Officers properly armed) will follow next the escort.
- iii. A spare vehicle shall follow the cavalcade/motorcade.
- iv. The advance pilot and the escort car shall be fitted with VHFWT sets, where possible.
- v. The vehicle employed on security duty should be fast and stable enough to follow the VVIP car at high speed under the condition of the road.
- vi. Additional Police strength may travel in separate transport at the discretion of the local police authorities where it is considered necessary to provide adequate protection to the VVIP party while travelling by road.

Part: “D ceremonial occasions”. The formation of the escort/cavalcade during journey is as under:

- i. Advance Police Pilot Vehicle for traffic warning.
- ii. Police Pilot on Motor Cycle.
- iii. Military Police Jeep (at some distance).

- iv. VVIP car/vehicle.
- v. Civil Police (uniformed) Escort Vehicle (Limousine convertible with one officer and 4 men armed with sten-gun/revolvers and with a wireless set.
- vi. Civil Police (plain clothed) close protection team in limousine.
- vii. Vehicle carrying additional gunman, convertible limousine.
- viii. Military Police out riders.
- ix. Military Police Jeep.
- x. Car of personal physician to the President/Prime Minister.
- xi. Spare car in case of break-down of VVIP car/vehicle.
- xii. The cars of other VIPs if any included in the procession should be fitted in after the spare VVIP car.

Furthermore, it is pertinent to mention here that President of Pakistan, Prime Minister of Pakistan, Foreign Heads of States and foreign dignitaries declared as state Guest by Government of Pakistan are entitled for route/clearance facility.

Yes. The emergency route clearance for ambulances is available during VVIP/VIP routes.

Will the Minister for Interior be pleased to state the number for vendor licenses issued to street vendors and eco-friendly carts in Islamabad funded under the Ehsaas Programme, indicating criteria for issuance of vendor licenses / permits?

Rana Sana Ullah Khan: The total number of licenses issued to Ehsas Rehri Baan is 127 in various sectors. Details are annexed at Annexure-A.

The licenses are issued on the recommendation of the Focal Person of Ehsas Rehri Baan program. There is no role of DMA or MCI in selection of vendors for granting license. Survey is conducted by Pakistan Institute of Development Economics (PIDE) on the basis of which recommendations are submitted to Focal Person of Ehsas Rehri Baan Scheme.

Criteria for survey and selection is attached at Annex Annexure-B.

Rana Sana Ullah Khan:

- a. A total of 37x NADRA Registration Centers (NRCs)/Citizen Facilitation Centers (CFCs) are operational in newly merged districts of KPK. District-wise list is at (**Annex-A**).
- b. A total of 268x employees are working in NRCs/CFCs of newly merged Districts including 224x Male and 44x Female employees.
- c. 7x Mobile Registration Vans (MRVs) are attached with newly Merged Districts. 1x Mobile Registration Van (MRV) is allocated for each District.

(Def.) *Question No. 2 **Senator Bahramand Khan Tangi:**

(Notice Received on 29/06/2022 at 9:55 AM) QID: 39271

Will the Minister for Interior be pleased to state whether it is a fact that a number of foreigners with particular reference to Afghani's have obtained Pakistan's CNICs and Passports during the last three years, if so, the details and reasons thereof and the steps being taken by the government to control the same?

Rana Sana Ullah Khan:

1. It is informed that NADRA issues CNICs to Pakistani Nationals only. However, due to presence of a large number of illegal immigrants throughout the country, NADRA has to be extra vigilant to encounter the menace of non-nationals' inclusion in database while ensuring that only genuine citizens should be registered. In past, a few non-nationals succeeded in obtaining CNICs by providing fake documents of through connivance of NADRA employees. However, CNICs of such non-nationals are digitally impounded/ cancelled as and when reported. It is pertinent to mention here that digitally impounding of CNICs is currently stopped on the directions of Islamabad High Court.
2. During last three years, 181 CNICs/issued to non-nationals, have been cancelled by NADRA. However, cases of 8152 individuals are under process of National status verification. Moreover, NADRA has initiated inquiries against employees involved in the illegal processing. During the period from 1st July 2021 to 30th June 2022, 279 inquiries have been initiated as per E&D Rules 2020 and 43x employees have been terminated / dismissed / removed from service.
3. NADRA has taken following initiatives to curb illegal processing:—
 - a. **Existing Registration Policy for fresh applicants:**
 - (i) Mandatory requirement of presence and capturing of biometrics of one of the blood relatives (parents or siblings or son or daughter of paternal/maternal grandparents).
 - (ii) In case of no blood relative, presence and capturing of biometric of immediate relatives paternal/ maternal uncle or aunt or cousin etc).
 - (iii) Provision of any one of the documents *i.e.* birth or education certificate or domicile etc. (if any).

- (iv) Interview and Verification from family tree.
- (v) In case of doubt, case is referred to verification board or verifying agency.

b. Fresh Business Rules incorporated in last one year;

Regular revision / updation of Registration policy / procedures by introducing following new business rules and technical checks:—

- (i) Biometric attestation and verification system of Parliamentarians in practice, since 2016 has been suspended.
- (ii) Text message to attester / verifier regarding confirmation of attestation.
- (iii) Text message to head of the family regarding new entry in the family (in case of fresh applicants).
- (iv) Ethnic language and birth sequence check.
- (v) Old records where Biometrics were not available are being monitored.
- (vi) Child Registration Certificate (CRC) is being revamped by capturing photographs of all minors and biometrics of 14 and above.
- (vii) SMS are being sent on daily basis to the citizens to renew their CNICs.
- (xvii) SIBS are being sent on daily basis to citizens to obtain CNICs of minors who have attained the age of 18 years.
- (xviii) Birth proof (CBRC) has been made mandatory for CRC processing.

- c. **Compliance / Monitoring:** SOP has been formulated to evaluate each fresh case processed across the country on daily basis. This is helping NADRA in immediately identifying any illegal / grey areas in processing.
- d. **Formation of Steering Committee:** To analyze the cases reported by verifying agencies *i.e.* IB or ISI etc., punitive actions are taken against NADRA employees and applicants accordingly.
- e. **Mystery Customer:** Concept is introduced to find out the grey areas.

(Def.) *Question No. 3 **Senator Bahramand Khan Tangi:**
(Notice Received on 29/06/2022 at 9:55 AM) QID: 39275

Will the Minister for Narcotics Control be pleased to state whether it is a fact that the number of illicit drugs manufacturers and users is increasing in the country, if so, the steps being taken by the Government to control the same?

Nawabzada Shahzain Bugti:

1. Pakistan is maintaining a poppy free status since 2001, as recognized by UNODC. There are no reports of local manufacturing and /or increase in local manufacturing of drugs.
2. The last drug survey was conducted in 2013.
3. In this regard Bureau of Statistics has been approached to conduct fresh drug use survey in the country. They are being partnered by NIPS and funded by UNODC. True picture regarding increase or decrease in the use of drug or prevalence of a particular drug among a particular strata of society, will be developed based on the concrete figures collected after fresh survey.
4. However, the government's efforts to control the menace of drugs continue. Presently there are 4 rehabilitation centres working in the country.

5. On supply side control, our Anti-Narcotics Force has made 459.5 tons seizures which has been recognized in the World Drug Report 2022 of UNODC. Thus, Pakistan's efforts continue to keep the country safe and to make the world the safe.
6. Anti-Narcotic Force consists of 3600 employees out of which only 2200 are operational and maintains the law enforcement activity across the country including International borders *i.e* Iran, Afghanistan and India. In addition, ANF actively perform duties at Sea Ports, dry ports and Airports to control the drug trafficking. With the inadequate Human Resources efforts are being made at gross root level also to snub the local drug traffickers/handlers and users.
7. Furthermore, Narcotics and Psychotropic substances are being used for the manufacturing of medicine and there is a possibility that due to pilferage the same may be used for recreational activities as a drug. There is no mechanism that could monitor and collect data of those people who used such type of drugs. MNC in coordination with DRAP allocated quota of substance used for Manufacturing Narcotics and Psychotropic drugs.

Will the Minister for Interior be pleased to state the total area of Sector G-17, as well as the area of land acquired / purchased by the Supreme Court Employees Cooperative Society in each sub-sector of Sector G-17 separately?

Rana Sana Ullah Khan: The total Area of sector G-17 is 5,069 Kanals. Supreme Court Employees Cooperative Housing Society submitted land documents of 2223.75 Kanals in this Sector. Out of these 2223.75 Kanals, ownership of land measuring 2222.06 Kanals, has been verified by CDA.

Will the Minister for Interior be pleased to state the total area of Sector F-16, as well as the area of land acquired / purchased by Jammu & Kashmir Cooperative Housing Society in each sub-sector of Sector F-16 separately?

Rana Sana Ullah Khan: It is stated that the total area of Sector F-16 is approximately 7289 Kanals. The Capital Development Authority approved layout plan of Jammu & Kashmir Cooperative Housing Society over an area measuring 3325 Kanals on 24-11-2005 in Sector F-16, Islamabad. The NOC for development was not issued as the management of the society failed to comply with the terms and conditions of layout plan.

However, the Cooperative Department/ Circle Registrar, ICT is the competent forum for details regarding land acquired/ purchased by Jammu & Kashmir Cooperative Society in Sector F-16, Islamabad.
