Will the Minister In-charge of the Cabinet Division be pleased to state:

- (a) the make and models of vehicles provided to the Cabinet Ministers during the period from May 2022 to 30th July 2023; and*
- (b) whether it is a fact that the Government imported BMW cars for its Cabinet Members during the said period, if so, the present status of those cars?*

Minister In-charge of the Cabinet Division: (a) As per rule 24 of the Rules for Use of Staff Cars 1980, Federal Ministers/Ministers of State/Advisors/ Special Assistants to the Prime Minister with the status of Minister/ Minister of State are entitled to use a 1800cc car to be provided by the respective Ministry. However, in case of non-availability of suitable entitled car with Ministry concerned, Cabinet Division provides the vehicles from its pool for the use of Federal Ministers / Ministers of State.

Further, a protected /higher engine vehicle shall be allocated to a vulnerable dignitary, subject to availability and approval of the Prime Minister in terms of rule 24 (2)(a) of the Staff Cars Rules, 1980 **(Annex-I).**

List of vehicles provided to the Federal Ministers /Ministers of State/ Advisors /Special Assistants to the Prime Minister during the period from May 2022 to 30th July, 2023 is enclosed as **Annex-II.**

(b) Cabinet Division has not imported / purchased any BMW vehicle, during the said period.

RULES FOR THE USE OF STAFF CARS 1980

**GOVERNMENT OF PAKISTAN
CABINET SECRETARIAT
CABINET DIVISION**

24. **Categories of Staff Cars and their Entitlement for use:-** (1) Staff cars for government use may be categorized as under:-

- a. Small Cars Up to engine power not exceeding 1300 CC.
- b. Medium Cars Cars with an engine power ranging from over 1300 CC to 1600 CC.
- c. Big Cars Engine power exceeding 1600 CC.
- d. All cars earmarked for foreign dignitaries and Federal / Provincial Ministers, Hon'able Judges of Supreme Court and Chief Justices of the High Court will be air conditioned. (Add. vide No. 12/65/81-CS, dated 4th August, 1983)

(2) The Prime Minister of Pakistan has been pleased to approve the following revised entitlement of staff cars:-

- ✓ a. Federal Ministers/Ministers of State/Advisors/ 1800 CC
Special Assistants to the Prime Minister with status of Minister/Minister of State.
"Provided that the protected vehicle shall be allocated to a vulnerable dignitary subject to availability and approval of the Prime Minister. However, Secretary, Cabinet Division may allow expenses on maintenance, repair and POL of any vehicle from the budget of Cabinet Division, Foreign Office or any other Division, which he may approve; provided that the vehicle was bought by a Government Authority / Ministry / Division and was used by anyone, after due authorization, whose assigned work falls within the ambit of that Division".
- b. Secretaries General/Secretary/Parliamentary 1300 CC
Secretaries and Officers equivalent to BPS-22.
- c. Additional Secretaries/Senior Joint Secretaries/ 1000 CC
Officers in BPS-21/20 and equivalent.

(3) The Senior government functionaries holding Staff Car with engine capacity above the entitlement will continue to use the existing vehicles till they are due for replacement as per rules subject to the condition that the vehicle is of older model than 2003.

(4) The Prime Minister has further been pleased to approve the responsibility of providing Staff Cars to various government functionaries as indicated below:-

- ✓ a. Federal Minister / Minister of State Respective Ministry
- b. Advisors to the Prime Minister/ Respective Ministry
Parliamentary Secretaries allocated a portfolio.
- c. Advisors/Special Assistants to the Prime Minister without portfolio. Cabinet Division

(5) The petrol/CNG ceiling of entitled officers are as under :-

Will the Minister In-charge of the Establishment Division be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that candidates/ officers selected for Audit and Accounts group through CSS examination during the last five years do not passes the required educational qualifications of Accounts or Audit, if so, the details and reasons thereof; and*
- (b) whether it is also a fact that a number of candidates with the required educational qualifications of Accounts and Audit have been selected for other APG groups, if so, the details and reasons thereof?*

Minister In-charge of the Establishment Division: (a) Minimum educational qualification for appearance in the CSS Exam is Second Division or Grade “C” Bachelor Degree in any faculty/discipline. Occupational Groups are allocated to successful candidates in terms of their order of merit and preference of the candidate irrespective of any specific discipline. However, details are at **Annex-I**.

(b) No specific educational qualification for Audit & Accounts is required or any of the 12 Occupational Groups included in the scheme of recruitment through CSS Competitive Examination. It is possible that the candidates allocated to any occupational group may have an educational qualification relating to a discipline of Audit & Accounts. Details are at **Annex-II**.





Mr. Ahmad Irfan Asalam: Despite a meagre overall contribution to the greenhouse gases, Pakistan is greatly affected by the climate threats including water stress, desertification, glacier melting, melting, extreme weather events and spread of diseases. These threats pose severe challenges to Pakistan in terms of ecology, agriculture, economic development. The challenges facing Pakistan are enumerated as under:

- Glacial Lake Outburst Floods:
There has been a 300% increase in GLOF events in just one year
- Global Warming: High intensity heatwave persistence has increased to 41 days per year. Hottest cities in the world for three years straight 53.7 C
- Erratic Weather: Over the last decades, unprecedented monsoon rains have wreaked havoc with increased intensity over the years. Pakistan suffered a loss of 30 billion USD in last year's floods.
- Water Scarcity: It is expected that there will be absolute water scarcity by 2025.
- Food Insecurity: expected to rise from 40% to 60% by 2050
- Sea-level rise: It is expected that along the coast may rise, by 2 to 3 feet by 2100, threatening the existence of cities of Thatta, Badin and Karachi.
- CC induced Migration: Threefold increase in climate induced migration from 0.7 M to 2.0 M by 2050

The Government of Pakistan is aware of the dire situation and has taken a number of pro-active initiatives which are as under:

1. Benefiting optimally from the Global Shield initiative, announced at COP-27 paving the way to leverage climate-risk financing;
2. Preparation for voluntary carbon market framework, which will provide guidance in the establishment of carbon markets in Pakistan
3. Joined the Plastic Free Rivers and Seas for South Asia (PLEASE) initiative for effective plastic waste management in future and to get access to international financing for the same;
4. National Adaptation Plan has been developed which will steer the adaptation process with regard to climate change;
5. Strengthening Adaptation and Resilience (SAR) Project for climate change has interventions for climate resilience in priority sectors as

identified by provincial stakeholders comprising of WASH, Health and Agriculture;

6. Pakistan has joined the Saudi and Middle East Green Initiative- (SMGI) which target planting or regenerating 50 billion trees across the region equivalent to 200 million hectares of land in regional member countries in Central Asia, West Asia, South Asia, North Africa and Sub-Saharan Africa to promote nature-based solutions and ecosystem-based approaches;
7. Pakistan has endorsed the Forest Climate Change Leaders Partnership proposed by the UK Government to halt and reverse forest loss and land degradation by 2030;
8. Pakistan has launched National Tree Plantation Campaign with the target of Planting of 303.77 million trees during Monsoon 2022 season out of which 71 million trees have been planted all over Pakistan so far;
9. National Clean Air Policy has been developed aiming to provide a framework for improving air quality in Pakistan. It is a national document and therefore focuses on actions at the national scale that can achieve improvements in air quality;
10. The “National Hazardous Waste Management Policy, 2022” has been developed which is a milestone achievement in addressing the issue of hazardous waste management in Pakistan. It enabled Pakistan to play a pivotal role in meeting the obligations under the Basel Convention on the Control of Transboundary Movements of Hazardous Wastes and their Disposal. In addition, it would also help Pakistan achieve the relevant Sustainable Development Goals and avail extension of the European Union’s GSP Plus status post - 2023.
11. The Living Indus Initiative aims to rejuvenate the Indus Basin into a thriving system by repairing and restoring the natural resources and ecosystems that are resilient in the face of climate change. The initiative proposes a diverse set of 25 interventions to initiate coordinated executive efforts to restore the health of the basin with particular focus on water, ecology, biodiversity, and agriculture sectors.

12. With a total budget of US \$77.8 million, Recharge Pakistan project focused on building Pakistan's climate resilience through eco-system-based adaptation for integrated flood management, better climate resilience, water, food, and energy security, and sustainable livelihoods in Pakistan. Its main components are enhancing resilience of vulnerable communities, and paradigm shift towards eco-based adaptation at critical tipping points within the country,
13. GLOF-II project is being implemented for helping vulnerable communities in the provinces of GB and KP, with objective to empower communities to identify and manage GLOFs risks, and related impacts of climate change, strengthen public services and improve community preparedness and disaster response capacities.

(b) the amount earned/expected to be earned from the outsourcing of those airports?

Minister for Aviation: (a) It is apprised that a Transaction Advisory Services Agreement (TASA) has been signed by Pakistan Civil Aviation Authority with International Finance Corporation. (IFC), a subsidiary of World Bank Group on 11th April, 2023 after obtaining approval from the then Federal Cabinet in line with the Public Private Partnership Authority (P3A) Act and its relevant regulations for outsourcing the operations of three international airports of Islamabad, Karachi and Lahore. A Steering Committee constituted by the then Prime Minister of Pakistan has been overseeing the process of outsourcing of airports headed by the Minister for Finance.

IFC will act as a Transactional advisor for the outsourcing of airports. Islamabad International Airport has been selected to be outsourced at first for which tender documents have been advertised in international and national press with the date of opening of bids fixed as 9th November, 2023. In this regard, a pre-bid meeting has been held on 26th September, 2023. It has also been decided that Islamabad International Airport would be outsourced for a period of 15 years, whereas the time period of the remaining two airports would be decided by the Federal Government on the basis of the detailed study to be prepared by IFC. The name of the successful bidder would be known once the bidding process is completed. It is expected that award of concession for outsourcing of Islamabad International Airport should be completed before June, 2024.

Another important aspect that needs to be highlighted is that only the operation and management of Passenger Terminal Building, the landside of the airport including Carpark and its Apron as well as Cargo Terminal shall be outsourced for Islamabad International Airport whereas Airside including the Runways & Taxiways, Rescue & Fire Fighting Services, Air Traffic Control Tower as well as the Air Navigation services such as Air Traffic Services, Navigational services, Radar, etc. shall remain with Pakistan Civil Aviation Authority.

It has also been decided to outsource the remaining two airports in a sequence, i.e. one by one.

(b) Necessary analysis in this regard for Islamabad International Airport has been completed. The amounts to be earned would be on the basis of two aspects namely a fixed initial amount to be paid by the successful bidder at the time of award of work and a percentage of revenue earned from the airport. However, a one-time initial payment of US \$ 100 Million would be required to be paid by the successful bidder. The amounts for airports located in Karachi and Lahore would be finalized on the basis of the analysis prepared by IFC in due course of time.

Minister for Poverty Alleviation and Social Safety: The **Catastrophic Healthcare Expenditure (CHE) Policy** was approved by the Federal Cabinet on 14th March 2022. Sehat Tahafuz Program (STP) in accordance to the CHE Policy is complementing the Sehat Sahulat/Sehat Card Program which is being administered by the Ministry of National Health Services.

The Sehat Tahafuz Program (STP) is a Rs. 1,989 million PSDP project, with an implementation period from 2021 to 2024 and manifestation of the CHE Policy. STP is a Shock-Oriented safety net program providing medical coverage against Catastrophic Healthcare Expenditure to vulnerable communities, through empanelled Public Sector Hospitals. The program covers ~900 treatment packages spanning 21 medical departments. Under STP, medical assistance has been provided to 17,953 beneficiaries in the following major categories:

Cardiology	563
Gastroenterology	1413
Internal Medicine	3124
Paediatrics	1911
Cochlear Implantation	188
Others	10754

Presently, 14 hospitals across Pakistan are empanelled with the STP. However, the program is in the process of expanding its operations to additional ~ 30 hospitals in the poorest districts of Pakistan.

- (a) whether it is fact that PLA planes operating on long routes are still equipped with old model of inflight entertainment system, if so, the reasons thereof; and*
- (b) the steps taken / being taken by the Government to upgrade the said system as per international standards indicating also the estimated cost and funds allocated for the same during the current financial year?*

Minister for Aviation: (a) Seat Back IFE is only installed on PIA B777 airplanes. These airplanes are installed with M/S Panasonic MAS 3000/3000i IFE system and two airplanes are equipped with M/s Rockwell

Collins, but both of the systems are facing phase out and are now obsolete in aviation industry.

(b) Considering the current financial situation of PIA, the management has initiated a small-scale measure to introduce a portable entertainment system on personal devices of the passengers (such as smart phones, laptops, tablets etc.). This interim approach will offer a relatively swift and cost-effective solution for, PIA fleet.

Will the Minister In-charge of the Establishment Division be pleased to state:

- (a) *whether it is a fact that the Benevolent Fund is granting reimbursement of semester's fees up to University level to the dependent children of Federal Government employees, if so, the details of the BS and MS programmes which were allowed fee reimbursement; and*
- (b) *whether it is also a fact that few of the programmes were not covered under the above arrangement, if so, its reasons and the details of disallowed programmes?*

Minister In-charge of the Establishment Division: (a) Yes, FEB&GIF in pursuance of Rule 25-A of FEBF&GI Rules, 1972 (amended from time to time) is paying reimbursement of semester /annual fee upto a maximum of Rs. 100,000/- per annum to every employee for professional education (degree programmes) of his or her two children in a year studying in Medical (MBBS&BDS), Engineering accredited by Pakistan Engineering Council, Architecture, IT (Computer Sciences, Software Engineering, Information Technology, Bio-Informatics, Information System), D-Pharmacy, Business Studies, (Business Administration, Accounting & Finance) upto MS/M.Phil levels (except Ph. D). For the purpose of this reimbursement of fee, children of Federal Government Employees should be enrolled in public sector universities, colleges and institutes duly recognized by Higher Education Commission and would have got admission on merit (**Annexure-A**).

(b) Yes, besides the above mentioned categories where reimbursement upto Rs.100,000/- is allowed, all other programmes are covered under educational stipend scheme that ranges from Rs.20,000 to Rs. 40,000 per annum for the students/children of the covered employees. It is informed that no program is disallowed for the purpose of stipend upto Rs.40,000/- per annum. All education degree programmes cannot be entertained under the fee reimbursement category (for payment of Rs. 100,000 per annum) as its financial implication would be too high & FEB & GIF is unable to cater such huge financial burden. As per Actuarial Report, the Group Insurance Fund (where from, fee reimbursement and education stipend etc., schemes are being paid) is in huge actuarial loss and keeping in view this, BoT in its 118th meeting rationalized the welfare

schemes and decided to curtail number of education stipends and fee reimbursement claims to 1000 each per annum (presently there is no limit on number of claims to be paid) respectively for which necessary amendment in FEBF&GI Rules 1972 is underway. Moreover, reimbursement to all such programmes would require significant increase in contribution rates as deducted from monthly salaries of the employees resulting in huge financial burden on the employees. The detail may be seen at (**Annexure-B**).

(I)/2014.- In exercise of the powers conferred by section 23 of the Federal Employees Benevolent Fund and Group Insurance Act, 1969 (II of 1969), the Federal Government is pleased to direct that the following further amendments/additions shall be made in the Federal Employees Benevolent Fund and Group Insurance Rules, 1972, namely:-

2. In the aforesaid Rules,

- i) In rule-25, in sub-rule (3), after the words "PhD", the words "and MPhil" shall be omitted.
- ii) After rule-25, the following new rule 25-A shall be added:-


25-A Reimbursement of Semester / Annual Fees for Professional Education.

Reimbursement of actual semester / annual fees shall be admissible to every employee for professional education (degree programmes) of his or her two children in a year in Medical, Engineering, Architecture, IT and Business Studies except PhD in the public sector universities, colleges and institutes recognized by the Higher Education Commission for those children who get admission on merit basis.

Provided that the student shall have to obtain the minimum passing marks in all subjects/courses prescribed by the university, college or institute for his promotion to the next semester / class / professional year.

Provided further that reimbursement will be made for the whole tenure/period prescribed for these studies but not for the semester in which the student fails in one or more subjects.

3. This Notification shall be deemed to have taken effect from the academic year 2013-14.

Will the Minister for Housing and Works be pleased to state:

- (a) *whether it is a fact that Federal Government Employees Housing Authority has announced to allot plots to general public in sectors G-12 and F-12, Islamabad, if so, the date / period during which the said land was acquired by the Government indicating also the rate at which the same was acquired;*
- (b) *whether it is also a fact that a Katchi abadi known as Mehar Abadi consisting of hundreds of houses, shops and markets etc. have been established / constructed on the said land, if so, the reasons for failure of the government to stop the said construction; and*
- (c) *whether it is further a fact that the Government, without taking the current owners and residents into confidence, acquired the land from the previous owners who have sold it to the current residents, if so, the procedure to be adopted for payment of compensation to the current owners of houses / shops and plots in the area?*

Minister for Housing and Works: (a) • Yes, the Federal Government Employees Housing Authority has opened registration to allot plots to general public in sector G-12 and F-12, Islamabad on 27-08-2023.

- Award of land of Sectors F-12 & G-12 was announced by the Deputy Commissioner CDA on 30-06-1985 & 28-04-1985 respectively under section 25 of CDA Ordinance 1960.
- The said Sectors were allocated by the Federal Cabinet to the Federal Government Employees Housing Authority (FGEHA) vide Cabinet decision No. 455/26/2020 dated 07-07-2020. Since, there is no provision for de-notification the award once announced. Neither is there any provision in the Land Acquisition Act 1894, which allows for setting aside of an

award. Accordingly, Judgment of Land Award was passed by DC, FGEHA on 23-04-2021 after addressing the court orders and other relevant issues. The Rate for Award issued is Rs. 62,90,000+ 15% compulsory land acquisition charges (Total Rs. 72,33,500/-).

- Thereafter, a summary with the following proposal for amendment in Award was placed for approval from the Federal Cabinet:

“Entire record of Sectors G-12 & F-12 along with award issued in 1985 are withdrawn from CDA and assigned to FGEHA for decision of compensation, as per direction of Lahore High Court, Rawalpindi Bench and incorporation of modalities as decided by Cabinet Committee”.

- The said proposal for amendment was approved by the Federal Cabinet in its meeting held on 07-12-2021. Thereafter, the CDA has handed over the said Land to FGE housing Authority.

(b) • Yes, a Katchi abadi known as Mehar Abadi consisting of hosues, shops and markets etc. have been established/ constructed on the said land.

- Land Award of Sectors F-12 & G-12 was initially announced by the Deputy Commissioner CDA on 30-06-1985 & 28-04-1985 respectively. The Katchi abadi was not raised after handing over the said Sector to FGE Housing Authority. The FGEHA has taken several steps to stop encroachment.

(c) • Award of land of Sectors F-12 & G-12 was announced by the Deputy Commissioner CDA on 30-06-1985 & 28-04-1985 respectively.

- The said Sectors were allocated by the Federal Cabinet to the Federal Government Employees Housing Authority (FGEHA) vide Cabinet decision No. 455/26/2020 dated 07-07-2020. Thereafter, Judgment of Land Award passed by DC, FGEHA on 23-04-2021 after addressing the court orders and other relevant issues. The Rate for Award issued is Rs. 62,90,000+ 15% compulsory land acquisition charges (Total Rs. 72,33,500/-).

The FGE Housing Authority has not paid any compensation of Land to any affecttee. However, compensation will be made as per laid down criteria.

Will the Minister for Climate Change be pleased to refer to Senate starred Question No.25-A replied on 31st March, 2023 and state whether the Government has taken / initiated any action against the brick kiln owners in Islamabad capital territory who have not yet converted to environment friendly zigzag technology, if so, the details thereof and if not, the reasons thereof?

Mr. Ahmad Irfan Aslam: Pakistan's brick sector is highly unregulated and non-registered industrial sector in the entire country. Within the jurisdiction of ICT, there are a total of sixty-three (63) Brick Kilns. Among these, four (4) have been permanently dismantled, while forty-nine (49) have transitioned to environmentally-friendly zigzag technology. However, the remaining ten (10) Brick Kilns are currently in the process of conversion out of the initial sixty-three.

All of these Kilns are located in either rural areas or in regions slated for future development by CDA.

Recently, Pak-EPA took legal action ,against six (6) Brick Kilns, shutting down their operations due to their non-compliance with the installation of environmentally-friendly zigzag technology, which was resulting, in pollution in the capital city's environment. **(Annex-A)**.

The focus should be on expediting the conversion of the remaining ten kilns to environmentally-friendly zigzag technology.

Furthermore, a robust monitoring and enforcement mechanism have been put in place to prevent any backsliding into non-compliance to the National Environmental Quality Standards by the Brick Kilns.

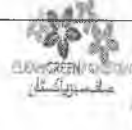

Will the Minister for Aviation be pleased to state:

- (a) whether there is any policy regarding postings of PIA Officers/staff abroad, if so, details thereof; and*
- (b) the mechanism devised / measure adopted by PIA to ensure equal opportunities to the officers/staff belonging to all provinces of Pakistan in respect of foreign postings?*

Minister for Aviation: (a) PIA has a global network which is being managed with its business & administrative resources at each foreign station. For this purpose, the workforce / human resources at foreign stations are classified as Pak-based employees at foreign stations. These are the PIA's regular employees in Pakistan who are selected through a foreign posting board and appointed as expatriates in supervisory roles to oversee the interest of the company at the foreign stations normally for a tenure of 03 years mainly in 04 areas i.e. Commercial, PHS, Engineering and Finance.

PIACL has a comprehensive policy for foreign posting. This policy covers the eligibility criteria, selection process, compensation and benefits, travel arrangements, and other aspects of working abroad. Keeping in view the importance of the position and the level of authority and accountability required for working at foreign stations, only officers are considered for foreign posting. The salient features of foreign posting policy are narrated as under:

Eligibility:

Department wise seniority is prepared for each Pay Group which led to eligibility while giving preference to officers having zero/NIL foreign posting. Once, a list of employees with Zero posting is ascertained, they are further evaluated on the basis of certain conditions i.e:

- The employee shall not be due for retirement within three years.
- The employee shall have at least 03 Outstanding and 02 Above Average Performance Appraisal Rating (PAR) in the last 05 years of service.

- The employee shall have 03 years of experience in the trade/department.

Foreign Posting Board:

- Candidates are called with the ratio of 1:3 against each position in the sequence of eligibility whereby employees with zero postings are prioritized.
- In case there is no such employee with zero foreign posting, candidates in the seniority list having one posting are eligible for interview. Similarly; if no candidate is available with one posting, those employees are considered who have already done 2 postings.

Selection Process

Employees who meet the required eligibility criteria are interviewed and assessed on the basis of Professional Knowledge, experience, communication and management skills. After the extensive interview of the eligible candidates, the most suitable employee is selected for the position based on collective wisdom by the constituted foreign posting board.

Foreign Posting Formalities

After formal approval by the management, foreign posting letter is issued to the selected employee with the advice to complete the mentioned below formalities in the timeline given therein:

Finally, upon completion of the formalities, the selected employee is moved from Pakistan for joining at respective foreign station and the officer already posted/working at foreign station is released with the advice to join Pakistan.

(b) Since only those employees who meet the criteria of foreign posting are eligible to appear before the foreign posting board, therefore, equal opportunity is provided to the candidates for competing in the interview and selection is based upon the performance, past experience, good communication skill and to compete the challenges at abroad and no selection is made having domicile of particular province.

(2) Rs. 7,907,000,243 (7.9 Billion approx.) was disbursed under financial assistance from GoP.

(3) As a result, pay roll cost of PIACL decreased from PKR 14.86 Billion (2020) to PKR 10.83 (2021) saving PKR 4 billion/ annum including other future liabilities i.e. Medical, Pension and free / rebated air travel.

Dr. Umar Saif: SCO is a strategic organization established in July 1976 on the directive of the then Prime Minister of Pakistan. The organization is mandated to plan, develop, operate and maintain telecom infrastructure in Azad Jammu & Kashmir (AJK) and Gilgit-Baltistan. This responsibility was shifted to SCO from erstwhile T&T Department.

Owing to strategic importance of these regions, difficult terrain and weather conditions, SCO operates under the auspices of Pakistan Army to overcome the challenges and carry out projects/initiatives as per the mandate.

The details of ongoing and completed projects of SCO during the last 5 years are placed at **Annex-A**.

- (c) • FGE Housing Authority executed an agreement with M/s Green Tree Pvt. Ltd. on 01-04-2009 for purchase of 3000 kanals private land at Bara Kahu, Islamabad. Provision of clear land is the responsibility of the JV partner and land provided was clear in all respects. Whereas, in sector F-14 & F-15, the LAC, ICT has announced 85 BUPs Award on 15-06-2017. Several operations had been conducted with the help of District Administration Islamabad for vacation of acquired land. Presently, the matter is subjudice in Hon'able Supreme Court of Pakistan with regard to the allotment policy.
- Allotments have been made to the eligible / successful registered applicants whose names were within merit of the concerned scheme as per laid down criteria. Whereas, Thalian Housing Scheme has been closed due to multiple land issues and its allottees will be accommodated in future schmes as per laid down criteria.

- (c) *whether the said project has been launched in Balochistan, if so, its present status of implementation?*

Dr. Umar Saif: (a) Crime Analytics and Smart Policing in Pakistan is a PSDP project of Ministry of Information Technology & Telecommunication and executed by Punjab Information Technology Board (PITB). This important project consists of integrated data system for analyzing crime patterns with respect to crime rate prediction, criminal networks and crime hot spot appraisal. This project aims to technology intervention in policing which can help in improving law and order situations and thereby creating positive impact on economic activities. The total cost of the project is 274.36 million rupees. 80% of the physical progress and 60% of the financial progress in respect of the said project has been achieved. This project has been extended recently up to 30th December, 2024 for rolling out its programme in all other provinces. The details in respect of the said project are placed at **Annex-A**.

(b) Yes, the said project has been rolled out in all provinces of Pakistan. In this regard the programme has been launched in the province of Punjab, Sindh, Balochistan, GB. The Core and Auxiliary Application deployment has been completed in the above provinces and Islamabad Capital Territory. Furthermore, the PC-I of the project has been extended upto December, 2024 to complete the rolling out programme of the project in KPK as well. At present 184 Police Stations have been planned under this project in the following cities:-

(c) Yes the said project has been rolled out in the province of Balochistan. The details in this regard are placed at **Annex-B**.

Annex-A**CRIME ANALYTICS AND SMART POLICING IN PAKISTAN**

Crime Analytics and Smart Policing in Pakistan is a very important PSDP project means to digital intervention tools in Police Department leading to improvement in law and order situation by way of crime detections, crime pattern analysis and hot spot appraisals. This programme consist of deployment of Applications at designated areas, locations/points to seek the desired data/outcome in respect of a particular crime/criminal.

The Applications in this regard may be either Core Applications or Auxiliary Applications. Core applications includes Police Stations Record Management System (PSRMS), Human Resource Management Information System (HRMIS), Criminal Record Management System (CRMS), Complaint Management System (CMS). Similarly auxiliary applications include Police Khidmat Markaz (PKM), Hotel Eye (HE), Travel Eye (TE), E-Police Post (EPP). The hardware required for the operations of these applications has been procured which would enable these applications to operate to achieve the desired outcomes. Due to Covid constraints, austerity measures and spike in the exchange rates the project has been accorded more time with revised cost through re-appropriation to replicate the success story in other provinces as well. The data base so maintained by law enforcement not only provide multi-dimensional features in respect of various crime patterns but also helps a great deal to fix it.

Annex-B**PRESENT STATUS OF IMPLEMENTATION OF BALOCHISTAN**

1. **"Crime Analytics and Smart Policing in Pakistan"**, has been extended to the province of Balochistan and necessary automation process of Balochistan Police is under way. In this regard 26 Police Stations in Quetta have been selected for the requisite installation of Core and Auxiliary Applications alongwith procurement of the hardware for operating the Applications.
2. All 4 core applications (PSRMS, HRMIS, CRO & CMS) and 3 Auxiliary applications (Hotel Eye & Travel Eye, TRS, PKM) have been deployed and operational in Quetta and similar replications shall be processed further in other major cities of Balochistan.
3. **Hardware** for all Quetta Police Stations had been provided under said project to Balochistan provincial police department so it could operate these applications without any technical issues.
4. Quetta Police is provided all necessary trainings in Quetta by PITB experts to execute these Applications and share their practical experiences for operations learned from deployments in Punjab.

Minister In-charge of the Establishment Division: (a) Establishment Division under the existing legal dispensation (Law and Justice Division's policy/ guidelines regarding nominations/ recommendations for appointment of legal advisors dated 03-06-2015 (**Annex-A**) read with provisions contained in Rule 14(IA) of Rule of Business (**Annex-B**) can hire private counsels in complex and challenging court cases. Private lawyers were engaged on three occasions during last five years with the approval of Attorney General's Office and the Law Division to defend government laws/rules/policies.

To conclude that private counsel was hired for pleading service matter cases of one service to the detriment of the other would be incorrect. The first occasions in last five years when private counsel was hired was to defend contempt filed before Supreme Court of Pakistan in promotion related cases. On two other occasions the services of private counsels were hired in order to defend amendments made in the Civil Service Rules, 1954.

- (b) *whether any rent is charged on account of the said allotments, if so, the procedure laid down for assessment of the rent indicating also the income generated from the same during the last five years with year wise and airport wise breakup?*

Minister for Aviation: (a) Commercial and Estates Directorate awards spaces/licenses in line with the Commercial Policy in vogue i.e. CAAO-004- CMPP-2.1, which categorizes the stakeholders/businesses in the following manner:

(a) Commercial Concessions:

- i. These include pure commercial businesses such as Exchange Companies, Food Outlets, Travel Requisite Shops, Travel and Tour Companies, Collection of Car Parking etc.
- ii. Licenses to commercial concessions are awarded through open tenders for a period up to five (05) years on monthly license fee with 10% annual cumulative enhancement during subsequent years of license.
- iii. Reserve price of new concessions for disposal through tendering is determined on the basis of data of similar businesses at other airports of same category, market potential and business growth.
- iv. Tendering of existing commercial concessions is initiated three (03) months prior to expiry of License Agreement, on Reserve Price calculated on the basis of last year's monthly license fee plus 10% added thereon.

(b) Semi-commercial Concessions:

- i. These include rooms and spaces allotted to Airline Offices, Ground Handling Agencies, Flying Clubs, Training and Educational Institutes, Charter Operators, Aircraft Manufacturing Industry, Aircraft Maintenance and Manufacturers, Cargo Clearing/Forwarding Agents, Cargo Sheds of GHAs and Airlines, Aircraft Hangers and Private Jet operators.
- ii. The aforementioned concessions are categorized as "Operational" except Cargo Clearing/Forwarding Agents and Private Jet Operators.
- iii. Spaces/Rooms to Semi-Commercial Concessions are granted at CAA Airports on direct allotment basis,

subject to availability, on CAA prescribed space charges which have been rationalized in line with National Aviation Policy 2019 (Operational Non-Operational), keeping in view category of the airports, for a period up to five (05) years which is further extendable by periods of up to five (05) years, on request of the licensee.

(c) Government Departments / Agencies:

- i. Government Departments directly connected to Operational Functioning of the Airports, Passenger Facilitations, Embarkation and Disembarkation of Passengers, Safety and Security of Passengers/ Aircraft / Airport Premises, Safety of Government Assets, Clearance of Passengers Baggage and Emplaning and Deplaning of Air Cargo are awarded spaces /rooms at Airports on direct allotment basis for a period up to five (05) years, further extendable for a period up to five (05) years on request of the licensee, subject to availability of spaces.
- ii. Spaces are awarded to Government Departments/ Agencies on the following basis;
 - Operational Spaces within Operational Areas: No Space Rent and Utilities are charged being essential operational requirements.
 - Operational Spaces Outside Operational Areas: No space rent is charged for such spaces. However, utilities are charged.
 - Non-operational Spaces: Space charges as per physical status (Non-operational) are charged including Utilities.

(b) Procedure for assessment of rent/license fee has been elaborated above in response to question 15(a) for each category of concessions. Moreover, income garnered from rent during last five years with year-wise/airport-wise breakup is enclosed as **Annex-A.**

This policy document is a 'living' document and will be reviewed and updated regularly to address emerging concepts and issues in the ever-evolving science of climate change.

The Ministry of Climate Change and Env Coordination is working with the provinces and has developed Provincial Climate Change Action Plans in collaboration with UNDP. Extracts of the Action Plans are provided as Punjab Climate Change Action Plan (**Annex-I**), Sindh Climate Change Action Plan (**Annex-II**), Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Climate Change Action Plan (**Annex-III**), Balochistan Climate Change Action Plan (**Annex-IV**).

MoCC & EC is determined to aid provinces to mainstream these policies and commitments in their mandates. Thus, the action plan provides a comprehensive framework to support the provinces to maximize the efforts on adaptation and mitigation actions in agriculture, water resources, forestry, wildlife and fisheries, health, energy, transport, industry, waste and urban planning sectors.

Owing to strategic importance of these regions, difficult terrain and weather conditions, SCO operates under the auspices of Pakistan Army to overcome the challenges and carry out projects/initiatives as per the mandate.
