REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ONPRIVILEGE MOTION NO. 1(255)/2016-M, MOVED BY SENATOR ILYAS AHMED BILOUR.

(Report No. 38/2017)

I, Chairman of the Committee on Rules of Procedure and Privileges, have the honour to present report of the Committee on Privilege motion No. 1(255)/2016-M, moved by Senator Ilyas Ahmed Bilour on 16th January, 2017.

The details of the issue before the Committee were that Senator Ilyas Ahmed Bilour moved Privilege motion No. 1(255)/2016-M, regarding conversion of building constructed for surgical ICU ward in Lady Reading Hospital, Peshawar, into offices without consulting the Senator as the building was constructed out of the development funds provided by him (the Senator). The Honourable Chairman Senate held the motion in order and referred the same to the Committee on Rules of Procedure and Privileges for investigation and report. The committee discussed the matter in its meeting held on 3rd February, 2017. The Secretary Health and Director Medical, Lady Reading Hospital Peshawar, attended the meeting.

4. The Chairman Committee said that Senator Ilyas Ahmed Bilour rendered a great service to humanity by providing funds to the said hospital. He was of the view

that this service should be acknowledged. He stated that many people participate in the social work and donate funds for welfare schemes and projects. At the time of inauguration of such projects and schemes the donors are invited and inaugural plates reflecting their names are affixed there in order to acknowledge their services. In the case under consideration of the committee the donor Senator was not consulted while utilizing the amount provided by him for the purpose other than that for which the same was provided.

5. Senator Ilyas Ahmed Bilour stated that during the last regime, the Government provided development funds to him. He, instead of allocating those funds for construction of drains and pavement of streets, preferred to provide the same to the Lady Reading Hospital for construction of ICU ward. He informed that he provided an amount of Rs. 5 crore out of his development funds for the said purpose. It was brought to his knowledge some days earlier that instead of spending that amount on construction of ICU ward the same was spent on construction of offices in that hospital. He said that he did not provide the funds for offices. The funds were provided for construction of ICU ward so that the patients may get treatment facilities there. The utilization of that amount for construction of offices instead of ICU ward was a breach of his privilege as he was neither consulted nor informed in this regard. He was of the view that he should have been informed about the said change. He informed further that the present Provincial Government of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa is replacing the inaugural plates of various development projects and schemes launched during the tenure of previous Government.

6. The Secretary Health, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, stated that they were thankful to the Senator for providing funds for the hospital. He stated that the project was consisting of two floors. The ICU ward was on the ground floor while the offices of the Doctors and Nurses of that ward were on 1st floor. The ICU ward was constructed as per PC-1 and the offices of the doctors and staffs working in the ward were a part of PC-1 as well as of that ward. He said that the concerned authorities of the hospital



should have consulted the Senator if there was any change in the original plan of that ward.


7. The Medical Director, Lady Reading Hospital Peshawar, stated that the ICU ward has been named as proposed by Senator Ilyas Ahmed Bilour. He informed that the said ward has not been inaugurated and Senator Ilyas Ahmed Bilour will be invited at the time of inauguration. He said that the offices referred to by the Senator were a component and part of ICU. He appreciated the Senator for providing funds for that purpose.

8. Senator Saeed Ghani proposed that Senator Ilyas Ahmed Bilour, the mover of the motion, may visit the hospital to witness the position himself. He also proposed that Senator Ilyas Ahmed Bilour should be invited in the inaugural ceremony of the said ward.


9. Senator Sardar Muhammad Yaqoob Khan Nasar supported the point of view of Senator Saeed Ghani. He also proposed that the inaugural plate reflecting the name of the Senator, who has provided the funds for ICU ward, may be affixed there. He was of the view that the change in the plan of construction of that ward should have been brought to the notice of the Senator.

10. The Chairman Committee said that the committee acknowledges and appreciates Senator Ilyas Ahmed Bilour for providing funds for the noble cause. He proposed that Senator Ilyas Ahmed Bilour should be invited at the inaugural ceremony of that ward.

11. Senator Ilyas Ahmed Biolour was satisfied over the explanation given by the concerned quarters and he did not press the motion. The committee recommended that the House may dispose off the motion accordingly.
