5. The Committee thoroughly discussed the subject matter. The Committee was briefed that the National Commission on the Status of Women was established to protect the rights of women, which is more than half of the total population of the country. It was further updated that the existing law doesn't give time frame to Government to appoint permanent Chairperson of the Commission. Therefore, the effectiveness of the Commission is undermined. The Committee was also updated that the Commission is working without a permanent Chairperson for the last so many months.

6. The Committee was further briefed that the passage of subject amendment would give a clear time frame to the Government to appoint Chairperson, to make the Commission more effective.

7. The Committee, therefore, unanimously recommended that the Senate may pass "The National Commission on the Status of Women (Amendment) Bill, 2107" as passed by the National Assembly

The Bill as passed by the National Assembly is Annexed.

(AS PASSED BY THE NATIONAL ASSEMBLY) A BILL

to amend the National Commission on the Status of Women Act, 2012.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the National Commission on the Status of Women Act, 2012 (VIII of 2012) for the purposes hereinafter appearing;

It is hereby enacted as follows:-

- 1. Short title and commencement.- (1) This Act may be called the National Commission on the Status of Women (Amendment) Act, 2017.
 - (2) It shall come into force at once.
- 2. Amendment of section 4, Act VIII of 2012.- In the National Commission on the Status of Women Act 2012 (VIII of 2012), hereinafter referred to as the said Act, in Section 4, after sub-section (5), the following new sub-section shall be added, namely:-
 - "(6) A vacancy of Chairperson shall be filled in as provided in this Act within thirty days of occurrence of the vacancy.".
- 3. Amendment of section 8, Act VIII of 2012.- In the said Act, in Section 8, the expression "or until the appointment of a new Chairperson, whichever is earlier", shall be omitted.

STATEMENT OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

The National Commission on the Status of Women was established to protect the rights of women, which is more than half of the total population of the country. It is noteworthy that any statutory body can play its due role, if it is given due/sanctioned workforce. The Chairperson of the National Commission on the Status of Women has central place to make sure results oriented performance of the Commission; however, the law does not give a time frame to the Government to appoint permanent Chairperson of the Commission, therefore, the effectiveness of the Commission is undermined. Likewise, the present Commission has been working without a permanent Chairperson for the last many months. Therefore, it is needed that the existing law of Commission should be amended to give a clear time frame to the Government to appoint Chairperson to make the Commission more effective.
