- 4. Senator Karim Ahmad Khawaja briefed the Committee about the salient features of his Bill titled "The Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (Amendment) Bill, 2018. He informed that the law was originally made by the Britishers during 1890. Therefore, there is a need to update the law according to the present requirements and to protect the animals from human brutality. The Committee appreciated the Bill and unanimously recommended to pass the Bill as introduced in the Senate.
- 5. The Committee recommends that the Bill titled "The Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (Amendment) Bill, 2018" as introduced in the Senate may be passed by the House. (Bill as introduced in the Senate is Annexed 'A').

BILL

further to amand the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act, 1890;

WHEREAS it is expedient further to amend the Prevention of Cruelty to Animair Act, 1890 (>1 or 1890), in its application to the Islamabad Capital Femilesy for the purpose hereinafter appearing;

it is hereby enacted as follows:-

- 1. Short title, extent and commencement (1) This Act may be called the Excuention of Crueity to Animals (Amendment) Act, 2018.
 - (2) It shall extend to the Islamabad Capital Territory.
 - (3) It shall come into force at once.
- Amendment of section 3, Act XI of 1890.— In the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act, 1890 (XI of 1890), hereinafter referred to as the said Act, in section 3.—
 - (i) for the words "fifty rupees", the words "one hundred thousand rupees, but shall not be less than ten thousand rupees" shall be substituted; and
 - (ii) for the words "one hundred rupees", the words "two hundred thousand rupees, but shall not be less than twenty five thousand rupees" shall be substituted.
- 3. Amendment of section 3A, Act XI of 1890.— In the said Act, in section 3A,
 - in sub-section (1), for the words "fifty rupees", the words "one hundred thousand rupees, but shall not be less than ten thousand rupees" shall be substituted; and
 - in sub-section (2), for the words "one hundred rupees", the words "two hundred thousand rupees, but shall not be less than twenty five thousand rupees" shall be substituted.
- 4. Amendment of section 4, Act XI of 1890.- In the said Act, in section 4,
 - in sub-section (1), for the words "five hundred rupees", the words "three hundred thousand rupees, but shall not be less than fifty thousand rupees" shall be substituted; and
 - (ii) in provise to sub-section (1), for the words "five hundred rupees", the words "five hundred thousand rupees, but shall not be less than any thousand rupees" shall be substituted.
- S. Amendment of section 5, Act XI of 1890. In the said Act, in section 5, for the words "two hundred rupees", the words "three hundred requising rupees, but shall not be less than fifty thousand rupees" shall be superficted.

- Amendment of section 5A, Act XI of 1890. In the said Act, in section 5A, for the vords "one hundred rupees", the words "two hundred to seed rupees, but shall not be less than twenty five thousand rupees" shall be substituted
- **Mendment of section 6, Act XI of 1890.- In the said Act, in suchor 6, for the words "one hundred rupees", the words "two hundred thousand rupees, but shall not be less than twenty five thousand rupees" shall be substituted.
- Amendment of section 6C, Act XI of 1890.— In the said Act, in section 6C, in paragraph (c), for the words "fifty rupees", the words "three hundred thousand rupees, but shall not be less than fifty thousand rupees" shall be substituted.
- 9 Amendment of section 7, Act XI of 1890.- In the said Act, in section 7,-
 - (i) for the words "one hundred rupees", the words "two hundred thousand rupees, but shall not be less than twenty five thousand rupees" shall be substituted; and
 - (ii) for the words "fifty rupees", the words "one hundred thousand rupees, but shall not be less than ten thousand rupees" shall be substituted.
- Amendment of section 15, Act XI of 1890.— In the said Act, in section 15, in sub-section (3), for the words "fifty rupees", the words "one hundred thousand rupees, but shall not be less than ten thousand rupees" shall be substituted.

STATEMENT OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

Pakistan has a century old law known as the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act, 1890 introduced by the British during their colonial rule to provide contection to the animals from human brutality. This Act was amended thrice by the British but unfortunately after the independence, no substantial reforms have been introduced to update the law according to present requirements and to protect the animals from human brutality. We are still following the same minimal panalities and fine amount imposed under the Prevention of Cruelty to Arimals Act, 1890. Therefore, this Bill strives to ensure stricter punishments for the protection of animals from human brutality.

This Bill intends to increase punishments to achieve aforesaid objectives.
