"The Senate of Pakistan expresses its deep concern over the construction of Baglihar Dam on River Chenab in Jammu and Kashmir by India. The gated structure of this Dam would provide India the capability to manipulate flow of water to Pakistan's disadvantages. One serious consequence would be that it would allow India with the capability to cause acute water shortage in Pakistan. It could deprive Pakistan upto 8000 cusecs of water per day. The Senate of Pakistan therefore urges upon India to suspend its work immediately on this Dam till the Government of Pakistan is satisfied that the construction of this Dam is not against the Indus Water Treaty and the interest of Pakistan."
