- 3. The subject matter of the point of public importance was considered by the Standing Committee in its meeting held on 7th August, 2018. Senator Dr. Jehanzeb Jamaldini, Member / mover of point of public importance stated that fatal accidents have occurred on Quetta-Karachi and Quetta-Taftan roads due to lack of illuminators and backlights of vehicles especially trucks and trollies causing loss of precious lives.
- 4. The Inspector General, National Highways & Motorways Police (NH&MP) informed the Committee that Motorways police is facing shortage of vehicles and staff and it needs around twenty vehicles for patrolling these roads. However he assured the Committee that suitable corrective measures will be taken to check all vehicles especially the commercial vehicles and it will be ensured that no vehicle is running on the roads without back lights.
