
4. Senator Javed Abbasi briefed the committee about the Bill which aimed to remove the bar on those Civil Servants from filing departmental representation who have not been

considered for promotion or denied promotion to next higher grade or scale. The Special Secretary Establishment said that they expressed their point of view on the earlier amendment, if that Amendment is passed by the committee, then the Service Tribunal (Amendment) Bill be passed. After detailed discussion the Committee decided to put the Bill to vote, whereupon the Bill was unanimously passed by the committee as introduced in the House. The committee approved presentation of the Report in the House.

further to amend the Service Tribunals Act, 1973

WHEREAS It is expedient further to amend the Service Tribunals Act, 1973 (LXX of 1973), for the purposes hereinafter appearing;

It is hereby enacted as follows:-

1. Short title and commencement. - (1) This Act shall be called the Service Tribunals (Amendment) Act, 2021.

(2) It shall come into force at once.

2. Amendment of section 4, Act LXX of 1973. - In the Service Tribunals Act, 1973 (LXX of 1973), in section 4, in sub-section (1), in the proviso, in paragraph (b), the words "or to be promoted to a higher grade" shall be omitted.

STATEMENT OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

The amendment is consequential upon a Bill seeking similar amendment in section 22 of the Civil Servants Act, 1973 which aims to remove the bar on those Civil Servants from filing departmental representation who have not been considered for promotion or denied promotion to next higher grade or scale.
