REPORT ON BUDGETARY PROPOSALS RELATING TO PUBLIC SECTOR DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM (PSDP) FOR THE FINANCIAL YEAR 2022-23.

4. During the course of discussions, the Committee deliberated upon the budgetary proposals in detail and sought briefings from senior representatives of the Ministry of Federal Education & Professional Training, and National Heritage and Culture Division on on-going and proposed projects. The summary of the proceedings of the meetings on the subject matter is provided below.

PSDP Proposals of Ministry of Federal Education and Professional Training:

- The Joint Secretary, Ministry of Federal Education and Professional Training, presented detailed briefing on the PSDP Proposals of the Ministry for the financial year 2022-23 amounting to PKR 12.4 billion. The Committee was briefed that a sum of PKR 9.6 billion including foreign aid is required for ongoing projects for the next financial year, whereas, a total of PKR 2.7 billion has been requested for release for new projects.
- 6. The Committee stressed the need for capacity building and training of teachers in private schools who do not provide training to their teachers. He further added that inclusiveness of transgender in the society should be ensured by the government by providing them opportunity of receiving education at schools. The Committee highlighted that government officers who deal with major public policy issues need to be trained for efficient working.
- 7. The Committee endorsed all the budgetary proposals of the Ministry of Federal Education and Professional Training. The Committee additionally recommended establishment of a school for transgender in Islamabad. The Committee also recommended launch of scholarship project for officers of federal government ministries/divisions and autonomous/constitutional bodies for Masters programmes in top-tier foreign universities for their professional development and capacity building. PSDP Proposals of National Heritage and Culture Division:

- 8. The Secretary, National Heritage and Culture Division, presented detailed briefing on the PSDP Proposals of the Division for the financial year 2022-23 amounting to PKR 569 million. The Committee was briefed that a sum of PKR 47 million is required for ongoing projects for the next financial year, whereas, a total of PKR 522.369 million has been requested for release for new projects.
- 9. The Committee noted that people are not aware of thousands of years of ancient civilization and cultural heritage which can be witnessed in museums and historical sites across the country. It opined that federal government should make a meticulous strategy and business plan to not only create awareness of our rich cultural heritage but also attract local and international tourists. It was of the view that accessibility to such sites is very important to ensure that tourists can comfortably and safely travel on roads leading to these sites. It was suggested that university students in faculties like archeology, sociology, history and fine arts can be engaged for devising campaigns to attract tourists.
- 10. The Chairman Committee remarked that spending on historical sites is not usually a priority of governments, however, support from NGOs and INGOs like UNESCO can be sought to minimize financial burden on the government for restoration and renovation of historical and archeological sites. He added that a visible social media presence and producing short documentary for promoting such sites can also be very useful.
- 11. The Committee endorsed all the budgetary proposals related to PSDP of the National Heritage and Culture Division for the financial year 2022-23 except proposal of "Establishment of National-Centre for Performing Arts/National Theater" which was not recommended. The Committee additionally recommended establishment of regional offices of Pakistan Academy of Letters in Peshawar, Quetta, Gilgit-Baltistan and Muzaffarabad (AJK) within the proposed PNCA Centers at the same cities.
