## **RESOLUTION**

**1. Senator Danesh kumar,** expressing solidarity with people of Kashmir on upcoming Kashmir Solidarity Day observed on 5<sup>th</sup> February 2025 moved the following resolution:-  
"Noting that the fifth February is observed, every year, as the "Kashmir Solidarity Day" to express solidarity with the Kashmiri people in their struggle for realization of their right to self-determination, Recalling that the Jammu and Kashmir dispute remains one of the oldest unresolved international disputes on the United Nations Security Council's agenda, Mindful of numerous United Nations Security Council Resolutions on Jammu and Kashmir, which remain unimplemented despite lapse of over seven decades,

### **This House:**

**Reaffirms** Pakistan's unwavering moral, political and diplomatic support for the Kashmiri people's just struggle for realization of their inalienable right to selfdetermination;

**Pays** rich tribute to the valour, courage and sacrifices of the people of Indian Illegally Occupied Jammu and Kashmir (IIOJK);

**Expresses** grave concern over India's continued efforts to consolidate its occupation of IIOJK and to undermine its internationally-recognized disputed status, especially in the aftermath of its illegal and unilateral action of 5 August 2019; **Underscores** that any political process in IIOJK cannot serve a substitute to the exercise of the right to self-determination by the people of Jammu and Kashmir, as enshrined in the relevant UN Security Council Resolutions;

**Condemns** the systematic human rights violations in IIOJK, under draconian laws that defy the norms of justice;

**Rejects** the provocative statement of the Indian political leaders and senior military officers regarding Azad Jammu and Kashmir and Gilgit-Baltistan;

**Emphasizes** that the settlement of the Jammu and Kashmir dispute, in accordance with UN Security Council resolutions and aspirations of the Kashmiri people, is essential for a lasting peace in South Asia;

**Demands** that India must improve the human rights situation in IIOJK; release all Kashmiri political prisoners; and repeal draconian emergency and counterterrorism laws;

This House, therefore, recommends that the Government of Pakistan should:

**Further Demands** that India must implement the relevant Security Council Resolutions so as to enable the Kashmiri people to determine their future through the democratic method of a fair and impartial plebiscite under the UN auspices."

**The Resolution was passed by the House.**
