RESOLUTION

1. Senator Mohsin Aziz, on behalf of **Senators Syed Shibli Faraz, Leader Of The Opposition, Mohsin Aziz, Aon Abbas, Dost Muhammad Khan and Falak Naz**, moved the following resolution:-

"WHEREAS the alarming increase in the use of drugs among students in schools and colleges poses a serious threat to the physical and mental well-being of our youth;

WHEREAS the youth represent the future of our nation and the growing trend of drug use is pushing them towards moral and social destruction;

The Senate of Pakistan, therefore, recommends, that the Government should take immediate and concrete steps to curb the spread of drugs in educational institutions;

The Senate of Pakistan also urges upon the Government to coordinate with the Provincial Governments and make a comprehensive national strategy to eliminate usage of drugs from academic institutions".

The Resolution was passed unanimously by the House.

BILL AS INTRODUCED

1. Dr. Tariq Fazal Chaudhary, Minister for Parliamentary Affairs, on behalf of **Dr. Khalid Maqbool Siddiqui**, Minister for Federal Education and Professional Training, to introduce a Bill to establish the King Hamad University of Nursing and Associated Medical Sciences [The King Hamad University of Nursing and Associated Medical Sciences Bill, 2025].

The Motion was put to the House and leave to introduce the bill was granted. The Bill introduced and referred to Standing Committee concerned.
