**RESOLUTIONS**

**29. SENATOR KAMIL ALI AGHA**, to move the following resolution:-

“Cognizant of the religious importance of Arabic for the Muslims, and that the teaching of Arabic language to the students will not only improve their understanding of the Holy Quran and the Hadith of the Holy Prophet (PBUH) but also increase employment and business opportunities in future;

The Senate of Pakistan, therefore, recommends that the Government should take measures for teaching Arabic as a compulsory subject (Language from grades 1 to 5 and grammar from grades 6 to 12) in all public and private educational institutions affiliated with the Federal Board of Intermediate and Secondary Education, Islamabad.”

**30. SENATOR DR. AFNAN ULLAH KHAN**, to move the following resolution:-

“The Senate of Pakistan, expresses grave alarm at the escalating humanitarian crisis in Gaza, where the Israeli occupying forces’ siege, bombardment, and targeting of civilians have led to mass displacement, man-made famine, and what the UN Independent International Commission of Inquiry has concluded as genocide;

It is, therefore, resolved that this House:

Condemns in the strongest terms continued siege by the Israeli occupying forces, bombardment, murder, mass displacement, terrorism, and all genocidal actions against the Palestinian people, in blatant violation of international law, human rights and basic humanity;

Acknowledges the emergence of the Global Sumud Flotilla, the largest civilian-led humanitarian initiative in history, in which delegations from more than 44 countries are sailing peacefully with the aim of breaking the illegal blockade of Gaza and delivering life-saving aid;

Affirms with pride that delegation of Pakistan citizens led by former Senator Mushtaq Ahmad Khan on board the vessels represent collective moral support of Pakistan nationals in this historic mission and that their courage and commitment reflect the will of the people of Pakistan;

Expresses full solidarity with the Flotilla participants and the people of Palestine, and calls for their safe passage, protection, and unhindered delivery of aid;

Calls upon the international community to take urgent and concrete measures for the safety and protection of all those participating in the Global Sumud Flotilla, ensure safe passage to Gaza along with all humanitarian aid and to assist and ensure the safe and protected return of all peaceful activists from Gaza or international waters or any other foreign land without harm;

Acknowledges Government of Pakistan's resolute and unwavering commitment to the Palestinian cause as demonstrated by Pakistan's consistent and unwavering support for the Palestinian people at all relevant international forums, especially the United Nations Security Council, the OIC, as well as the International Court of Justice (ICJ);

Urges the Government of Pakistan, in collaboration with the 15 signatory States and other like-minded nations, to immediately dispatch rescue and relief missions to accompany the Flotilla, as practical demonstration of commitment to the safety and security of the humanitarian mission; and raise the issue at all relevant international forums including the UN, OIC, and ICJ, and uphold its principled stance on Palestine;

Reiterates Pakistan's unyielding commitment to the right of Palestinian people to self-determination, their freedom, dignity, land, existence with all human rights and the urgent necessity of ending the illegal blockade and systematic violence against Palestine, as well as an immediate, permanent, and unconditional ceasefire; full civilian protection; unrestricted humanitarian access; and accountability of the occupying power for its grave violations; and

Reaffirms its unwavering support to the establishment of an independent, sovereign, viable and contiguous State of Palestine, on the basis of pre-June 1967 border, with Al Quds Al Sharif as its capital."

**31. SENATOR MUHAMMAD TALHA MAHMOOD,** to move the following resolution:-

“The Senate of Pakistan recommends that the Government should provide adequate relief packages and compensation to the families affected by floods, 2025 in the country.”
