### **BILLS TO BE INTRODUCED**

**1. Senator Nadeem Ahmed Bhutto**, moved for leave to introduce a Bill to provide for the establishment of the City University Islamabad [The City University Islamabad Bill, 2026].

**The Motion was put to the House and leave to introduce the bill was granted. The Bill introduced and referred to Standing Committee concerned.**

**2. Senator Anusha Rahman Ahmad Khan**, to move for leave to introduce a Bill further to amend the Securities and Exchange Commission of Pakistan Act, 1997 [The Securities and Exchange Commission of Pakistan (Amendment) Bill, 2026].

**The Motion was put to the House and leave to introduce the bill was granted. The Bill introduced and referred to Standing Committee concerned.**

### **BILLS AS REPORTED BY THE STANDING COMMITTEES**

**1. Senator Sherry Rehman**, moved that the Bill to prohibit the use of plastic covers on books sold in the Islamabad Capital Territory [The Islamabad Capital Territory (Prohibition of Plastic Book Covers) Bill, 2025], as reported by the Standing Committee, be taken into consideration at once.

**The Motion was put to the House. Thereafter, the House started second reading of the Bill i.e. clause by clause consideration.**

**2. Senator Sherry Rehman**, moved that the Bill to prohibit the use of plastic covers on books sold in the Islamabad Capital Territory [The Islamabad Capital Territory (Prohibition of Plastic Book Covers) Bill, 2025], be passed.

**The Motion was put to the House and the Bill was passed.**

**3. Senator Samina Mumtaz Zehri**, to moved that the Bill further to amend the Pakistan Penal Code, 1860 and the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1898 [The Criminal Laws (Amendment) Bill, 2023] (**Insertion of new section 376B in PPC and subsequent amendment in Schedule-II of Cr.PC**), as reported by the Standing Committee, be taken into consideration at once.

**The Motion was put to the House. Thereafter, the House started second reading of the Bill i.e. clause by clause consideration.**

**4. Senator Samina Mumtaz Zehri**, to moved that the Bill further to amend the Pakistan Penal Code, 1860 and the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1898 [The Criminal Laws (Amendment) Bill, 2023], be passed.

**The Motion was put to the House and the Bill was passed.**

**5. Senator Samina Mumtaz Zehri**, moved that the Bill further to amend the Prevention of Trafficking in Persons Act, 2018 [The Prevention of Trafficking in Persons (Amendment) Bill, 2024], as reported by the Standing Committee, be taken into consideration at once.

**The Motion was put to the House. Thereafter, the House started second reading of the Bill i.e. clause by clause consideration.**

**6. Senator Samina Mumtaz Zehri**, moved that the Bill further to amend the Prevention of Trafficking in Persons Act, 2018 [The Prevention of Trafficking in Persons (Amendment) Bill, 2024], be passed.

**The Motion was put to the House and the Bill was passed.**

**7. Senator Samina Mumtaz Zehri**, moved that the Bill further to amend the Prevention of Electronic Crimes Act, 2016 [The Prevention of Electronic Crimes (Amendment) Bill, 2024], as reported by the Standing Committee, be taken into consideration at once.

**The Motion was put to the House. Thereafter, the House started second reading of the Bill i.e. clause by clause consideration.**

**8. Senator Samina Mumtaz Zehri**, moved that the Bill further to amend the Prevention of Electronic Crimes Act, 2016 [The Prevention of Electronic Crimes (Amendment) Bill, 2024], be passed.

**The Motion was put to the House and the Bill was passed.**

**9. Senator Samina Mumtaz Zehri**, move that the Bill further to amend the Pakistan Penal Code, 1860 [The Pakistan Penal Code (Amendment) Bill, 2024], **(Amendment of section 377 of PPC)**, as reported by the Standing Committee, be taken into consideration at once.

**The Motion was put to the House. Thereafter, the House started second reading of the Bill i.e. clause by clause consideration.**

**10. Senator Samina Mumtaz Zehri**, moved that the Bill further to amend the Pakistan Penal Code, 1860 [The Pakistan Penal Code (Amendment) Bill, 2024], be passed.

**The Motion was put to the House and the Bill was passed.**

## **RESOLUTIONS**

**1. Senator Dr. Zarqa Suharwardy Taimur**, to move the following resolution:-

“Resolution on Protection of Rooftop Solar Prosumers and Alignment of NEPRA's Draft "Prosumer Regulations, 2025" with National Policy. This House, Recognizing that Pakistan's energy security, economic stability, and climate obligations require accelerated deployment of indigenous and renewable energy, including distributed generation by households and small enterprises;

Recalling that the Alternative & Renewable Energy Policy, 2019, the National Electricity Policy, and Pakistan's Nationally Determined Contributions envisage a growing role for citizen participation in clean energy; Noting with grave concern that the draft NEPRA (Prosumer) Regulations, 2025:

Permit retrospective alteration of existing net-metering licenses;

Reduce rooftop export compensation by approximately 70% without transparent, evidence-based valuation; Render small-scale solar economically unviable; and Concentrate discretionary powers in licensees without adequate safeguards; Further noting that rooftop prosumers export approximately 80 MW out of 45,000 MW of national capacity—less than 0.002%—and are not responsible for capacity payments, which arise primarily from long-term IPP contracts; affirms that:

Retrospective regulatory change undermines legal certainty and investor confidence; Citizen investment in clean energy is a public good and must be protected; Distributed renewable energy must be integrated, not penalized, within Pakistan's power system; Resolves that the Government of Pakistan shall. Direct NEPRA to withdraw the draft regulations in their present form; Incorporate an explicit non-retroactivity clause protecting existing and pending licenses for their full term; Ensure any transition includes a minimum 24-month grace period; Require a published, independent Value-of-Solar study before finalizing export tariffs; and Align the regulatory framework with national energy and climate policy. This House calls upon the Government to ensure that Pakistan's energy transition remains equitable, evidence-based, and citizen inclusive."

**The Resolution was Rejected.**
