RESOLUTIONS

62. SENATOR SAMINA MUMTAZ ZEHRI, to move the following resolution:-

Cognizant of the fact that Islam is a religion of peace, justice, dignity, compassion, equality before law, protection of life, protection of women, children, minorities and vulnerable persons, and that the mosque and madaris system holds a central and respected position in the moral and social guidance of society.

Noting with concern that many serious social issues in Pakistan, including honour killings, forced marriages, denial of women's inheritance, domestic violence, child abuse, child marriage, hate speech, mob violence, misuse of religion, sectarian intolerance, discrimination against minorities and violence against vulnerable communities, are often rooted not in religion, but in ignorance, harmful customs, lack of legal awareness and wrongful interpretation of social practices.

This House is of the considered opinion that Imams, Khateebis, religious teachers and madaris leadership can play a highly positive and effective role in promoting human dignity, peace, tolerance, constitutional rights and social justice through Friday sermons, religious teaching and community guidance.

This House, therefore, recommends that the Federal Government, in consultation with the relevant ministries and departments of Provincial Governments may develop a structured, non-political and non-sectarian training programme for Imams, Khateebis and madaris teachers on human rights in Islam and constitutional rights of citizens including model sermon guidelines to be prepared in simple Urdu and regional languages to assist Imams and Khateebis in delivering Friday sermons on social justice, compassion, protection of vulnerable persons, family responsibility, tolerance and respect for law, without interfering in religious freedom or the independent role of religious scholars.

63. SENATOR MUHAMMAD TALHA MAHMOOD, to move the following resolution:-

Cognizant of the socio-economic plight of the affected households of Dasu Hydropower Project in Upper Kohistan Khyber Pakhtunkhwa;

The House recommends that under the Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) of the Project, the Government should launch various socio-economic uplift programs for the welfare of affectees and other people living in surroundings of Dasu Hydropower Project, Upper Kohistan.

64. SENATOR DR. ZARQA SUHARWARDY TAIMUR, to move the following resolution:-

WHEREAS, Shaheed Group Captain Asim Tariq of the Pakistan Air Force displayed exceptional courage, selflessness and devotion to the highest values of humanity by intervening to protect a young woman who was allegedly being harassed and assaulted on a public road in Islamabad;

AND WHEREAS, despite being unarmed and under no legal obligation to intervene, he chose to place his own life at risk in defence of another citizen, ultimately embracing martyrdom in the line of moral duty;

AND WHEREAS, his courageous action exemplifies the finest traditions of the Pakistan Air Force and reflects the values of bravery, honour, compassion, public service and respect for the dignity and safety of women;

AND WHEREAS, such acts of extraordinary courage deserve the highest recognition of the State and serve as an inspiration for present and future generations of Pakistanis;

NOW, THEREFORE, THIS HOUSE RESOLVES THAT:

1. The Senate of Pakistan pays its highest tribute to Shaheed Group Captain Asim Tariq for his supreme sacrifice and outstanding act of courage.
2. The Senate expresses its profound condolences and solidarity with the bereaved family of the Shaheed and with the Pakistan Air Force.
3. The Senate declares Shaheed Group Captain Asim Tariq a symbol of national courage, civic responsibility and moral leadership, whose sacrifice shall remain an enduring example for the nation.
4. The Senate urges the Federal Government to ensure the swift investigation, prosecution and exemplary punishment, in accordance with law, of all those responsible for this heinous crime.
5. The Senate further reaffirms its unwavering commitment to ensuring the safety, dignity and security of women in public spaces and calls upon all State institutions to strengthen measures for the prevention of harassment and violent crime.

Resolved further that copy of this Resolution be transmitted to the family of Shaheed Group Captain Asim Tariq.
