The Senate of Pakistan met in the Senate Hall (Parliament House) Islamabad at thirty eight minutes past ten in the morning with Mr. Presiding Officer (Senator Saleem Mandviwalla) in the Chair.

جناب پریذائیڈنٹ آفیسر: بسم اللہ الرحمن الرحیم۔ جی مسرور صاحب۔

Points of Public Importance raised by Senator Syed Masroor Ahsan regarding (i) Strike being observed by the students and staff of the Federal Urdu University, Karachi and (ii) The ban on the Students' Unions in the Universities

سینیٹر سید مسرور احسن: جناب چیئرمین! گزشتہ چند مہینوں سے کراچی میں وفاقی اردو یونیورسٹی میں طلباء اور teaching staff اور non-teaching staff ہڑتال پر ہیں اور روزانہ strike ہو رہی ہے۔ ان کا مسئلہ یہ ہے کہ ان کی salaries اور salaries میں جو اضافہ کیا گیا ہے، وہ انہیں نہیں مل رہا۔ وائس چانسلر صاحب یہ چاہتے ہیں کہ ان کا جو house rent ہے جو کہ انہیں نہیں ملتا، اس کو بالکل ختم کر دیا جائے۔ میری آپ سے گزارش ہے کہ اس مسئلے کو دیکھیں کیونکہ سارے پاکستان میں، میں یہ محسوس کرتا ہوں کہ جگہ جگہ طلباء کے اور اساتذہ کے کہیں نہ کہیں کوئی معاملات ابھر رہے ہیں جیسے ابھی گزشتہ دنوں پنجاب یونیورسٹی میں واقعہ ہوا۔ کراچی یونیورسٹی میں لوگ ہڑتال پر ہیں تو اس سارے مسئلے کو دیکھتے ہوئے طلباء یونینز پر بھی پابندی ختم کی جائے اور طلباء یونینز کے انتخابات آزادی سے کروانے چاہئیں۔ طلباء یونینز پر پابندی ضیاء الحق دور کی ایک بدترین مثال ہے۔ اس پابندی کو ختم کرنے کے لیے تمام صوبائی حکومتیں اور وفاقی حکومت تقریباً تیار ہیں۔ اگر ایسا ہو جاتا تو بہتر ہوتا کیونکہ نئی generation وہیں سے آتی ہے اور نئے سیاسی کارکن وہیں سے پیدا ہوتے ہیں۔

میری گزارش ہے کہ ان سارے معاملات کو دیکھا جائے۔ نہیں تو ان معاملات کو، وفاقی اردو یونیورسٹی کے مسئلے کو اور طلباء یونینز پر جو پابندی ہے اور ان کے الیکشن نہیں ہو رہے، کمیٹی کے سپرد کر دیا جائے۔ شکریہ۔

جناب پریذائیڈنٹ آفیسر: مسرور صاحب! اس میں مسئلہ یہ ہے کہ یہ ایک provincial subject ہے۔ ہم کمیٹی کو تو refer کر دیتے ہیں مگر یہ صوبائی معاملہ ہے۔ یہ حکومت سندھ کو وہاں take up کرنا پڑے گا but anyway ہم اس کو کمیٹی کی طرف refer کر دیتے ہیں۔ جی تارڑ صاحب۔

Senator Azam Nazeer Tarar, Federal Minister for Law

سینیٹر اعظم نذیر تارڑ (وفاقی وزیر قانون): جناب! فیڈرل اردو یونیورسٹی کی حد تک کمیٹی کو

بھیجنے سے پہلے، چونکہ وزیر موصوف بھی کراچی سے ہی ہیں، آج وہ موجود نہیں ہیں، انہوں نے مجھے خصوصی طور پر request کی تھی کیونکہ ان کے کچھ سوالات بھی ہیں، ان کی جگہ پر میں ہی جواب دوں گا۔ جیسا کہ مسرور صاحب نے بات کی ہے، یہ معاملہ وزیر موصوف تک پہنچانا ہوں کہ فیڈرل اردو یونیورسٹی میں جو تنخواہوں اور allowances کا معاملہ ہے، اس پر توجہ دیں۔ اصل میں سب یونیورسٹیوں کو یہ challenges درپیش ہیں۔ Unfortunately باقی ملک کے اداروں کی طرح universities میں بھی over-staffing ہے۔ وقت کے ساتھ ساتھ کوئی وائس چانسلر ایسے آئے جنہوں نے بھرتی کر دیے اور پھر جب universities پر pensions کا بوجھ بڑھا تو financial space بہت زیادہ سکڑ گئی۔

میں اردو یونیورسٹی کے حوالے سے وفاقی وزیر تعلیم تک مسرور صاحب کی معروضات آج پہنچا دیتا ہوں۔ رہی بات student unions پر پابندی اٹھانے کی، وہ صحیح فرماتے ہیں کہ یہ کام ضیاء دور میں ہوا اور اس کے بعد مختلف ادوار میں مختلف حکومتیں آئیں لیکن unfortunately, barring one elections جو کہ شہید محترمہ بے نظیر بھٹو صاحبہ کے دور میں، میرے خیال میں 1988-89 میں ہوئے تھے، یہ معاملہ پھر رک گیا تھا۔ یہ بھی صوبائی معاملہ ہے کیونکہ devolved subject ہے۔ صوبوں میں کون سا صوبہ چاہتا ہے، کون سا صوبہ نہیں چاہتا، یہ ایک اچھا اور well thought of decision ہونا چاہیے۔ اس میں uniformity بھی ہونی چاہیے، لہذا، یہ صوبوں کے لیے ضرور ہے۔ آپ نے آج highlight کیا، I am sure کہ یہ معاملہ صوبائی حکومتوں تک پہنچے گا لیکن فیڈرل اردو یونیورسٹی کی حد تک، Federal Education Department سے اسٹاف بھی بیٹھا ہے، جوائنٹ سیکرٹری اس وقت گیلری میں موجود ہیں، ان کے نوٹس میں آگیا ہے، میں خود بھی وزیر صاحب سے بات کروں گا۔

*Question No. 13 **Senator Shahadat Awan:** *Will the Minister for Federal Education and Professional Training be pleased to state:*

- (a) *the number of scholarships offered to Pakistani students under the Bilateral Exchange Scholarships Programme during the last three years; and*
- (b) *the number of students sent abroad on those scholarships with province wise break up indicating also the name of country, stipend and other facilities offered in each case?*

Dr. Khalid Maqbool Siddiqui: (a) Under the Bilateral Exchange Scholarships Program (Stipendium Hungaricum), 367 Pakistani students have been offered scholarships during the last three (03) years. The Year wise break up is as under.:

Mr. Presiding Officer: Any supplementary?

سینئر شہادت اعوان: جناب! میں نے اس سوال میں Federal Education and Professional Training سے یہ پوچھا تھا کہ bilateral exchange scholarship programme کے تحت جتنے ہمارے لوگ تین سالوں میں گئے ہیں، اس کی detail بتائیں۔ جو وزیر موصوف نے بتائی ہے، وہ خالی ہنگری سے متعلق ہے کہ وہاں کتنے لوگ گئے ہیں۔ مجھے جہاں تک یاد پڑتا ہے، وزیر موصوف جانتے ہوں گے کہ 2015 میں جس وقت Education, Science and Technology working group کے تحت Prime Minister, Pakistan and President, US کے درمیان ایک معاہدہ ہوا تھا کہ دس سالوں میں US کے لیے دس ہزار scholarship پاکستان کو دی جائیں۔ اس پروگرام کو سال 2025 تک چلانا تھا۔ پی۔ ایچ۔ ڈی کے لیے سال 2017 میں اسے دوبارہ revise کیا گیا کہ پی۔ ایچ۔ ڈی کے لیے ایک ہزار scholarships صرف امریکہ کے لیے ہوں گی۔ اس کے برعکس یہاں پر جو data دیا گیا

ہے، اس میں نہ تو چین کے scholarships کا ذکر ہے، نہ بنگلہ دیش کی scholarships کا ذکر ہے، نہ ترکیہ کا ذکر ہے تو اس کا مطلب ہے کہ تین سال کے اندر ٹوٹل 130، 114 اور 123 کا بتایا گیا ہے۔

حیرت کی بات یہ ہے کہ خیبر پختونخوا میں فاٹا کا merger بھی ہو گیا ہے لیکن لگتا ہے کہ یہاں کوئی پرانا data دے دیا گیا ہے کیونکہ اس میں فاٹا کا الگ سے ذکر کیا گیا ہے۔ ان scholarships میں جو backward areas تھے، تھر پار کر کے لیے ایک اسکیم بنائی گئی تھی کہ اس کا حصہ الگ سے ہوگا۔ تھر پار کرنا ہم نے mention کرنا تھا، اس کا ذکر یہاں پر نہیں کیا گیا even scheduled castes کو الگ سے mention کرنا تھا، وہ نہیں کیا گیا۔ میری request ہوگی کہ یہ بڑی اہم چیز ہے اور اس کو properly handle نہیں کیا گیا، اس کو کمیٹی میں بھیجیں تاکہ اس کو thoroughly دیکھا جاسکے۔

Mr. Presiding Officer: Minister sahib, you would agree that this question has not been answered properly. سینیٹر اعظم نذیر تارڑ: میں نے بھی ان سے پوچھا ہے، انہوں نے کہا ہے کہ اس وقت جو offer ہو رہا ہے، وہ ہنگری کا ہے۔ انہوں نے اسی کی ساری detail دی ہے۔ وہ کہتے ہیں کہ ہم چاروں جو صوبائی اکائیاں ہیں اور Islamabad Capital Territory کا جو population base ہے، اس کے مطابق allocate کر کے اور short list کر کے وہ numbers بھیجتے ہیں۔ اس کے بعد Hungary کی ایک اپنی body ہے جو کہ online viva لیتے ہیں۔ اس میں کئی مرتبہ تناسب تھوڑا خراب ہو جاتا ہے لیکن ہم یہ کوشش کرتے ہیں کہ ساری جگہوں پر، چاروں صوبوں اور ICT میں یہ برابر تقسیم ہو۔ اگر شہادت صاحب سمجھتے ہیں کہ جو factors انہوں نے بیان کیے ہیں، وہ میرے نوٹس میں نہیں ہیں، آج وزیر موصوف چونکہ خود موجود نہیں ہیں، یہ معاملہ کمیٹی کو refer کر دیا جائے تاکہ وہاں پر یہ آرام سے discuss ہو جائے۔

Mr. Presiding Officer: OK, the question is referred to the Committee. Do you want to ask a supplementary? Yes, please.

سینیٹر کامران مرتضیٰ: جی جناب۔ اس میں دو تین چیزیں سمجھ میں نہیں آئیں۔ ایک تو بڑا limited سا جواب آیا ہے، وہ آپ کہہ رہے ہیں کہ کمیٹی کو refer کرتے ہیں مگر اس کی جو publication ہوتی ہے، ہوتا یہ ہے کہ ہم دور بیٹھے ہوئے لوگ ہیں، tail end پر ہیں۔ اس کی publication اس طرح سے ہوتی ہے کہ وہاں تک اطلاع نہیں پہنچتی۔ اس کی publication and actual date کے درمیان ایک مناسب وقفہ ہونا چاہیے۔ دوسری بات یہ کہ سوال کے جواب میں بتایا گیا ہے کہ بلوچستان سے کچھ لوگوں کو scholarships دیے گئے ہیں۔ کیا ان کی domicile verification کا بھی کوئی نظام ہے یا ایسا ہے کہ بس ایک computerized domicile کاغذ دے کر اس پر آگے معاملات چل جائیں۔ وہاں پر یہ عام شکایت ہے کہ ہمارے لوگوں تک scholarships کے فائدے نہیں پہنچتے۔ اس حوالے سے specially یہ ہونا چاہیے کہ متعلقہ deputy commissioner سے domicile verification ہونی چاہیے تاکہ پتا چلے کہ وہاں جو actual لوگ رہتے ہیں، ان تک یہ فائدہ پہنچا ہے یا نہیں۔ بھلے اس کا بعد میں جواب بھی آجائے لیکن اس معاملہ کے ساتھ اسے کمیٹی میں بھیج دیں، شکریہ۔

Mr. Presiding Officer: Yes, Minister for Parliamentary Affairs.

سینیٹر اعظم نذیر تارڑ: جناب! یہ کمیٹی میں جا رہا ہے لیکن آنے سے پہلے میں نے سارے طریقہ کار کا پوچھا تھا۔ انہوں نے پھر مجھے بتایا کہ ظاہر ہے کہ جب صوبوں میں یہ scholarships تقسیم ہوتے ہیں تو domicile, national identity card and last degree from the university اس میں شامل ہیں لیکن پھر بھی میرے خیال میں یہ کمیٹی میں at length discuss ہو جائے گا۔

- (a) the criteria laid down by the Government for the grant/issuance of NOC for construction of an interchange on the motorways by a private housing society;
- (b) whether it is a fact that Capital Smart City Islamabad, has been awarded NOC for construction of interchange on M-2 motorway, if so, the details and reasons thereof; and
- (c) whether the said facility is available to other private housing societies under similar conditions, if so, the details thereof, if not, the reasons thereof?

Mr. Abdul Aleem Khan: (a) Procedure for grant of NOC for construction of interchange on Motorways by a housing society at its own cost is as follows:

1. **Eligibility Criteria:**

- i. Minimum distance criteria of the proposed interchange must be 10 KMs from the existing interchange.
- ii. Ownership of atleast 4000 Kanals Land.

2. **Conditions for Provisional Approval:**

- i. Mandatory NOCs from relevant Departments/ Ministries.
- ii. Approved Detailed development & Service Plan.
- iii. Certificate of infrastructure completion upto 40%.
- iv. Deposit of one-time processing Fee of 05 million and 25% of the total NOC fee (i.e. 60 million for 4000 Kanals)
- v. Submission of Traffic Impact Study/ Geometric Study/ Highway Safety Audit Report & Road Safety Certificate.

After fulfilling the above conditions, provisional approval is granted by Chairman NHA.

3. **Conditions for Formal Approval:**

- i. Completion of 75% infrastructure development.
- ii. Mutation of adequate land in favour of NHA, without any cost to NHA which will remain the property of NHA.
- iii. Total cost of construction of interchange (as deposit work) alongwith all other NHA's applicable fee are to be completely borne by the applicant. NHA does not bear any such costs. Instead, it generates the revenue through Tolling.

On fulfilment of these conditions, NHA will issue NOC to the applicant after Formal Approval by Executive Board

“Regulations for Access from NHA Controlled Network-2019 as amended in 2023, pursuant to the decision of NHC 41st Meeting held on 29th March, 2023” governing the criteria for issuance of an NOC for construction of an interchange is **Annexed at “A”.**

Formal approval for construction of interchange at KM 332-333, M-2 to Future Development Holding Pvt. Ltd. (FDHL) **(for which the applicant has to bear the cost of construction)** for its housing project named as Capital Smart City under Regulation for Access from NHA Controlled Network-2019 was granted by NHA Executive Board in its 381st Meeting held on 04.02.2022.

The National Highway Council (NHC) in its 41st Meeting held on March 29th, 2023 approved the amendments in Regulations for Access from NHA Controlled Network-2019 which will be named as subject quoted above. The same are circulated for information, dissemination, and implementation by all concerned, please.

Regulations for Access from NHA Controlled Network-2019 as amended in 2023, pursuant to the decision of NHC 41st Meeting held on 29th March 2023

1.1. Background.

- a. NHA Network consists of:
- i. Controlled Access i.e. Motorways/ Expressways /Link Roads: Interchanges are constructed for approach to/from controlled access network. These Interchanges are constructed through PSDP/project cost. Link roads also make part of controlled access.
- ii. Non-controlled Access Roads and Highways/ Strategic Roads: Access from highways is made through ramps/acceleration/deceleration lanes or through service roads as approaches. NHA issues NOC for approach to National Highway Network through its RoW and charges NOC fee as well as approach rentals.
- b. NHA has been receiving request from private sector, particularly housing societies for access to NHA controlled network through construction of interchange at their own expenses.
- c. Although a policy for housing societies already existed, but need for making it more comprehensive and futuristic was felt, as approved by NHEB in its 314th meeting held on January 10, 2019 instead of keeping it sector specific.
- d. Hence inclusion of following sectors in the new regulations on the subject, as granting such permissions carries huge revenue potential.
 - i. Housing Societies
 - ii. Medical Cities
 - iii. Education Cities
 - iv. Industrial / Commercial Hubs
 - v. Factory Outlets
 - vi. Theme Parks
- e. Hence certain amendments were proposed in Policy for Access to NHA Controlled Network by Housing Societies earlier approved by NHA Executive Board in its 240th meeting held on November 12, 2014.
- f. These amendments were presented before NHA Executive Board in its 314th meeting held on January 10, 2019. NHEB approved Regulations for Access to NHA Controlled Network.
- g. Thereafter, same is presented before NHC in its 33rd meeting held on February 25, 2019 for consideration. NHC also approved these Regulations.
- h. However, due to urbanization and their effect to the general public residing along the Link Road, the National Highway Council in its 37th Meeting held on 30th June, 2022 has directed NHA "to bifurcate Motorways and their link roads in 'Regulations for Access from NHA Controlled Network' and submit a concrete proposal in the next meeting".

- i. Accordingly, the NHA Executive Board in its 402nd meeting held on July 22, 2022 review the Regulations for Access from NHA Controlled Network-2019 and forwarded their recommendations for consideration of NHC.
- j. NHC in its 38th Meeting held on 1st August 2022, deferred the recommendations of NHEB and directed Member (Finance) NHA to seek input from CDA, LDA, PDA etc. for submission in next meeting alongwith provision of details of all Link Roads on motorways.
- k. In compliance of the above directions, requisite details were presented before the NHC in its 41st meeting held on 29.03.2023. After deliberations, the NHC considered the recommendations and approved the Regulations for Access from NHA Controlled Network-2019 as amended in 2023.

[Sub-Clauses-h to k are inserted pursuant to the approval of NHC in its 41st meeting held on 29th March 2023]

1.2. Preamble.

- a. Should there emerge a requirement of an interchange on motorways/expressways/link roads required by a Housing Society, Medical City, Education City, Industrial/Commercial Hub, Factory Outlet, Theme Park or any such like enterprise for access. NHA shall follow the Regulations.
- b. "Provided except for requirement of Government of Pakistan for national interest, NHA shall not allow interchange for access to (or) from Motorway/expressway * within 10 KMs of an existing interchange on the Motorway/expressway*.

"Sub-Clause-b is amended by deleting "Link Road" for implementation of 10-KM distance criteria from existing interchanges, as approved by NHC in its 41st meeting held on 29th March 2023]

- c. "Construction of interchange on a Link Road (as defined in Clause 1.7 as Schedule-II) of at any location shall be allowed, subject to fulfillment of requirements as per these Regulations and a detailed feasibility study to be conducted by NHA through M/s NESPAK at the expense of applicant."

[Sub Clause-c is inserted as per approval of NHC in its 41st meeting held on 29th March 2023]

1.3. Conditions for Provisional Acceptance.


- a. An Entity i.e. Housing Society, Medical City, Education City, Industrial/Commercial Hub, Factory Outlets, Theme Park and other (to be determined by NHA Executive Board) will submit formal request in writing.
- b. An Entity shall have ownership/mutation in its own name, having a minimum area as per Schedule-I.
- c. An Entity shall submit the following along with request:
 - i. Detailed development plan approved by the relevant authority.
 - ii. Detailed services plan approved by the relevant authority.
 - iii. Mandatory NOCs from relevant Departments/ Ministries.
 - iv. Specified time limit for completion of the project.

(1 \ 2)

- v. Certificate of infrastructure completion upto 40% certified by the relevant Government Department which approved the development plan.
- vi. One time processing fee (non-refundable) of Rs.5 million with the request.
- vii. 25% of the total NOC Fee as described in Schedule-I.
- d. NHA shall scrutinize the request to confirm that there is no conflict for strategic reasons, road safety and smooth flow of traffic or any other sensitivities.
- e. Traffic impact study carried out on the expense of the applicant by an engineering consultant shall be submitted for approval by NHA.
- f. Geometric study/highway safety audit report prepared on the expense of the applicant by an engineering consultant shall be submitted for approval by NHA.
- g. Interchange and affiliated works shall be designed, estimated and constructed by NHA as deposit works.
- h. In case of change of title/ownership, fresh NOC shall be obtained from NHA.
- i. In case of addition of land/expansion, fresh NOC shall be obtained from NHA.
- j. On fulfilment of these conditions, NHA ROW Section will issue them letter of Provisional Acceptance after approval from Chairman NHA.
- k. This Provisional Acceptance shall be valid for a period of two years from the date of issuance. The same shall stand revoked on expiry of validity period.
- l. The 25% NOC fee deposited at the time of submission of application shall be refunded, in case Clause (k) is invoked.
- m. Provisional Acceptance shall not be used for advertisement/promotional purposes by any means including electronic, print and social media until grant of Formal Approval.
- n. The 25% NOC fee shall be forfeited in case Clause (m) is violated/not adhered to.
- o. Road safety certificate will be requested from NH&MP duly approved by IG (NH&MP) before provisional acceptance.

1.4. Conditions for Formal Approval.

- a. The Entity shall apply for formal approval on completion of 75% of infrastructure development.
- b. Applicant will provide undertaking on judicial paper regarding completion of infrastructure development up to 75%, certified by relevant Government department which approved the development plan.
- c. Adequate land, free of all encumbrances, will be mutated, for construction of interchange outside the fence / ROW including loop land, in the name of NHA without any cost to NHA.
- d. The land shall remain the property of NHA and shall not be given back, in case of demolition / removal etc. of the structure in future. Hence, new ROW will be defined.



- e. To Facilitate the staff of NHMP, staff facilitation center (comprising of two rooms) on all new interchanges at the expense of the applicant will be established.
[Sub Clause-e is inserted as per approval of NHC in its 41st meeting held on 29th March 2023]
- f. On fulfilment of these conditions, NHA will issue NOC to the applicant after Formal Approval by Executive Board.

1.5. Operation and Management.

- a. NHA shall own, operate or cause to operate the toll plazas.
- b. 100% toll shall be retained by NHA as a matter of right.
- c. Toll exemption shall be applicable to vehicle as per rules and regulations of NHA.
- d. If toll collection is not equal to cost of operations and maintenance, the applicant shall pay the deficit of toll collection on monthly basis till the time when such expenses and toll collection eventually becomes equal.
- e. The level of service and maintenance requirements shall be pre-agreed and become the part of agreement as determined by NHA.
- f. NHA shall reserve the right to close the interchange for reasons attributable to either the State requirements and in case of defaults or termination of contract following prescribed procedures.
- g. The applicant shall not do any other business or activity except the specific business or activity as shall be approved by NHA and covered under the laws of Pakistan.
- h. All the prevalent laws of the land, including NHSO-2000, applicable on Motorways/ Expressways/Link Roads shall be applicable to the so constructed interchanges.
- i. No hoarding/advertisement shall be permissible except directional/traffic signs approved by NHA. These signs shall also be paid by the applicant as per NHA Rules and Regulations.
- j. The applicant shall promptly act on legitimate directions of NHA within specified time.

1.6. Schedule-I. NHA shall charge NOC Fee (one time) for construction of new interchange, as per table below:

- **Provided** that in case of establishment of subsequent multiple projects/schemes availing access from so constructed interchange, 100% original NOC fee shall be charged on one time basis.
- **Provided further**, in case of request for access through modification in so constructed interchanges, all above conditions including NOC fee shall be applicable.
- **Provided further**, the entity having constructed such Interchange will not permit any other subsequent entity to use the same unless so permitted by NHA through process of granting of fresh NOC as per these regulations.

CAPITAL SMART CITY

Brief on Construction of Interchange at KM 332-333, Islamabad Lahore Motorway (M-2) to Capital Smart City under Regulation for Access from NHA Controlled Network 2019.

Stages of Approval:

As per NHA Regulations for Access from NHA Controlled Network 2019, approval of the interchange consists of two stages i.e.

- a. Provisional Acceptance.
- b. Formal Approval.

STATUS OF PROVISIONAL ACCEPTANCE OF CAPITAL SMART CITY'S INTERCHANGE:

Upon completion of requisite conditions for the provisional acceptance, NHA vide its letter dated 10th June, 2021 had granted provisional acceptance to Capital Smart City for establishment of Interchange at KM 332-333, Islamabad Lahore Motorway (M-2). The main requirements for the provisional acceptance completed by Capital Smart City are summarized below:

- i. 10-KM distance criteria from existing interchanges fulfilled.
- ii. Payment of Rs. 5 million was made as processing fee by Capital Smart City.
- iii. Minimum land requirement of 4000 Kanal for Housing Society was fulfilled.
- iv. Mandatory NOCs, development and service plans were provided.
- v. 40% infrastructure development completion Certificate from RDA was provided.
- vi. Traffic Impact Study and Geometric Study/ Highway Safety Audit Report were submitted.
- vii. Road safety certificate duly approved by IG (NH & MP) was submitted.
- viii. NOC Fee @ Rs. 60,000/- per Kanal was deposited.
- ix. Required undertakings were submitted.

In addition to above, it is also one of the conditions of provisional acceptance that interchange and affiliated works shall be designed, estimated & constructed by NHA as deposit work.

Design of the Interchange duly prepared by M/s NESPAK was also submitted to NHA as pre-requisite condition of provisional acceptance.

STATUS OF FORMAL ACCEPTANCE OF CAPITAL SMART CITY'S INTERCHANGE:

On fulfillment of the following conditions, Capital Smart City applied for grant of formal approval of interchange for commencement of procurement & construction at the proposed site.

- a. Applicant provided undertaking of judicial paper regarding completion of infrastructure development upto 75% certified by relevant Govt. Department which approved the development plan.
- b. Adequate land, free from all encumbrances, was mutated, for construction of interchange outside the fence/ROW including Loop Land, in the name of NHA without any cost to NHA.

Current Status:

NHA issued NOC to the applicant after formal approval by the National Highway Executive Board (NHEB) in its 381st Meeting held on 04.02.2022.

Dr. Khalid Maqbool Siddiqui: (a) DGRE (Directorate General Religious Education) under the M/o FE&PT is the only department at Federal Level to register Deeni Madaris in the country and has already registered 17738 Madaris till date 11-09-2024.

Madrassa which wants to get register with DGRE submits its application on standard form (**Annex-I**). After scrutiny of registration form certificate is then issued.

(b) DGRE has provided financial assistance to 598 registered Deeni Madaris by providing 1196 teachers.

DGRE appoints teachers on the recommendations of concerned Madrassa and Wafaq who fulfil the laid down criteria which includes minimum Bachelor's Degree with English, Mathematics and General Science subjects. However, Religious Education if required in addition to above qualifications is given preference.

**Question No. 33 Senator Fawzia Arshad: Will the Minister for National Health, Services, Regulations and Coordination be pleased to state whether it is a fact that the Federal Government is planning to outsource the diagnostic services at Pakistan Institute of Medical Sciences Islamabad, if so, the reasons thereof indicating also the implications for the future of the employees?*

Minister for National Health, Services, Regulations and Coordination: The decision to outsource diagnostic services was taken to improve service delivery in health sector on modern grounds.

Accordingly, PIMS has completed need assessment through Technical Working Group and currently it is in the final phase of preparing procurement documents and technical specifications/ modalities for outsourcing of departments of Radiology & Pathology Services.

The current employees being civil servants will not be affected by the outsourcing of diagnostic services.

Mr. Presiding Officer: Next Question, Senator Muhammad Aslam Abro. He is not present.

*Question No. 34 **Senator Muhammad Aslam Abro:** *Will the Minister for Federal Education and professional Training be pleased to state:*

- (a) *whether it is a fact that the scheme for provision of books with up to 50% discount by National Book Foundation has been discontinued, if so, the date and reasons of its discontinuation;*
- (b) *the budget allocated and utilized on the said scheme during the last seven years with year wise break up; and*
- (c) *whether any alternate arrangements have been made by the Government to provide books to the public on discounted rates from authorized book shops, if so, the details thereof?*

Dr. Khalid Maqbool Siddiqui: (a) Since 2012 onward no allocation has so far been made to NBF under Readers Club ID No. 3989. Hence due to non-availability of funds under the said Scheme is suspended to date.

(b) Since the said Scheme is very popular amongst the General Public. Hence it has been decided by the NBF management to continue it through its recurring grant. The details are as under: -

Due to the spread of the COVID-19 pandemic from 2019 onwards, this scheme had to be discontinued.

(c) Due to budget constraints and other factors, NBF has discontinued this scheme without making any alternative arrangements. However, NBF is offering a 50% discount on books published by NBF, available to the general public through its own bookshops.

Mr. Presiding Officer: Next Question, Senator Samina Mumtaz Zehri. She is not present.

**Question No. 35 Senator Samina Mumtaz Zehri: Will the Minister for Federal Education, Professional Training be pleased to state:*

- (a) the details of the HEC recognized Universities in the country that have made internships mandatory for the students in order to complete their 4 years' BS degree programs;*
- (b) whether HEC has formulated any policy guidelines for these universities to regulate the said internships in order to assist the students in finding the right institutions for completing internships, if so, its details; and*
- (c) whether any quality check or monitoring mechanism has been devised by HEC in order to ensure that those universities provide proper assistance to their students in finding the relevant institutions or entities for completing their internships as per university requirements, if so, the details thereof?*

Dr. Khalid Maqbool Siddiqui: (a) In accordance with HEC's Undergraduate Policy the Internship (6-8 weeks) is a mandatory requirement to complete undergraduate (4 years BS degree). The policy is rolled out in 2023 and all Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) are required to adopt the said policy by Fall 2023 after attaining approval of their relevant statutory bodies.

(b) Yes, the Higher Education Commission (HEC) has provided guiding principles/framework for mandatory Internship to complete an undergraduate degree (4 years BS). The relevant extract of the policy is reproduced below:

Field Experience/Internship:

The field experience of six to eight weeks (preferably undertaken during semester or summer break) must be graded by a faculty member in collaboration with the supervisor in the field. This is a mandatory degree award requirement of 3 credit hours for all undergraduate/equivalent degree programs. However; for Associate Degrees, the requirement shall only be applicable where prescribed by the respective Accreditation Council, National Curriculum Review Committee or by the concerned university.

The purpose of such field experience is to provide practical exposure and professional learning experience to students in their relevant field of study. It is pertinent to mention here that HEC has only issued the policy guidelines declaring “Internship” as mandatory degree completion requirements. The execution plan of this mandatory activity is responsibility of the universities. For the purpose, the Universities are required to establish an effective Student Advisory System to ensure that the academic advice is available to every student, as and when needed, that also includes addressing the key issues faced by students related to their field experience.

(c) The revised Quality Assurance Framework of HEC envisages framework to assess the performance/quality of a university whether is there any robust systems for advising and counseling students to support their academic, personal, and career development, fostering a conducive environment for student success and well-being exists in the university or otherwise. Likewise, the internal Quality Assurance Mechanism of universities is in place in the form of “Quality Enhancement Cells (QECs)” which is mandated to ensure compliance of HEC’s policy/regulations in true spirit. In addition to above, the universities have Industry-Academia Linkages programs, job fairs and Placement Offices to provide ample opportunities to the students to secure internships or even employment in their relevant field of study.

Mr. Presiding Officer: Next Question No. 36, Senator Haji Hidayatullah Khan. He is not present.

*Question No. 36 **Senator Haji Hidayatullah Khan:** *Will the Minister for National Health Services, Regulations and*

Coordination be pleased to state the reason(s) of non-transmission of lab reports to patients online by the Federal Government Hospitals in Islamabad despite being equipped with internet and other requisite facilities indicating also the time by when the said facility will be made available?

Minister for National Health Services, Regulations and Coordination: Federal Government Polyclinic has prepared an application through which patients can view and download lab reports online. Link of application is available on FGPC’s official website www.fgpc.gov.pk and QR code is being generated on patient registration slip.

Moreover, “One patient One ID” project is under process of implementation in PIMS, NIRM & FGPC in coordination with M/o NHSR&C and NITB. PIMS has partially implemented “One patient One ID” project in three departments i.e. Children Hospital, Mother & Child Health Center (MCH) and Burn Care Center (BCC).

“One patient One ID” is being implemented by NITB in all the Federal Government Hospitals. Through this system every patient will have its unique ID. All the patients history and previous / new reports will be retrieved and saved on single ID and patients will have option to retrieve their lab reports on the mobile through app. This system is in process of implementation and will be, adopted in all Federal Government hospitals by 30th December, 2024.

Mr. Presiding Officer: Question No. 37, Senator Jan Muhammad.¹

**Question No. 37 Senator Jan Muhammad: Will the Minister for Federal Education, Professional Training, be pleased to state:*

- (a) the budget allocated to the universities of Balochistan during the financial year 2023-24 with university wise breakup; and*
- (b) whether it is a fact that the said universities are facing financial crunch at present, if so, the details thereof*

indicating also the steps being taken by the Government to overcome the issue?

Dr. Khalid Maqbool Siddiqui: (a) During FY 2023.24, the Federal Government/HEC's recurring grant allocated to eight (08) universities in the Balochistan province is Rs. 3,302.354 Million. The university wise breakup of allocation of HEC's recurring grant is as under:

(b) Yes, the universities in Balochistan are facing budgetary deficits. Detail of the challenges/major financial bottlenecks being faced by these public sector universities in Balochistan are:

- Lowest student fee package as 60% of population in province lives below the poverty line.
- Absence/inadequacy of pension fund and huge pension liability thus being met from the annual recurring budget leaving lesser cushion for salaries and operating expense.
- Inadmissible allowances
- Overstaffing
- Weak financial and governance systems due to appointment of non-professionals against key statutory/professional positions of the Treasurer and the Registrar
- Use of Single-Entry Accounting Systems
- Lack of Income Diversification (negligible income from intellectual sources) etc.

Measures taken by HEC

a) The Chairman HEC formally approached all the provincial governments including Balochistan to adequately fund provincial universities out of their provincial NFC shares. Pursuant to these efforts, the Government of Balochistan in CFY has enhanced its regular recurring allocation from Rs. 2.5 billion to Rs. 5 billion (100% increase) and deliberations on distribution of enhanced allocation are under way at the level of Balochistan Universities Finance Commission.

b) The Budgetary Review and Assessment report of the Public Sector Universities of Balochistan detailing financial/administrative bottlenecks and recommendations was shared with the CM, Governor, HE Departments of the Government of Balochistan and requested for their support in implementation of the HEC recommendations necessary for improvement in the governance and financial management of universities.

c) Regarding request of the Government of Balochistan to the former PM for provision of Rs. 10 billion for establishment of Endowment Fund for universities in Balochistan, HEC has supported establishment of Endowment Fund with seed money of matching volume by the Federal and Provincial Governments. However, despite Chairman HEC's special visit to Quetta on the direction of the PM office and holding consultative meetings with the CM & Governor Balochistan followed by a joint meeting of the CM Balochistan with the Prime Minister, matter could not be concluded on desired outcome.

d) In consideration of the bleak financial scenario, HEC in addition to the annual recurring allocations has also released Rs. 257.617 Million additional support to financially distressed universities of Balochistan in FY 2023-24 as per following breakup:

i. **University of Balochistan Quetta:** Rs. 50 Million solarization and Rs. 11.034 million research grant.

ii. **BUIITEMS Quetta:** Rs. 40 Million solarization grant and Rs. 66.587 million Research grant.

iii. **Lasbela University of Agriculture, Water and Marine Sciences, Uthal:** Rs. 10 Million budgetary support.

iv. **Balochistan University of E&T Khuzdar:** Rs. 30.00 Million solarization grant.

v. **University of Loralai:** Rs. 30.00 Million solarization grant.

vi. **University of Turbat:** Rs. 20.00 Million special grant for Revenue Generation Activities.

"10. Posting and Transfer.—Every Civil Servant shall be liable to serve anywhere within or outside Pakistan, in any equivalent or higher post under the Federal Government, or any Provincial Government, or local authority, or a corporation or body set up or established by any such Government:

Provided that nothing contained in this section shall apply to a civil servant recruited specifically to serve in a particular area or region:

Provided further that, where a civil servant is required to serve in a post outside his service or cadre, his terms and conditions of service as to his pay shall not be less favorable than those to which he would have been entitled if he had not been so required to serve.”

Annex-A

1* Civil Servants Act, 1973 (Act No. LXXI of 1973)

An Act to regulate the appointment of persons to, and the terms and conditions of Service of persons in, the service of Pakistan.

WHEREAS it is expedient to regulate by law, the appointment of persons to, and the terms and conditions of service of persons, in the service of Pakistan, and to provide for matters connected therewith or ancillary thereto;

It is hereby enacted as follows:-

1. **Short title, application and commencement.**-(1) This Act may be called the Civil Servants Act, 1973.

(2) it applies to all civil servants wherever they may be.

(3) It shall come into force at once.

2. **Definitions.**-(1) In this act, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context,-

(a) "ad hoc appointment" means appointment of a duly qualified person made otherwise than in accordance with the prescribed method of recruitment, pending recruitment in accordance with such method;

(b) "civil servant" means a person who is a member of an All-Pakistan Service or of a civil service of the Federation or who holds a civil post in connection with the affairs of the Federation, including any such post connected with defence, but does not include-

(i) a person who is on deputation to the Federation from any Province or other authority;

(ii) a person who is employed on contract, or on work-charged basis or who is paid from contingencies; or

(iii) a person who is "worker" or "workman" as defined in the Factories Act, 1934 (XXV of 1934), or the Workman's Compensation Act, 1923 (VIII of 1923):

(c) "initial appointment" means appointment made otherwise than by promotion or transfer.

*The Act received assent of the President on the 26th September, 1973 and was published in the Gazette of Pakistan, Extra, Part I, September 29, 1973.

Provided that civil servants who are selected for promotion to a higher post one batch shall, on their promotion to the higher post, retain their inter se seniority as in the lower post.

9. Promotion – (1) A civil servant possessing such minimum qualifications as may be prescribed shall be eligible for promotion to a higher post for the time being reserved under the rules for departmental promotion in the service or cadre to which he belongs:

³“Provided that the posts of –

- (a) Additional Secretary and Senior Joint Secretary may, in the public interest, be filled by promotion from amongst officers of regularly constituted Occupational Groups and services holding, on regular basis, posts in Basic Pay Scale 20; and
- (b) Secretary may, in the public interest, be filled by promotion from amongst officers of regularly constituted Occupational Groups and services holding, on regular basis, posts in Basic Pay Scale 21, in such manner and subject to such conditions as may be prescribed.”

(2) A post referred to in sub-section (1) may either be a selection post or a non-selection post to which promotions shall be made as may be prescribed-

- (a) in the case of a selection post, on the basis of selection on merit; and
- (b) in the case of a non-selection post, on the basis of seniority-cum-fitness.

⁴(3) Promotion to posts in basic pay scales 20 and 21 and equivalent shall be made on the recommendations of a Selection Board which shall be headed by the Chairman, Federal Public Service Commission.

10. Posting and transfer.- Every civil servant shall be liable to serve anywhere within or outside Pakistan, in any equivalent or higher post under the Federal Government, or any Provincial Government, or local authority, or a corporation or body set up or established by any such Government;

Provided that nothing contained in this section shall apply to a civil servant recruited specifically to serve in a particular area or region:

Provided further that, where a civil servant is required to serve in a post outside his service or cadre, his terms and conditions of service as to his pay shall not be less favourable than those to which he would have been entitled if he had not been so required to serve.

Will the Minister for Federal Education and Professional Training be pleased to state:

- (a) the number of educational institutions working under the administrative control of the Federal Government with Province wise breakup; and*
- (b) detail about check and balance on these institutions in line with result/award policy and scholarships for the deserving students?*

Dr. Khalid Maqbool Siddiqui: (a) Federal Directorate of Education is responsible for imparting quality education through its 432 educational institutions in Islamabad Capital Territory. FDE is providing equitable access to quality education for the residents of ICT and adjoining areas. FDE is mandated to provide formal education to the residents of ICT. In pursuance of Article 25-A FDE is providing free education including Textbooks up to Secondary level. To enhance literacy rate in Islamabad Capital Territory Federal Directorate of Education is providing free education to the students of Class Prep to X in Federal Capital Area.

A list of federally chartered public sector Universities/ HEIs currently operating under various Ministries (administratively controlling bodies) is attached as **Annex-A**.

As such, no university comes under the direct administrative control of HEC; rather HEC plays the regulatory and advisory role in the higher education sector {public & private sector Higher Education Institutions (HEIs)} in the country. Likewise, the Ministry of Federal Education and Professional Training and HEC perform functions as elucidated in various Statutory bodies (Senate/BoG, Syndicate, F&PC etc.) in the Act of these HEIs.

(b) Area Education Officers play an important role in monitoring the academic activities of the schools located in each of the five sectors of Islamabad Capital Territory. AEOs also help FDE with administrative issues of those schools. They furnish detailed reports regarding daily activities of the sector including visits of the AEOs to the schools on fortnightly basis to the Director (Schools). These activities are also recorded in the Green

Book kept in the office of the AEO concerned. Furthermore, scholarships are given to 500 students of Grades-V & VIII.

Universities/DAIs are autonomous entities governed through their statutory bodies and HEC has representation in their statutory bodies. As far as the result/award of degree is concerned, each university/DAI has its own policies/SOPs approved by their statutory bodies in accordance with Semester System guidelines of HEC, National Qualification Framework (NQF), Undergraduate Education Policy and Postgraduate Education Policy. HEC periodically assess the academic and administrative quality of the universities through institutional Performance Evaluation (IPE) based on multiple standards including processes/SOPs of assessment and awarding degrees. Professional Councils like PEC, PM&DC, PBC, PCATP, NCBEAC, NCEAC etc. also regulate the undergraduate degree programs including course contents and assessment/examinations across the board.

The national-level scholarship schemes are executed by HEC under which scholarships are awarded in transparent manner (as per relevant PC-I) to qualified and deserving students while each university has its mechanism of granting need or merit-based scholarships. In accordance with Federal Universities Ordinance, 2002 (the model Act for establishment of a university or Degree Awarding Institute), each university is bound to offer scholarships to 10% students (merit and need-based). However, this provision may vary from university to university keeping in view the enactment of Act of Universities/DAIs from various Provincial Assemblies.

(b) Federal Directorate of Education (FDE) oversees 432 educational institutions in Islamabad Capital Territory (ICT), ensuring quality education for residents of ICT and surrounding areas. Its mandate includes providing formal education in line with Article 25-A, offering free education and textbooks up to the secondary level. Key initiatives to boost enrollment and reduce dropout rates, particularly for girls, include:

- Hiring new teachers.
- Establishing IT labs and providing Chromebooks.
- Setting up Mother & Child Health Care Centers in schools.
- Opening 100 Early Childhood Education (ECE) centers with modern facilities in both rural and urban schools.
- Providing transport for female students from rural areas through the Pink Bus initiative.
- Creating a conducive learning environment with

programs on character building, life skills, improved sports facilities, and more.

- Launching a comprehensive nutrition program in collaboration with Allah Walay Trust, benefiting 43,000 students across 155 institutions with eye screening, BMI checks, and hot meals, which have increased enrollment and attendance.

Flexible admission policies have also been introduced, allowing for maximum intake, provisional admissions, and age relaxation for Class-Prep and Class One. Education from Class Prep to X is free, including textbooks.

Regarding Out-Of-School Children, the government enrolled 72,000 students in both formal and non-formal education during 2023-24, with 65% of the 3,400 enrolled through NGOs being girls. The Education Voucher Program (EVP) for 2024-25 allocates Rs.5,000 per month per child for private school education, with a preference for girls. Additionally, 50 schools now run evening shifts, enrolling 7,500 students, with 30 of these schools focused on girls' education.

The Pakistan Institute of Education has reported significant improvements in girls' enrollment, with nearly 90% net enrollment at the primary level and a Gender Parity Index (GPI) above 1. The increase in female teachers and better teacher training programs has created a more supportive environment for girls. Finally, from August 2024, 57,000 students across 200 schools in Islamabad will benefit from a free meal program.

Dr. Khalid Maqbool Siddiqui: (a) A list of federally chartered public sector Universities/HEIs currently operating under various Ministries (administratively controlling bodies) is attached as **Annex-A**.

(b) At present, there are six (06) federally chartered universities without regular Vice Chancellors and these are being managed through Acting Vice Chancellors as stop-gap arrangements.

In total, there are 60 Public Sector HEIs of Pakistan where the post of Vice Chancellor/Rector is either being officiated on Acting Charge basis (57 HEIs) or is vacant (03 HEIs), the details are attached as **Annex-B**.

Annex-B

The universities are autonomous entities established through Act/Ordinance enacted by the respective the legislative Assemblies i.e. the Parliament in the case of Federally chartered universities, and provincial Assemblies in the case of provincially chartered universities. All affairs of the universities including the process of appointment and removal of the Vice Chancellor/Rector/President are governed as per the dictates of their Act/Ordinance and rules/regulations as outlined in their respective Statutes.

Administratively, the provincially chartered HEIs are governed through the Higher Education Department of the respective Province. The process of appointment and removal of the Vice Chancellor/Rector/President of the provincially chartered HEIs is carried out in accordance with provisions outlined in their Act/Ordinance and rules/regulations/ Statutes thereof.

A critical element in ensuring the effective performance and sustainability of HEIs is their leadership, particularly the role of the Vice Chancellor (VC). The absence of regular and full-time VC can significantly impact educational policies and institutional standards in any HEI.

It is important to note that the HEC plays a limited role in the appointment of Vice Chancellors in Federally Chartered Universities while there is no direct role of HEC in the appointment of Vice Chancellors in the Provincially Chartered Universities. However, cognizance of the role of university leadership, HEC has been actively coordinating with the provincial governments and formally reached out multiple times to the Honorable Governors and Chief Ministers of the Provincial Governments, urging the timely appointment of Vice Chancellors.

Current Status:

As of now, 60 public HEIs remain without regular Vice Chancellors (summary is elucidated below). Although, managing the affairs of the universities through Acting Vice Chancellors is not an ideal as a long-term solution, however, this has helped maintain basic operational continuity until regular appointments are made.

- the details of measures taken/being taken by the Government to control and prevent the spread of dengue indicating also the number of FIRs registered or challans issued against the violators of SOPs?

Minister for National Health Services, Regulations, and Coordination: (a) As informed by the District Health Office, 2220 cases were reported in Islamabad since 1st January, 2024 till date. Details of area-wise breakup is enclosed as **Annex-A**.

- b. In order to mitigate the impact of dengue fever, the District Health Office, Islamabad is taking following measures to address the situation:
- i. Focusing on public awareness campaigns,
 - ii. Promoting preventive measures, and enhancing vector control efforts.
 - iii. Efforts are focused on targeted vector control strategies like Indoor Residual Spraying (IRS) are prioritized in the patient's home and nearby houses to quickly reduce mosquito populations.
 - iv. Focusing on habitat reduction, biological control, and the use of larvicidal, as extensive larval source management in surrounding areas is crucially,
 - v. Thermal fogging effectively is being done in early morning or late evening, especially in high-risk areas.
 - vi. Areas with a high number of larvae are prioritized, as they indicate the presence of adult mosquitoes. Community engagement and real-time data monitoring is also conducted to enhance their impact on controlling transmission.

Minister for National Health Services, Regulations and Coordination: A 200-bedded, four stories, state-of-the-art hospital for outdoor services and indoor admission of various types of cancer patients established in PIMS and its groundbreaking ceremony was held on 17th July 2023. Comprehensive Cancer Treatment Facilities includes Radiology, Pathology, Medical Oncology with day care Chemotherapy facilities, Oncology and Surgery, ICU, Emergency facilities for Cancer Patients, Genetics and Research.

Execution and Phases:

Phase-I The project was approved by CDWP with total cost of Rs.3406.169 million and its authorization was issued on 24th February, 2023 with date of administrative approval on 6th March 2023. The project started on 7th April, 2023 and as per PC-

I, the date of Completion is 30th June, 2025. An amount of 1763 million has been released to PWD for infrastructure. The amount of 1060 million has been released for infrastructure in PSDP 2024-2025.

Phase-II includes a total amount of Rs.7476.01 million for procurement of medical equipment, operation theatres, chemotherapy chairs, hospital beds, computers, furniture etc. The Phase-II of the project was submitted to the Ministry of Planning, Development & Special Initiatives and was approved on 9th August, 2023 by CDWP, however, its authorization is still awaited. An amount of Rs. 2050 million is allocated for the equipment in PSDP 2024-25.
