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

The Senate of Pakistan met in the Senate Chamber, (State Bank Building), Islamabad, at half-past five of the clock in the evening, Mr. Chairman (Mr. Habibullah Khan) in the Chair.

STARRED QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Mr. Chairman: Now, we take up questions.

WAPDA TUBE-WELLS

57. \***Khawaja Mohammad Safdar:** Will the Minister for Fuel, Power and Natural Resources be pleased, to state:

(a) the number of tube-wells owned by the WAPDA which were not functioning on the 30th June, 1974, in each of the four provinces due to (i) any mechanical defect in the tube-well, (ii) due to non-availability of electricity, (iii) due to the burning of the transformer; and

(b) the number of applications, category-wise, for electricity connection pending in each province as on the 30th June, 1974?

جناب تاج محمد خان جمالی : جناب والا ! میں دوبارہ عرض کرتا ہوں  
کہ اس طرح ہوتا ہے کہ درمیان میں کچھ ٹیوب ویل خراب ہوتے ہیں -  
انکو پھر ٹھیک کر دیا جاتا ہے کوئی چھ مہینے کے بعد ٹھیک کر دیا جاتا ہے

اور کوئی تین مہینے بعد اور کوئی دو مہینے بعد اس طرح خراب بھی ہوتے رہتے ہیں اور ٹھیک بھی ہوتے رہتے ہیں۔ ان کی خاص تاریخ کا ہتہ نہیں لگ سکتا۔

جناب تاج محمد خان جمالی: جناب والا! اس میں بھی وہی بات ہے۔ کوئی ٹرانسمیٹر جل جاتا ہے پھر اسکو بنالیتے ہیں اور جو ٹیوب ویل خراب ہوتے ہیں انکو ٹھیک کر لیتے ہیں۔ ان کی تاریخ کا ہتہ نہیں ہے۔

#### OIL EXPLORATION IN LORALAI

58. \*Haji Sayed Hussain Shah: Will the Minister for Fuel, Power and Natural Resources be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that oil prospecting licence has been granted by the Government of Pakistan to an American firm for eight prospecting sites in Loralai District; and

(b) if answer to (a) above be in the affirmative, the amount of royalty this firm will pay to the Government of Pakistan, in case oil is found there?

Mr. Mohammad Yusuf Khattak (Read by Mr. Taj Mohammad Khan Jamali): (a) An exploration and prospecting licence has been jointly granted to Amoco (Pakistan) Exploration Company and Total Pakistan of France for an area of 19,770 sq. miles out of which 540 sq. miles lie in Loralai District.

(b) The companies are liable to pay 12½ % of the well-head value of crude oil produced and sold or utilized by them for any purpose other than in the production of petroleum. A minimum rate of royalty is fixed at fifty paises per (40) forty gallons of crude oil produced and sold.

حاجی سید حسین شاہ: کیا محترم وزیر مملکت صاحب یہ ارشاد فرمائیں

گے کہ ۱۹۷۷۰ per miles میں سے کتنا ایریا مری علاقے میں واقع ہے؟

Mr. Taj Mohammad Khan Jamali: Sir, it is not more than a few hundred.

کیونکہ جہانتک میرے پاس ریکارڈ ہے۔

It is 450 in Loralai district but in Marri or Bugti area it will not be more than a few hundred.

حاجی سید حسین شاہ : کیا میں جناب محترم وزیر مملکت صاحب سے یہ پوچھ سکتا ہوں کہ رائٹٹی جو مقرر کی گئی ہے ، وہ بین الاقوامی قیمتوں کے مطابق ہے ؟

جناب تاج محمد خان جمالی : اس میں ہر ملک کا اپنا اپنا طریقہ کار ہوتا ہے۔ چونکہ ہمارے ملک میں اس سے پہلے کبھی تیل کے اتنے امکانات وغیرہ نہیں تھے۔ ہم رائٹٹی سرے سے زیادہ تو نہیں کہہ سکتے۔ اگر کمرشل basis پر تیل نکل آئے تو ہمارا اس میں ۴ فیصد ہوگا اور پرائیویٹ کمپنی کا ۶ فیصد ہوگا اور یہ شاید ہر ملک میں vary کرتا ہے۔

#### NEWSPAPER ADVERTISEMENTS

59. \*Mr. Zamarrud Hussain: Will the Minister-in-Charge of Information and Broadcasting be pleased to state:

(a) the payment made to different newspapers on account of advertisement charges by the Press Information Department during 1972-73 and 1973-74 and the budget allocation for this purpose during 1974-75;

(b) the payment made on account of advertisement charges to the newspapers of Baluchistan Province during 1972-73 and 1973-74; and

(c) the criteria on the basis of which advertisements are given to different newspapers?

Malik Mohammad Akhtar (Read by Mr. Hafeczullah Cheema): (a) None.

(b) None.

(c) The Federal Information Ministry have given a broad guideline to their Press Information Department for distributing Federal Government's advertisements to newspapers. This guideline says that in the selection of news-

papers for placement of advertisements due consideration should be given to claims and interests of national, regional and Mofussil Newspapers in order to maintain a proper balance between metropolitan, regional and Mofussil Press. If a newspaper receives a larger quantity of advertisements, it is due to that newspaper's position in terms of circulation or influence.

#### IRRIGATION PROJECTS

60. \***Khawaja Mohammad Safdar:** Will the Minister for Fuel, Power and Natural Resources be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that work on about half a dozen important irrigation projects has been delayed indefinitely in the absence of a decision on allocation of river waters to the provinces as disclosed by Mr. Sayyid Hamid, President, West Pakistan Engineering Congress, in his address at the 54th annual session;

(b) whether the irrigation projects delayed were (1) Chashma Right Bank Canal which is to irrigate areas in D.I. Khan and D.G. Khan districts, (2) Greater Thal Project which is to irrigate Mianwali and Shahpur districts, (3) the Dajal Canal extension which is to irrigate areas in D.G. Khan, (4) the Jalalpur Canal which is to irrigate Jhelum district, (5) the Tarbela Left Bank Canal which is to irrigate Hazara and Campbellpur districts; and

(c) the reasons for not making any decision about the distribution of river waters amongst the provinces?

**Mr. Mohammad Yusuf Khattak** (Read by Mr. Taj Mohammad Khan Jamali): (a) No it is not a fact that work on about half a dozen schemes has been delayed indefinitely in the absence of a decision on allocation of river waters amongst the Provinces.

(b) All these schemes are in different stages of examination and have not been finally approved as yet.

(c) The matter is under consideration of Government.

Mr. Mohammad Yusuf Khattak (Read by Mr. Taj Mohammad Khan Jamali): (a) The numbers of villages, province-wise, electrified during years 1971-72, 1972-73, 1973-74 and 1974-75 are indicated below:

#### ADJOURNMENT MOTIONS DEFERRED

**Mr. Chairman:** Now, we take up adjournment motions. This is adjournment motion No. 37. Haji Sahib, it is in your name.

**Haji Sayed Hussain Shah:** Mr. Chairman, I beg leave of the House to move a motion for the adjournment of the business of the House.....

**Mr. Chairman:** Yes?

**Mr. Hafeezullah Cheema:** Mr. Chairman, Sir.

**Mr. Chairman:** No, no, but how do you rise in your seat? Don't you want him to move this motion?

**Mr. Hafeezullah Cheema:** No, Sir, the adjournment motions No. 37 and 38 stand in the name of Senator Haji Sayed Hussain Shah. They may be taken up tomorrow, because we have asked the concerned department to give the information required. The notices were received at 12.30 p.m. today. So, these can be taken up tomorrow.

**Mr. Chairman:** Do you agree? It is upto you.

**Haji Sayed Hussain Shah:** I don't mind, Sir. I agree. May be deferred for tomorrow.

**Mr. Chairman:** Both are in your name.

**Haji Sayed Hussain Shah:** Both are in my name, Sir.

**Mr. Chairman:** Yes. Can we take both the adjournment motions tomorrow?

**Mr. Hafeezullah Cheema:** Yes, Sir.

**Mr. Chairman:** So, both the adjournment motions are deferred till tomorrow morning.

#### STANDING COMMITTEE REPORT *RE:* THE PEOPLE'S FINANCE CORPORATION (AMENDMENT) BILL 1974

**Mr. Chairman:** Yes, now, Mr. Ihsanul Haq to present the report of the Standing Committee. Anybody in his place? Mr. Ihsanul Haq has to present the report of the Standing Committee on a certain Bill. The normal practice is that either the Member concerned should be present in the House or he should authorise somebody else to present the report on his behalf.

**Khawaja Mohammad Safdar:** The Committee can only authorise, as far as I remember.

**Mr. Chairman:** Anybody?

**Khawaja Mohammad Safdar:** Only the Committee can authorise, as far as I remember.

**Mr. Chairman:** Who has been authorised if Mr. Ihsanul Haq is not present? What happens to it then, if there is none to move? Then, it is not moved, that is all.

**Khawaja Mohammad Safdar:** Yes, Sir.

**Mr. Chairman:** Oh yes, not moved. Now, we pass on to the next one. Yes, Rana Mohammad Hanif.

**Ch. Mohammad Hanif Khan:** Sir, I beg to move:

“That the requirement of sub-rule (2) of rule 83 of the Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business in the Senate, 1973, in regard to the

Bill to amend the People's Finance Corporation Act, 1972 [The People's Finance Corporation (Amendment) Bill, 1974], as reported by the Standing Committee, be dispensed with".

**Mr. Chairman:** A very embarrassing situation has been created for me, you see, Mr. Rana. First, the Standing Committee's report with regard to this very Bill had to be placed before the House. Now, neither Mr. Ihsanul Haq is present nor....

**Ch. Mohammad Hanif Khan:** Sir, you called upon me because this is to be presented by....

**Mr. Chairman:** No, no, I don't call upon any particular person unless his name is here. The report has to be presented to the House by Mr. Ihsanul Haq.

**Ch. Mohammad Hanif Khan:** Quite true, Sir.

**Mr. Chairman:** Well, I have been looking for him and he was not there. I have been asking the House, if there is any other person to present the report on his behalf but there was no response. Probably, you came late. It does not matter. It is not your fault. I know you had been in the....

**Khawaja Mohammad Safdar:** Unless the Standing Committee empowers somebody to present the report on behalf of the Committee, nobody is competent to present it, neither even the Minister, is competent to present that report. This is the rule, Sir.

**Mr. Chairman:** Where is this first requirement that only....

*(Interruption)*

**Mr. Chairman:** I am hearing it. The point is very simple. Mr. Ihsanul Haq, who had to present the report of the Standing Committee before the House is not here. Now, the question is whether the Minister or any other person can do that job.

**Khawaja Mohammad Safdar:** No, Sir.

**Mr. M. Rafi Raza:** I think, I will give you the relevant rules. There is a rule on this.

**Mr. Chairman:** That is the Standing Committee, who authorises somebody to present its report.

**Rao Abdus Sattar:** Yes, Sir.

**Khawaja Mohammad Safdar:** Only the Standing Committee, Sir.

**Mr. Chairman:** You just refer me to that rule. You may be correct but you may refer me to that rule, if there is any.

**Khawaja Mohammad Safdar:** Yes, Sir.

**Mr. M. Rafi Raza:** Rule 165, Sir.

**Mr. Chairman:** But what should I say. It is a discourtesy to the House when the mover is neither present nor he made some alternative arrangement, the whole proceedings cannot be taken up. I am....

**Mr. M. Rafi Raza:** Mr. Chairman, I am just reading. You asked for the rule. Rule 165(1), page 87. "The report of a Committee...."

**Mr. Chairman:** No, no, rule number?

**Mr. M. Rafi Raza:** Rule 165, on page 87—top of page 87.

"The report of a Committee shall be presented to the Senate by the Chairman of the Committee or, in his absence, by another member chosen by the Committee".

**Khawaja Mohammad Safdar:** Nobody has been chosen.

**Mr. Chairman:** What should I do now?

**Mr. M. Rafi Raza:** Carry it over to the next day.

**Mr. Chairman:** I will provoke a roar of laughter in the House, if I show this book to you!

**Mr. M. Rafi Raza:** We can suspend this rule by a motion in the House.

**Mr. Chairman:** No, no, I am not getting the rule.

**Mr. M. Rafi Raza:** Rule 165, Sir. We can suspend the rule, if it comes to that. But the rule is this.

**Mr. Chairman:** You just see the book. Please see this book. How it is bound! The pages have been turned topsyturvy!

**Mr. M. Rafi Raza:** Sir, the office is not performing its functions.

*(Laughter)*

**Mr. Chairman:** You have been telling me over and over again that the rule is there, but I could not find that because of the change in pages. Now, I have got it.

**Mr. M. Rafi Raza:** Sir, we can suspend the rule by a motion.

**Mr. Chairman:** Now, I have got it. Yes, "The report of a...."

**Mr. M. Rafi Raza:** "The report of a Committee shall be presented to the Senate by the Chairman of the Committee or, in his absence, by another member chosen by the Committee".

**Mr. Chairman:** Now, the Chairman is not here. No member has been chosen. All right. Now?

**Mr. M. Rafi Raza:** Rest of the rule is not relevant here. "In presenting the report the Chairman of the Committee or in his absence...." That is irrelevant.

**Mr. Chairman:** That is not relevant. How can I suspend this rule?

**Mr. M. Rafi Raza:** The House can always suspend its own rules.

**Mr. Chairman:** The House?

**Mr. M. Rafi Raza:** Yes, the House can.

**Mr. Chairman:** Now, because of the difficulty created by circumstances beyond my control....

**Khawaja Mohammad Safdar:** Sir, may I point out to you that rule 229 does not apply. I beg to differ with the honourable Minister.

**Mr. Chairman:** Rule?

**Khawaja Mohammad Safdar:** Rule 229.

**Mr. Chairman:** One minute please.

**Khawaja Mohammad Safdar:** We cannot suspend the rules like that. Have you got it, Sir? Page 115.

**Mr. Chairman:** No, no, you don't tell me the page but the rule.

**Khawaja Mohammad Safdar:** Sir, rule 229 is regarding suspension of rules, which reads:—

"Whenever any inconsistency or difficulty arises in the application of these rules, any member may, with the consent of the Chairman, move that any rule may be suspended in its application to a particular motion before the Senate, and if the motion is carried the rule in question shall stand so suspended."

Sir, there is neither any inconsistency nor there is any difficulty in the application of these rules.

**Mr. Chairman:** The inconsistency is not there. There I agree with you but the difficulty is there.

**Khawaja Mohammad Safdar:** What is the difficulty? This motion can be moved tomorrow. What is the difficulty? Sir, what is the hitch?

**Mr. Chairman:** It was probably only for such like situation that this rule had been inserted.

**Mr. M. Rafi Raza:** Yes, Sir.

**Khawaja Mohammad Safdar:** I beg to differ, Sir, respectfully.

**Mr. Chairman:** What seems to have happened is that the Standing Committee could not contemplate, could not foresee that Mr. Ihsanul Haq would be absenting himself. God forbid, he may be involved in some accident. He may be seriously ill but anyhow I don't presume that he has absented himself deliberately not to present this report before the House. My feeling is that since the Committee could not contemplate, could not foresee that he would be absent on that day, therefore, they could not nominate another person to present this report before the House. Now, there is the difficulty. We have taken up the Bill. The motion for consideration is there. The motion for passage is there but we cannot proceed further without the first motion although it is a mere question of formality that a report is to be placed before the House. It is not a substantive question. Had it been a substantive question, I would have probably agreed with you. But this a mere question of formality. As, I told you earlier, the Committee could not contemplate such a situation that Mr. Ihsanul Haq would absent himself and that they should have nominated somebody else as an alternative. It is my feeling that Mr. Ihsanul Haq has not deliberately absented himself. I may be wrong.

**Khawaja Mohammad Safdar:** You are quite right, Sir.

**Mr. Chairman:** May be due to unavoidable circumstances, it is very unfortunate but the fact is there that he is not here and the report could not be presented. So, the difficulty is there.

**Khawaja Mohammad Safdar:** Difficulty should be in the application of rules. It arises in the application of rules.

**Mr. Chairman:** We are applying rules.

**Mr. M. Rafi Raza:** We have suspended rules in the past as well but not as the honourable Member is interpreting them.

*(Laughter)*

**Mr. Chairman:** Let me exercise my own discretion and make use of my judgment.

**Khawaja Mohammad Safdar:** All right, you are welcome, Sir.

**Mr. Chairman:** I feel that this is a difficulty as envisaged by rule 229 because we cannot take up next two motions unless the rule is suspended under rule 229. Now, this motion for suspension of rules can be made by any gentleman.

**Ch. Mohammad Hanif Khan:** Sir, I beg to move:

“That under rule 229 of the Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business in the Senate, 1973, the requirements of rule 165 be waived.”

**Mr. Chairman:** The motion before the House is:

“That the application of rule 165 to the instant case be suspended under the provisions of rule 229.”

**Khawaja Mohammad Safdar:** Opposed.

**Mr. Chairman:** Do you oppose it?

**Khawaja Mohammad Safdar:** Certainly, Sir.

**Mr. Chairman:** Well, you cannot oppose it while you are sitting. I don't recognise any opposition which is made by a Member while sitting.

**Khawaja Mohammad Safdar:** Quite right, Sir.

**Ch. Mohammad Hanif Khan:** Sir, I will have to move again because that motion is not complete. I move that:

“Under rule 229, the requirements of rule 165 be waived and that the Minister for Finance be allowed to move the motion.”

**Mr. Chairman:** Well, I put the question. Where is this? There is no such requirement.

**Khawaja Mohammad Safdar:** Sir, the Finance Minister cannot present this report to the House. Only a Member can present this. Therefore, my very honourable friend, the Finance Minister, cannot do it. He can move the motion for the suspension of the rule, but he cannot present the report. Somebody else should lay the report before the House.

**Mr. Chairman:** But when the application of this rule is suspended, then?

**Khawaja Mohammad Safdar:** Only for presentation you are suspending it.

**Mr. Chairman:** We are confusing the issue. This report had to be placed before the House either by the Chairman or by any other Member. This was the requirement of rule 165. Now, under rule 229 this is sought to be suspended. Then, what will happen?

**Khawaja Mohammad Safdar:** We are only suspending this rule 165 for removing the difficulty which has arisen so that some other Member may be able to present the report of the Committee. And in part (2) of rule 165 it is quite clearly laid down that only a Member of the Senate can present the report if the Chairman is absent.

Sir, I make the move.

**Mr. Chairman:** We read part (2):—

“In presenting the report the Chairman of the Committee or in his absence the member....”

**Khawaja Mohammad Safdar:** It is a member, Sir, not a non-member. Of course, the honourable Finance Minister is a non-member.

**Mr. Chairman:** Let me read it. It is very clear but we are confusing it:—

“165(1) The report of a Committee shall be presented by the Chairman of the Committee”—who is Mr. Ihsanul Haq—“or, in his absence, by another member chosen by the Committee”.

Nobody has been chosen. The difficulty is there. Now, part(2) says:—

“(2) In presenting the report the Chairman of the Committee or in his absence the member presenting the report....”

That member who has been chosen by the Committee. So, this is a motion for the suspension of the whole rule.

**Khawaja Mohammad Safdar:** Now, another difficulty has arisen.

*(Laughters)*

**Mr. Chairman:** Yes, anybody can move it.

**Ch. Mohammad Hanif Khan:** Sir, am I allowed?

**Mr. Chairman:** Yes, but the motion should be very simple.

**Ch. Mohammad Hanif Khan:** Sir, I beg to present the report of the Standing Committee on the Bill to amend the People's Finance Corporation Act, 1974 [The People's Finance Corporation (Amendment) Bill, 1974].

**Mr. Chairman:** This stands placed before the House. Oh! We have again committed a mistake.

**Ch. Mohammad Hanif Khan:** I think, it was not put to the House.

*(Laughter)*

**Mr. Chairman:** That motion had to be put to the House. So, again we go back to the original motion. Why are we so much in a hurry?

خواجہ محمد صفدر: جناب والا! اصل بات یہ ہے۔۔۔

**Mr. Chairman:** We have got enough time. I am looking at the watch. Well, the motion before the House is:

“That the requirements of rule 165 be suspended under rule 229.”

*(The motion was adopted)*

**Mr. Chairman:** The rule stands suspended. Now, Rana Sahib, you present the report.

**Ch. Mohammad Hanif Khan:** Sir, I beg to present the report of the Standing Committee on the Bill to amend the People's Finance Corporation Act, 1972 [The People's Finance Corporation (Amendment) Bill, 1974].

**Mr. Chairman:** The report stands presented. Now, Rana Sahib, you make the next motion.

#### THE PEOPLE'S FINANCE CORPORATION (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1974

**Ch. Mohammad Hanif Khan:** Sir, I beg to move:

“That the requirement of sub-rule (2) of rule 83 of the Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business in the Senate, 1973 in regard to the Bill to amend the People's Finance Corporation Act, 1972 [The People's Finance Corporation (Amendment) Bill, 1974], as reported by the Standing Committee, be dispensed with.”

**Mr. Chairman:** The motion moved is:

“That the requirement of sub-rule (2) of rule 83 of the Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business in the Senate, 1973, in regard to the Bill to amend the People's Finance Corporation Act, 1972 [The People's Finance Corporation (Amendment) Bill, 1974], as reported by the Standing Committee, be dispensed with”.

**Khawaja Mohammad Safdar:** Opposed, Sir.

**Ch. Mohammad Hanif Khan:** Sir, it is a very simple Bill....

**Mr. Chairman:** I was given to understand that there had been some sort of agreement.

خواجہ محمد صفدر: جناب والا! وہ تو کوئی بات ہی نہیں کرتے - انہوں نے غلط طریقہ استعمال کیا ہے - رول کی پابندی ہونی چاہیے - میں آپ کی توجہ اور آپ کی وساطت سے وزیر صاحب کی توجہ اس رول کی طرف دلاتا ہوں :

Rule 83(3) "In case of urgency, the member-in-charge may move that the requirement of sub-rule (2) be dispensed with and, if the motion is carried, the provisions of that sub-rule shall stand suspended in regard to that Bill and the member-in-charge may forthwith make any of the motions in rule 84."

As far as I know, Sir, there is no urgency. Dinner is not an urgency. Of course my honourable friends will have their dinner. What is the hurry. This is the question which I want to pose to the honourable Minister through you, Sir.

**Mr. Chairman:** Am I correct or not—I was given to understand that there has been some sort of agreement between the two parties that if other two Bills are not moved today then they wouldn't object to this suspension of rule?

**Ch. Mohammad Hanif Khan:** Sir, my position is very clear. What are other two Bills?

خواجہ محمد صفدر: جناب والا! یہ بل تو محترم خان عبدالقیوم خان صاحب وزیر داخلہ کے ہیں -

**Ch. Mohammad Hanif Khan:** Sir, I am not aware of these two Bills. My position is very clear. The honourable Member is talking about dinner because you made certain remarks. The question that some of my work in both the Houses, that is, the Senate as well as the National Assembly, is to be taken on the same day, it comes up before both the Houses on the same day. I have two Bills today before the National Assembly and today I had this Bill here as well. I made a request to the honourable Speaker that since there is a lot to be done before my Bills are taken there, I should be granted permission because it appears on the Orders of the Day here so I should be granted permission to deal with this particular Bill before the Senate so, and therefore the honourable Speaker allowed me to come over here.

**Khawaja Mohammad Safdar:** Now, is this the urgency?

**Ch. Mohammad Hanif Khan:** Because if this is not taken up today then tomorrow again this Bill will come before the Senate and two Bills will be before the National Assembly, and then it is quite possible that either I can stay here or stay in the National Assembly. So, it is for you to decide as to whether you want to dispose of all the Bills today, as tomorrow probably my presence will be in the National Assembly, and this Bill will not be taken up tomorrow even.

**Mr. Chairman:** Well, Khawaja Sahib, you have opposed it. Now, I put the question before the House.

The question before the House is:

“That the requirement of sub-rule (2) of rule 83 of the Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business in the Senate, 1973 in regard to the Bill to amend the People's Finance Corporation Act, 1972 [The People's Finance Corporation (Amendment) Bill, 1974], as reported by the Standing Committee, be dispensed with”.

*(The motion was adopted)*

**Mr. Chairman:** The requirements of sub-rule (2) of rule 83 stand dispensed with.

Now, we take up next item.

**Ch. Mohammad Hanif Khan:** Sir, I beg to move:

“That the Bill to amend the People's Finance Corporation Act 1972 [The People's Finance Corporation (Amendment) Bill, 1974], as reported by the Standing Committee, be taken into consideration at once.”

**Mr. Chairman:** The motion moved is:

“That the Bill to amend the People's Finance Corporation Act, 1972 [The People's Finance Corporation (Amendment) Bill, 1974], as reported by the Standing Committee, be taken into consideration at once.”

**Khawaja Mohammad Safdar:** Opposed Sir.

**Ch. Mohammad Hanif Khan:** Sir, for the benefit of the honourable Members of the Senate, I would like to make a very respectful submission that the People's Finance Corporation was set up under the People's Finance Corporation Act, 1972. The idea is to provide financial assistance to the people belonging to the middle and lower income groups. People's Finance Corporation provides even assistance to those people whose assets don't exceed beyond Rs. 50,000/-. For example, when money is given to the individuals it is seen that the total amount, which forms property of the individual himself, his spouse

[Ch. Mohammad Hanif Khan]

and minor children, doesn't exceed Rs. 50,000/-. If that condition is satisfied then the Corporation can grant loan up to Rs. 50,000/- only. Now, the purpose behind this Bill is only to provide assistance to individuals, as is clear from the amendment. Even the Government servants who are working in offices, can get Financial assistance from the Corporation not to make small purchases, like bicycle....

**Khawaja Mohammad Safdar:** ....or motorcar—

**Ch. Mohammad Hanif Khan:** Motorcar cannot be purchased by Rs. 50,000/- because today motorcar is very expensive. Even if a man is in a position to purchase a smaller one, he can't maintain it.

**Mr. Chairman:** I am told that prices are coming down.

**Ch. Mohammad Hanif Khan:** The idea behind it is that the poor people can get money from the Corporation.

**Mr. Chairman:** We were talking about cars. Is it a fact that the car prices are coming down?

**Ch. Mohammad Hanif Khan:** I am not aware of it. May be it is in your knowledge. I don't know anything about it. But the idea of this amendment is only to provide financial assistance to poor people.

**Mr. Chairman:** I asked this supplementary because you remarked that the prices of cars are going up.

**Ch. Mohammad Hanif Khan:** I didn't say.

**Mr. Chairman:** I was told. I am sorry.

**Ch. Mohammad Hanif Khan:** Neither I said they are coming down; and I shouldn't say whether they are going up or coming down. So, that is only the idea behind it. I don't want to make a speech. It is only to provide financial assistance to small people, just to make small purchases.

خواجہ محمد صفدر: جناب چوئرمین! مجھے افسوس سے کہنا پڑ رہا ہے کہ محترم وزیر صاحب نے اپنا بل نہیں پڑھا۔ اگر وہ اسے پڑھ کر آتے تو یقیناً ہمیں اس سے بہتر تقریر سناتے۔ اس بل کے دو مقاصد ہیں اور انہوں نے ایک ہی مقصد بتایا ہے جو کہ اصل بل میں موجود ہے۔ وہ کہتے ہیں کہ یہ دوسری بار اس بل میں شامل نہیں کیا جا سکتا۔ اس میں پہلا مقصد یہ بتایا گیا ہے

I clearly said that I don't want to make a long speech. If he wants me to make a long speech, then I will discuss the whole Bill, and that will take too much time of this august House.

**Mr. Chairman:** This is exactly what you want.

**Ch. Mohammad Hanif Khan:** Because we are doing more or less for Azad Kashmir, it is provided there. We want to give assistance to poor people in Azad Kashmir as well, and the honourable Member was present when this Bill.....

**Mr. Chairman:** But he never objected to your making a long speech. You can do so. This is exactly what you want.

**Khawaja Mohammad Safdar:** Sir, let him enlighten the House.

**Mr. Chairman:** You can consume as much time of the Senate as you like.

**Mr. Tahir Mohammad Khan:** But the House is not in a mood.

خواجہ محمد صفدر : - - - کہ اس بل کا ایک تو یہ مقصد ہے - اس مقصد کے متعلق میرا اعتراض، یہ ہے جیسا کہ میں نے عرض کیا ہے اور دوسرا مقصد اس بل کا یہ ہے کہ اصل قانون کے تحت یہ خیال کیا جاتا ہے، اگرچہ میں اس سے اتفاق نہیں کرتا کہ صرف Firms and association of persons کو قرضہ دیا جا سکتا ہے، افراد نہیں لے سکتے -

جوہدری محمد حنیف خان : لے سکتے ہیں -

Ch. Mohammad Hanif Khan: The things, which he said were absolutely relevant under the law, already exist. Actually, these cannot be given to the individual firms and the honourable Member was present during the thorough and protracted discussion of this Bill by the Standing Committee. The only objection raised by the honourable Member was that few words were not needed and were redundant. That was the only point, Sir.

**Khawaja Mohammad Safdar:** Point of order, Sir.

The only relevant point is raised about the people who are living outside Pakistan, who are intended to be covered by this Bill, but, as a matter of fact, People's Finance Corporation is not compelled or bound always to extend financial assistance to everybody who makes an application because certain conditions are to be satisfied and certainly, unless laws are made, rules are made, whereby the loans granted to individuals outside Pakistan are properly covered, no loans can be granted. So, that is quite clear. Then, we should keep in mind that no loans can be granted to individuals living outside Pakistan, unless rules or laws or such regulations are made which enjoin or oblige the persons who take the loans to return them under the law. That will be taken care of.

**Mr. Chairman:** Now, the question before the House is:

“That the Bill to amend the People's Finance Corporation Act 1972 [The People's Finance Corporation (Amendment) Bill 1974], as reported by the Standing Committee, be taken into consideration at once.”

*(The motion was adopted)*

**Mr. Chairman:** Now, we take the Bill clause by clause. Is there any amendment?

**Khawaja Mohammad Safdar:** Yes, Sir.

**Mr. Chairman:** Yes, you move your amendment to Clause 2.

**Khawaja Mohammad Safdar:** It is only for deletion, Sir.

**Mr. Chairman:** One minute. Correct papers have been given to me just now. Do you want the Clause 2 to be deleted?

**Ch. Mohammad Hanif Khan:** Well, it is a surprising thing. Actually, I have just brought it to your notice, Sir, that I sought the permission of the honourable Speaker to come to Senate, and just now, in the presence of the Leader of the Senate, I received information that that Bill is going to be taken up, and that I should hurry up and reach there. This is the position now, Sir. That is the real urgency that when a Minister-in-charge has to work in both the Houses at one time, the whole thing becomes impossible.

**Mr. Chairman:** The question before the House is:

That Clause 2 stands part of the Bill."

*(The motion was adopted)*

**Mr. Chairman:** Now, we move to Clause 3. Is there any amendment?

**Khawaja Mohammad Safdar:** Yes, Sir, there are two amendments. I will move only one, Sir.

**Mr. Chairman:** Which one?

**Khawaja Mohammad Safdar:** 2(a), Sir.

**Mr. Chairman:** The first one that is in Clause 3.

**Khawaja Mohammad Safdar:** Yes, Clause 3, Sir.

I beg to move:

"That in Clause 3, in the proposed sub-section (1) of section 18, full stop be added after the word "Corporation" occurring in the 5th line and the subsequent words, comma and full stop be deleted."

**Mr. Chairman:** The motion moved is:

"That in Clause 3 of the Bill in the the proposed sub-section (1) of Section 18, full stop be added after the word "Corporation" occurring in the 5th line and the subsequent words, comma and full stop be deleted."

**Malik Mohammad Akhtar:** Opposed.

**Mr. Chairman:** Yes, Khawaja Shaib.

خواجہ محمد صفدر : جناب والا ! میں آپکے قوسط سے مجوزہ سب کلاز کے الفاظ پڑھے دیتا ہوں :

“Individuals and firms having net assets not exceeding fifty thousand rupees in value, and all classes of small business owned or sponsored by such individuals or firms shall be eligible for loans from the Corporation.”

Finance Corporation Act: Section 33.—Powers to make Rules.

“Subject to the approval of the Federal Government, the Board may, by Notification in the Official Gazette, make rules for carrying out the purpose of this Act and such rules shall be placed before the National Assembly as soon as possible.”

خواجہ محمد صفدر: اسی ایکٹ میں جناب والا! یہ شق اس طرح شروع ہوا۔

“Subject to the rules and regulations, if any, the Corporation may carry out, transact and do several kinds of business or acts hereinafter specified, namely, (a) to sanction loans, debts or cash credit in accordance with the policy either directly or through scheduled banks under an agreement.”

And the last para (m) in this section: “to do all other acts and things in furtherance of this Act.”

Reference is there because otherwise we do not provide this condition here. I beg to differ with my learned friend, for when you say prescribed, it always means prescribed under the rules and the rule making power is given only under section 33 which means it is upto them and not for him. They may submit those rules for the approval of the National Assembly whenever they like. That is besides the point. I am not going into that point. It is for the National Assembly to go into the point whether those rules have been laid before it or not. When it is mentioned that such and such things will be done as prescribed, that means prescribed under the rules and not beyond that. And the rule making power, as I mentioned in the beginning of my speech, is given under section 33. Therefore, Sir, any rule whether under this clause or any other clause, which will be framed, will only be framed under section 33. So, Sir, there cannot be a new set of rules, as my learned friend has tried to put before the House. Therefore, Sir, I think, this portion, which I have requested this honourable House to delete, must be deleted. It is necessary that it should be deleted. It is redundant, it is superfluous. Sir, you know in law no extra word should be used otherwise it will create complications, it will create difficulties, of course, lot of such difficulties as we have

been resolving since we met today in the evening. Therefore, Sir, I very humbly submit that my learned and my honourable friend the Finance Minister should accept my amendment.

**Ch. Mohammad Hanif Khan:** Actually, if the amendment is very necessary or reasonable, we may accept, but I have already made the submission that the People's Finance Corporation has to discharge a wide spectrum of subjects. So far as these people are concerned, the number of these poor people, who are to be dealt with under the rules and regulations, which are going to be prescribed, is going to be very limited, and the other rules are going to be submitted before the National Assembly. But it will take time and we actually want to provide assistance to these people straightaway without any loss of time. It is very important that we should provide assistance to these people. It will make the whole job very easy. Within two or three days the rules will be ready.

**Mr. Chairman:** The question before the House is:

“That in Clause 3 of the Bill in the proposed sub-section (1) of Section 18, the full stop be added after the word ‘Corporation’ occurring in the 5th line and the subsequent words, coma and full stop be deleted.”

*(The motion was negatived)*

**Mr. Chairman:** Now, I put Clause 3. The question before the House is:

“That Clause 3 does stand part of the Bill.”

*(The motion was adopted)*

**Mr. Chairman:** Clause 3 does stand part of the Bill.

Now, we are left only with Clause 1 and Preamble.

The question before the House is:

“That Preamble, Short Title and Clause 1 do stand part of the Bill.”

*(The motion was adopted)*

**Mr. Chairman:** The Preamble, Short Title and Clause 1 form part of the Bill. Next.

**Ch. Mohammad Hanif Khan:** I beg to move:

“That the Bill to amend the People's Finance Corporation Act, 1972 [The People's Finance Corporation (Amendment) Bill, 1974], be passed.”

**Mr. Chairman:** The motion before the House is:

“That the Bill to amend the People's Finance Corporation Act, 1972 [The People's Finance Corporation (Amendment) Bill, 1974], be passed.”

**Khawaja Mohammad Safdar:** Opposed.

**Ch. Mohammad Hanif Khan:** But there is no speech. This is just a formality—opposed but no speech. So, should I oppose?

**Khawaja Mohammad Safdar:** Do you oppose your own Bill?

**Mr. Chairman:** The question before the House is:

“That the Bill to amend the People's Finance Corporation Act, 1972 [The People's Finance Corporation (Amendment) Bill, 1974], be passed.”

*(The motion was adopted)*

**Mr. Chairman:** The Bill stands passed. Now, we take up the other one.

Yes, you can proceed.

#### THE FRONTIER CORPS (AMNEDMENT) BILL, 1974

**Mr. Abdul Qaiyum Khan:** Sir, I beg to move:

“That the Bill further to amend the Frontier Corps Ordinance, 1959 [The Frontier Corps (Amendment) Bill, 1974], as passed by the National Assembly, be taken into consideration”.

**Mr. Chairman:** The motion before the House is:

“That the Bill further to amend the Frontier Corps Ordinance, 1959 [The Frontier Corps (Amendment) Bill, 1974], as passed by the National Assembly, be taken into consideration.”

**Mr. Abdul Qaiyum Khan:** There is nothing in this Bill. The only thing is that we have now set up a separate Frontier Corps for Baluchistan, and we have to appoint a separate Inspector General and Deputy Inspectors General. It is only a formal thing. The whole thing is being done in the interest of efficiency and better administration, and I hope that the House will pass this Bill.

**Mr. Chairman:** Yes, not opposed?

**Khawaja Mohammad Safdar:** Sir, I beg to move:

“That the Frontier Corps Amendment Bill, 1974, as passed by the National Assembly, be referred to the Standing Committee concerned.”

**Mr. Abdul Qaiyum Khan:** It is opposed, Sir! Sir, I am sorry my learned friend is opposing it. There was a Standing Committee in the National Assembly, and even the National Assembly did not think it worthwhile to have a Standing Committee meeting on it. It is only that instead of one Inspector General, we are going to have a separate one for Baluchistan, and I do not think any one should oppose it. It is very simple.

*(Interruptions)*

**Mr. Chairman:** Khawaja Sahib, you talk between yourself while sitting. You have moved your amendment, and that amendment is to be put to the House.

**Khawaja Mohammad Safdar:** Yes, Sir.

**Mr. Chairman:** And you did not allow me time to put it to the House. The amendment moved is:

“That the Frontier Corps (Amendment) Bill, 1974, as passed by the National Assembly, be referred to the Standing Committee concerned.”

So, the question before the House is:

“That the Frontier Corps Amendment Bill, 1974, as passed by the National Assembly, be referred to the Standing Committee concerned.

*(The motion was negatived)*

**Mr. Chairman:** The amendment is rejected.

Now, the motion before the House is:

“That the Bill further to amend the Frontier Corps Ordinance, 1959 [The Frontier Corps (Amendment) Bill, 1974], as passed by the National Assembly, be taken into consideration.”

*(The motion was adopted)*

**Mr. Chairman:** Now, we take up the next question.

**Mr. Abdul Qaiyum Khan:** Sir, I beg to move:

“That the Bill further to amend the Frontier Corps Ordinance, 1959 [The Frontier Corps (Amendment) Bill, 1974], be passed.”

**Mr. Chairman:** No, I will have first to move it clause by clause. There are no amendments. The question before the House is:

“That Clauses 2, 3 and 4 of the Bill stand part of the Bill.”

*(The motion was adopted)*

**Mr. Chairman:** Now, the question before the House is:

“That Preamble, Short Title and Clause 1 form part of the Bill.”

*(The motion was adopted)*

**Mr. Abdul Qaiyum Khan:** Sir, I beg to move:

“That the Bill further to amend the Frontier Corps Ordinance, 1959 [The Frontier Corps (Amendment) Bill, 1974], be passed.”

**Mr. Chairman:** The question before the House is:

“That the Bill further to amend the Frontier Corps Ordinance, 1959 [The Frontier Corps (Amendment) Bill, 1974], be passed.”

*(The motion was adopted)*

**Mr. Chairman:** The Bill stands passed.

**Mr. Abdul Qaiyum Khan:** Sir, as regards the other Bill, I am accepting quite a number of his amendments, and I gave him advance news about this.

**Mr. Chairman:** Are you accepting his amendments?

**Mr. Abdul Qaiyum Khan:** Yes, Sir, quite a number of them.

**Mr. Chairman:** All right, we will do it tomorrow. The House stands adjourned to meet again tomorrow at 10.00 a.m.

**Mr. Abdul Qaiyum Khan:** Sir, tomorrow at 10.00 a.m. the Prime Minister has fixed a discussion on the Five Year Plan.

**Mr. Chairman:** You want me to meet at what time ?

**Mr. Abdul Qaiyum Khan:** 5.30 p.m. Sir.

**An honourable Member:** Why not 4.30 p.m.?

**Mr. Chairman:** Now, in view of the request made by the honourable Minister, I amend my earlier decision. The House now stands adjourned to meet at 4.00 p.m. tomorrow.

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The Senate adjourned till four of the clock in the evening on December 10, 1974.

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
