MARKING IN URDU MEDIUM SCHOOLS

118. *Mr. Ahmad Waheed Akhtar : Will the Minister for Education and Provincial Coordination be pleased to state :

(a) whether it is a fact that Urdu Medium Schools which are under the control of Federal Government do not give detailed marks obtained by the students in the mark sheet ;

(b) if answer to (a) above be in the affirmative, whether it is done under any instructions issued by the Government ; if so, the reasons therefor ; and

(c) if answer to (b) above be in the negative, whether Government intends to direct the authorities of the schools referred to (a) above to issue a detailed mark-sheet to the students ?

(a) Some of the schools issue detailed mark sheets while others do not, mainly those taken over recently.

RECRUITMENT IN PAKISTAN SECURITY PRINTING CORPORATION

80. *Khawaja Mohammad Safdar (Put by Maulana Shah Ahmad Noorani Siddiqi) : Will the Minister for Finance Planning and Development be pleased to state :

(a) whether it is a fact that during the past few months some officers have been recruited in Pakistan Security Printing Corporation ; if so, their names, designations and their monthly salaries ;

(b) whether it is a fact that the officers mentioned in (a) above are drawing much higher salaries as compared to other officers who are serving the Corporation in similar capacities ; if so, the reasons therefor ; and

(c) whether it is also a fact that three of the officers already serving the Corporation have resigned in protest against giving higher salaries to newly-recruited officers ?

Rana Mohammad Hanif Khan : (a) Yes. The names, designations and monthly salaries of the newly-recruited officers are given in Annexure.

(b) Yes. Higher salaries above the minimum have been offered to the newly-recruited officers in view of their better educational and technical qualifications.

PAYMENT FOR CURRENCY NOTES OF REPATRIATES

105. *Khawaja Mohammad Safdar (Put by Maulana Shah Ahmad Noorani Siddiqi) : Will the Minister for Finance, Planning and Development be pleased to refer to the answer to starred question No. 110 given in the Senate on 23rd December, 1975, and state the steps so far taken to pay to the repatriates the value of the currency notes so received ?

Rana Mohammad Hanif Khan : Three committees have been constituted to verify and scrutinize the claims for *ex-gratia* payment in lieu of demonetised Pakistani banknotes surrendered by repatriates. One of the committees has scrutinized 32,491 cases involving Rs. 85,03,045. Examination of the remaining 22,493 cases involving Rs. 39,13,290 is likely to be completed by the end of April, 1976.

So far payment of Rs. 87,065 has been made to civil internees and Rs. 14,770 to Defence personnel.

The figures need correction because on the day this reply was supplied to the Senate the amount was Rs. 87,065 and Rs. 14,770 but now the payment made to civil internees is Rs. 6,48,410 and the payment made to Defence personnel is Rs. 2,31,540. This is the latest position.

THE PROVINCIAL SERVICE TRIBUNALS (EXTENSION OF PROVISIONS OF THE CONSTITUTION) (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1976

Major-General (Retd.) Jamal Dar (Minister of State for Establishment):
