Dr. Arbab Alamgir Khan: NHA is lately following three modes for plantation along Motor ways and GT Road (N-5):—

1. *Greener Pakistan Voluntary Program.*—Main objective of this program, launched in Jan 2009, is to seek voluntary support of government, semi-government, national, multinational, non-governmental organizations, etc, for plantation. Progress is at **Annex-A,**
2. *Deposit Work.*—Two plantation projects launched through Provincial Forest Departments. Details are at **Annex-A.**
3. *Open Bidding:*
 - a. Tree plantation and landscaping at Loops 1 and 2 of Zero Point Interchange (M-I) awarded to M/s. Ikan Engg Services. Total 30,000 trees planted.
 - b. NHA has recently procured 12 afforestation contracts along N-5 under the National Highway Improvement Program. Total 800,000 trees will be planted from Karachi to Peshawar. Work is in progress, Details are at **Annex-B.**

Annexure-A

AFFORESTATION ALONG NHA NETWORK
GREENER PAKISTAN VOLUNTARY PROGRAM

1. **First** MoU signed with Pakistan Tobacco Coy (PTC) for plantation along Motorway M-1. PTC planted 200,000 plants in 2009 on RoW and median. Spring plantations will now commence. Maintenance responsibility for rests with NHA and has been out-sourced.
2. **Second** MoU with Lakson Tobacco Coy for replanting of trees and establishment of two main nurseries with necessary infrastructure having capacity of 20 million saplings on Motorway M-2 is being concluded.

3. **Third** MoU with Pakistan State Oil for plantation on Salt Range upto Lillah Interchange is under discussion.

FOREST DEPARTMENT DEPOSIT WORK

4. **Islamabad-Burhan (M-1).**

Afforestation contract along this section, which was opened to traffic in Sept 2004, was awarded to Punjab Forest Department as deposit work in 2004-05 for Rs 39.86 million. A total of 166,266 plants were to be planted till 2006, thereafter, upto 2012, the Forest Department was to ensure maintenance.

5. **Rashakai–Charsada (M-1).**

Plantation was undertaken by NWFP Forest Department as NHA's deposit work through a MoU signed on Jul 1, 2007 valid upto Jun 30, 2012 costing Rs 26.506 million for 107,272 plants. Total 80,000 plants since planted.

Sardar Aseff Ahmed Ali: (a) There are **06** (Six) women universities/ degree awarding institutes (05 public & 01 private) in the country.

(b) Presently, cases of following four women Universities are under consideration to be established in the country:—

- Women University, Multan
- Women University, AJK
- Women University, Faisalabad
- Women University, Sukkur

The PC-I for Women University, Multan has been approved and implementation has been initiated while the other projects are under preparation of the respective Provincial/ AJK Governments.

Will the Minister for Local Government and Rural Development be pleased to state the mechanism devised by the Government to monitor the standard of work on the development schemes submitted by the parliamentarians out of their development funds?

Mr. Justice (Retd.) Abdul Razzaq A. Thahim: Approximately 35000 Development schemes have been executed under TPP/KP-I and PWP-I from 2002 to 2009, as sponsored by the Parliamentarians. These schemes are executed by various Federal agencies and Provincial & District Governments. The agencies observe their own codal formalities and also monitor the standard of work as per their laid down procedure. Monitoring the standard of work of this large number of schemes requires, a very extensive network at Federal, Provincial and District level. However progress of implementation is periodically reviewed in Federal Development Committee's Meetings represented by all concerned. Physical inspection is also being carried out by representatives of the Ministry and representatives of the Provincial/District Governments.

Dr. Arbab Alamgir Khan: (a) The total estimated / approved cost of the Pakistan Transport Plan Study (PTPS) is Rs. 38.7 million including FEC of Rs. 24.0 million. The entire foreign exchange component has been provided by the Government of Japan through JICA.

(b) Rs. 1,000,000/- have been allocated in the PSDP 2009-10. Against the released amount of Rs 250,000/-, an expenditure of Rs. 173,198/- has so far been incurred

(b) Rs. 800,000/- have been allocated in the PSDP 2009-10. Against the released amount of Rs. 200,000/-, an expenditure of Rs. 51,515/- has been incurred.
