DEFERRED QUESTIONS

(Questions Nos. 40, 42, 45, 51, 52, 53, 81, 85, 86, 89, 90, 49 and 54 were set down for answering on 8th March, 2013 (91st Session) but were deferred)

40. ***Mrs. Farah Aqil:** (Notice received on 07-01-2013 at 10:20 a.m.)

Will the Minister for Housing and Works be pleased to state:

- (a) *whether it is a fact that the road constructed by Pak PWD in Street 2, Bani Gala, Islamabad, out of my development funds for the year 2011-12, is in dilapidated condition; and*
- (b) *whether any inquiry has been conducted into the sub-standard work of the said road, if so, the action taken against the contractor / officials responsible for the sub-standard work, if not, its reasons?*

Mr. Usman Ibrahim: (a) No, it is not a fact that the road constructed by Pak PWD in Street No. 2 Bani Gala Islamabad is in dilapidated condition. The concerned Assistant Executive Engineer alongwith Sub-Engineer and contractor visited the said road and reported that the said road is in good condition, however the local bodies have damaged the existing P.C.C. Street by cutting at some locations for the crossing of Gas Pipeline, which have been repaired.

(b) Keeping in view the above narrated position, no inquiry in matter is required to be conducted.

42. ***Col. (R) Syed Tahir Hussain Mashhadi:** (Notice received on 07-01-2013 at 10:25 a.m.)

Will the Minister for Housing and Works be pleased to state:

- (a) *the number of Government Employees registered so far for the housing scheme launched by the Federal Government Employees Housing Foundation with year-wise and category-wise break-up; and*
- (b) *the amount collected as registration fee from the said employees with year-wise break-up?*

Mr. Usman Ibrahim: (a) Housing Foundation announced Membership Drive on 28th August 2009 with the approval of the Prime Minister of Pakistan. Total 20167 members have been registered so far under membership drive. Year-wise and category-wise list is at **Annexure-A**.

(b) Total Rs. 479,240,000/- have been collected as registration fee from the said employees. Year-wise detail is at **Annexure-B**.

45. ***Mr. Muhammad Talha Mehmood:** (Notice received on 08-01-2013 at 09:00 a.m.)

Will the Minister for Housing and Works be pleased to state whether there is any proposal under consideration of the Government to enhance rental ceiling of the Government employees for hiring residences, if so, when?

Mr. Usman Ibrahim: A Summary was moved on 28-11-2012 to the Prime Minister's Secretariat on the advice of Finance Division for 25% enhancement in the existing rental ceiling. However, the Summary has been retrieved by the Finance Division. Subsequent action the Finance Division is awaited.

51. ***Mr. Muhammad Talha Mehmood:** (Notice received on 10-01-2013 at 09:15 a.m.)

Will the Minister for Housing and Works be pleased to state:

- (a) *the estimated number of homeless families in the country; and*
- (b) *the steps being taken by the Government to provide housing facilities to the said families?*

Mr. Usman Ibrahim: (a) The housing backlog as estimated according to the 1998 census was 4.30 million units which is now projected as 7 million units, thereby rendering about 7 million families as homeless.

(b) To overcome the housing backlog and recurring shortfall Prime Minister has announced a Housing Programme for construction of one million housing units throughout the country which is under implementation at Federal level and also by Provincial Governments.

52. ***Maulana Muhammad Saleh Shah:** (Notice received on 10-01-2013 at 16:40 p.m.)

Will the Minister for Housing and Works be pleased to state:

- (a) the names and designations of Officers in BPS-22 who have been allotted one kanal plots under the Prime Minister package since its inception indicating also the number and location of plot in each case;*
- (b) whether it is a fact that the apex Court has recently struck down some of the said allotments, if so, the details of such allotments with names of the allottees;*
- (c) the reasons for striking down the said allotments and steps taken to allot them plots; and*
- (d) the names and designation of the officers in BPS-22 who have not been allotted plots under the said package so far indicating also the reasons thereof and the steps being taken by the Government to allot them plots?*

Mr. Usman Ibrahim: (a) A list showing names, designations and location of plots allotted to BS-22 officers under Prime Minister's Assistance Package Scheme is enclosed at Annex-A.

(b) Some of the BS-22 officers were allotted newly created plots in Sector G-13, Islamabad under Prime Minister's Assistance Package Scheme. The apex court has recently struck down the creation of these plots. The names of the officers alongwith plots affected by the decision of the apex court are mentioned in the list enclosed at Annex-B.

(c) The plots were newly created at inutility area (excess area) of Sector G-13 earlier reserved for parks, school and nullah of the sector. The Welfare Committee of residents of Sector G-13 filed a writ petition against creation of these plots in Islamabad High Court on the grounds that basic amenities such as park, schools were abolished due to creation of these plots. The High Court decided in favour of the Welfare Committee of Sector G-13, however the Housing Foundation filed an appeal in Supreme Court of Pakistan against the said judgment. The Supreme Court has turned down appeal of the Housing Foundation and upheld the decision of the Islamabad High Court. The FGE Housing Foundation is going to file review petition. A requisition has also been sent to CDA to provide alternate plots in Sector D-12 or any other comparative developed sector for allotment of these Officers.

(d) The names and designations of those officers who have not been allotted plots under Prime Minister Assistance Package are mentioned at Annex-C. The Ministry of Housing & Works has requested CDA to provide at least 200

developed plots. On availability of plots, allotments to remaining officers would be issued by Housing Foundation.

(Annexures have been placed on the Table of the House as well as Library.)

53. ***Maulana Muhammad Saleh Shah:** (Notice received on 10-01-2013 at 16:40 p.m.)

Will the Minister for Housing and Works be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is fact that the Federal Government Employees Housing Foundation initiated a housing scheme at Bara Kahu, Islamabad, in 2009;*
- (b) whether it is also a fact that the Supreme Court of Pakistan has taken notice of the scheme, if so, the findings of the court; and*
- (c) the steps taken by the Government for provision of plots to the employees who have been retired after the initiation of the Bara Kahu housing scheme or retiring till the finalization of the case by the Supreme Court?*

Mr. Usman Ibrahim: (a) Federal Government Employees Housing Foundation with the approval of the Executive Committee / Board of Directors of Housing Foundation purchased 3000 kanals of land in Bara Kahu, Zone-IV, Islamabad for developing a housing scheme on ownership basis for Federal Government Employees in 2009.

(b) Supreme Court took *Suo-Moto* Notice in May 2009. M/s Green Tree (Pvt) Ltd. had submitted various options before the Hon'ble Supreme Court of Pakistan to resolve the matter. The Supreme Court has directed Executive Committee on 22-11-2012 to review its decision. The Executive Committee meeting held on 29-11-2012 to constitute a sub-committee and present its report within 15 days. The report of the committee will be submitted to Executive Committee, immediately. The Hon'able Supreme Court will be intimated accordingly.

(c) Registration of Federal Government Employees for allotment of plot/apartment on first come first serve basis serving and retired Federal Government employees. The quota for retired employees has been enhanced as under:—

- i. Employees of Federal Government who would retired during the period 01-07-2009 to 31-12-2010. 10%
- ii. Old retirees who did not get any plot from FGEHF/CDA 10%

81. ***Col. (R) Syed Tahir Hussain Mashhadi:** (Notice received on 09-01-2013 at 10:30 a.m.)

Will the Minister for Housing and Works be pleased to state:

- (a) *whether it is a fact that the Federal Government Employees Housing Foundation (FGEHF) collected registration fee from Government employees in connection with allotment of plots in a housing scheme in 2010, if so, the name of the bank authorized to collect that fee;*
- (b) *the time by which the scheme will be launched indicating also the sector earmarked for the purpose; and*
- (c) *the criteria adopted for determining priority / seniority for allotment of plots in the said scheme?*

Mr. Usman Ibrahim: (a) Federal Government Employees Housing Foundation announced Membership Drive on 28th August 2009 with the approval of the Prime Minister of Pakistan. Membership requires one time registration fee for entitlement of plot/apartment in all future schemes of FGE Housing Foundation. Askari Commercial Bank is authorized to collect the Membership Drive fee.

(b) There are two projects in pipe-line:—

- (i) Proposed Housing Scheme at Bara Kahu, Zone-IV, Islamabad. The project will be completed in 30 months after issuance of NOC from CDA. The exact date of launching could however not be instantly given as the project is subjudice before the Honorable Supreme Court under *Suo-Moto*.
- (ii) G+14 storey apartments scheme in Sector G-13, Islamabad. The project will be completed in 48 months after launch. The tentative date of launching is August 2013. The Housing Foundation is, instantly, pursuing CDA for issuance of NOC for the project.

(c) Registration / Seniority of members is based on the date of deposit of fee **on first come first serve basis**. Only the registered employees would be entertained for allotment in all future schemes.

85. ***Mrs. Nuzhat Sadiq:** (Notice received on 18-01-2013 at 15:30 p.m.)

Will the Minister for Housing and Works be pleased to state:

- (a) *the date on which summary for allocation of Sector F-14, Islamabad for Housing Scheme for Government employees was submitted to the Prime Minister of Pakistan; and*

- (b) *the steps taken by the Ministry of Housing so far to pursue the case with the Prime Minister and make arrangements for early development of the siad sector for Government employees?*

Mr. Usman Ibrahim: (a) The Summary for the Prime Minister for allocation of land in Sector F-14 was initiated by the Ministry of Housing and Works through Cabinet Secretary on 20-09-2011 (copy of Summary at Annex-A).

(b) The Cabinet Division *vide* its letter No.5/1/2004-CDA.II dated 29-05-2012 (Annex-B) intimated that a meeting was held on 21-03-2012 under the chairmanship of Cabinet Secretary to discuss the un-resolved cases and a committee has been constituted under the chairmanship of Cabinet Secretary on the directive of Prime Minister to discuss and resolve the issue pertaining to allocation of land for Federal Government Employees Housing Scheme in Islamabad. In the meeting convened on 21-03-2012, it was decided to seek detail of reports/various proposals with regards to allocation of land for FGE Housing Foundation, Pakistan Housing Authority and Capital Development Authority. In compliance with the decision of the above said committee, the FGE Housing Foundation has submitted its report to the Cabinet Division *vide* letter No.10(F-12)/Tech/HF/2005 dated 11-06-2012 (Annex-C). No further meeting of the committee has been convened as yet. The Ministry of Housing is pursuing this matter with Cabinet Division for an early decision.

86. ***Mrs. Nuzhat Sadiq:** (Notice received on 18-01-2013 at 15:30 p.m.)

Will the Minister for Housing and Works be pleased to state:

- (a) *the date on which development work was started on officer's Housing Scheme, Kurri Road, Islamabad;*
- (b) *the number of interruptions in the development work took place since its start indicating also the reasons for each interruption; and*
- (c) *the name of officers / officials found responsible for interruptions in the development work and action taken against them?*

Mr. Usman Ibrahim: (a) The development work on Officer's Housing Scheme, Kurri Road, Islamabad was awarded to the Contractor on March 22, 2012.

(b) The main interruption is the delayed handing over of the land by CDA. The possession was taken over in the last week of September, 2012. A total of 90.82 acres land was to be handed over to PHAF by CDA while only 80 acres are given to PHAF so far.

(c) The matter regarding possession of remaining land from CDA is being vigorously pursued by PHAF to avoid interruptions in the development works.

89. ***Mr. Muhammad Mohsin Khan Leghari:** (Notice received on 22-01-2013 at 14:40 p.m.)

Will the Minister for Housing and Works be pleased to state:

- (a) *the total amount deposited so far by the allottees of the Officer's Housing Scheme, Kurri Road, Islamabad;*
- (b) *the amount utilized out of the same so far with head wise break up; and*
- (c) *the balance amount indicating also the head of account where it has been kept?*

Mr. Usman Ibrahim: (a) The total amount deposited so far by the allottees of the Officer's Housing Scheme, Kuri Road, Islamabad is Rs. 1,296.32 Million.

(b) So far Rs. 255.84 Million have been utilized out of the total amount deposited by the allottees of the Officer's Housing Scheme, Kuri Road, Islamabad. The head wise breakup of the amount utilized so far is given below:

90. ***Mr. Muhammad Mohsin Khan Leghari:** (Notice received on 22-01-2013 at 14:40 p.m.)

Will the Minister for Housing and Works be pleased to state:

- (a) *whether it is fact that a number of allottees of the Officer's Housing Scheme, Kurri Road, Islamabad, are not depositing their installment in time due to inordinate delay in development work of the scheme; and*
- (b) *whether it is also a fact that the terms of the said scheme provide for 2% penalty on late payment, if so, the steps taken by the Government to remove this penalty and reconsider / revise the schedule for payment in view of the slow pace of development work on the scheme?*

Mr. Usman Ibrahim: (a) Yes, it is a fact that few allottees were not depositing their installments owing to the slow pace of development.

(b) As per terms and conditions of the allotment, 2% of the delayed payment amount is levied as penalty charges owing to delay in payment by the allottee. However, in view of slow progress of infrastructure development on the site, the Board of Directors, PHA Foundation in its 7th Board meeting allowed six (06) months relaxation in payment of installment to allottees of Kuri Road Housing Project.

49. ***Col. (R) Syed Tahir Hussain Mashhadi:** (Notice received on 13-02-2013 at 10:40 a.m.)

Will the Minister for Housing and Works be pleased to state:

- (a) *the names of employees of Islamabad Police illegally occupying Government accommodation in Islamabad; and*
- (b) *the steps-taken by the Government to get vacated the said accommodations?*

Mr. Usman Ibrahim: (a) A list showing the names of employees of Islamabad Police illegally occupying Government Accommodation in Islamabad is at **Annex-A**.

(b) Steps for vacation were initiated in these cases but the un-authorized occupants have got stay orders from various courts. These stay orders are being contested in the Courts.

54. ***Ch. Mohammad Jaffar Iqbal :** (Notice received on 14-02-2013 at 9:04 a.m.)

Will the Minister for Water and Power be pleased to state:

- (a) the number of violations of Indus Water treaty made by India since 1st January, 2000 and the action taken by the Government of Pakistan thereon;*
- (b) whether it is a fact that India has constructed Nimoo-Bazgo and Chuttak hydropower projects on Indus river in violation of the said Treaty and the relevant Pakistani Institutions have failed to take up such violations at appropriate forum within statutory parameters, if so, the reasons thereof;*
- (c) whether it is also a fact that an inquiry committee was constituted to assess negligence on the part of Pakistani Institutions in connection with said violations, if so, the findings of that committee; and*
- (d) the names and designation of the persons found responsible for the said negligence by the said inquiry committee and the action taken against them?*

Khawaja Muhammad Asif: (a) Since January 2000, India committed a number of violations of the Indus Waters Treaty. These pertained to the following categories.

- (i) Not following the design criteria given in the Treaty (e.g. Baglihar dam, Kishenganga dam).
- (ii) Starting construction without informing Pakistan (Chutak Hydroelectric Plant constructed on a tributary of the Indus River) and,
- (iii) Not following the operational provisions (e.g. first filling of Baglihar dam).

On all these violations either Government of Pakistan checked Indian violation as per the dispute resolution mechanism given in the Treaty or did not press its objections where there was no impact on Pakistan or India provided plausible justification of its designs; the details are given in the following paragraphs.

1. Violation of design criteria in case of Baglihar Hydroelectric Plant (HEP) on Chenab River.
2. In 2006, start of construction without informing Pakistan of 44 MW Chutak HEP on Suru River, a tributary of the Indus.
3. In August 2008, India started initial filling of dead storage of Baglihar HEP without consultation with Pakistan.
4. India's design which involved diversion of waters of Kishenganga river to Jhelum Basin would adversely affect environment and hydroelectric uses

downstream of Line of Control in AJK was without consideration of the relevant Treaty provisions.

5. India's design of Nimoo Bazgo HEP violated certain provisions of the Treaty.

Steps taken by the Government of Pakistan upon violations by India during the last four years :

1. In case of Baglihar, Pakistan took up the case with Neutral Expert who determined that Pakistan's objections were valid in 3 out of 4 design parameters on which Pakistan had objected. One objection pertaining to crest level of spillway was decided in India's favour; the decision of NE on spillway clearly ignored the relevant Treaty provisions. The basis on which the Neutral Expert gave decision has now been rejected by the Court of Arbitration in Kishenganga Case.
2. Regarding start of construction of Chutak HEP, Pakistan Commissioner for Indus Waters took up the matter with India at the highest level and India provided the design of the project in November 2007.
3. Pakistan strongly protested on initial filling of Baglihar Plant without involving Pakistan and after discussions in many meetings and site visits, India assured Pakistan that it will be careful in future in such cases.
4. Regarding Kishenganga Pakistan has challenged diversion of water to Indian Occupied Kashmir and substantiated that the design would adversely impact the environment and hydel power generation in Pakistan which is in violation of the Treaty provisions. Proceedings of the case have been completed and Partial Award has been announced. The final decision would be given in December 2013.

(b) As noted above, the case of Chutak HEP has been settled at the level of Permanent Indus Commission.

With reference to taking of Nimoo-Bazgo Hydroelectric Project case to the Neutral Expert; the matter was considered in the back drop of an earlier experience which Pakistan had regarding Baglihar Dam of India, in which case Neutral Expert had not given ruling in our favour. Hence, in view of this fact and in larger interest of the country, it was decided not to take the matter to the Neutral Expert. Rather, it was deemed proper to follow an alternative course of action by taking the issue of legal interpretation of certain clauses of Indus Waters Treaty to the Court of Arbitration. Accordingly a general question for legal interpretation was framed in Kishenganga case, which has been conclusively decided in Pakistan's favour in the Partial Award given by the Court in February 2013.

Thus, a strategically appropriate course was adopted by the relevant institutions of Government of Pakistan due to which Pakistan is now in a much better position to take up such cases against India even at the level of Neutral Expert, as a clear interpretation of the relevant clauses is now available in the matter.

Issue with regard to Chutak Hydro Power Project has already been explained at Para b (2) above.

(c) No inquiry has been constituted to assess negligence on part of Pakistani institutions. However, an inquiry committee was constituted against the former Pakistan Commissioner for Indus Waters, Syed Jamait Ali Shah. According to the findings of the committee, Mr. Shah was exonerated from the charges placed against him.

(d) As inquiry committees constituted to assess negligence on part of some officials have not held anybody responsible for negligence, the answer to this question is to be taken as nil.

@7. ***Mrs. Rubina Khalid:** (Notice received on 05-07-2013 at 13:40 p.m.)

Will the Minister for Inter Provincial Coordination be pleased to state:

- (a) *the number of FA equivalence certificates issued by Inter Board Committee of Chairmen to the students / persons holding high school equivalence diploma from USA from 1st January, 2000 to 1st January, 2008; and*
- (b) *whether the testimonials / certificates submitted by the said students/ persons were got verified from the concerned educational institutions in America, if so, the number of such testimonials / certificates, names of educational institutions and the students concerned?*

Mr. Riaz Hussain Pirzada: (a) No separate country-wise record is maintained.

(b) Verification of certificates from the concerned institutions is a pre-requisite. However, no separate country-wise record is maintained.

Will the Minister for Petroleum and Natural Resources be pleased to state:

- (a) *the number of persons appointed on regular, contract, daily wages and third party contract (out source) basis in PSO since 2008 with province-wise and grade-wise break-up; and*
- (b) *the procedure adopted for appointment of the said persons?*

Will the Minister for Petroleum and Natural Resources be pleased to state:

- (b) *whether the said incumbent has dual nationality?*

Will the Minister for Foreign Affairs be pleased to state:

- (b) *the details of complaints received against the said persons during the last three years indicating also the action taken in each case?*

53. *Mr. Heman Daas: (Notice received on 23-04-2013 at 15:30 p.m.)

Will the Minister for Water and Power be pleased to state:

- (a) *the name and location of each Independent Power Producer (IPP) in the country; and*
- (b) *the terms and conditions settled with each unit for production and purchase of electricity?*

Khawaja Muhammad Asif: (a) Currently there are twenty nine (29) Independent Private Power Projects (IPPs) operational in Pakistan having a cumulative gross capacity of **8,657 MW** listed as follows:

54. *Col. (R) Syed Tahir Hussain Mashhadi: (Notice received on 24-04-2013 at 09:30 a.m.)

Will the Minister for Housing and Works be pleased to state:

- (a) *the steps being taken by the Government to resolve the issue of shortage of Government owned residential accommodations in Islamabad; and*

(b) *whether there is any proposal under consideration of the Government to construct flats / houses in Islamabad for the Government employees during the current financial year?*

Mr. Usman Ibrahim: (a) The construction of new houses/flats was stopped on imposition of ban by the Cabinet since 1995.

(b) No, as the ban imposed in 1995 could not be lifted till date. However, the Prime Minister in a meeting held on 27.04.2009 reviewed the matter and was pleased to direct the Ministry of Housing and Works to submit a Summary proposing lifting of ban, which has been initiated, but decision thereof not yet conveyed.

55. ***Col. (R) Syed Tahir Hussain Mashhadi:** (Notice received on 24-04-2013 at 09:30 a.m.)

Will the Minister for Petroleum and Natural Resources be pleased to state:

(a) *whether it is fact that Sui Southern Gas company limited is at the verge of bankruptcy, if so, the reasons thereof; and*

(b) *the dues and receivables of Sui Southern Gas company at the credit of KESC, WAPDA, Pakistan Steel Mills and other public entrepreneurs and the recoveries made thereof during the last five years?*

Mr. Shahid Khaqan Abbasi: (a) SSGC is facing severe financial problems due to non-payment of dues from KESC, Pakistan Steel Mills (PSM), WAPDA, Non-recovery of Gas Development Surcharge (GDS) and Non-release of Sales Tax Refund Claims which may lead to a position where SSGC will default on payments to Gas producers.

Will the Minister for Housing and Works be pleased to state:

- whether it is a fact that former Prime Minister, Raja Pervaiz Ashraf, approved plots to officers in BPS-22 under Prime Minister's package, if so, the names, date of Birth/superannuation and names of departments/occupational group of such officers;*
- whether it is also a fact that allotment of plots has either not been made or had been made on conditional basis to the officers of the National Assembly and the Senate under the said package;*
- whether it is further a fact that despite Supreme Court of Pakistan's judgment declaring the employees of the Parliament as "Civil Servant" and the Public Accounts Committee's direction to treat the officers of the Parliament in BS-22 at par with the officers in BS-22 of other groups, the Secretary / Special Secretary of the Senate and National Assembly have been treated differently, if so, the officers/authorities responsible for the defiance of court judgment and/or PAC Directions; and*
- the present status of allotment of plots to the officers of the Senate and the National Assembly under the scheme?*

Mr. Usman Ibrahim: (a) The then Prime Minister of Pakistan, in 2006, approved an Assistance Package for BS-22 Officers including allotment of plots in addition to the one allotted on the basis of age-wise seniority. The criteria of the scheme was formulated by Ministry of Interior and approved by the Prime Minister's Secretariat. According to the criteria, BS-22 officers of the regularly constituted occupational groups and Hon'ble Judges of Supreme Court of Pakistan are eligible for allotment of plot under the said package. The plots are made available by the CDA whereas, allotments are issued by Ministry of Housing and Works through Federal Government Employees Housing Foundation. So far, 213 allotments have been made under the said scheme and still 128 BS-22 officers and Hon'ble Judges of Supreme Court of Pakistan are on the waiting list. Initially, CDA provided plots in Sector D-12 for allotment to BS-22 officers. Afterwards, CDA regretted to create further plots due to non-availability of land. On 8th February, 2013, a summary was sent to the Prime Minister for allocation of plots in Zone-IV of Islamabad which was approved and CDA was directed to develop 200 plots there for allotments to those BS-22 officers and Hon'ble Judges who are on the waiting list / for future requirements. Present waiting list of 98 BS-22 Officers and 07 Hon'ble Judges of Supreme Court of Pakistan and 23 Officers who were allotted plots had been declared illegal by the Court of Law allotment to be substituted (Total 128 plots) is at **Annex-A**.

(b) Allotments are issued under the said Prime Minister's Assistance Package Scheme on recommendation of Establishment Division. Three allotments were issued to the officers of National Assembly / Senate Secretariat on the recommendation of their controlling department. But Establishment Division stated that since they do not belong to any constitutional group, they are not entitled for allotment under the criteria of the scheme approved by the Prime Minister (**Annex-B**).

(c) The allotments under the said package are made by the Housing Foundation on the recommendation of Establishment Division or controlling Ministry of the officer. As per clarification received from Establishment Division, only BS-22 officers of the regularly constituted occupational groups are entitled for allotment of plots in pursuance of the criteria of the scheme approved by the Prime Minister.

(d) The allotments made to the Officers of Senate and National Assembly have not been cancelled so far under the direction of Ex-Chairman PAC.

61. ***Haji Ghulam Ali:** (Notice received on 31-05-2013 at 11:30 a.m.)

Mr. Riaz Hussain Pirzada: (a) The Pakistan Olympic Association (POA) is the sole representative of the International Olympic Committee (IOC) in Pakistan and

operates exclusively under the Olympic Charter, independent of any and all political, government or private organization whatsoever. The elections of POA were conducted by the Interim Committee of POA on 5th July, 2013. The record regarding number of official visits of President and Secretary POA is not available with the present management as the same has not yet been handed over to them by the outgoing management, since the matter regarding to election of various office holders is pending in court of law.

(b) Pakistan Sports Board did not pay any amount to POA on account of foreign visits of President and Secretary, POA.

62. ***Haji Ghulam Ali:** (Notice received on 31-05-2013 at 11:30 a.m.)

Will the Minister for Inter Provincial Coordination be pleased to state the details of steps taken by the Government for promotion of sports at national and international level?

Mr. Riaz Hussain Pirzada: Primarily, it is the responsibility of the National Sports Federations to promote their respective games. However, the Government is committed to provide maximum possible financial, infrastructure and administrative support to its affiliated National Sports Federations for promotion of games.

- a. For the promotion of Sports, the Government through Pakistan Sports Board is providing financial assistance to the recognized National Federations in the shape of Annual Grants for holding the annual national championships and Special Grants for participation in International competitions at home and abroad.
- b. Pakistan Sports Board also bears the expenses on preparation of Pakistan Sports teams and holding of National Training Camps for participation in Olympics, Asian, Commonwealth, South Asian and Islamic Games with enhanced facilities.
- c. Expenses on participation in the Olympics, Asian Commonwealth, South Asian and Islamic Games.
- d. Provision of services of Foreign Coaches.
- e. Payment of Cash Awards to Medal Winners in mega sports events.
- f. Organization of PSB Inter Provincial Under-14 Boys and Under-16 Girls tournaments throughout Pakistan on rotation basis.

- g. Development of sports infrastructure.
 - h. The Federal Government is contemplating to boost the sporting activities at Club Level.
63. ***Maulana Muhammad Saleh Shah :** (Notice received on 21-06-2013 at 16:30 p.m.)

Will the Minister for Water and Power be pleased to state whether it is a fact that the transformer feeding block Nos.86 to 93, category-V sector G-10/3, Islamabad, is below capacity to meet the requirement of the consumers; if so, the steps taken to install highest capacity transformers?

Khawaja Muhammad Asif: It is a fact that distribution transformer installed for feeding electricity to Block No. 86 to 93 Category-V, G-10/3, Islamabad is over loaded.

In this regard LT proposal for installation of additional 200 KVA transformer was prepared which has been approved and work order issued for redressal of low voltage in said area.

The work is likely to be completed by 25.08.2013 subject to availability of material and right of way from CDA according to the approved sketch.

64. ***Syeda Sughra Imam:** (Notice received on 26-06-2013 at 09:15 a.m.)

Will the Minister for Petroleum and Natural Resources be pleased to state:

- (a) *the steps being taken by the Government for shale gas exploration in the country; and*
- (b) *the names of companies engaged / being engaged for the said purpose?*

Mr. Shahid Khaqan Abbasi: (a) The Government is in the process of preparation of Shale Gas framework providing appropriate incentives to E&P Companies to jump start Shale gas exploitation. The Government has taken following steps to explore shale gas in the country;

- (i) M/s PPL (state-owned company) and M/s Eni had signed a Joint Study and Cooperation Agreement on 07-02-2011 with the aim to identify viable projects for the development of the shale gas in the country.
- (ii) The committee was also constituted comprising of PPL, ENI and OMV for preparing framework to incentivize and kick start the Pilot Projects.
- (iii) The ECC of the cabinet has initially approved shale gas framework for the first three pilot projects and upon their competition shale gas framework will be finalized.

- (iv) The pilot projects will determine potential shale gas and recoverable reserves.
- (v) Expertise of ADB, USAID and the World Bank have also been associated for exploitation of shale gas.
- (vi) USAID has agreed to provide technical assistance

(b) At present, none of local as well as foreign company is engaged for exploration/production of the shale gas in Pakistan except at a (i) above.

65. ***Syeda Sughra Imam:** (Notice received on 27-06-2013 at 09:30 a.m.)

Will the Minister for Water and Power be pleased to provide the details of water disputes between Pakistan and India based on Indus water treaty?

Khawaja Muhammad Asif: At present two disputes are active between Pakistan and India, Kishenganga case which is in the Court of Arbitration and Wullar Barrage/Tulbul Navigation Project which is under discussion at the Government level between the two countries.

There were disputes between the two countries on Salal Hydropower Project and Baglihar Dam, but the first was resolved by discussions between the two governments while the later was taken to Neutral Expert who decided the matter in 2007.

At present India has provided designs of four projects on the Chenab river, Rattle Hydroelectric Project (HEP), Lower Kalnai HEP, Miyar HEP and Pakal Dul storage project. The designs of these projects have been evaluated by Pakistan and objections communicated to India. The objections on the first three were discussed in the last meeting of the Indus Commission held in Lahore in March 2013. Further discussions will be held on designs of all the four HEPs in the next meeting of the Indus Commission expected to be held in August 2013.

66. ***Syeda Sughra Imam:** (Notice received on 28-06-2013 at 09:30 a.m.)

Will the Minister for Water and Power be pleased to state whether there is any proposal under consideration of the Government to import electricity from India, if so, its details?

Khawaja Muhammad Asif: Yes there is a proposal under consideration of the government to import electricity from India following are details.

- 1 In pursuance of advice conveyed by the Commerce Division as a follow up of decisions made in 5th round of secretary level talks on commercial and economic, cooperation between commerce secretaries of India and Pakistan held on 27-28 April, 2011, in Islamabad (Annex-1), an Expert group for

trade in electricity with India was constituted and notified by Ministry of commerce.

2. In order to promote trade with India in electricity, Ministry of commerce led the delegation to India including the expert group on power and held meetings in New Delhi on 20-10-2011. A joint declaration regarding first meeting for the group of experts to facilitate trade in electricity was also issued.
3. The promotion of trade in electricity has also been agreed in high level meetings between India and Pakistan. A meeting of joint Working group was held in 1st week of July, 2013 at Islamabad. The Indian delegation also visited the possible sites of interconnection in Lahore.
4. India has shown its interest to export 220 to 500MW to Pakistan immediately, if infrastructure for transmission of Power is made available. We have received in this regard a pre feasibility study carried out by World Bank.
5. On September 20, 2012, another commerce secretaries level meeting between India & Pakistan was held and it was resolved to hold technical group meeting in the last week of September, 2013 followed by expert group meeting in India.
 1. The Government of Pakistan and India agreed at the very start to work together on the detailed feasibility and design. This agreement could be in the form of a memorandum of understanding. The government of Pakistan can utilize technical assistance funds under the ongoing electricity distribution and transmission improvement project to engage consultants for the detailed feasibility and design. World Bank has been requested to provide funds and technical assistance for carrying out feasibility study. Draft MoU is under checking/vetting and scrutinization. Visit of Pakistan Technical group is also being proposed shortly.

67. ***Mrs. Nuzhat Sadiq :** (Notice received on 28-06-2013 at 11:30 a.m.)

Will the Minister for Water and Power be pleased to state:

- (a) *the time frame given to KESC under its revised privatization agreement for making itself self sufficient in production of electricity;*
- (b) *whether it is a fact that KESC has failed to make itself self sufficient in production of electricity, if so, the reasons thereof;*
- (c) *whether it is also a fact that relatively more efficient power plants of KESC are kept non operative; and*

(d) *the steps being taken by the Government in this regard?*

Khawaja Muhammad Asif: (a & b) Under the Amendment Agreement to the Implementation Agreement, KESC sponsor shareholders agreed to make an investment of USD 361 Million for the up-gradation and creation of new generation capacity as well as for working capital requirements. This investment of US\$ 361 Million has been successfully made by the sponsor shareholders and around 1,010 MW has been added to the existing KESC generation capacity as under;

- 560 MW Bin Qasim Combined Cycle Power Plants
- 220 MW Korangi Combined Cycle Power Plant
- 180 MW GE-Jenbacher gas engines at Site & Korangi
- 50 MW through Re-habilitation of old BQPS-I

(c) KESC decides based on the economic merit order which plants to operate. The plants with lowest cost of generation are dispatched first.

(d) KESC is a private entity and operate under the license from NEPRA. The regulator monitors its functioning.

Minister for Foreign Affairs: (a) In total 88 countries 117 Pakistan Embassies/Missions have been established. (Ambassadorial Missions 87, Charged Affaires (Cd'A) 1, Consulate Generals 18, Consulates 05, Consulate Generals headed by other Ministries 05, Consulates headed by other Ministry 01).

(b) A total of 972 (282 officers and 690 staff members) are working in those Embassies/Missions.

(c) A list containing number, names, BPS, district of domicile and place of present posting of the persons belonging to Balochistan working in Pakistan Missions abroad is attached.

Number of persons belonging to Baluchistan working in Pakistan . Missions abroad = 28

(b) During the said period, 7 Exploratory wells were drilled in the country resulting in three oil and gas discoveries. The details of the wells and discoveries are attached at Annexure-II, & III.

71. ***Mr. Hilal Ur Rehman:** (Notice received on 15-07-2013 at 13:35 p.m.)

Will the Minister for Water and Power be pleased to state:

- (a) *whether the electricity connections provided by TAESCO to Marble and Furnace Industrial units in Mohammand Agency are legal, if so, whether NOC was obtained from the then Ministry of Environment for those connections;*
- (b) *whether electricity meters have been installed in the said industrial units;*

(c) *whether the electricity bills of the said units are being paid regularly, if so, the account under which the same are being deposited; and*

Khawaja Muhammad Asif: (a) The Furnace and Marble connections installed in Mohmand Agency are legal connections. The NOC from M/o Environment was not provided as the same was not required in the connection procedure of the said connections.

(b) These connections are being billed on the basis of units consumed at Grid Station keeping in view load and load factor of connections. The existence of meters at individual premises in FATA is not practicable.

(c) The electricity bills are regularly paid. The detail of connections and its account No. is given at Annex-A.

(d) The details of the bills paid by these connections during the last three years is as under:

Will the Minister for Housing and Works be pleased to state whether it is a fact that some residential blocks of Pak P. W.D., category IV, Sector G-10/3, Islamabad are in dilapidated condition, if so, the time by which repairing of those blocks will be carried out?

Mr. Usman Ibrahim: The repair and maintenance of said blocks were carried out by Pak-PWD during the year 2001-2002. However, the repair and maintenance of said block could not be done in the recent past due to non availability of funds.

As far as the structural stability of Category-IV flats in Sector G-10/3 is concerned, only the R.C.C pardi wall is in dilapidated condition, which need repair and rehabilitation work to the tune of Rs.650,000/- and shall be undertaken by Pak-PWD when the said funds are provided.

However, the estimates for external painting work are under process and work shall be taken up after provision of funds.

73. ***Mrs. Rubina Irfan:** (Notice received on 31-07-2013 at 09:15 a.m.)

Will the Minister for Petroleum and Natural Recourses be pleased to state:

- (a) *the main obligations of Mari Gas Company, working on Koh-e-zarghoon Gas field, in connection with welfare projects for the locals; and*
- (b) *the details of welfare projects launched/completed by the said company in the said area so far?*

Mr. Shahid Khaqan Abbasi: (a) M/s Mari Petroleum Company Ltd (MPCL) is under obligation to spend a specific amount US\$ 20,000 per year on the social welfare schemes based on the requirement of the area in consultation with the local administration and endorsed by the concerned MNA. The schemes will be in the areas of health, education, water supply, drainage and provision of gas to the surrounding areas. The schemes are to be monitored by concerned DCO.

In addition Mari Gas would pay a loyalty of 12.5% to the Govt. that gas to the province.

(b) A statement showing details of welfare projects launched/completed by MPCL is attached as Annex-I.

74. ***Mrs. Sehar Kamran :** (Notice received on 01-08-2013 at 14:00 p.m.)

Will the Minister for Water and Power be pleased to state whether there is any proposal under consideration of the Government to import electricity, if so, it details?

Khawaja Muhammad Asif: The following imports projects are under consideration, summary of these projects are given below;

1. **Import of 74 MW from Iran**

The contract for import of 30 MW power from Iran was signed on 10-11-2002 for electrification of border towns of Balochistan. Currently the total capacity contracted under a 30 years contract with M/s. TAVANIR of Iran is 74 MW. Electricity is being provided to the border towns of Balochistan at three points, namely

- 1. Mand at 132 kV (70 MW)

2. Mashkail at 20 kV (2 MW)
3. Taftan at 20 kV (2 MW)

2. Import of 100 MW from Iran

Considering rapid developments in Gawadar area, process of signing another contract with TAVANIR for import of 100 MW for Gawadar area was initiated and the contract with TAVANIR was signed on 07 Feb 2007 at Lahore. TAVANIR agreed in principle to supply 100 MW power to Gawadar. For this purpose a double circuit twin bundle 220 kV line would be constructed from Polan in Iran to Gawadar in Pakistan. Length of transmission line in Pakistan would be 78 km and 51 km in Iran. Agreement has signed with SUNIR of Iran regarding the construction of 220 kV transmission line and GIS grid station. The project will be financed through Economic Development Bank of Iran. Iran has completed the construction of transmission line upto the border whereas, work on construction of transmission line in Pakistan side is under progress.

3. Import of 1000 MW from Iran

The Minister of Water and Power signed another MOU with the Minister of Energy of Iran on 8-4-2007 at Tehran for supply of upto 1000 MW power from Iran to meet the demand of Balochistan. Consultant where nominated by TAVANIR and NTDC to carry out physibilitystudy was signed. The physibilitystudy submitted by consortium of consultants was endorsed by TAVANIR and NTDC on 31-5-2012. The case has been forwarded to Ministry of Water and Power for approval of ECC before submitting to NEPRA for final approval of tarrif.

4. CASA 1000 MW

A project name CASA-1000 is under consideration since 1994 for importing 1300 MW power from Kyrgyzstan and Tajikistan for Afghanistan and Pakistan respectively. It will take tentatively four(4) years after the construction of transmission line and grid station starts before we receive power at NTDC Grid, Actual construction period will be finalized when agreements are signed. No rate for the supply of electricity for the project has been finalized.

5. Import of power from india

In april 2011 india proposed to sell electricity to Pakistan. As a consequence commerce secretry level talks held between Pakistan and India on 27-28 april 2011 to undertake the assignment of import of electricirty from India to Pakistan. A working group was constituted by ministry of water and power government of Pakistan on 1-7-

2011 for follow up of above commerce secretary talks. Pakistan and indian officials on 2-08-2012 discussed planed to import 500MW of electricity through high voltage direct current (HVDC) link between the two countries.

After several meetings a draft MoU has been prepared and discussed with indian delegations on 11-6-2013. NTDC has endorsed the draft MoU. The prime minister of Pakistan has approved the summery for “approval of trade with india in electricitry”. As a first step in interconnection will be build between Amratsar & Lahore which will be through either 400KV DC or 500KV DC. The MoU is subject to approval of all relevant ministries departments and agencies of both governments, where after it will be signed jointly by both governments.

The rate for the import of power from india has not been decided and it has been proposed in the MoU that the GOP or NTDC would have to employee a power trade company in India to purchase power from engery from exchange in india or from IPPs, state or government owned power plant, captive power plant or other sources.
