Will the Minister for Federal Education and Professional Training be pleased to state:

- (a) the name of authority / body authorized to register Religious Madaris in the country indicating also the procedure/criteria laid down for registration of the same; and
- (b) whether the said authority has any role in appointment of teachers and imams in the said Madaris, if so, the details thereof indicating also the criteria and procedure being adopted for the same?

**Dr. Khalid Maqbool Siddiqui:** (a) DGRE (Directorate General Religious Education) under the M/o FE&PT is the only department at Federal Level to register Deeni Madaris in the country and has already registered 17738 Madaris till date 11-09-2024.

Madrassa which wants to get register with DGRE submits its application on standard form (Annex-I). After scrutiny of registration form certificate is then issued.

(b) DGRE has provided financial assistance to 598 registered Deeni Madaris by providing 1196 teachers, DGRE appoints teachers on the recommendations of concerned Madrassa and Wafaq who fulfil the laid down criteria which includes minimum Bachelors Degree with English, Mathematics and General Science subjects. However, Religious Education if required in addition to above qualifications is given preference.

Will the Minister for Communications be pleased to state:

- (a) the name, educational qualification and grade of the incumbent Member (Administration) NHA indicating also the salary allowances and other fringe benefits admissible to him; and
- (b) whether it is a fact that the said officer is from audit and Accounts Group, if so, the details of officers of that group who were appointed Member (Administration) NHA before this?

**Mr. Abdul Aleem Khan:** (a) Mr. Mansoor Azam, BS-20 officer is currently posted as Member (Administration), NHA under Section 10 of the Civil Servants Act, 1973 vide Establishment Division's Notification No. 1/216/2024-E-4 dated 13.05.2024 on the proposal of Ministry of Communications and approval of the Prime Minister of Pakistan.

Section 10 of the Civil Servants Act, 1973 reads as under (Annex-A)

"10. Posting and Transfer.- Every Civil Servant shall be liable to serve anywhere within or outside Pakistan, in any equivalent or higher post under the Federal Government, or any Provincial Government, or local authority, or a corporation or body set up or established by any such Government:

Provided that nothing contained in this section shall apply to a civil servant recruited specifically to serve in a particular area or region:

Provided further that where a civil servant is required to serve in a post outside his service or cadre, his terms and conditions of service as to his pay shall not be less favorable than those to which he would have been entitled if lye had not been so required to Serve.

The qualification profile of the officer is as under:

- MA (International Development) from Japan from 2009 to 2011
- MSc International Relations from QAU. Islamabad in 2000
- BA from Govt. College, Lahore in 1997

(b) Yes, the officer belongs to Pakistan Audit Accounts Service.

It is also a fact that an officer Mr. Muhammad Azhar, a BS-20 officer of Pakistan Audit & Accounts Service has also served as Member (Administration), NHA, w.e.f 22.09.2020 to 28-05-2021 & 03-02-2022 to 15-06-2022.

#### 1\*Civil Servants Act, 1973 (Act No. LXXI of 1973)

An Act to regulate the appointment of persons to, and the terms and conditions of Service of persons in, the service of Pakistan.

WHEREAS it is expedient to regulate by law, the appointment of persons to, and the terms and conditions of service of persons, in the service of Pakistan, and to provide for matters connected therewith or ancillary thereto;

It is hereby enacted as follows:-

- 1. Short title, application and commencement.-(1) This Act may be called the Civil Servants. Act. 1973.
  - (2) it applies to all civil servants wherever they may be.
  - (3) It shall come into force at once.
  - Definitions.-(1) In this act, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context,-
  - (a) "ad hoc appointment" means appointment of a duly qualified person made otherwise than in accordance with the prescribed method of recruitment, pending recruitment in accordance with such method;
  - (b) "civil servant" means a person who is a member of an All-Pakistan Service or of a civil service of the Federation or who holds a civil post in connection with the affairs of the Federation, including any such post connected with defence, but does not include-
    - a person who is on deputation to the Federation from any Province or other authority;
    - a person who is employed on contract, or on work-charged basis or who is paid from contingencies; or
    - (iii) a person who is "worker" or "workman" as defined in the Factories Act, 1934(XXV of 1934), or the Workman's Compensation Act, 1923 (VIII of 1923):
  - (c) "initial appointment" mans appointment made otherwise than by promotion or transfer.

The Act received assent of the President on the 26th September, 1973 and was published in the Gazette of Pakistan, Extra, Part 1, September 29, 1973.

Provided that civil servants who are selected for promotion to a higher postone batch shall, on their promotion to the higher post, retain their inter se seniority as in lower post.

9. Promotion – (1) A civil servant possessing such minimum qualifications may be prescribed shall be eligible for promotion to a higher post for the time being reserved under the rules for departmental promotion in the service or cadre to which he belongs:

"Provided that the posts of -

- (a) Additional Secretary and Senior Joint Secretary may, in the public interest, be filled by promotion from amongst officers of regularly constituted Occupational Groups and services holding, on regular basis, posts in Basic Pay Scale 20; and
- (b) Secretary may, in the puble interest, be filled by promotion from amongst officers of regularly constituted Occupational Groups and services holding, on regular basis, posts in Basic Pay Scale 21, in such manner and subject to such conditions as may be prescribed."
- (2) A post referred to in sub-section (1) may either be a selection post or a nonselection post to which promotions shall be made as may be prescribed-
  - (a) in the case of a selection post, on the basis of selection on merit; and
  - (b) in the case of a non-selection post, on the basis of seniority-cum-fitness.
- 4[(3) Promotion to posts in basic pay scales 20 and 21 and equivalent shall be made on the recommendations of a Selection Board which shall be headed by the Chairman, Federal Public Service Commission.
- 10. Posting and transfer.- Every civil servant shall be liable to serve anywhere within or outside Pakistan, in any equivalent or higher post under the Federal Government, or any Provincial Government, or local authority, or a corporation or body set up or established by any such Government;

Provided that nothing contained in this section shall apply to a civil servant recruited specifically to serve in a particular area or region:

Provided further that, where a civil servant is required to serve in a post outside his service or cadre, his terms and conditions of service as to his pay shall not be less favourable than those to which he would have been entitled if he had not been so required to serve.

- (a) the names, designation, grades and place of domicile of officers and officials appointed on deputation basis and absorbed in the Ministry of Foreign Affairs during the last five years;
- (b) the criteria devised by the Government to send officers/ officials of the Ministry at Pakistani Missions Abroad; and
- (c) whether it is a fact that a number of officers / officials appointed on deputation basis in the Ministry during the said period have also been posted at foreign mission, if so, the details and reasons thereof?

**Mr. Mohammad Ishaq Dar:** (a) The list of officials who were transferred from other Ministries/ Divisions on deputation basis and appointed by transfer (absorbed) in the Ministry of Foreign Affairs during the last five years is placed at **Annex-I.** 

The officers who join the Ministry of Foreign Affairs on deputation basis are not absorbed in the Ministry. They are repatriated to their parent Ministry/ Division upon completion of the deputation period.

(b) The foreign posting of the Ministry's officers is governed by the Posting Policy-2015. Major consideration for posting abroad includes functional requirement of the Mission, as well as skills, proficiency, and expertise of officers.

As regards officials of the Ministry, their posting abroad is governed under Posting Policy-2016, devised by the Ministry of Foreign affairs, whereby the posting of officials to Missions abroad is decided on the basis of certain considerations including seniority, stay at Headquarters, previous posting, and family circumstances.

(c) Ministry considers the cases of officers and officials, on deputation, for posting to Pakistan Missions abroad as per Ministry's devised policy. The foreign posting of officers and officials, on

deputation, is done to meet the shortage in Pakistan Missions abroad. Only those officers and officials who possess the requisite qualification/technical skills and experience of the post are considered for posting abroad in the public interest. List of such officers and officials is attached as **Annex-II.**

Mr. Mohammad Ishaq Dar: Under the Civil Servants Appointment, Promotion & Transfer (APT) Rules. 1973, three modes of appointment have been provided, that is, by promotion, transfer and initial appointment. The APT Rules were amended in 2007, and Rule 20A was inserted to provide for appointment of a deputationist, and therefore the procedure and instructions provided there under are required to be followed for the purpose of appointment of a deputationist. Ministry utilizes the services of officers and officials who possess the requisite qualification and experience of the post concerned, for an initial period of three years. Ministry has observed the government instructions in letter and spirit.

#### Chaudhry Salik Hussain: (a) Mandate of EOBI:

Mandate of EOB Act 1976 was enforced with effect from April 01, 1976, to achieve the objective of Article 38 (C) of the Constitutions, by providing for compulsory social insurance. It operates under the control of Ministry of Overseas & Pakistani & Human Resource Development.

EOBI Operates on the basis of collection of contribution in respect of insured person. The employee as well as the employer are liable to make contribution under EOBI Act 1976. The Contribution of Employer in respect of each insured person is 5% of prevalent minimum wages and employee contribute 1% of minimum wages per month.

It extends following benefits under EOBI Act 1976 to insured person or their survivors

- Old Age Pension
- Survivor's Pension
- Invalidity Pension
- Old-Age Grant

#### **Functions of EOBI:**

The Employees' Old Age Benefits Institution (EOBI) is an autonomous body of the Federal Government under the Ministry of OP&HRD. It was established under the EOB Act 1976 and performs following core functions:

- i. Identification & Registration of Establishments & Industries.
- ii. Identification & Registration of Insured Persons.
- iii. Collection of Contribution
- iv. EOB Fund Management
- v. Provision of Benefits as per Law

#### **Working Structure**

The Head Office is located in Karachi. It has three zonal offices, known as Benefit & Contributions (B&C), located in Karachi, Lahore and Islamabad. It has 40 regional offices and 32 field offices for operational activities.

#### Number of Officers & Officials Working in EOBI

Officers = 284

Officials / Staff = 348

Total working strength = 632 against sanctioned strength of 1476

- (a) the details of the HEC recognized Universities in the country that have made internships mandatory for the students in order to complete their 4 years' BS degree programs;
- (b) whether HEC has formulated any policy guidelines for these universities to regulate the said internships in order to assist the students in finding the right institutions for completing internships, if so its details; and
- (c) whether any quality check or monitoring mechanism has been devised by HEC in order to ensure that those universities provide proper assistance to their students in finding the relevant institutions or entities for completing their internships as per university requirements, if so, the details thereof?

**Dr. Khalid Maqbool Siddiqui:** (a) In accordance with HEC's Undergraduate Policy (**Annex-A**), the Internship (6-8 weeks) is a mandatory requirement to complete undergraduate (4 years BS degree). The policy is rolled out in 2023 and all Higher Education Institutions (HEls) are required to adopt the said policy by Fall 2023 after attaining approval of their relevant statutory bodies.

(b) Yes, the Higher Education Commission (HEC) has provided guiding principles/framework for mandatory Internship to completer an undergraduate degree (4 years BS). The relevant extract of the policy is reproduced below:

#### Field Experience/Internship:

The field experience of six to eight weeks (preferably undertaken during semester or summer break) must be graded by a faculty member in collaboration with the supervisor in the field. This is a mandatory degree award requirement of 3 credit hours for all undergraduate/equivalent degree programs. However, for Associate Degrees, the requirement shall only be applicable where prescribed by the respective Accreditation Council, National Curriculum Review Committee or by the concerned university.

The purpose of such field experience is to provide practical exposure and professional learning experience to students in their relevant field of study. It is pertinent to mention here that HEC has only issued the policy guidelines declaring "Internship" as mandatory degree completion requirements. The execution plan of this mandatory activity is responsibility of the universities. For the purpose, the Universities are required to establish an effective Student Advisory System to ensure that the academic advice is available to every student, as and when needed, that also includes addressing the key issues faced by students related to their field experience.

(c) The revised Quality Assurance Framework of HEC envisages framework to assess the performance/quality of a university whether is there any robust systems for advising and counseling students to support their academic, personal, and career development, fostering a conducive environment for student success and well-being exists in the university or otherwise. Likewise, the internal Quality Assurance Mechanism of universities is in place in the form of "Quality Enhancement Cells (QECs)" which is mandated to ensure compliance of HEC's policy/regulations in true spirit. In addition to above, the universities have Industry-Academia Linkages programs, job fairs and Placement Offices to provide ample opportunities to the students to secure internships or even employment in their relevant field of study.

The maximum age limit to fill this post through initial appointment is 50 years.

While considering posting/ transfer of an employee, his seniority, performance, expertise, integrity and departmental needs are taken into consideration by the competent authority.

At present Mr. Taimoor Hassan, Director (Accounts/BS-19) is posted as G.M. (Revenue) in his own pay and scale by the competent authority vide order dated 13.12.2024. The officer is senior most Director in Finance Cadre possessing the qualification of B.Com with ACMA (Foundation Qualified) and MBA. The officer has the experience of 20 years in NHA in the field of Accounts/Finance. The officer while posted as Director (Revenue-Operation) was given looked after charge of GM (Revenue) in his own pay & scale during the period from 03.03.2020 to 31-08-2022.

(b) The post of Member (Planning) in NHA is placed in grade 20/21 and officer of Engineering Cadre is appointed to the said post by the competent authority under Rule 30 of NHA Service Rules, 1995.

At present Mr. Sami ur Rehman, GM (Engineer/BS-20) is posted as Member (Planning) by the competent authority vide order dated 03-09-2024. The officer possesses the qualification of B.Sc (Civil) with M.Sc. (Transportation Engineering) and has the experience of serving for 32 years in Civil Engineering works. The officer is holding the post of Member (Planning) for the first time.

**Dr. Khalid Maqbool Siddiqui:** The Higher Education Commission (HEC) has taken measures to support Special Persons/Differently Abled Persons, as outlined below:

- A dedicated option is available for differently abled persons when applying for degree attestation through HEC.
- Document attestation services are provided free of charge to differently abled individuals through courier. Applicants do not need to visit the HEC office; the courier service manages the attestation process and delivers the documents to the applicant's specified address.
- HEC facilities, including those for degree attestation, have been equipped with special ramps and separate washrooms for differently abled individuals.
- If a differently abled person visits HEC's Attestation Section, their case is handled on a priority basis.
- The Local equivalence, as well as equivalence of Deeni Asnad of differently abled persons, is also free of charge.

### \*Question No. 31 **Senator Fawzia Arshad:** (Notice Received on 14/11/2024 at 12:19 PM) QID: 42634

Will the Minister for National Health Services, Regulations and Coordination be pleased to state:

(a) the current status of National Emergency Health Services under the administrative control of Ministry and the employees working therein; and

(b) whether it is a fact that rightsizing of National Emergency Health Services is under consideration, if so, the reasons thereof; indicating also the post rightsizing status of civil servants, regular/contractual employees and deputationists working in that department?

Minister for National Health Services, Regulations and Coordination: (a) The current status of National Emergency Health Services (NEHS) is an Executive Department under the administrative control of M/o NHSR&C Currently, there are 27 officers/ officials working in the organization (Annex-I).

(b) Yes, NEHS is merged with National Institute of Health (NIH) after due deliberation and recommendations of the Committee on Right Rising of the Federal Government and subsequent decision of Federal Cabinet in its meeting held on 27.08.2024 as the functions of NEHS were overlapping with functions of NIH (Annex-II). There is no contractual/daily wages employees and educationist working in NEHS. A committee has been constituted to amend NIH Act, 2021 and legislation is under process (Annex-III). The status of employees as Civil Servants will be taken care of.

\*Question No. 32 **Senator Mohammad Humayun Mohmand:** (Notice Received on 15/11/2024 at 11:57 AM) QID: 42643

Will the Minister for Inter-Provincial Coordination be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that Pakistan Sports Board (PSB) provides assistance/recommends players and allied staff in obtaining Visas facilitating them to participate in different events abroad with stipulation of returning back, if so, the details thereof; and
- (b) whether it is also a fact that a number of players and allied staff who obtained visas on the recommendations of PSB have not returned back, if so, the details of such cases during the last three years along with the action taken in each case?

Minister for Inter-Provincial Coordination: (a) Pakistan Sports Board (PSB) does not facilitate athletes and allied staff to obtain visas. Instead, National Sports Federations receive invitations from the organizers of various events or championships. Based on these invitations, they apply for visas. However, PSB issues No Objection Certificates (NOCs) to National Sports Federations after receiving approval from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the Ministry of Interior through the Ministry of Inter-Provincial Coordination. When applying for an NOC, one of the requirements is for the National Sports Federations to submit a surety bond.

- (b) As mentioned above, the Pakistan Sports Board (PSB) does not facilitate the process of obtaining visas. However, the following athletes and officials have skipped abroad during/after conclusion of the events:
  - (i) Mr. Faizan Akbar, a swimming player, was skipped from the 19th FINA World Championship, Hungary in 2022. The Pakistan Swimming Federation initiated an inquiry into the matter and the inquiry report was submitted to Pakistan Sports Board. Thereupon, PSB raised some observations on the inquiry report and directed Pakistan Swimming Federation to submit reply of the observations. Response from Pakistan Swimming Federation is still awaited (Annex-I).
  - (ii) Two Pakistani boxers, Mr. Suleman Baloch and Mr. Nazeer Ullah Khan, skipped their participation in the 22nd Commonwealth Games, which were held in Birmingham, UK, from 28th July to 8th August 2022. An inquiry is currently underway by the Ministry of Inter-Provincial Coordination (Annex-II).
  - (iii) Mr. Zohaib, Boxer skipped during Olympic Qualifying Tournament held at Italy in March 2024. Following this, an inquiry committee was formed, which recommended imposing a life ban on Mr. Muhammad Khalid Mahmood and Lt. CoI.(R) Muhammad Nasir Ijaz Tung, alongside a fine of Rs.1.00 million and a referral to the FIA for further investigation on possible human trafficking. The Pakistan Sports Board approved the report during its 30th meeting on 10th

- September 2024, and the recommendations were implemented. The Boxing Federation challenged these decisions in the Islamabad High Court, and the case is still pending (Annex-III).
- (iv) The Pakistan Hockey Team traveled to the Netherlands and Poland from 23 to 31 June 2024, but it was reported that three players and one physio applied for political asylum in Europe. In response, the Pakistan Hockey Federation (PHF) imposed life bans on these individuals. The Pakistan Sports Board (PSB) has formed an inquiry committee to investigate the matter, with the report still awaited (Annex-IV).

#### MISSING ATHLETE-19 FINA WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP BUDAPEST.

This is with reference to your letter No.19th/FINA WSC/3/2022 dated · 20th August, 2022 on the subject mentioned above.

- The Court of Inquiry in case of Mr. Faizan Akbar, Swimmer missed / absconded in Budapest, Hungry was perused and the following observations are made for clarification:
  - The Inquiry Report (Court of Inquiry) does not indicate that which authority & under which clause of rule / regulation / code / constitution has constituted the same.
  - The inquiry Report indicates that the Committee members comprised upon only Federation's office bearers and no impartial personnel was included in the Committee which itself is a question mark on the authenticity of the report.
  - It was revealed that the whole debris was thrown on the family (parents of the escaped swimmer) as his father submitted affidavit / surety bond that in case of not reversion of the swimmer in Pakistan, he would pay Rs.2,000,000/-. However, Pakistan Swimming Federation did not mention in the Inquiry Report about the undertaking submitted to PSB vide letter dated 16th April, 2022 wherein the President and the Secretary General of Pakistan Swimming Federation took personal responsibility in case of nonreversion of Mr. Falzan Akbar (copy attached).
  - No responsibility on the part of accompanying representatives of Federation / Team Manager / Coach in the said event was fixed.

It was reported that three players from the Pakistan national hockey team, along with a team physio, have applied for political asylum in Europe and PHF vide letter dated 26th August, 2024 imposed life time ban on these players and physio. However, these persons have denied the allegations of seeking asylum as reported in the media.

Will the Minister for National Health Services, Regulations and Coordination be pleased to state:

(a) the province-wise and district-wise details of polio cases reported in the country since January 01, 2024;

- (b) the details of steps taken or being taken to address systemic inefficiencies in vaccine delivery, particularly in high-risk areas like Balochistan and South Khyber Pakhtunkhwa; and
- (c) whether it is a fact that the Government plans to integrate the Polio Eradication Initiative (PEI) with Routine Immunization (RI) programs under a unified command, if so, the details thereof?

Minister for National Health Services, Regulations and Coordination: (a) In 2024, a total of 59 Polio cases have been reported in the country. Of these, 26 cases are from Balochistan, 16 from Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, 15 from Sindh, and one each from Punjab and Islamabad. The severity of paralysis among the affected children varied: 10 cases had severe paralysis, 27 had moderate paralysis; and 22 had mild paralysis. The district wise details of the Polio cases is attached as **Annex-A**.

- (b) The Polio Program developed a comprehensive 12-month roadmap as part of which, all Programmatic components underwent a reset phase to address underlying gaps and achieve eradication level performance in all areas including Balochistan and South KP. Key steps taken include:
  - Development and implementation of district and campaign improvement plans, focusing on low-performing UCs to address operational gaps and optimize performance.
  - Optimization of operational processes including microplanning, team selection, and training.
  - Capacity building of frontline workers and deployment of culturally and language appropriate Polio teams during campaigns.
  - Strengthening of supervision and monitoring.
  - Relocation of FIR to high-risk areas deploying the best staff to the most challenging regions.
  - Optimization of evening review meetings during campaigns to address issues in real time.

- Consultative workshops with all key Divisions of Provinces including Balochistan and South KR.
- Regular campaign reviews at all levels to maintain consistent campaign quality.
- Digitization of still-missed children to track them for vaccination.
- In Balochistan, the staggering of campaigns was addressed.
- (c) The Ministry of NHSR&C has taken comprehensive steps to establish synergy between the Polio and EPI Programs. It has constituted a Technical Working Group and a National Steering Committee to strengthen the synergy between the two Programs. A joint integrated plan is being developed by the Polio and EPI Programs to work together in the highest-risk areas and establish coordination and collaboration in operations, surveillance communication, and monitoring.
