**\*(Def.) Question No. 58 Senator Quratulain Marri:**  
(Notice Received on 26/12/2024 at 12:32 PM) QID: 42747

*Will the Minister for Railways be pleased to state:*

- (a) whether it is a fact that luggage vans have been outsourced by Pakistan Railways during the last three years, if so, details of outsourcing arrangement and stakeholders involved;*
- (b) comparative statement of total revenue generated through luggage vans operated directly by Pakistan Railways and outsourced parties during the last three years with year wise breakup; and*
- (c) whether there is any proposal to outsource additional services of Pakistan Railways to improve operational efficiency and earnings, if so, the details thereof?*

**Minister for Railways:** (a) Yes, it is fact that luggage vans have been outsourced by Pakistan Railways during the last three years.

Details of outsourcing arrangement are as follows:

1. The bids for outsourcing of luggage/brake vans are initiated through the process of open tendering which are advertised.
2. The contracts for outsourcing are awarded to the parties after due process in line with extant rules.
3. The benchmark for the bid is set keeping in view the previous year's earning of luggage/brake vans.
4. Advance amount to the tune of 15 % is deposited by the successful bidders in advance and balance amount in 10 equal instalments on monthly basis.
5. The contracts are valid for two years and further extendable for another year with mutual consent of both parties and subject to satisfactory performance of the contractor.

Following are the stakeholders involved:

1. Pakistan Railways.
2. Private contractors to whom luggage / brake vans are outsourced.

(b) The total revenue generated through brake vans and luggage vans, operated directly by Pakistan Railways and by outsourced parties during the last three years, is as follow:

*Will the Minister for Interior and Narcotics Control be pleased to state the details of the steps taken by CDA to ensure price, quality and measurements of stuff sold at G-6 and H-9 stalls Sunday Bazaars in Islamabad indicating fine imposed on violations and income generated against rent of said stalls over last one year?*

**Syed Mohsin Raza Naqvi:** It is submitted that teams consisting of Inspectors & Supervisors are deployed in each Bazaar to monitor and control the prices and quality of items being sold in these Bazaars. The complaint registers have been placed in the administrative office established in the premises of each Bazaar. The consumers registered their complaints / suggestion, if any in the said complaint register. On receipt of complaint action is taken in the presence of the complainant keeping in view the complaint then and there.

2. Revenue collected from weekly Bazaar G-6 and H-9 is as under:-

3. In addition to above, the concerned Assistant Commissioner, ICT and Area Magistrate also visit the site on Bazaar Day. In case of any violation from the stallholder on price, quality and measurement etc. they not only arrest them but also impose fine upon the defaulters.

**\*Question No. 24 Senator Samina Mumtaz Zehri:**

*Will the Minister for Interior and Narcotics Control be pleased to state the steps taken by the Government towards conflict resolution in Kurram/Parachinar region also indicating number of persons killed and convoys attacked over last two decades in said region?*

**Syed Mohsin Raza Naqvi:** The volatile security situation in Kurram, exploited by militants and sectarian elements, has led to frequent incidents. Recurrent sectarian violence and road closures have caused shortages of fuel, food, and medicine, resulting in a humanitarian crisis. The main road blockade in Kurram reached its 100th day on Monday (13 Jan 2025) with the route being intermittently opened to allow the passage of essential supplies.

On 16 Jan 2025, an aid convoy of 35 vehicles enroute from Thall to Parachinar was attacked near Bagan Bazar in Lower Kurram, damaging 04 vehicles, martyring 02 security personnel and injuring 07 including 03 security personnel. In retaliation, 06 attackers were killed and 10 others were injured.

On 04 Jan 2025, DC Kurram Javedullah Mehsud and his security team were attacked near Bagan while negotiating with protestors to open the Thall-Sadda Parachinar Highway. This led to the imposition of Sec 144 and stringent measures by the Grand Jirga to apprehend the perpetrators.

On 01 Jan 2025, a 14-point agreement was signed by Ahle Tashee, Ahle Sunnat tribal elders, and government representatives to ensure peace, open the Thall-Sadda-Parachinar Highway on 04 Jan 2025, and ended the 86-day blockade and prevent any Jang-e-Maghlooba (local term indicating recurring war of attack and revenge).

The KP Government convened the Jirga after the attack on the Ahle Tashee convoy in Ochat, Lower Kurram, which led to 42 fatalities and injured 20, including one police official. In retaliation, armed Ahle Tashee groups with ZB elements attacked Bagan Bazar, setting fire to buildings, killing 37 and injuring several.

**No. of Persons Killed and Convoys Attacked (2018-2025)**

- a. From 2018-2025, a total of 149 persons have been martyred in the violent clashes.
- b. Reported 03 attacks on convoys (dated - 21 Jun 2024, 21 Nov 2024, and 16 Jan 2025) have been carried out by miscreants in Kurram.

Following measures have been taken towards conflict resolution in Kurram:

- a. Federal Minister for Interior, during the KP Apex Committee meeting on 20 Dec 2024 emphasized to eradicate bunkers and de-weaponize the area, assuring full cooperation to KP Government to restore law and order in Kurram.
- b. On directives of Chief Minister KP, a helicopter delivered essential supplies to Parachinar during the blockade. The Federal Government aimed to establish a Special Protection Force of 399 ex-servicemen for enhanced security.
- c. As directed by the KP Apex Committee, the provincial government plans to construct 48 CPs along the Thall-Sadda-Parachinar Road, manned by a Special Protection Unit of 399 ex-servicemen. Around 273 private bunkers will be demolished in phases, with 08 already removed in Balishkhel and Khar Kili areas.
- d. The Grand Jirga mandated strict action against violators and locals aiding miscreants. A permanent ceasefire will be upheld, and all bunkers must be demolished by 01 Feb 2025. Post-demolition hostilities will be deemed terrorism, with both communities required to submit arms ban plan within two weeks.
- e. The provincial government, tribal elders, and the Jirga will resolve the land dispute with support from the peace committee, administration, and LEAs. Infrastructure gaps are being addressed with new CPs on the Thall-Sadda-Parachinar

Road, and militant bunkers will be demolished by 01 Feb 2025.

- f. Regarding the steps taken for the conflict resolution in Kurram/Parachinar, Police and Law Enforcement Agencies have launched joint operation in Baggan and Lower Kurram against militants.
- h. Movement of goods/relief convoys to Kurram is operational under the extensive security cover.
- i. Elders and leaders of both the sects have been engaged for de-escalation of the situation and a peace accord been signed.
- j. Bunkers constructed by both the sects in district Kurram are being destroyed and strict action is being taken against the peace spoilers.

*Will the Minister for Interior and Narcotics Control be pleased to state whether it is a fact that implementation of the Day Care Centers Act, 2023 have been initiated, if so, total number of Day care centers established in public and private establishments in ICT since enactment, indicating also the challenges and measures taken or being taken to address such challenges in implementation?*

**Syed Mohsin Raza Naqvi:** The Establishment of Day Care Centers is the responsibility of Federal Government **under Section 3** of the Day Care Centers Act, 2023 (**Annex-A**). The Federal Government may by notification in the Official Gazette make rules for carrying out the purpose of this Act (**Section 8 of this Act**). The ICTA will help in the implementation of this Act as and when the Federal Government make rules to implement this Act in ICT.

Acts, Ordinances, President's Orders and Regulations

*Islamabad, the 16th June, 2023*

No.F.23(14)/2019-Legis.—The following Act of *Majlis-e-Shoora* (Parliament) received the assent of the President on the 15th June, 2023 is hereby published for general information:—

ACT NO. XXVIII OF 2023

AN

ACT

*to provide for the facility of day care centres in public and private establishments*

WHEREAS, it is expedient to provide for the facility of day care centres in public and private establishments and for the purposes connected therewith and ancillary thereto;

It is hereby enacted as follows:—

1. **Short title, extent and commencement.**— (1) This Act shall be called the Day Care Centres Act, 2023.
- (2) It extends to the Islamabad Capital Territory.
- (3) It shall come into force at once.

2. **Definitions.**— In this Act, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context,—

- (a) “Code” means the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1898 (Act V of 1898);
- (b) “day care” means child care during the day when the parents work; and
- (c) “establishment” means and includes any public, private, autonomous, semi-autonomous, corporation, body, society under the Societies Registration Act, 1860 (XXI of 1860) any club, any small and medium enterprise, any NGO, etc.

3. **Establishing day care centre.**— (1) The Federal Government shall ensure the establishment of day care centre at all those establishments having at least seventy employees.

(2) All private establishments having at least seventy employees shall ensure the establishment of day care centre at their premises to provide benefit to their employees.

4. **Punishment for non-compliance.**— Whosoever does not comply to the provisions of this Act shall be given one warning in writing and in case of further non-compliance shall be punished with fine which may extend to one hundred thousand rupees. In case of further non-compliance, the person concerned shall be punished with imprisonment for six months.

5. **Cognizance of an offence.**— Notwithstanding anything contained in the Code, an offence punishable under this Act shall be trial under the Code by the magistrate of first class.

6. **Application of the provisions of the Code.**— Any proceedings under this Act shall be carried out in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Code.

7. **Removal of difficulties.**— If any difficulty arises in giving effect to any provision of this Act, the Federal Government may make such order not inconsistent with the provisions of this Act as may appear to be necessary for the purpose of removing such difficulty.

8. **Power to make Rules.**— The Federal Government may, by notification in the official Gazette, make rules for carrying out the purposes of this Act.

**\*Question No. 26 Senator Danesh Kumar:**

*Will the Minister for Railways be pleased to state whether it is a fact that some railway crossings across the country are without Pathak and others with unmanned Pathak, if so, the details of such railway crossings along with reasons for not constructing Pathak and deploying men?*

**Minister for Railways:** There are two types of railway level crossings.

- i. Manned Level Crossings (with Pahtak/ Gate leaves operated by Gate Keeper).
- ii. Un-manned Level Crossings (without Phatak/ Gate Leaves or Gate Keeper).

There are 2,777 level crossings over the Railway network, out of which 1,416 are un-manned and 1,361 are manned.

Financing for conversion of un-manned level crossing into manned level crossing is the responsibility of the road owning authorities of provinces and districts as per Section 12 of Railways Act-1890.

Keeping in view the safety of general public, 550 most vulnerable un-manned level crossings have been earmarked, to be upgraded into manned level crossing under sponsorship of the provincial governments.

So far 175 un-manned level crossings have been up-graded up till now and the provincial governments are constantly being pursued for the sponsorship of converting remaining unmanned level crossings into manned level crossings.

In terms of Railway level crossing policy (2019), the construction of new un-manned level crossings across the railway network has been banned to mitigate safety risks to general public.

**\*Question No. 27 Senator Danesh Kumar:**

*Will the Minister for Interior and Narcotics Control be pleased to state whether it is a fact that inquiries on incidents of collapse and damages of Bhara Kahu Fly over have been conducted, if so, the details thereof, indicating also the action taken against the contractor, consultant and Government functionaries involved in negligence?*

**Syed Mohsin Raza Naqvi:** Two incidents occurred at the project site during the execution of work. As per initial findings:

- (1) The first incident was caused by the impact of an oversized load-carrying vehicle on the shuttering of Transom - 10.
- (2) The second incident resulted from a lateral jerk of the 5th girder, leading to the tilting of the girders.

It is important to note that adequate safety arrangements were in place at the time of both incidents. Furthermore, initial examination established that these incidents were not due to any deficiencies in the quality of materials or workmanship.

Following the incidents, the Honorable Prime Minister constituted an Inquiry Commission, led by Mr. Shahid Khan, former Secretary for Ministry of Interior, to investigate the collapse of the shuttering and girders. However, the Capital Development Authority (CDA) has not been officially informed of the outcome of the inquiry. CDA will take appropriate action once the findings are communicated.

*Will the Minister for Interior and Narcotics Control be pleased to state whether criminal cases have been initiated against officials of FIA involved in human trafficking, if so, details thereof, indicating status of their trail during the last three years?*

**Syed Mohsin Raza Naqvi:** The detail regarding cases registered against FIA officials is as under:

FIA has established, a dedicated Personnel and Internal Accountability Branch (PIAB) which functions under HR Directorate at HQs Islamabad. The branch is mandated to initiate immediate departmental actions on receiving complaints against staff members of the agency. Similarly, criminal actions are also taken by the concerned zones on receiving complaints or tangible evidence against officials and officers of the department.

It is worth mentioning here that, FIA took stern criminal action against its officials after first boat incident dated 14.06.2023 and arrested 27 officials in 07 cases registered in different FIA Zones including Gujranwala, Faisalabad and Quetta.

Furthermore, total number of 110 departmental proceedings against FIA officials have been initiated, wherein 48 officials have been dismissed from service, 02 officials compulsory retired and 13 officials have been awarded minor penalties.



- (a) whether it is a fact that the water level at Rawal Lake has fallen considerably due to a prolonged dry spell in Islamabad and surrounding areas, if so, the details thereof; and*
- (b) steps taken or being taken to address the impact of climate change on water resources of the Federal Capital?*

**Syed Mohsin Raza Naqvi:** (a) the Capital Development Authority (CDA) receives a limited supply of only two million gallons per day (MGD) of water from Rawal Dam. It is important to note that the management of Rawal Dam falls under the purview of the Small Dam Project, Irrigation Department of the Government of Punjab. Furthermore, the supply of treated water from the dam is managed by the Water and Sanitation Agency (WASA), Rawalpindi. Therefore, for accurate and detailed information regarding the water level of Rawal Dam, the relevant provincial departments may be consulted.

(b) The following steps are being taken by the CDA to address the impact of climate change on the water resources of the Federal Capital:

- i. The CDA has constructed a pilot project for Rain Water Harvesting under the recharge well to increase groundwater resources and subsequently implement household-level measures through building by laws.
- ii. The feasibility study for the following carryover dams is in progress through WAPDA to enhance water storage capacity:
  - a. Construction of Dotara Dam (Carryover dam at Khanpur).
  - b. Construction of Chinot Dam (Carryover dam at Simly Dam).

- c. Construction of Shadara Dam
- iii. Efforts are being made to explore ways to control the seepage and misuse of water from the Khanpur Dam.
- iv. Special notices and challans are being served to residents for water wastage.
- v. Treated water from the Sewage Treatment Plant (STP) is being reused for horticulture and construction purposes.
- vi. The reuse/recycling of wastewater from service stations is also under consideration.

**Reasons for Impounding of CNIC:**

- a. Under Section 18

Section 18 of NADRA Ordinance 2000 empowers NADRA to Cancel, Impound or Confiscate the cards by calling upon individual to show cause based upon the following clear reasons to believe after awarding proper personal hearing opportunity: -

- i. The card has been obtained by a person who is not eligible to hold such card, by posing himself as eligible.
- ii. More than one cards have been obtained by the same person on the same eligibility criteria.

- iii. The particulars shown on the card have been obliterated or tempered with; or
  - iv. The card is forged
- b. By Court orders

**Mechanism to Un-Impound CNICs:**

- a. MOI vide Notification 8/37/216-NADRA dated 19-04-2017(copy attached) has provided the mechanism for clearance of blocked CNICs, based on provision of any verifiable document issued prior to 1979 by Federal/Provincial Government.
- b. CNICs blocked on Court Orders are unblocked/cleared through same or higher Courts.

In exercise of power conferred under Section 47 of National Database and Registration Authority Ordinance, 2000 (VIII of 2000), the Federal Government constituted a Review Committee headed by Deputy Speaker, National Assembly vide notification No.8/37/2016-NADRA dated 5th January 2017. On the recommendations of the Parliamentary Committee, the Federal Government is pleased to approve following mechanism for clearance of Blocked CNICs:

1. Blocked CNIC will be cleared if applicant provides one or more of following documents:
  - 1) Land record registered prior to 1978 (verified by Revenue Deptt.)
  - 2) Local/Domicile Certificate issued prior to 1978 and verified by issuing authority
  - 3) Pedigree (Shajra-e-Nasab) issued & verified by Revenue Deptt.
  - 4) Government employment certificate (or of blood relative), employed before 1990
  - 5) Verified educational certificates (issued prior to 1978)
  - 6) Passport issued to applicant prior to 1978
  - 7) Any other document issued by Government of Pakistan prior to 1978 and verified by issuing authority (Including Arm License, Driving License or Manual NIC issued prior to 1978 duly verified by record)
2. NADRA will handle routine cases while complex (Blocked In Confirm Aliens/ on Agency Report) cases will be dealt by District Level Committee.
3. The composition of District level Committee:
 

1) Deputy Commissioner/PA	-	President
2) District Police Officer	-	Member
3) Assistant Director NADRA	-	Member
4) Rep from ISI	-	Member
5) Rep from IB	-	Member
4. MNA of respective District will monitor the progress however responsibility of verification will be on the Deputy Commissioner /Political Agent.
5. If document being provided is from district where applicant is residing then NADRA will decide case in 6 x working days and otherwise NADRA shall decide case in 30 x working days.
6. District Level Committee will decide verification status of blocked CNICs within 30 days.
7. The above mentioned process will not be applicable on persons falling under purview of 16-A of Citizenship Act 1951.

**Syed Mohsin Raza Naqvi:** (a) Islamabad Capital Territory Police is committed to fulfilling its duties round the clock to apprehend criminals and foster a sense of security among the citizens of Islamabad. Special attention is being focused on minimizing crime rate through effective preventive measures and enhanced patrol strategies, resulting in decreasing crime rate.

As per reports obtained from police stations of Islamabad through Zonal Superintendents of police, from January 1, 2023, to February 06, 2024, a total of 10,119 cases of crime against property were reported at various police stations within the Islamabad Capital Territory (ICT). In contrast, from January 1, 2024, to February 06, 2025, a total of 9,312 cases have been reported for the same period, indicating a reduction in crime rates by 9 %. The detail is attached as “Annex-A”.

Moreover, the ICI, Police is preoccupied with special duties, including frequent visits from foreign dignitaries and delegations, as well as the security of foreign diplomats residing in the capital. Despite these responsibilities, the ICT Police has implemented foolproof security arrangements round the clock to maintain law and order situation in the Islamabad Capital Territory. S.R.O (I)/2024, \_ In exercise of the powers conferred by section 22 of the Federal Prosecution Service Act, 2023 (LXV of 2023), the Federal Government is pleased to make the following rules, namely: -

**1. Short title and commencement.** \_ (1) These rules shall be called the Federal Prosecutor General (Terms and Conditions of Service) Rules, 2024.

(2) These rules shall come into force at once.

**2. Pay and allowances.** \_ The Federal Prosecutor General, so long as he holds his office, shall be entitled to the pay, allowances and other prerequisites as are admissible to an officer of the Federal Government on his appointment in Special Professional Pay Scale-I(SPPS-I).

**3. Duties of the Federal Prosecutor General.** It shall be the duty of the Federal Prosecutor General to give advice to the Government on such constitutional or legal matters and perform such other functions of a legal character as may be referred or assigned to him by the Government.

**4. Responsibilities of the Federal Prosecutor General.** \_ The Federal Prosecutor General shall not:- \_

- (a) engage in private practice so long as he holds the office of the Federal Prosecutor General;
- (b) advise or hold briefs against the Government;
- (c) advise or hold briefs in cases in which he is likely to be called upon to advise, or appear for, the Government;
- (d) defend accused persons in criminal prosecutions without the prior order or permission of the Government;
- (e) accept any appointment in any company, corporation, or organization, without prior permission of the Government; and
- (f) make conceding statement unless so authorized by the Ministry of Interior or the head of the administrative Division or the department concerned in writing .

**5. Leave.** \_ The Revised Leave Rules, 1980, shall be applicable to the Federal Prosecutor General in case of his leave except the provisions contained in rules 5(c), 8, 11, 14, 16, 17, 18, 8-A, 19, 27, 33, 34, 35, 36, and 39. All leaves at the credit of the Federal Prosecutor General shall lapse on the expiry of the term of his office.

6. **Pension.** \_ No pension and gratuity shall be admissible to the Federal Prosecutor General.

7. **General Provident Fund.** \_ No contribution on account of General Provident Fund shall be required.

8. **Conduct and discipline.** \_ Subject to the provision of these rules, in respect of efficiency, discipline and conduct of the Federal Prosecutor General, regulations and instructions applicable to civil servants of the Federal Government shall with necessary modifications apply.

9. **Residual matters.** \_ In matters not covered under these rules, the rules, regulations and other instructions applicable to the civil servants or such other persons in the service of Pakistan of the same status and rank shall with necessary modifications apply.
