***(Def.) Question No. 27 Senator Shahadat Awan:**
(Notice Received on 11/12/2024 at 3:00 PM) QID: 42371

Will the Minister Incharge of the Cabinet Division be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of criteria devised by Pakistan Telecommunications Authority to deal with the roll-out obligations by the licensees in absence of any regulation / framework made for Right of Way; and*
- (b) whether it is a fact that licensees have to fulfill the roll-out obligation in the uninhabited areas despite being included in the region for which the license has been granted, if so, the details thereof?*

Minister Incharge of the Cabinet Division: (a)

1. In line with Government’s policies, PTA issues licenses to Cellular Mobile Operators (CMOs) through open auction and all terms and conditions related to rollout obligations are included in licenses. Such details are also published through an Information Memorandum (IM) whenever the new licenses are awarded. For reference, the current roll out targets for CMOs focuses on 3% increase in population coverage, which can be targeted through site addition, which varies for each

province depending upon variable Radio Frequency (RF) conditions, terrains, already covered population etc. The minimum yearly BTS site count/target for each province per operator, to fulfill rollout obligations is as under;

- a. 245 BTS sites for Punjab.
 - b. 105 BTS sites for Sindh.
 - c. 65 BTS sites for KPK.
 - d. 30 BTS sites for Balochistan.
2. Specifically, to address Right of Way (RoW), the same is governed under Section 27 (A) of Pakistan Telecom Re-Organization Act, 1996 ("Act"), in this regard Ministry of IT and Telecom (MoIT&T) has also issued a "Public & Private Right of Way Policy Directive" dated 9th Oct, 2020. This policy is aimed to facilitate the development and expansion of telecommunications infrastructure by streamlining the process for telecom operators to acquire Right of Way. Furthermore, MoIT&T is also in process of developing an automated online system for streamlining Right of Way NOC processes.
- (b)
1. CMOs are issued licenses for a period of 15x years. From 2021, population-based coverage obligations have been enhanced. These obligations mandate the operators to increase network coverage in terms of targeting population each year, in each province. This ensures a continuous expansion of telecom services, particularly in under-served regions.
 2. For underdeveloped and underserved areas, including uninhabited regions, the Universal Service Fund (USF) Company plays a crucial role. In accordance with the Pakistan Telecom (Re-Organization) Act, USF is responsible for facilitating coverage expansion in such areas through targeted projects.
 3. PTA has also issued specific licenses for Azad Jammu & Kashmir (AJ&K) and Gilgit-Baltistan (GB), with distinct rollout targets for both urban and rural areas. These targets are designed to ensure equitable access to telecommunication services across various regions.

***Question No. 63 Senator Abdul Shakoor Khan:**

Will the Minister for Housing and Works be pleased to state whether it is a fact that the Green Enclave-1 Housing Project, Islamabad, has not been completed so far, if so, the reasons thereof indicating also the steps taken or being taken by the Government for the completion of the said project and the expected timeline by which the same will be completed?

Mian Riaz Hussain Pirzada:

- The development work was started on 06-12-2019, but halted due to following reasons:
 1. Dispute of exact percentage of work.
 2. Issue of provision of performance Security.
 3. Issue of time extension.
 4. Hilly terrains.
- Physical progress of project is 55% as per the consultant.
- The major challenges that was faced by the project at its initial stage are as follows:
 - a. Suo-Moto by the Supreme Court of Pakistan.
 - b. NAB Cases
 - c. Settlement of issues of Access Road
 - d. Delayed submission of Bank Guarantee
 - e. Delay in approval of Layout Plan by CDA
 - f. Spread of pandemic COVID-19.
- A committee under the chairmanship of Senior JS M/o H&W was constituted as per decision of 35th Executive Board held on 16-08-2024 to present a details report on plausible way forward of the project.
- The Executive Board in its 36th meeting held on 08-11-2024 was briefed about the progress of the Committee. The committee identified certain technical and financial issues. The Executive Board

decided to form a Technical Team comprising of Engineers of Pak PWD to conduct comprehensive surveys to assess on-site progress. The committee has finalized its report; the same will be presented before the Executive Board for decision.

- After completion of development work, possession will be handed over.

***Question No. 64 Senator Syed Masroor Ahsan:**

(Notice Received on 24/06/2025 at 9:15 AM) QID: 43303

Will the Minister for Housing and Works be pleased to state:

- (a) *whether it is a fact that tender for development of sub-sector G-14/1 has been issued, if so, the details thereof; and*
- (b) *whether the contract for the development work of the said sub-sector has been awarded under that tender, if so, the details thereof and if not, the reasons thereof?*

Mian Riaz Hussain Pirzada:

- (a) Yes.
 - a) The tender was advertised on 9th August 2024 in national dailies, with a submission deadline of 27th August 2024. Technical bids were opened on 2nd September 2024.
 - b) As per the Technical Evaluation Report dated 27th November 2024, M/s Awais Iqbal N Daow Rajput Associates Company (Pvt.) Ltd. qualified out of four bidders.
 - c) Financial bids were opened on 11th December 2024, and the Financial Evaluation Report was uploaded on the PPRA website on 12th December 2024.
- (b) No, the contract has not been awarded. FGEHA annulled the bidding process due to the following reasons:
 - a) Non-compliance with Rule 36(b)(iii & v) of the PPRA Rules, as observed by internal audit and PPRA authorities.
 - b) The quoted rates of the sole responsive bidder exceeded the Technical Sanctioned (TS) amount by over 25%, raising serious concerns about the reasonableness of rates.

***Question No. 65 Senator Syed Masroor Ahsan:**
(Notice Received on 24/06/2025 at 9:16 AM) QID: 43304

Will the Minister for Housing and Works be pleased to state:

- (a) *whether it is a fact that the Islamabad High Court has passed order in 2022 to give possession of plots to the allottees of sub-sector G-14/1 within 8 months, if so, the details thereof; and*
- (b) *whether it is also a fact that the FGEHF has not given possession of plots to the allottees in that sub-sector so far, if so, the reasons thereof indicating also the time by which they will be given possession of their plots?*

Mian Riaz Hussain Pirzada:

- (a) The Hon'ble Islamabad High Court in its judgment 'dated 13-03-2022 passed in Writ Petition No. 1518/2021 directed the FGEHA to conclude the land acquisition proceedings as per the following;

1. Compensation shall be released to the affectees, and that all acquired properties be vacated, demolished within the stipulated timeframe.
2. The FGEHA scheme shall be given effect so that the allottees may get their plots within next six (06) to eight (08) months positively after development of scheme as per approved layout plan.
3. Amenities shall be provided by the FGEHA.

Moreover, the latest developments on the matter has also been appraised to the Hon'ble Islamabad High Court on 25-06-2025 (**Annex-A**). The details on awarding of contract of infrastructure development work of Sub-Sector G-14/1 are explained at para b below.

- (b) ➤ Total Land of the project 1718.15 Kanals.
- Due to effort of FGEHA and decisions of the Hon'ble Islamabad High Court possession of 738.04 kanal land in Sector G-14/1 is available for development.
- The Project will be carried out in two Phases.

- Tender advertisement was floated on 9th August 2024 with Bid-Submission date 27th August 2024.
- Technical Bid opened on 27-8-2024.
- Financial Bid Opened on 11-12-2024.
- FGEHA has been canceled the current bidding process as per PPRA Rule 33(1), and directed to initiate re-tendering process of Infrastructure Development of works of Sub-Sector G-14/1, Islamabad Phase-I as soon as possible
- The Contractor will be mobilized on site up to November-2025.
- The Development works will be completed within one years on available land.

Learned counsel for respondent/FGEHA has
submitted following report: -

It is respectfully submitted that substantial progress has been achieved in Sub-Sectors G-14/2 and G-14/3, primarily due to the kind judgment of this Hon'ble Court in the instant matter. The said judgment not only empowered the Federal Government Employees Housing Authority (FGEHA) to proceed with anti-encroachment operations confidently but also served as a guiding directive for the residents to cooperate with the Authority. As a result, the longstanding hardship of the allottees who have awaited possession of their developed plots for over 15 years has been significantly alleviated. Some residents of the area have filed ICA against the said judgment but no restraining/injunctive order has been passed by the Hon'ble Court.

➤ It is further submitted that approximately 97% of the encroachments in G-14/2 have been removed. FGEHA now has possession of the acquired land, which is actively being handed over to the allottees for residential construction. Infrastructure development on more than 90% of the acquired area has been completed, and work on the remaining portion is in progress

➤ It is apprised that nearly 98% of the area in Sub-Sector G-14/3 is now clear, and approximately 92% of development work has been completed. The remaining 1% of land is subject to ownership disputes currently under adjudication in the lower courts. Possession of developed plots is being granted to allottees upon request, and construction is underway on a number of plots of varying categories.

➤ So far, around 660 possession letters have been issued to the allottees of Sector G-14/2&3 and more than 300 houses of different categories are under construction.

2. As per the stance of the Director (Land), FGEHA, they have almost taken over the entire area, except for a few Built-Up Properties that are under litigation. They are ready to deliver possession letters for 660 plots to the allottees in Sector G-14/2 and G-14/3, Islamabad, and 300 houses of different categories are currently under construction.

3. In this backdrop of the case, the applicant is directed to approach the office of FGEHA to obtain the possession letter, subject to completion of codal formalities. However, if the possession letter is not issued, the applicant shall submit his point of view to the Director (Land), FGEHA, who shall decide the matter accordingly.

Will the Minister In-charge of the Cabinet Division be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of salary, allowances, perks and privileges admissible to the Prime Minister of Pakistan; and*
- (b) the details of monetary as well as other benefits admissible to the Prime Minister after retirement?*

Minister In-charge of the Cabinet Division:

(a & b) The perquisites and privileges permissible to the Prime Minister are sanctioned under the **Prime Minister's Salary, Allowances and Privileges Act, 1975**. Further, the Prime Minister, under section 17 of the **Act** is entitled to life time security. Section 17 states: -

"Every person who has held the office of the Prime Minister under Clause (4) of Article 91 of the Constitution shall be entitled for life to the suitable security, which the Federal Government shall, by notification in official Gazette, specify and make the required arrangements including services of personnel, vehicle or vehicles and allied matter."

Further, the Prime Minister is not entitled to pension or monetary benefits, after leaving the office of the Prime Minister, under the said Act. (Annexed)

THE PRIME MINISTER'S SALARY, ALLOWANCES
AND PRIVILEGES ACT, 1975.

ACT No. LIX OF 1975
(As amended upto 13.08.2012)

An act to determine the salary, allowances and privileges of the Prime Minister.

WHEREAS it is expedient to determine the salary, allowances and privileges of the Prime Minister and to make provision for enabling him to discharge conveniently and with dignity the duties of his office;

It is hereby enacted as follows:-

1. **Short title and commencement.**- (1) This Act may be called the Prime Minister's Salary, Allowances and Privileges Act, 1975.

(2) It shall come into force at once and shall be deemed to have taken effect on the fourteenth day of August, 1973.

2. **Definitions.**- In this Act, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context,---

- (a) "family" means the Prime Minister's spouse and such of his children and step-children as ordinarily reside with and are wholly dependent upon him;
- (b) "furnishings" means pictures, paintings, curios, linen, glass-ware, brass-ware, cutlery, crockery, kitchen equipment, radios, radio-grams, lamps, public address systems, projectors, television sets of all kinds, acoustical equipment and similar other articles;

- (c) "furniture" includes carpets, sofa covers, curtains, refrigerators, air-conditioners, washing machines and similar other articles;
- (d) "Government" means the Federal Government;
- (e) "maintenance",—
 - (i) in relation to official residence, includes the maintenance and replenishing of furniture and furnishings, payment of local rates and taxes, maintenance of roads and electric, water, gas and sanitary fixtures and installations, and the provisions of electricity, gas and water;
 - (ii) in relation to river-craft, includes expenditure on the pay of the establishment maintained in connection therewith, and on their victualling while afloat, and expenditure on the purchase of marine stores; and
 - (iii) in relation to official cars and aircraft, includes the pay and allowances of chauffeurs, pilots and other establishment and the provision of oil and petrol;
- (f) "official cars", "railway saloons", "river-craft" and "aircraft" mean such cars, railway saloons, river-craft and aircraft, if any, as are from time to time provided for use by the Prime Minister;
- (g) "official residence" means the house specified in the First Schedule and such other premises in Pakistan as the Prime Minister may use as his official residence and includes the staff quarters and other buildings appurtenant thereto and the gardens thereof;
- (h) "prescribed" means prescribed by rules to be made by the Government;
- (i) "year" means a year commencing on the first day of July and ending on the thirtieth day of June next following; and
- (j) other words and expressions used in this Act and not defined shall have the meanings assigned to them in the Constitution of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan or the Fundamental and Supplementary Rules.

3. ¹Salary.- The salary to be paid to the Prime Minister shall be [one hundred seven thousand two hundred eighty rupees] per mensem.

4. **Equipment allowance.-** The Prime Minister may, on his assumption of office as such, draw twenty thousand rupees as an allowance for equipping himself;

Provided that, during the ten years immediately preceding the assumption of that office he had not drawn an allowance for the same purpose upon election or appointment to the office of President, Prime Minister, Chairman, Speaker, Federal Minister, Governor or Minister of State or a diplomatic office.

5. **Allowances on taking up and laying down the office.—** The Prime Minister shall be entitled to claim actual expenses to the extent mentioned below for the journey from his ordinary place of residence to the seat of Government on taking up office and from the seat of Government to his ordinary place of residence on laying down office:-

- (a) the actual travelling expenses for himself and his family;
- (b) the cost of transporting personal servants, not exceeding three, by the lowest class of accommodation; and
- (c) the cost of transporting household effects, not exceeding one hundred and twenty maunds, by goods train, steamer or other craft, excluding aircraft, and his personal car, if any.

(2) No claim shall lie for any travel or transportation not performed within six months of the date of assuming or laying down office, as the case may be.

6. **Official residence, railway saloons, river-craft, aircraft and official cars.-** (1) Throughout his term of office, the Prime Minister shall be entitled without payment or rent or hire to the use of his official residence, and of the railway saloons, river-craft, aircraft and official cars, and no charge shall fall on him personally in respect of the maintenance thereof:

Provided that the Prime Minister shall not, except when proceeding on or returning from leave, be entitled to the use of the railway saloons, river-craft, aircraft or official cars during any period for which he is on leave.

(2) The provisions of sub-section (1) shall also apply to the family of the Prime Minister.

Note: In addition to the salary as mentioned above, the Prime Minister has also been allowed 15% Ad-hoc Relief Allowance, 2011 (Rs. 12,110/- of previous salary i.e. Rs. 80,730/-), 20% Ad-hoc Relief Allowance, 2012 (Rs. 21,456/- of existing salary i.e. Rs. 107,280/-) and 10% Ad-hoc Relief Allowance-2017 Rs. 10,728/- vide Cabinet Division's O.M. No. 2-4/2011-Min-I, dated 14-02-2012, 07- 08-2012 and 08-09-2017 respectively.

(3) The Prime Minister may requisition a special railway train for journeys on official duty.

7. Discretionary grant, sumptuary allowance and other allowances.- There shall be paid in each year to the Prime Minister —

- (a) an allowance for expenses connected with the purposes specified in the Second Schedule, not exceeding the maximum amounts specified in that Schedule:

Provided that the Prime Minister may, without exceeding the maximum specified in column 7 of the aforesaid Schedule, re-appropriate, whenever necessary, from one sub-head in that Schedule to any other sub-head therein, except to or from the sub-heads relating to discretionary grant and sumptuary allowance;

- (b) an allowance for expenses connected with improvements in and maintenance of the official residence and maintenance of the furniture and furnishings thereof, not exceeding the maximum amounts specified in the Third Schedule:

Provided that the Prime Minister may, without exceeding the maximum specified in column 5 of the aforesaid Schedule, re-appropriate, whenever necessary from one sub-head in that Schedule to another sub-head therein;

- (c) The actual charges of electricity and gas consumption.

8. Payment of further amounts.- There shall be paid from time to time to the Prime Minister such further amounts necessary to enable him to discharge conveniently and with dignity the duties of his office as the Prime Minister may by general or special order authorize, and any such order may be given retrospective effect whenever necessary.

9. Payment on account of deferred pay, etc., of officers.- Nothing in this Act shall apply to any payment on account of the deferred pay, leave salaries, allowances, cost of passage or increments due to any officer provision for whose pay is made in the Second Schedule, and the amounts of such payment shall be in addition to the maximum amounts specified in that Schedule.

10. Amounts to be included in estimates of expenditure.- The Prime Minister may, subject to any general or special order made by him, include the amounts in any year in the estimates of expenditure for the purpose of giving effect to the provisions of this Act, and such amounts shall be charged upon and paid out of the Federal Consolidated Fund.

11. Compensation in case of air accident.- (1) If the Prime Minister, while travelling by air, on official duty, by any flight scheduled or unscheduled

(including flight in a Government-owned aircraft of any type), dies or receives an injury as a result of an accident, the Government shall pay to the person or persons referred to in sub-section (2) a sum of one million rupees in the case of death, and an amount to be determined by the Government having regard to scales of compensation applied by insurance companies in like cases, in the case of an injury.

(2) The compensation shall be payable, in the case of injury to the Prime Minister, and, in the case of death, to such member or members of his family, or, if there be no such member, such other person or persons as may be nominated by him, and in the absence of such nomination to his heirs.

(3) A nomination under sub-section (2) may be made and may also be revoked or altered, by a notice in writing signed by the Prime Minister and addressed to the Accountant General, Pakistan Revenues.

12. Leave.- (1) The Prime Minister may avail himself of leave of absence during his term of office, at any one time or from time to time, for urgent reasons of health or private affairs for a period not exceeding three months in the aggregate:

(2) The leave allowance of the Prime Minister shall be one hundred seven thousand two hundred eighty rupees per mensem.

13. Medical facilities.- The Prime Minister and the family of the Prime Minister shall be entitled to medical facilities in accordance with the Special Medical Attendance Rules:

Provided that he and his family shall ordinarily be entitled to receive medical treatment at his residence:

Provided further that the Prime Minister may, if so advised by his physician, receive medical treatment abroad or consult a foreigner or a physician other than his own and receive such other treatment as may be prescribed.

14. Customs-duties or sales tax not leviable on certain articles.- (1) No custom duties or sales tax shall be levied on the following articles if imported or purchased out of bond by the Prime Minister on appointment or during his tenure of office, namely:-

- (a) articles for the personal use, wear or consumption of the Prime Minister or any member of his family provided that the cost of such articles shall not exceed two hundred thousand rupees per annum;

- (b) Omitted vide Prime Minister's Salary, Allowances and Privileges (Amendment) Act, 1997, (Act No.XXX of 1997).
- (c) foodstuffs and tobacco for the Prime Minister, members of his family and his guests, whether official or not;
- (d) articles for furnishing of the Prime Minister's official residence; and
- (e) official cars, river-craft, or aircraft.

(2) No custom-duties or sales tax shall be levied on tobacco imported by manufacturers in Pakistan for the manufacture of cigarettes, and no excise duty shall be levied on indigenous tobacco used in Pakistan in the manufacture of cigarettes and on cigarettes manufactured in Pakistan, when such cigarettes are for consumption by the Prime Minister, members of his family or the guests referred to in clause (c) of sub-section (1).

(3) No excise duty shall be levied on indigenous petrol and petroleum products when such petrol or petroleum products are for use in the official cars, river-craft and aircraft.

15. Provident Fund.- The Prime Minister may, at his option, become a subscriber to the General Provident Fund and, if he so opts, he shall subscribe to the Fund as a compulsory subscriber in accordance with the General Provident Fund (Central Services) Rules.

16. Act to have effect subject to instructions, etc.- This Act shall have effect subject to such instructions, rules, exceptions, further concessions or easements as the Government may from time to time prescribe or grant.

16-A. Increase in emoluments.- The salary, allowances and privileges of Prime Minister shall automatically be revised alongwith the revision of the emoluments of the civil servants.

***17. Security.-** Every person who has held the office of the Prime Minister under Clause (4) of Article 91 of the Constitution shall be entitled for life to the suitable security, which the Federal Government shall, by notification in official Gazette, specify and make the required arrangements including services of personnel, vehicle or vehicles and allied matter.

Will the Minister Incharge of the Cabinet Division be pleased to state the details of latest warrants of precedence?

The current version of the warrant, as amended upto 6th December, 2008, was notified by the Ministry of Interior. Currently, the Cabinet Division is reviewing the process to update the Warrant of Precedence by moving a summary for the PM to re-notify committee.

Mian Riaz Hussain Pirzada:

- (a). Pursuant to the Expression of Interest (EOI) floated on 27.08.2009. Amongst 12 nos. participated bidders / firms 4 nos. were shortlisted, their quoted rates are attached **(Annex-A)**. In addition to, the criteria adopted is **(Annex-B)**.
- (b). On the basis of the above said criteria, the project was awarded to M/s Progressive Motels & Resorts, selected as JV partner with FGEHA and JV agreement was executed on 19.03.2010, on the basis of ratio of 50:50 shares, an entity on the name of EHFPRO was incorporated as a private limited company with Securities and Exchange Commission of Pakistan (SECP) on 24th May, 2010. A new partner M/s Granite Enterprises was inducted by Progressive Motels and Resorts. The shareholders as on 2012 and onward is illustrated as under:
FGEHA-50%
Progress-10.5%
Granite-39.5%
Land (10 + 5 Acre) was provided by FGEHA to retain the ownership rights and an amount of Rs. 600 million was initially agreed upon to be injected by the JV partner

which was later on, reduced to Rs. 300 million and further revised to Rs. 258 million.

- (c). The original estimated cost of 10 Acre plot was worked out of amounting to Rs. 15.245, billion while original estimated cost of 05 Acre plot determined 11.4 billion and expected / extended date of completion was determined 22.09.2019 / 31.12.2020 and 16.07.2021, and revised cost of amounting to Rs 40.344 billion and 20.597 billion respectively.
- (d). Reasons of delay are as under:
- 1) The approval process was very protracted, like wise securing layout plans, design clearance, municipal authorization and prolonged litigation is one of the major hurdles of the delay.
 - 2) During the phase excavation the Directorate of Building Control of CDA repeatedly made hindrances. Almost 10 months lapsed in obtaining the approval of buildings plans.
 - 3) Financial restructuring for project completion also made the project delayed.
 - 4) The vetting of the structural design took 15 months and finally satisfied in January, 2018.
 - 5) Inadequate financial planning and mobilization of resources alongwith insufficient material procurement strategies coupled with failure to secure the required capital also caused the delay.
 - 6) Covid-19 also impacted the timeline of the project and subsequently, post covid market ups and downs affected the project.
 - 7) The demise of the contractor as well as leadership vacuum also significantly delayed the project.
 - 8) At the last but not least, the frequent changes of CEOs also prolonged the execution of the project.

Minister Incharge of the Cabinet Division:

- (a) Toshakhana is presently being governed under the Toshakhana (Management and Regulation) Act, 2024, which received the assent of the President on 16th April, 2024.

In pursuance of the said Act, the Federal Cabinet constituted a Cabinet Committee on Toshakhana (Management and Regulation) Act, 2025 to frame Rules under the said law.

The Committee has held two meetings on 6th March 2025 and 16th June 2025, respectively. After detailed deliberations, the Committee has finalized its recommendations for the Toshakhana Rules, which are being submitted to the Federal Cabinet for formal approval.

- (b) To promote transparency and public accountability in Toshakhana matters, the Government has taken the following steps:

1. In 2023, an Inter-Ministerial Committee (IMC) was constituted by the Federal Cabinet which finalized and recommended a Revised Toshakhana Procedure for Acceptance and Disposal of Gifts, 2023, to streamline processes, enhance documentation, valuation, and disposal transparency.

2. Subsequently, Gift records up to 30th December 2024, are available for public scrutiny on the official website of the Cabinet Division.

3. In addition, a robust /dedicated Toshakhana Inventory Application system has been developed in collaboration with the Punjab Home Department.

4. The operationalization/automation of the said Inventory system in near future, will enhance security of Toshakhana data by ensuring secure digital record-keeping, track & trace and audit readiness.

- (b). As per Clause 3.29 & 3.30 of PBM Employees Service Regulations, 2021, the additional charge of an equivalent posts and current charge of higher posts can be granted to another employee/officer (who is fit and qualified to hold the post) by the Managing Director, Pakistan Bait-ul-Mal, being competent authority. The arrangement is not made for a period of less than one month and should not exceed three months; however it may be extended for more terms as the case may be with the approval of Managing Director **(Annex-B)**.
- (c). Detail is placed at **(Annex-C)**.
- (d). At present, there is no regular BPS-19 Officer in Provincial Office Baluchistan. Therefore, Dr. Muhammad Zafar Khan Safdar, Director (BPS-19) is assigned look after duties w.e.f 05.04.2025 till further orders, to run the affairs of Prov. Office Baluchistan. 3.26. Regularization of Contract Employees

Contract employees having proven good service record may be considered for regularization by the Bait-ul-Mal Board, provided:-

- a) Initial appointment on contract was in accordance with regulations 3.5 to 3.13;
- b) Seniority will be counted from the date of regularization.

3.27. Appointment on Daily Wages / Contingency basis

- a) The Managing Director or an officer so authorised may as considered appropriate, appoint staff in Pakistan Bait-ul-Mal in BPS 1 to 6 against sanctioned posts on daily wages / contingency basis;

Provided that the person so appointed otherwise fulfils the prescribed conditions for appointment and that too for a defined period;

- b) Managing Director or an officer so authorised may employ an individual in any of the running PBM projects in grade 1 to 16 as considered appropriate, in accordance with the policy of the project approved by the Bait-ul-Mal Board.

3.28. Probation

Persons appointed by promotion or direct recruitment or by transfer shall be on probation for a period of one year. This period may be curtailed or extended through a specific order for good and sufficient reasons, to be recorded.

ADDITIONAL CHARGE AND CURRENT CHARGE OF POSTS**3.29. Additional charge of an equivalent post**

If a post falls vacant and it is not possible to fill it immediately in the prescribed manner, the work of the post may, as far as possible, be distributed amongst more than one employee of the same status and designation. However, where this is not feasible, the charge of the vacant post may be entrusted in its entirety, by the Managing Director to another employee (projects employees are not entitled to this effect). The arrangement should not be made for a period of less than one month and should not exceed three months. However, it may be extended for more terms, as the case may be, with approval of the Managing Director.

3.30. Current charge of a higher posts

Where a temporary vacancy occurs for not more than two months or when a regular vacancy occurs and no arrangement for carrying out the day-to-day routine work of the post is possible, the charge of the vacant post may, with the approval of the Appointing Authority, be given temporarily, in addition to the duties of his own post, to an officer in the cadre present at the place if he is otherwise fit and qualified to hold that post.

The above arrangement should not be made for a period of less than one month and should not exceed three months. However, it may be extended for more terms, as the case may be, with approval of the Managing Director.

Will the Minister for Poverty Alleviation and Social Safety be pleased to state:

(a) the details of criteria laid down for identification of families eligible for financial assistance under the Banazir Income Support Program; and

(b) *the amount of monthly financial assistance being provided to the said families indicating total number of such families at present?*

Syed Imran Ahmad Shah:

a) Benazir Income Support Programme (BISP) primarily runs unconditional and conditional cash Transfer programs. Detail of criteria for identification, amount of financial assistance and total number of beneficiaries under each program is given as under

i) Unconditional Cash Transfer (UCT) (Kafaalat program):

Beneficiaries of Unconditional Cash Transfer (UCT) Programme also known as Benazir Kafaalat Programme are identified/ selected through scientific mode of National Socio Economic Registry (NSER) based on Proxy Means Test (PMT) Technique which allocates a score ranging from 0-100. Financial assistance is provided to those falling within the approved PMT Cut-off, which is currently set at 32.

It is clarified that Benazir Income Support Programme (BISP) provides cash assistance on quarterly basis instead of monthly disbursement. Presently, around 10 million regular UCT/Kafaalat beneficiaries are registered with BISP and receiving Rs. 13,500/- per quarter per beneficiary.

ii) Conditional Cash Transfer (CCT- Taleemi Wazaif Programme)

Children of all Kafaalat beneficiaries complying with following criteria are eligible for enrollment in Taleemi Wazaif Programme:

- Age criteria is 4-12 years for Primary Education
- Age criteria is 8-18 years for Secondary Education
- Age criteria is 13-22 years for Higher Secondary Education

Benazir Taleemi Wazaif Programme also has two co-responsibilities that the children have to comply with in order to receive cash transfers:

- (i) Admission in a school/College
- (ii) 70 percent quarterly attendance

(b). Cash stipend on quarterly basis is provided for primary, secondary, and higher secondary level of education at following rates:

Description	Per Boy/per quarter (Rs.)	Per Girl/per quarter (Rs.)
Primary Level	2,500	3,000
Secondary Level	3,500	4,000
Higher Secondary Level	4,500	5,000

One-time graduation bonus of Rs 3000/- is also provided to girl students to encourage them to complete primary education.

Presently, total 10.77 million children are enrolled under Taleemi Wazaif Programme including 5.77 million boys and 5 million girls.

Eligibility criteria for Balochistan is relaxed. Children from households with PMT Score 32-60 (Non-Kafaalat Beneficiaries) are also eligible for Benazir Taleemi Wazaif Programme.

Under Nashonuma Program, Special Nutrition Food (SNF) and quarterly cash stipend is provided to beneficiaries.

Quarterly Cash stipend is provided as for following details:

Under Nashonuma Programme, there are 2.06 million active beneficiaries (including women and children).

iii) CCT-Nashunoma

Pregnant & Lactating women and their children under the age of 2 years from Kafaalat beneficiary households are eligible for Nashonuma Programme.

However, for Balochistan province, eligibility criteria is relaxed and pregnant and lactating women and their children under the age of 2 year from households with PMT between 32-60, are also eligible.

Moreover, in 81 flood effected districts (Floods-2022), eligible criteria is also relaxed and Nashonuma beneficiaries can be from households with PMT 32-37. Noshonuma Programme has four conditions to receive cash stipend including:

- Regular health check-ups
- Consumption of Specialized Nutritious Food
- Attending health care awareness sessions
- Completing immunization of baby

- (b) *steps taken or being taken to get the said flats / residences vacated?*

Mian Riaz Hussain Pirzada:

- (a) **The matter of illegal occupation of government residences is essentially non-static and changes continuously however, every effort is made to keep this number zero. At this point in time, an illegal occupation which is either reported or revealed during field visit, the same is cancelled and vacated forthwith, and further allotment is made to an eligible Federal Government Servant under the rules.**

In a bid to curb illegal occupations, the Estate Office in collaboration with Intelligence Bureau has initiated a joint survey under directions of the Cabinet conveyed on 26-04-2024. During this effort, 509 illegal occupations have been identified so far which have been cancelled, vacated and further allotments of these accommodations have been made on merit to legal allottees. A summary indicating the exact number of cancelled allotments in each category/type can be perused at **Annex - A while individual details of these accommodations is at **Annex - B**. It is to mention that the said effort is on-going apart from routine filed inspections by the Estate Office's field formations.**
