Will the Minister for Interior and Narcotics Control be pleased to state whether criminal cases have been initiated against officials of FIA involved in human trafficking, if so, details thereof indicating status of their trail during the last three years?

Syed Mohsin Raza Naqvi: The details regarding FIA officials involved in human trafficking, during the last three years is as under:-

FIA has established a dedicated Personnel and Internal Accountability Branch (PIAB) which functions under HR Directorate at HQs Islamabad. The branch is mandated to initiate immediate departmental actions on receiving complaints against staff members of the agency. Similarly, criminal actions are also taken by the concerned zones on receiving complaints or tangible evidence against officials and officers of the department.

It is worth mentioning here that, FIA took stern criminal action against its officials and arrested 56 officials in 21 cases registered in all FIA Zones including Gujranwala, Lahore, Faisalabad, Multan, Karachi, Kohat, Peshawar, Islamabad, Balochistan & Hyderabad. 16 cases are under trial at present.

Will the Minister for Interior and Narcotics Control be pleased to state the details of FIA officials dismissed from service over their alleged collusion with human smugglers during the last three years?

Syed Mohsin Raza Naqvi:

The Federal Investigation Agency (FIA) has dismissed 51 employees in the last three years for suspected collusion with human smugglers. A breakdown by year is as follows:

In 2022, 6 FIA employees were dismissed for clearing passengers with forged documents at Islamabad and Karachi Airports. This was followed by 4 dismissals in 2023 for clearing a passenger with a fake passport at Multan Airport. Finally, in 2024, 41 employees were dismissed for their involvement in processing passengers related to the Greece boat incident.

Syed Mohsin Raza Naqvi: (a) & (b) The Establishment of Day Care Centres is the responsibility of Federal Government **under Section 3** of the Day Care Centres Act, 2023 (**Annex-A**). The Federal Government may by notification in the Official Gazette make rules for carrying out the purpose of this Act (**Section 8 of this Act**). Ministry of Interior & Narcotics Control will help in the implementation of this Act as and when, the Federal Government make rules to implement this Act in ICT.

THE DAY CARE CENTRES ACT, 2023

ACT NO. OF 2023

[15th June, 2023]

AN

ACT

to provide for the facility of day care centres in public and private establishments

WHEREAS, it is expedient to provide for the facility of day care centres in public and private establishments and for the purposes connected therewith and ancillary thereto;

It is hereby enacted as follows:—

1. Short title, extent and commencement.— (1) This Act shall be called the Day Care Centres Act, 2023.

(2) It extends to the Islamabad Capital Territory.

(3) It shall come into force at once.

2. Definitions.— In this Act, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context,—

- (a) "Code" means the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1898 (Act V of 1898);
- (b) "day care" means child care during the day when the parents work; and
- (c) "establishment" means and includes any public, private, autonomous, semi-autonomous, corporation, body, society under the Societies Registration Act, 1860 (XXI of 1860) any club, any small and medium enterprise, any NGO, etc.

3. Establishing day care centre.— (1) The Federal Government shall ensure the establishment of day care centre at all those establishments having at least seventy employees.

(2) All private establishments having at least seventy employees shall ensure the establishment of day care centre at their premises to provide benefit to their employees.

4. Punishment for non-compliance.— Whosoever does not comply to the provisions of this Act shall be given one warning in writing and in case of further non-compliance shall be punished with fine which may extend to one hundred thousand rupees. In case of further non-compliance, the person concerned shall be punished with imprisonment for six months.

5. Cognizance of an offence.— Notwithstanding anything contained in the Code, an offence punishable under this Act shall be tried under the Code by the magistrate of first class.

6. Application of the provisions of the Code.— Any proceedings under this Act shall be carried out in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Code.

7. Removal of difficulties.— If any difficulty arises in giving effect to any provision of this Act, the Federal Government may make such order not inconsistent with the provisions of this Act as may appear to be necessary for the purpose of removing such difficulty.

8. Power to make Rules.— The Federal Government may, by notification in the official Gazette, make rules for carrying out the purposes of this Act.

Khawaja Muhammad Asif:

- (b) The system of pensions in Pakistan International Airlines Corporation Limited (PIACL) is governed under PIA Pension Rules, 1976. These pension rules are structurally different from the pension rules of the Federal Government. In the Federal Government, commuted pension is restored after a fixed number of years which depends upon age of the employee at retirement. On the other hand, **PIA Pension Rules, 1976 does not provide for any such restoration.** There are two systems of post-retirement benefits: pension system and provident fund system. PIA follows provident fund system. In this system, pension is not granted to employees, a lump-sum amount at time of retirement is given. In PIA, 8.9% of Basic pay is contributed to Provident Fund by the employee, same amount is deposited by employer in the fund. A lump-sum amount is given to PIA employees at time of retirement. However, PIA as an additional welfare step, also provides pensions to its employees.


Decision of Board dated 2nd May 2019 (32nd Meeting) resolved that **restoration of pension shall be conditional upon the provision of requisite financial assistance from the Government of Pakistan.** However, support and subsidy from Government of Pakistan is suspended since 2018. Hence, revision in pension rules to incorporate restoration could not be materialized.



Syed Mohsin Raza Naqvi:

- (a). Currently, 3159 CCTV cameras of Safe City, Islamabad have been installed at key locations in Islamabad. These Cameras include PTZ, ANPR and Fix Cameras etc. that cover approx. 35% of critical area of ICT, including Red Zone, all major entry and exit points, important marketplaces, High-Traffic Roads and other significant public spaces through continuous 24/7 digital surveillance with approx. 95% network uptime. At any given time, around 120 to 140 cameras are typically undergoing scheduled repairs or maintenance as part of regular upkeep.
- (b). In line with PPRA rules, vendors for the operations and maintenance of Safe City, Islamabad camera infrastructure are selected through a transparent tendering process, ensuring continuous and efficient system performance.
- (c). Additionally, the PC-I for the expansion of the Safe City project has been approved, which will extend surveillance coverage to approximately 90% of ICT. This expansion will significantly enhance the project's capacity to meet the security and surveillance requirements of the Capital Territory.



Mr. Attaullah Tarar:

- (a) • As per Section-6 (1) of the PEMRA Ordinance, 2002, as amended by PEMRA (Amendment) Act, 2023, the Authority shall consist of a Chairman and twelve members to be appointed by the President of Pakistan Annex-A.
- **Section-6 (2):** The Chairman of the Authority shall be an eminent professional, of known integrity and competence having substantial experience in media, business, management, finance, economics or law.
 - **Section-6 (2A):** The division to which business of this Ordinance stands allocated shall recommend a panel of five candidates fulfilling the conditions of sub-section (2) and send it to a parliamentary committee consisting of four members two from the National Assembly and two from the Senate to be nominated by the Speaker of the National Assembly and the Chairman of the Senate respectively out of which one shall be from the treasury benches and one from the opposition in each House and the parliamentary committee shall consider the panel and recommend one candidate for appointment by the President under sub-section (1) and where the parliamentary committee fails to recommend within thirty days of receipt of the panel any person, the division concerned shall forward the panel to the Prime Minister who shall recommend to the President the candidate eminently suited to be appointed as Chairman by the President.
- (b) • **Date of Appointment:** Mr. Muhammad Saleem Baig was appointed as Chairman, PEMRA on 28.06.2018 for a period of four years, for the first time Annex-B.
- **Re-appointment:** As per Section-7 (1) of the PEMRA Ordinance, 2002, as amended by PEMRA (Amendment) Act, 2023 Annex-C, Mr. Muhammad Saleem Baig was re-appointed as Chairman, PEMRA on 12.08.2022. He will be retired on attaining the age of 65 years on 30.09.2025 Annex-D.
 - **Pay, Allowance and other Perks and Privileges:** As per Section-9 (1), the Chairman and members shall be paid such emoluments as the President of Pakistan may determine and shall not be varied to their disadvantage during their term of office Annex-D. Currently, he is working in MP-I Scale with the approval of the President of Pakistan Annex-D.

¹[4. **Functions of the Authority.**— (1) The Authority shall be responsible for regulating the establishment and operation of all broadcast media and distribution services in Pakistan established for the purpose of international, national, provincial, district, local or special target audiences.

(2) The Authority shall regulate the distribution of foreign and local TV and radio channels in Pakistan;

(3) The Authority may, by notification in the official Gazette, make regulations and also issue determinations for carrying out the purposes of this Ordinance.]

(3) Out of ¹[twelve] members one shall be appointed by the Federal Government on full time basis and five shall be eminent citizens chosen to ensure representation of all provinces with expertise in one or more of the following fields: media, law, human rights, and social service. Of the five members from the general public, two members shall be women.

(4) Secretary, Ministry of Information and ²[Broadcasting, Secretary, Interior Division, Chairman, Pakistan Telecommunication Authority and Chairman, Central Board of Revenue] shall be the *ex officio* members.

³[(4A) The remaining two members shall, by the division to which business of this Ordinance stands allocated, be appointed on need basis on recommendation of the Chairman and they shall be nonvoting honorary members, one from broadcasters and one from Pakistan Federal Union of Journalists (PFUJ).]

(5) The members, ⁴**** shall receive such fee and expenses for each meeting as may be prescribed.

(6) ⁵[A member, other than an *ex officio* member, shall be deemed to have vacated his office if he absents himself for three consecutive meetings of the Authority without the leave of the Authority.]

~~7. Tenure of members. - (1) The Chairman and members, other than *ex officio* members, unless earlier removed for misconduct or physical or mental incapacity, shall hold office for a period of four years and shall be eligible for re-appointment for a similar term or as the Federal Government may determine.~~

Provided that the Chairman and a member shall retire on attaining the age of sixty-five years.

Explanation.- For the purposes of this section the expression "misconduct" means conviction for any offence involving moral turpitude and includes conduct prejudicial to good order or unbecoming of a gentleman.

(2) The Chairman or a member may, by writing under his hand, resign his office.

8. Meetings of the Authority, etc. (1) The Chairman or, in his absence, the member elected by the members for the purpose, shall preside at a meeting of the Authority.

(2) One-third of the total members shall constitute a quorum for meetings of the Authority requiring a decision by the Authority.

(3) The members shall have reasonable notice of the time and place of the meeting and the matters on which a decision by the Authority shall be taken in such meeting.

(4) The decisions of the Authority shall be taken by the majority of its members present, and in case of a tie, the member presiding a meeting shall have a casting vote.

(5) All orders, determinations and decisions of the Authority shall be taken in writing ²* * *.

9. Remuneration of Chairman and members. - (1) The Chairman and members shall be paid such emoluments as the President of Pakistan may determine and shall not be varied to their disadvantage during their term of office.

10. Chairman and members not to engage themselves in certain business, etc.-

(1) The Chairman shall not, during his term of office, engage himself in any other service, business, vocation or employment, or enter into the employment of, or accept any advisory or consultancy relationship with any person or entity engaged in applying for a licence from the Authority or operating a broadcast station established within the purview of the Authority or in providing services or products to the Authority on any of the projects, schemes, proposals or plans undertaken, executed or supervised by the Authority or any related undertaking of such aforesaid person or entity.

(2) The members shall not have any direct or indirect financial interest, or have any connection with any such person, entity or related undertaking as mentioned in sub-section (1) of this section associated in any way with the licensee of a broadcast station for so long as they are members and hold office.

11. Officers, employees, etc. - To carry out the purposes of this Ordinance, the Authority may, from time to time, appoint members of its staff, experts, consultants, advisers and other officers and employees on such terms and conditions as ³[may be prescribed by regulations].

12. Officers, etc. deemed to be public servants. - The Chairman, members, members of its staff, other officers and employees of the Authority shall be deemed to be public servants within the meaning of section 21 of the Pakistan Penal Code (Act XLV of 1860).

Will the Minister for Interior and Narcotics Control be pleased to state number of rape cases registered in the ICT since 1-1-2021 alongwith present status of each case indicating also the number of persons arrested, challaned and convicted in said cases?

Syed Mohsin Raza Naqvi:

It is submitted that as per reports obtained from all Police Stations of Islamabad through Zonal Superintendent of Police, during the period from 01.01.2021 to 20.06.2025, total 567 cases of rape were registered and 625 accused were arrested.

Out of 567 cases, 485 cases were challaned, 80 accused were convicted, 23 accused were acquitted and accused in 406 cases are still facing trial in the competent courts.

29 cases are under investigation and will be concluded as soon as possible.

Detail of cases is attached as Annex-A. Moreover, supplementary material is attached as Annex-B.

Will the Minister for Interior and Narcotics Control be pleased to state whether it is a fact that Islamabad Traffic Police has issued driving licenses to medically unfit people during the last three years, if so, the details thereof indicating also the action taken against responsible officials and any reward announced for those identifying the same?

Syed Mohsin Raza Naqvi:

No. Islamabad Traffic Police (ITP) strictly adheres to the legal provisions governing the issuance of driving licenses and has never issued a license to any medically unfit individual. As mandated under Section 7, Sub-Section 5 of the Motor Vehicle Ordinance 1965, every applicant must undergo a comprehensive medical examination to assess their physical and mental fitness before the commencement of any licensing process. This mandatory procedure ensures that only individuals who meet the prescribed health and fitness standards are granted driving privileges, thereby safeguarding public safety and reducing the risk of road accidents. The provision of Section 7(5) is hereby reproduced for reference:

"7(5) If, from the application or from the medical certificate referred to in sub-section (3) it appears that the applicant is suffering from any disease or disability specified in the Second Schedule or any other disease or disability which is likely to cause the driving by him of a motor vehicle of the class which he would be authorised by the licence applied for to drive to be a source of danger to the public or to the passengers, the licensing authority shall refuse to issue the licence".

It is further stated that the Islamabad Traffic Police has dedicated medical staff and doctors to conduct medical and eyesight examinations of applicants. These examinations are carried out in accordance with First Schedule, Form 'B' of the Motor Vehicle Ordinance, 1965, to ensure compliance with the prescribed fitness standards.

- (a) whether it is a fact that employees of Pakistan Television Corporation (PTV) have been receiving their salaries with delays for the past 4-5 months, if so, the reason thereof; and*
- (b) the steps being taken by the Government to ensure timely disbursement of salaries to PTV employees?*

Mr. Attaullah Tarar:

- (a). The delay in the disbursement of salaries for PTV regular employees, which are usually being paid between the 17th to 20th of each month for the last five to six months is primarily due to temporary cash flow constraints currently being faced by the organization. However, there is lag of about two months in payment of salaries to the contractual employees such as anchors. This situation has arisen due to significant operational expenditures, including substantial payments made towards acquiring crucial international media rights and other strategic commitments aimed at enhancing the national broadcaster's outreach and content quality. While these investments are vital for the long-term sustainability and competitiveness of PTV, they have put short-term pressure on liquidity.
- (b). The management is actively engaged in addressing this situation through internal resource optimization, improved revenue generation strategies and coordination with relevant departments for financial support where necessary.

Mr. Muhammad Hanif Abbasi:

- (a) Pakistan Railways has initiated "Installation & Commissioning of Solar System at 155 Nos. Railway Stations" across railway network as part of on-going energy conservation policy to reduce electricity consumption. Out of a total of 155 railway stations, solar energy systems have been installed at 37 stations, while solarization work at 76 stations is currently in progress. Furthermore, the tendering is in process for the remaining 107 railway stations. Details of province wise break-up of such installations is as under:

Syed Mohsin Raza Naqvi:

- (a) The Anti-Narcotics Force (ANF) conducts strategic seizures and enforcement actions in accordance with the Control of Narcotic Substances (CNS) Act, 1997.
- (b) **As per Higher Education Commission (HEC)'s guidelines, internal hierarchy & administrations are themselves responsible for discipline enforcement/ regulatory mechanisms, within the premises of EIs.**
 - ANF does not directly intervene with internal disciplinary framework of EIs. But focus of its counter narcotics (CN) operations remains on targeting the drug dealers, suppliers, & key facilitators, operating in the vicinity of EIs.
 - The data on arrested students for supplying drugs within EIs, as well as the number of students, referred to rehabilitation or treatment centers, along with details of the rehabilitation services provided, may therefore, be acquired from respective EI/ University administrations or the local Police authorities, who are mandated to undertake such operations within premises of EIs. As regards rehabilitation, one Model Addiction Treatment and Rehabilitation

Replies

Centre (MATRC) is being run at Islamabad, under supervision of ANF. In last three years, 4 x addicted students have been treated there.

- (C) **ANF conducted EI-Centric CN Campaign for 2024/25 from 11 Sep 2024 to 31 May 2025.** ANF covered **263 x Higher Els** across Pakistan with concurrent advancement of **hard (enforcement operations) & soft (awareness campaigns) prongs.** Campaign resulted in seizure of **1457.709 Kgs** of narcotics, destined to be supplied to the students of Els, with **arrest of 451 drug peddlers in 395 x cases.** **Els-Centric CN Campaign plan for 2025/26 is now being conducted,** in which HEC, Provincial Governments, Education Departments and LEAs are collaborating with ANF. **Enhancing the scope of campaign, Colleges and Schools have also been incorporated.** Like yester year, **Universities will be covered by ANF whereas Colleges and Schools will be covered by Provincial Governments, Education Departments, LEAs and other agencies.** ANF will provide needful assistance for coordination and training of master trainers.

- (b) *whether the said policy has been approved by the Cabinet, if not the reasons thereof?*

Syed Mohsin Raza Naqvi:

(a & b). It is submitted that the deportees on account of undesirable activities or illegal entry or criminal charges are placed on Passport Control List (PCL) for a period of five years as per provision of Rule 21 (l) read with Rule 22 (2)(b) & (2)(c) of Passport Rules, 2021 which are also reproduced as under;

Rule 21 (l)

" A citizen of Pakistan may be refused issuance of passport for the time being on any of the following grounds, namely:-

(l) a person previously deported from abroad on account of undesirable activities or illegal entry or criminal charges;"

Rule 22(2)(b)

"Under category „B", the names of those persons are placed who have been refused passport under these rules....;"

(c) "Normal period of retaining a person on the PCL is five years. However, a person may be kept on PCL even beyond five years provided the referring department or agency recommends for further retention having full justification in this regard....."

Moreover, Passport Rules, 2021 have been approved by the Federal Cabinet of Government of Pakistan notified vide S.R.O 245(1)/2022 dated 14-02-2022.

The development of project has been delayed due to default in payment of development charges by all allottees of all blocks in general.

At present, laying of sewerage, water pipelines and sub-base roads is under process in Block-D and work is being done as per available funds. However, the construction of the Bridge & Access Road work of which has already been awarded and construction at a slow pace is under progress. Non-payment of development charges has caused delay completion of works which has resulted in delay in handing over of possession to allottees. The detail of allottees of D-Block along-with deposited amount is at **Annex-A**.

- (b). As per report of the Society, the Society is trying its best to recover dues from defaulter members whereas AGM of society has already approved to cancel plots of defaulter allottees. Society is hopeful that recovery position will be better in upcoming months and incomplete works will be completed after which possession to allottees of D-Block will be handed over accordingly.

Mr. Muhammad Hanif Abbasi:

- (a). Pakistan Locomotive Factory, Risalpur is a strategic asset of Pakistan Railways (PR) and is operating on no profit/ no loss basis. The factory was commissioned in 1993 with cooperation of Japan, and designed to manufacture 25 locomotives per annum. However, it is not an earning unit and its core function is to manufacture new locomotives for PR, through PSDP funding. So far, 102 DE locomotives had been manufactured and 26 overage locomotives have been rehabilitated in this factory. In case of non-manufacturing of DE Locos, other tasks/manufacturing of Diesel Spares as well as other rolling stock/jobs are done regularly. Currently, the factory is engaged in local manufacturing of High Capacity Bogie Freight Wagons. The factory is fully equipped & functional and is in position to manufacture locos, spares and freight wagons, however, there are some key constraints causing imbalances in revenues for the factory such as: -

1. No project for manufacturing of locomotives has been approved by the Government since long.
2. Insufficient vendors support for indigenous manufacturing of DE Locomotives.
3. Shortage of skilled workforce due to retirements over the time.

4. Lack of modern machinery and delay in procurement of essential equipment.
5. Delays in release of allocated funds and inadequate repair of existing machinery.

The majority of officers against whom charges of corruption have been substantiated have already been subjected to significant penalties, including dismissal, removal, compulsory retirement, or reduction to lower time scales, in accordance with the severity of the charges. Some officers, against whom charges have not yet been proven and whose inquiries are still ongoing, are currently serving in the CDA. However, these officers have been relieved from the positions or posts in relation to the ongoing investigations. A detailed list of the officers and officials is provided in Annexure-A.

- c. In order to enhance transparency and accountability, the Capital Development Authority (CDA) has implemented the Public Procurement Regulatory Authority (PPRA) Rules in their true letter and spirit for all types of procurement, tendering, and auction processes. The use of the **E-PADS online** system has been made mandatory in this regard. Furthermore, the Directorate of Procurement and Contracts has been restructured to ensure more effective oversight and control over all procurement and tendering activities. In addition, all land records have been **digitized** through the Punjab Land Record Authority (PLRA). The process of property transfers under the Estate Management Directorate has also been digitized, with case tracking now facilitated through a dedicated mobile application. In its ongoing efforts to streamline administrative processes and enhance operational efficiency, the Capital Development Authority (CDA) has successfully implemented the e-Office system across the organization. This initiative is aimed at expediting the processing and resolution of cases while ensuring greater transparency, accountability, and seamless coordination among various departments. The adoption of the e-Office system not only accelerates decision-making but also reduces delays, eliminates paperwork, and fosters a more efficient and transparent workflow, thereby contributing to the overall effectiveness of the authority's operations.

Syed Mohsin Raza Naqvi: (a) Two Agreement dated 12-09-2007 and 14-03-2008 were signed between CDA and DHAI, as per said agreements, CDA allocated 2412 Kanal raw land to DHA-I and in exchange of that allocated / allotted land, DHA-I agreed to handover 729 developed plots to CDA (measuring 500 Sq.yard each). (Copy of agreement Annexed).

(b) DHA-I handed over 727 allotment certificate on 31-12-2013, in allotment certificates plots numbers were not mentioned. Now, DHA-I handed over allotment letters of 725 plots with designated plot numbers in September 2024.

(c) As per agreements Plots were to be offered in Phase-II (Extension). 725 plots are allotted in DHA Phase-VI.

CDA vide letter dated 15-05-2025, allotments of 193 plots were returned to DHA to dispose of the same, and CDA has asked the DHA that in first instance the offered amount may be shared with CDA so that the same may be approved. (copy Annexed).

Mr. Muhammad Hanif Abbasi: (a) At present only Jaffer Express (39Up/40Dn) is plying between Peshawar and Quetta as per following time table:

- Ex: Quetta departure 09:00 Hrs, Peshawar arrival 19:35 Hrs (Next day).
- Ex: Peshawar departure 07:00 Hrs, Quetta arrival 17:00 Hrs (Next day)

(b) It is not a fact that coaches of the Jaffer Express are in deteriorated condition. All the coaches running with this train are well maintained and are fit mechanically as well as-electrically in all respect.

(c) At present, Jaffer Express is running with composition and services which are sufficient to cater to the needs of the current potential of traffic of that area. Hence there is no such proposal to enhance coaches of Jaffer Express so far.
