*Will the Minister for Information and Broadcasting be pleased to state the details of persons appointed in PTV on regular, contract and daily wage basis during the last one year indicating also the number of persons appointed against the quota of Balochistan and persons with disabilities out of the same?*

**Mr. Attaullah Tarar:**

- During the last year from 01.07.2024 to 30.06.2025 PTV appointed 81 employees on contract/professional basis as per list attached at “**Annex-A**”. No regular and daily wages appointments made during the said period. During the last one year 02 persons of Balochistan domicile were appointed.
- Presently number of persons appointed against quota of Balochistan is 9%, whereas prescribed quota is 6%.
- As far as number of appointed persons with disabilities is concerned, prescribed quota is already fully occupied, hence no person with disabilities has been appointed during the last one year.

**Khawaja Muhammad Asif:**

The New Gwadar International Airport (NGIA) project has been implemented under the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) framework with financial assistance from the Government of the People's Republic of China. Various Chinese and Pakistani firms have been engaged for different components of the project. Their details are as follows:

*Will the Minister for Defence be pleased to state whether the provision of cargo, immigration, navigation and other facilities at par with international standard at the New Gwadar International Airport have been completed, if not, the time by which the same will be provided / completed?*

**Khawaja Muhammad Asif:**

The New Gwadar International Airport (NGIA) operational area has already been completed, and the Airport has been in operation since January 20, 2025. Major facilities (i/c but not limited to Immigration, Navigation, Communication etc) have been developed in accordance with the standards prescribed by the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO) and the Pakistan Civil Aviation Authority (PCAA).

The Cargo Handling Facility is at the final stage of Construction under the Pakistani side scope of work and is expected to be completed by December 2025.

*Will the Minister for Defence be pleased to state the number of PIA flights operated for EU countries and revenue generated through the same since lifting of ban?*

**Khawaja Muhammad Asif:**

After lifting of EASA (European Union Aviation Safety Agency) ban on 29<sup>th</sup> November 2024, PIA has resumed Europe operation with re-launching Paris flights from 10<sup>th</sup> January 2025. Initially, PIA operated 02 weekly flights between Islamabad and Paris. Later from 18<sup>th</sup> June 2025, 3<sup>rd</sup> weekly flight between Lahore and Paris was added. From 10<sup>th</sup> January till 16<sup>th</sup> August 2025, PIA has operated 73 flights and generated revenue of PKR 4.3 billion.

*Will the Minister for Interior and Narcotics Control be pleased to state whether it is a fact that Islamabad is being provided with water in accordance with allocation by the Council of Common Interest (CCI)?*

**Syed Mohsin Raza Naqvi:**

The Council of Common Interests (CCI) on February 29th, 2016 approved 200 Cusecs water allocation for Islamabad from Indus River System as per following share agreed by all the provinces:

- i. 74 Cusecs water from the Province of Sindh.
- ii. 74 Cusecs from the Province of the Punjab.
- iii. 24 Cusecs from the Province of Balochistan.
- iv. 28 Cusecs from the Province of KPK.

In order to utilize the said water allocation, the CDA has already conceived a project regarding "Conduction of Water from Indus River System at Tarbela Dam for Islamabad & Rawalpindi". However, the project hasn't been materialized yet by one reason or other; but mainly due to financial constraints being a multibillion project both in Capital cost as well as in Operation & Maintenance (O&M). Even the project was considered by the Special Investment Facilitation Council (SIFC) during the year 2024 but didn't proceed further.

However, the Task Force constituted by the Prime Minister on "Water Supply to the Twin Cities of Islamabad and Rawalpindi" has decided (during its meeting held on 25-06-2025) that the Ministry of Water Resources, Govt. of Pakistan will undertake feasibility studies of the said project on immediate basis through WAPDA.

Presently, water is being supplied to Islamabad through surface as well as the groundwater resources. Such resources located in the Islamabad Capital Territory (ICT) are the Simly Dam and Rawal Dam Reservoirs, 04 Nos. Small Water Works besides a number of Tube Wells. Whereas, water is also being supplied to Islamabad from Khanpur Dam Reservoir located in the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KPK) province; the apportionment of which had been approved by the ECNEC.

*Will the Minister for Interior and Narcotics Control be pleased to state whether it is a fact that portraits of our national poet Allama Muhammad Iqbal and Romanian national poet Mihai Eminescu have gone missing from the Pakistan Monument, Islamabad, if so, details thereof including action taken against those found guilty or negligent?*

**Syed Mohsin Raza Naqvi:**

On 14-01-2025, a complaint regarding the said incident was received from Mr. Ghulam Murtaza Chandio, Magistrate City Circle, Islamabad, upon which Case FIR No.62/25, dated 14-01-2025 U/S 425/434 PPC PS Kohsar, Islamabad was registered immediately and investigation was started accordingly, (Copy of FIR is placed at **Annex-A**). During investigation of the case, it revealed that the above-said monument was built by the Embassy of Romania with the collaboration of CDA, Islamabad in the year 2004. This monument is jointly dedicated to the National poets of Pakistan Allama Muhammad Iqbal and Romanian poet Mihai Eminescu, who are revered equally by both nations. Further, as per the information containing in letter received from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (**Annex-B**), the said monument was vandalized in the end of 2022, by some unknown accused. At that time, despite the Embassy of Romania had intimated the same to the concerned authorities of CDA, Islamabad, who further assured to the embassy for early rehabilitation of the said monument, but the same was not done well in time. Given the successive damages to the monument, the Embassy is concerned that these acts may signify more than mere theft and vandalism. The Embassy has, therefore, urged the concerned authorities to act against the perpetrators and rehabilitate the monument. It is also pertinent to mention here that the said incident was not reported to the local Police of PS Kohsar till 14-01-2025.

To investigate the case, a Special Investigation Team (SIT) was constituted vide Order No.702-06-DIG/lbd, dated: 29-01-2025, under the supervision of SSP Investigation comprising of SP City Zone, DSP Investigation City Zone and DSP RDU, Islamabad. During investigation of the above-said case, SIT inspected the crime scene, drew the un-scaled map of the crime scene, also recorded the statements of the relevant staff of the CDA Parks Wing, as well as the residents and the shopkeepers who are running their businesses in the vicinity to inquire regarding the whereabouts of the unknown accused. So far, Q5x Suspects apprehended have further been interrogated accordingly, but so far no fruitful information has been received regarding the involved accused. Safe City, Islamabad was approached for provision of the footage of CCTV cameras installed in the surroundings of the crime scene. However, as the incident happened at the end of the year 2022 and was not timely reported

Subject: Vandalism of the Monuments of National Poets of Pakistan and Romania in Islamabad.

The Romanian Embassy in Islamabad has expressed strong concerns regarding the recent acts of vandalism against the monument, jointly dedicated to the national poets of Romania and Pakistan, Mihai Eminescu and Mohammad-Allama Iqbal, built in Islamabad, on January 15, 2004. This act has caused almost complete destruction of the monument.

2. According to Romanian Embassy, the monument was previously vandalized in the end of 2022. At that time, despite reporting to the concerned authorities and receiving assurances for its rehabilitation, the monument was not rebuilt till date. Given the successive damages to the monument, the Embassy is concerned that these acts may signify more than mere theft and vandalism. The Embassy has, therefore, urged the concerned authorities to act against the perpetrators and rehabilitate the monument.

3. This monument is conceived as an emblem of friendship between the Pakistan and Romania, and symbolizes unique blend of arts and architecture; appreciation of the poetic legacies and values of amity and goodwill that the two countries have historically shared. Recently, the two countries celebrated 60th anniversary of establishment of bilateral relations.

4. In view of our friendly bilateral relations, this Ministry recommends investigation and restoration of the monument, and a report by the relevant authorities for sharing with the Romanian Embassy. The Romanian Embassy's note dated 8 January 2025, is enclosed for information and necessary action please.



**Syed Mohsin Raza Naqvi:**

- (a) All the Societies registered with Cooperative Societies Department, ICT have built their websites and all are operational except few numbers of societies. Society wise breakup list along with their websites is attached at **(Annex-I)**.
- (b) The Cooperative Societies Department, ICT, Islamabad has directed all cooperative housing societies to update their official websites in compliance with Sections 44-D and 44-E of the Cooperative Societies Act, 1925.

Furthermore, vide its circular No.4993/CR/ICT/B dated 19-11-2019 **(Annex-II)**, the Department has instructed societies to strictly comply with all provisions of Rule 61 of the Islamabad Cooperative Societies Rules, 2018, in true letter and spirit. It is also submitted that upon every notification of a newly elected Managing Committee, the Department reiterates compliance with the directions under Sections 44-D and 44-E, including the requirements of Rule 61 of the Islamabad Cooperative Societies Rules, 2018, regarding the establishment and maintenance of an official website.

It is pertinent to mentioned here that show cause have also been issued to the Societies for non-compliance of directions of this office vide letter No. 1093/CR/ICT/B dated 25-02-2020 **(Annex-III)**.

- (c) As per report of Society the Federal Residents Cooperative Housing Society, Islamabad was earlier named as Senate Secretariat Employees Co-operative Housing Society, Islamabad and a website was operative with its domain name, however, after change of name a new domain name has been registered as frchs.pk. at present society is under the process of election which is scheduled on 19-Oct-2025. As soon as the management assumes charge, the new website with updated records, currently under compilation, will be uploaded and made available for the information of all members.

Please refer to the subject noted above.

2. Rule 61 of Islamabad Cooperative Societies Rules, 2018 requires all the Cooperative Housing Society to take numerous measures for the transparency & accessibility of services being provided by them. However, it is observed that this Rule has not been complied with. The Competent Authority has taken a serious notice of this violation by the Cooperative Housing Society registered with Cooperative Societies Department, ICT, Islamabad.

3. Therefore, you are directed to develop your websites & comply with all the provisions of Rule 61 of Islamabad Cooperative Societies Rules, 2018 in true letter & spirit. Final compliance report in this regard should be submitted to this office within 02 Months without fail. Non compliance of these directions would tantamount to disobedience of the directions of the Authority and strict legal action shall be initiated against the entire Managing Committee of the society, if Rule 61 of Islamabad Cooperative Societies Rules, 2018 is not complied within stipulated period.

*Will the Minister for Interior and Narcotics Control be pleased to state:*

- (a) the rules/regulation under which CDA allot plots for residential, commercial and welfare purposes in Islamabad;*
- (b) whether it is a fact that CDA has authority to cancel the allotment of a plot and re-allot to some other person, if so, the name of authority which exercise this power; and*
- (c) the number of allotment of plots cancelled and re-allotted to other parties by CDA during the last five years indicating also the names and addresses of the allottees in each case?*

**Syed Mohsin Raza Naqvi:**

- (a) All categories of plots are strictly disposed of under the provision of Islamabad Land Disposal Regulation, 2005. Copy of Islamabad Land Disposal Regulation, 2005 is annexed.
- (b) In case of any property canceled due to default of bidder/allottee or any violation of terms and condition of allotment, cancelled properties are again disposed off purely on the same way as mentioned above (a).
- (c) No such practice took place as far as commercial properties are concerned.

## CHAPTER III

## DISPOSAL OF PLOTS

4. **Disposal of Plots.-** The plots shall be sold or leased out by the Authority according to the provisions given for each category of plots and the allotment shall be subject to the terms and conditions contained in the respective allotment letters or, as the case may be, in the Conveyance or Lease Deeds executed by the Authority in respect of plots:

*Provided that* CDA Board may decide to enter into joint ventures with any private or public sector agency regarding property vested in it for any specific project.

*Provided further that* in respect of matters not provided for in this Regulation, other Regulations and Instructions of the Authority, as may be in force from time to time, shall apply.

5. **Residential Plots.-** (1) All residential plots in developed Sectors shall be allotted through open auction. The residential plots in other Sectors shall be disposed of in the following manner:

(2) Notwithstanding anything contained in clause (1) the Authority may reserve any land for the residences of Govt. employees including employees of CDA, autonomous and semi-autonomous bodies and for the Affectees of Islamabad.

(3) Plots for the persons falling in clause 5(1)(ii) shall be allotted by the CDA Board as per criteria to be laid down by it.

(4) Plots for the persons falling in Clause 5(1)(iii) shall be allotted on the recommendations of the Ministry of Defence.

(5) The applications for allotment of plots to persons falling in Clause 5(1)(iv) shall be scrutinized and disposed off by the CDA Board as per prescribed criteria.

(6) Plots to the CDA Employees falling in Clause 5(1)(v) shall be allotted in accordance with the criteria to be laid down by the CDA Board.

#### COMMENTS

**Deputationist.** A deputationist cannot claim allotment as employee of the Capital Development Authority. Considering deputationist to be having equal status of regular employees of the Authority is a door of corruption and is not backed by the Constitution [2013 MLD 935]. Deputationists can claim allotment of plots out of 80% remaining quota reserved for employees of Federal Government [2013 MLD 1538].

**6. Commercial and Business Plots.-** (1) All Commercial and Business plots shall be sold or leased out through open auction as commercial plots, or for one of the specific activities mentioned in Clause 3(2):

*Provided that* plots meant for any activity as determined by CDA Board may be disposed of through auction amongst pre-qualified parties. Criteria for prequalification and plot-specific conditions of allotment shall be publicized.

(2) Plots auctioned as commercial plots may be used for any of the activities falling within the scope of commercial plots as defined in clause 3 (2) and also for activities such as hospitals, clinics, maternity homes, gymnasiums, art-galleries, amusement centers, clubs, museums, libraries, educational institutions, research centers and community centers:

*Provided that* no plot auctioned as Commercial plot shall be used for construction of petrol/ CNG filling station and/or service station, 5 star hotels, marriage hall and for religious purposes.

(3) Plots already sold or leased out specifically for any of the activities in clause 3(2) may be put, with the prior approval of the Authority and subject to restrictions imposed by the Proviso to clause (2) to a different commercial activity on payment of conversion fee at the rates as may be fixed for different commercial activities by the CDA Board from time to time:

*Provided that plots specifically allotted for construction of and use as hospital, wholesale market, petrol/ CNG filling and/ or service station, hotels, 5 star hotels, marriage halls, sites for multi-storeyed building allotted exclusively for residential apartments, religious purposes and community centers will not be allowed any conversion.*

**7. Community Building and Facilities Plots.- Public Sector:** (1) Plots for Primary Schools shall be made available to the Federal Government free of cost and for Secondary and Higher Education at amenity rates.

(2) Land for mosques, churches and other places of worship and deeni madrassas established for free religious education shall be allotted free of cost.

(3) Plots for other community buildings and facilities shall be allotted to Government organizations at amenity rates.

*Private Sector.*- (4) Plots earmarked for educational institutions in private sector shall be allotted after inviting applications and as per criteria to be laid down by the CDA Board.

(5) Plots for other private institutions, including plots for hospitals, maternity homes, clinics, art galleries, gymnasiums, amusement parks, etc., shall be sold/ leased by auction.

*Provided that* CDA Board may decide to dispose of certain plots in this category through auction amongst pre-qualified parties.

(6) Large scale, social sector projects, involving large tracts of land, like a private university, may be considered for special dispensation by the Federal Cabinet on a case-to-case basis.

#### COMMENTS

##### Synopsis

1. Allotment of plot without advertising.

2. Cancellation of allotment.

**1. Allotment of plot without advertising.** According to Regn. 7(4) of Islamabad Land Disposal Regulations, 2005, allotment could be made after inviting applications. Application could not be invited without publicizing plot in newspaper. Board had to lay down criteria after receiving applications for allotment. Neither suit plot had been publicized nor on basis of criteria mentioned in such advertisement any plot finding mention therein could be allotted to a person not running school in Islamabad. Chairman, CDA in his affidavit filed in Court had admitted allegations made in constitutional petition except allegation regarding nepotism after undertaking to allot suit plot in accordance with law and criteria laid down. Respondent-allottee by filing in Court his affidavit

gave up his claim regarding suit plot. High Court accepted constitutional petition and directed CDA to proceed with allotment of suit plot in accordance with law and procedure [2011 CLC 814].

2. Cancellation of allotment. Capital Development Authority Board approved 30% quota for educational institutions from outside Islamabad and remaining 70% for schools running in the Capital Territory. No other document was available with the Authority to establish that the Board had not approved policy to allot 30% of plots to educational institutions not established in Islamabad. When Capital Development Authority itself received application of petitioner, scrutinized it, entertained it and approved it by allotting plot in question to petitioner to establish school, received huge amounts from petitioner, put petitioner in possession of disputed plot, issued possession certificate to petitioner and approved its building plan, then the Authority could not assert that some other policy was formulated. High Court declared the order of cancelling allotment and return of pay orders to petitioner to be null and void and set aside cancellation order. Petition was allowed in circumstances [2015 CLC 779].

8. **Administrative and Public Sector Plots.**- These Plots shall be allotted to the respective Ministries, Government agencies and autonomous/ semi autonomous organizations of the Government by the Board at such rates as may be determined by it from time to time:

*Provided that* these plots may also be allotted to International and Regional Organizations of which Pakistan is a member, on the recommendation of the Federal Government at such rates as the Authority may determine from time to time.

9. **Industrial Plots.**- Industrial plots shall be sold or leased through open auction. Plots for extractive industries will, however be given only on license terminable on 3 months notice and on payment of such periodical license fee as may be prescribed.

10. **Diplomatic Plots.**- These plots shall be allotted to foreign Governments for their diplomatic missions or for the residences of their representatives on the recommendation of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs:

*Provided that* subject to availability of land, plots in Diplomatic Enclave may also be allotted to International and Regional Organizations of which Pakistan is a member, on the recommendation of the Federal Government at such rates as the Authority may determine from time to time.

<sup>2</sup>[11. **Public Parks.**- (1) Public Parks, playing fields and graveyards, shall be planned, developed and maintained by the Authority. However, the Authority may license/rent out some sites or the portions of public parks, playing

fields or open spaces to private sector on agreed terms and conditions for recreational purposes, sports facilities and ancillary usages.

(2) Playing fields and open spaces may be categorized for sports purposes as under:—

- (a) Cricket, hockey, football.
- (b) Basket ball, Volley ball, badminton, tennis and open gymnasiums.
- (c) Adventure sports:—
  - (i) Rock climbing, dirt bike tracks, mountain bike cycling, horse riding, etc.
  - (ii) Entertainment projects like Go Carts, Archery, Water sports and amusement parks, etc.

(3) Category (a) and (b) of (2) above will be managed as follows:—

- (i) Grounds managed by professional sports organizations.
- (ii) Multi-purpose sectoral grounds managed by Directorate of Sports and Culture through Sector Management Committees.

(4) The allotment for category (c) of (2) above will be considered on following criteria:—

- (a) Type of project.
- (b) The best offer received in terms of rent;
- (c) The Size of Investment;
- (d) Commercial potential; and
- (e) Area, location and specific land use.

12. **Agro-farming and Agro-Industries Plots.**— These plots shall be sold or leased through open auction.

*Provided that* Agro-farming plots may be allotted at reserve price to be fixed by the Authority from time to time to all the genuine Affectees of various areas of Islamabad who have lost in acquisition to the Authority, cultivable land not less than 100 kanals in area, in accordance with the Islamabad Displaced Persons Rehabilitation Policy, 1996:

*Provided further that* no allotment shall be made to the affectee applying through or pursuing for allotment through attorney.

**13. Plots in Model Villages and Sub-Urban Centers.-** Residential plots in Model Villages and Sub-Urban Center will be allotted as under:—

- (a) 50% to the eligible Affectees of Islamabad whose land had been acquired by the authority prior to 1st January 1996, in accordance with the rehabilitation policy of the authority as may be in force from time to time.
- (b) 50% through open auction:

*Provided that* the left over plots against the reserved quota for the Affectees of Islamabad shall also be disposed of through open auction.

**14. Auction Committee.-** For the auction of different categories of plots, the Authority shall constitute a committee/committees of not less than three persons. A Member of the Board shall be the Chairman of the auction committee.

**15. Sale Price/ Mode of Payment.-** (1) The price of auctioned plot shall be its bid as finally approved by the Authority, and will be payable as per terms and conditions prescribed for its auction.

(2) The price of plot and mode of payment in other case shall be such as may be determined by the CDA Board from time to time.

#### CHAPTER IV

#### CONSTRUCTION PERIOD

**16. Construction period.-** The allottees shall have houses/ buildings constructed and industries commissioned on their plots or farms developed within the time as indicated below from the date of possession or deemed possession whichever is earlier:

- (1) Residential plots including residential plots in Model Villages & Sub-Urban Centers. • 3 Years.

**Syed Mohsin Raza Naqvi:**

- (a) The project of Recep Tayyip Erdogan Interchange, Islamabad (Resolving Traffic Congestion Issues at Crossing of 9<sup>th</sup> Avenue & Jinnah Avenue / Ibn-e- Sina Road, Islamabad) was completed on 18<sup>th</sup> February, 2025. As per contract, the stipulated completion period was 180 days, whereas the

project was successfully completed and delivered in only 84 days. Accordingly, there was no delay; rather, the project was completed before the planned completion period. With regard to damages, it is submitted that minor undulations were observed after completion at certain ramp and road sections. These deficiencies were rectified by the Contractor at his own cost. The project presently remains functional and is under the two year Defects Liability Period (DLP), during which the Contractor is fully responsible to repair any such deficiencies as per contract provisions.

- (b) No inquiries were initiated regarding damages to the said project, as the observed issues were minor in nature and were immediately addressed through contractual obligations.
  
- (c) Since, no structural failure or major deficiency was established and the minor deficiencies were rectified by the Contractor in a timely manner therefore no punitive action was warranted against the Contractor or the Project Consultants. Nevertheless, under the provisions of the contract, the Contractor remains bound during the Defects Liability Period to rectify any deficiencies at their own cost.

**Khawaja Muhammad Asif:**

- (a) With regard to airfares guidelines, it is submitted that for growth and fostering of aviation activities government-imposed restrictions on the commercial behavior of air service operators ought to be kept minimum. A liberalized market structure and reliance on competition is the best way to delivery efficient aviation services for the benefit of consumers.

Globally, airfares are determined by market forces of demand and supply. These market forces determine the price, quality and range of air services options. The responsibility of the states is usually limited to safety, security & efficiency related matters. As per policy in vogue, same internationally used air-fare system is implemented in Pakistan and domestic & International airfares in Pakistan are determined by way of competition with an aim to provide enabling environment for sustainable market growth leading to availability & enhancement of services/service quality.

Keeping in view the dynamics of airline operations, it is best to let the market forces of demand and supply determines the price, range and quality of services. Nevertheless, PCAA remaining cognizant of airfares, time and again demands of airlines to refrain from adopting unfair practices.

- (b) While affordability of air travel is one aspect; it is equally important to consider the characteristic of aviation business. Airlines are for-profit entities liable to pay taxes and duties. Flight operations and / or ticket-pricing on a particular route or routes is an airline's commercial decision, which is significantly dependent upon various factors including passenger demand, load-factors based on its aircraft fleet, compatibility of its aircraft with available airport infrastructure, operational costs, regulatory compliances, etc. Yet, there is no guarantee for the airline that all its capacity would get sold on all its flight. It is pertinent to mention that airlines use a system called, revenue management system that automatically adjusts air fares depending on the supply and demand seasonal variations and numerous other factors. It would not be out of context to mention that airlines supply/capacity (no of seats) is limited and cannot be altered especially at shore note.

Airlines pricing strategies conform to supply and demand at a particular point in time, and in multiple occasions, operators are compelled to sell air-tickets below cost of operating the aircraft and recoup incurred loss at some other point. As observed over time, average airfares have generally remained within appropriate ranges. it has also been observed higher airfares primarily occur where time of purchase of ticket is very close to scheduled departure time of flight when the availability of seats is very limited while the same ticket if purchased sufficiently in advanced is available at a very reasonable price. AS a general principle of economics, in case there exists a shortfall in supply or an increase in demand it may increase the prices of a commodity or services being rendered.

It must also be emphasized that losses suffered (if any) from aircraft operations are borne only by the airlines. Therefore regulating airfare may jeopardize dynamics of the industry and prove detrimental to both carriers and passengers. Additionally airlines would also require compensation of loss suffered in such case. Any consideration of regulation (recovery of cost + profit) of airfares at this point in time may be against the public interest especially considering the huge exchange losses being suffered by airlines due to recent Pak-Rupee devaluation and enormous Debt-servicing obligations of one of the airlines.

- (a) PIA launched flights Turbat to Sharjah and Turbat to Muscat in January 2025, aiming to enhance connectivity for the region's expatriate community. However, the operations were discontinued in May 2025 due to fleet limitations. The primary challenge was the unavailability of ATR fleet typically used for regional routes. As a result, PIA was unable to sustain the service despite its potential demand.
- (b) Based on commercial viability and the availability of suitable aircraft, PIA will reassess the feasibility of resuming the Turbat-Sharjah and Turbat-Muscat routes in future. The airline remains committed to exploring opportunities that enhance regional connectivity, provided they align with operational capabilities and market demand.

In accordance with National Aviation Policy – 2023, Para 3.2.1., Sub-Para 7, RPT operators / Airlines are required to operate 5% of their total capacity floated on domestic Primary routes on at least one secondary route.

Secondary Route Airports include the following airports:

Bahawalpur, Bannu, Chitral, Dalbadin, DG Khan, DI Khan, Gilgit, Gwadar, Hyderabad, Khuzdar, Moenjo Daro, Muzaffarabad, Nawabshah, Panjgur, Parachinar, Pasni, Rahim Yar Khan, Rawalakot, Saidu Sharif, Sehwan Sharif, Sibi, Skardu, Sukkur, Turbat and Zhob.

The airports listed in the Question are included in Secondary Airports, however, the discretion of selection as to which Secondary Airport to operate is left to the airline and it is their commercial decision based on specific factors.

The detail of the RPT operator's approved flight schedule for Secondary Routes for the running Summer Season, 2025 is listed below. Actual operations by the airlines against the flight schedule may vary.

In case of non-operation on Secondary Routes, enforcement action is initiated against the airline which includes financial as well as administrative penalties.

- (b) In accordance with National Aviation Policy – 2023, Para 3.2.1., Sub-Para 7, RPT operators / Airlines are required to operate 5% of their total capacity floated on domestic Primary routes on at least one secondary route.

Ministry of Defence recently held meetings with Pakistan Civil Aviation Authority (PCAA) and all the RPT operators to engage RPTs for operations on secondary routes. The airlines cited fleet constraints, grounding of aircraft owing to bird strikes, excessive taxes/ FED imposed on aviation sector and infrastructure issues of secondary airports as the key impediments in expanding operations on secondary routes in particular. PCAA has been tasked to prepare plans/proposals for resolution of these issues in consultation with Pakistan airports authority and Pakistani airlines.

Moreover, proposals are also under consideration for making one (01) designated secondary routes mandatory for each airline and enhancing penalties for noncompliance (including curtailment of international flights). The endeavor is being contemplated to uplift the domestic air connectivity of Pakistan, especially on secondary routes.

**Mr. Attaullah Tarar:**

**(a) Responsibilities and Function of the Press Council of Pakistan**

- The Press Council of Pakistan, as established under the Ordinance of 2002, is primarily responsible for upholding and promoting the freedom of the press while ensuring that the press adheres to the highest professional and ethical standards. One of its key roles is the implementation, enforcement, and periodic revision of the Ethical Code of Practice for newspapers, news agencies, editors, journalists, and publishers. The Council receives complaints regarding violations of this code, investigates them through Inquiry Commissions, and issues decisions which may include publishing clarifications, apologies, or warnings.
- The Council acts as a guardian of press freedom and can receive complaints from journalists, newspapers, or individuals against interference by the government, political parties, or other organizations in the free functioning of the press. It monitors developments that could restrict the free flow of information and undertakes studies and research to analyze the state of journalism, circulation, and trends in the media industry.
- Additionally, the Council manages its funds, levies and collects prescribed fees from registered newspapers and news agencies, and exercises financial control including auditing its accounts. It also performs disciplinary functions over its own members and employees as prescribed by regulations. The Council has powers to summon individuals, receive evidence, and conduct inquiries, but cannot compel journalists to disclose their sources of information. Overall, its responsibility is to balance press freedom with accountability, protect citizens' rights, and maintain a responsible and credible media environment in Pakistan.

- (a) The project of F-8 Flyover, i.e. Reccp Tayyip Erdogan Interchange, Islamabad (resolving traffic congestion at the junctions of 9<sup>th</sup> Avenue with Jinnah Avenue and Ibn-e-Sina Road, Islamabad) was undertaken by CDA to address severe traffic bottlenecks in the area. The PC-I was approved by CDA-DWP on 11-07-2024 at a cost of Rs. 4,120 million. The agreement cost of the project is Rs. 4,000.021 million and the consultancy agreement with M/s NESPAK was signed at Rs. 117.810 million.

The procurement was carried out under PPRA Rule 36(b) (Single Stage - Two Envelope procedure). The work was awarded to M/s Maaksons Engineering Corporation; a PEC-registered experienced firm specialized in road and bridge construction. M/s NESPAK served as the design and supervision consultant as the premier public sector consultancy organization with extensive experience in similar projects.

- (b) There was no change in the conceptual design of the project. However, while finalizing and issuing the construction drawings, the Consultant made certain site specific adjustments as per site requirements, which did not result in any increase in cost; rather, led to a saving. Approximately Rs. 340 million savings emerged as compared to the original contract cost. From these savings, the remodeling and improvement works of the F-10 Roundabout were executed in order to enhance traffic flow and to avoid congestion at F-10 and adjoining areas. Accordingly, the total expenditure remains at Rs. 3,850 million against the agreement cost of Rs. 4,000.021 million.

**Syed Mohsin Raza Naqvi:**

CDA has taken following steps to control the mushroom growth of illegal housing schemes in Islamabad:

1. Public Notices issued in newspapers to warn general public about these illegal housing societies.
2. Public Notices uploaded on CDA website regarding illegal housing schemes in Islamabad.
3. Notices issued to the sponsors of the schemes by CDA warning them not to make publicity / marketing / sale of plots and to refrain from making any construction in unapproved schemes.
4. A number of cases have also been registered against the sponsors of illegal societies.
5. The Authority has also requested CEO, IESCO, GM, SNGPL and Regional GM, PTCL, Islamabad that connections in the unauthorized / illegal housing schemes may not be provided till the provision of NOC from the Authority.

6. SSP (Operations), ICT, has been provided a list of illegal/unauthorized Housing Societies/Schemes to take action against them.

Furthermore, steps are being taken for Regularization of Illegal schemes/settlements in the light of Recommendations of Commission constituted by the Federal Government of Pakistan. The relevant part is reproduced as under;

"the sponsors of such schemes should bring layout plans\_along with other documents to CDA for approval. Where sponsors are not available the residents associations may approach CDA for approval of layout plans as per given criteria. After assessment of existing infrastructure and land use of these schemes individually and as Consolidated plan of neighboring schemes they should be allowed to obtain NOC from CDA. All duties and fines will be borne by the sponsors or resident associations of these schemes. These schemes be regularized after receiving following fees where required and without prejudice to the right the authority to acquire the land in public interest:

- a. Development Charges.
- b. Fees public amenities plots.
- c. Regularization Fee.
- d. Commercialization charges (where applicable).
- e. Scrutiny fee of the Layout plans.
- f. The individual building plans will be provided by the Corresponding owners for approval procedure.

Consultant will be hired for *preparation* of Feasibility to Regularize the illegal schemes.

**Mr. Muhammad Hanif Abbasi:**

Pakistan Railways is undertaking various measures to improve the railway stations at Karachi, Lahore, Peshawar, and Rawalpindi. Details of these initiatives taken are as under:

**(1) KARACHI:**

- Escalators are being provided to ease in/out movement of all passengers in general and for elderly and disabled people in particular from one platform to another.
- Information desk and free Wi-Fi facility have been provided on Karachi Railway station.
- An agreement has been executed with Sindh Solid Waste Management Board (SSWMB) for cleaning process of platforms, parking areas, washrooms, platform shelters, ceiling fans and drainage of stagnant water.

**(2) LAHORE:**

- Escalators have been provided to ease in/out movement of all passengers in general and for elderly and disabled people in particular from one platform to another.
- New design glass type Information Desk has provided at main Lobby which is functioning round the clock.
- A new multi-storeyed Train Dispatching building has been completed where new Computer Based Interlocking system will be installed with modern amenities shortly.

- One modern CIP Lounge has been developed and operative.
  - Wash Rooms of all platforms have been up-graded.
  - Economy class waiting halls upgraded equipped with AC facilities.
  - One waiting hall has been upgraded on main lobby having seating capacity of more than 200 passengers equipped with Auto Sensor Door, Air Conditioning facilities and upgraded washroom.
- 
- Pakistan Railways in joint collaboration of Government of Punjab has also taken the initiative for the up-gradation of infrastructure of its three railway stations, Lahore, Rawalpindi and Taxila to enhance passenger's amenities. For the very purpose, the task has been entrusted to the Tourism Development Corporation (TDCP) of Punjab and the Communication & Works (C&W) Department. In this regard, site surveys of all 03 stations have been carried out and technical drawings, detailed plans, elevation & cross sections handed over to Chief Architect (C&W) Department GoP on 15-08-2025. Government of Punjab has allocated Rs. 1000.00 Million for the year 2025-26.
  - An agreement has been executed with Lahore Waste Management Company (LWMC) for cleaning process of platforms, parking areas, washrooms, platform shelters, ceiling fans and drainage of stagnant water.

### **(3) PESHAWAR:**

- Up-gradation work of façade of the Peshawar Cantt. Station building, provision of tough tiles at platforms, ceiling of offices in station building, renovation of washrooms, flooring of parking area and renovation of reservation office has already been carried out in the fiscal years 2019-20 & 2020-21.
- State of the art Information Desk for passengers has been provided at railway station, which is fully functional.

- A business lounge has been developed at railway station along with provision of multiple benches and dustbins at platform to ensure comfort and cleanliness.
- A contract has been executed for establishing a Bogi Restaurant at Peshawar Cantt station to facilitate passengers and public by providing clean and hygienic food.
- A proposal is under negotiations with KPK Government for Solid Waste Management System for cleaning process of platforms, parking areas, washrooms, washing lines, platform shelters, ceiling fans and elimination of stagnant water.

**(4) RAWALPINDI:**

- Raising of Platforms No. 4 and 5 is in progress and will be completed shortly to enhance passengers comfort while getting on and off the trains.
- 10 Nos. Architecturally designed Tuck Shops have been built to enhance beauty & uniformity at the platforms.
- CIP Lounge is being constructed/renovated at Platform No. 3, while other waiting rooms are also being upgraded to improve passenger comfort.
- Furthermore, contract for cleanliness of Rawalpindi Station and its surrounding area has been awarded to RWMC (Rawalpindi Waste Management Company) to enhance round the clock clean and hygienic environment.
- Washing of trains rakes at washing line has also been outsourced.
- Pakistan Railways in joint collaboration of Government of Punjab has also taken the initiative for the up-gradation of infrastructure of its three railway stations, Lahore, Rawalpindi and Taxila to enhance passenger's amenities. For this purpose, the task has been entrusted to the Tourism Development Corporation (TDCP) of Punjab and the Communication & Works (C&W) Department.
- A project of Safe & Smart station is under progress by FWO.

Railway Land is leased/rented out as per Pakistan Railway Property & Land Rules-2023, approved by the Federal Cabinet and circulated vide SRO No. 768(1)/2023, dated 22nd June 2023.

Accordingly, Railway land is leased through transparent bidding / auctions as short-term leases (maximum up to 10 years) for agriculture, shops, parking, nurseries, and stacking, while medium-term leases (21 years) and long-term leases (33 years), with provisions for extension, are granted for high-value projects.

Additionally, land is also leased out to Government Departments on a non-competitive basis for public welfare projects in the light of approved rules.

*Will the Minister for Interior and Narcotics Control be pleased to state the details of street crimes reported in ICT during last 12 months indicating also the specific measures taken or being taken for safety of women and vulnerable groups in public places especially during the late hours?*

**Syed Mohsin Raza Naqvi:**

It is submitted that Islamabad Capital Territory Police is committed to fulfilling its duties round the clock to apprehend criminals and foster a sense of security among the citizens of Islamabad. Special attention is being focused on minimizing crime rate through effective preventive measures and enhanced patrolling strategies, resulting in decreasing crime rate. As per reports obtained from Police Stations of Islamabad through Zonal Superintendents of Police, from September 24, 2023 to September 24, 2024, total 3366 cases of street crimes were reported at various Police Stations within the Islamabad Capital Territory (ICT). In contrast, from September 24, 2024, to September 24, 2025, total 2812 cases have been reported for the same period indicating a reduction in crime rate by 16%. The detail is attached as 'Annex-A'.

The steps taken by the ICT Police for combating the crime in Islamabad are as under:-

- Identification of Crime hotspots.
- Technology based surveillance of Active Gangs.
- Intelligence-Driven Policing
- Crime Mapping & Predicative Analyses.
- Preventive framework after Identification of crime hotspots & their Integration.
- Development of criminal data bases.
- Total 156 Combing/Search Operations were conducted during the last one year.
- Total 1121 Proclaimed Offenders (POs) were arrested during the last one year.
- Total 1616 Target Offenders (TOs) were arrested during the last one year.
- Establishment of 06 static Nakajat and additional surprise Nakajat as per requirement for checking of suspicious elements.
- Survey of rented accommodation & illegal settlements was conducted.
- Surveillance of suspected Elements.
- Data proofing of released prisoners.

- Establishment of Dolphin Squad comprising of 608 officers/officials and 196 Motorcycles performing duties in two shifts round the clock.
  - Ababeel Patrolling Squad comprising officers/officials with 20 Motorcycles performing duties within ICT round the clock.
  - Police Emergency Response Unit (PERU) 06 vehicles and Smart Mobiles (Smart Cars) 14 vehicles for patrolling and surprise checking.
- 
- City Watchers Squad comprising of 05 vehicles.
  - Trail Patrolling Unit comprising of 06 Motor bikes.
  - Foot Patrolling Unit at Trails (III & V).
  - Provision of E-Police Post to enhance the checking mechanism of suspicious persons/vehicles.
  - Surveillance through Safe City Cameras round the clock.
  - Deployment of beat officers round the clock.
  - Installation of trackers in vehicles of Police Stations for effective patrolling and monitoring.
  - Fresh Identification of Hot Spot areas and revised patrolling plan.
  - Dedicated teams are constituted for apprehension of TOs/POs.
  - General Holdup.
  - Deployment of Dolphin Pairs through concerned Police Stations in hot spot areas.
  - Tracing and tracking of accused and suspicious activities through the specialized LAB.
  - More than 55,000 CDRs of suspicious persons were analyzed during the last one year.
  - Geo-fencing is conducted and data are analyzed to arrest the accused persons in heinous cases.
  - Deployment of Quick Response Force in 05 Zones of ICT Police.

Furthermore, the specific measures taken for the safety of women and vulnerable groups are as under:

ICT Police is taking action on receipt of information of cognizable offence against the vulnerable segment of the society i.e women, children and transgender in Islamabad. In the wake of prevalent crime situation, the ICT Police have implemented various measures to cope with the situation.

These measures include increasing police patrol in crime-infested areas, setting up special units to handle cases involving violence against women, Children and transgender, enhancing the responsiveness of the police force to such incidents. The ICT Police have also been working closely with local communities and NGOs to improve reporting mechanisms, provide support to victims and ensure a more effective law enforcement approach. The ICT Police have implemented several steps to address and curb crimes against women, children and transgender in Islamabad. Some of these measures include:

- Providing specialized training to Police officers on handling evidence.
  - Specialized unit (SSOIU) has been established for the investigation of Gender Based Violence cases.
  - Provide legal aid and social services to the victims of Gender Based Violence.
  - Grant of Investigation funds in Gender Based Violence cases.
  - Mobile Forensic team for collection of evidence from crime scene.
  - Use of digital forensic tools to collect, preserve and analyze electronic evidence such as text messages emails and social media interactions.
  - Collection of evidence and ensure the safety of Victims.
  - Implementing case tracking systems to monitor the progress and outcomes of Gender Based Violence cases.
  - Engaging with communities to build trust and encourage reporting of Gender Based Violence cases.
  - Establishment of Prosecution Department within ICT Police to remove flaws and irregularities in investigation, Gender base training for female staff of ICT police in Capital Police College (CPC) Islamabad.
- 
- Empowering the female by establishment of women police station and appointed a female officer as SHO In Islamabad. Safe and supportive work environment for female officers.
  - ICT Police has been conducting community outreach programmes in collaboration with government departments, civil society and educational institutions. Targeted awareness drives with a particular focus on women and youth are being further strengthened to disseminate information regarding Gender Based Violence.
  - Dedicated Women Complaint Desks have been established in Police Stations of Islamabad, manned by trained female personnel, to ensure prompt and gender-sensitive facilitation of women complainants.
  - Gender Protection Unit, Online Women Police Station, dedicated Helpline and the "One-Info" mobile application have also been established to provide accessible complaint and support mechanisms.
  - Specialized training modules on gender sensitivity, cybercrime handling and victim facilitation have been incorporated into the police training curriculum.
  - Continuous professional development courses are being conducted at the Capital Police College (CPC) to enhance the capacity of police officers in handling such cases with professionalism.
  - ICT Police remains committed to ensuring strict accountability of offenders and extending full cooperation in the expeditious investigation and prosecution of cases under the applicable laws,

particularly those concerning women and youth. Necessary measures are being undertaken in close coordination with the Ministry of Interior, National Cyber Crime Investigation Agency, and other relevant stakeholders.

- Safe City Islamabad, Existing Helplines including those of Ministry of Human Rights and PTA will be effectively coordinated with ICT Police response mechanisms to ensure timely reporting and redressal of Gender Based Violence related complaints.
- Islamabad Capital Police remains dedicated to addressing Gender Based Violence through multi-stakeholder collaboration, effective law enforcement and victim-sensitive response mechanisms.

**Syed Mohsin Raza Naqvi:**

No child recovered during the last Three years from Child Labour. However, As per section 3 of the Employment of children Act, 1991:  
*"No child shall be employed or permitted to work in any of the occupations set forth in Part I of the Schedule or in any workshop wherein any of the processes set forth in Part II of that Schedule is carried on:  
 Provided that nothing in this section shall apply to any establishment wherein such process is carried on by the occupier with the help of his family or to any school established, assisted or recognized by Government"*

It is submitted that a total of 326 factories are registered with this office. The field staff of Labour Welfare Department, ICT, regularly inspects their respective areas for implementation of Labour Laws. A fresh survey of Brick kilns was also conducted by the Labour Welfare Department, ICT and no child Labour was found during survey.

The Labour Welfare Department, ICT established a primary school at Moza Noon (class 1 to 6) with the support of Brick Kilns Association and volunteers for the children of brick kilns workers. Moreover, more than 200 students are studying in said school. The Labour Welfare Department, ICT distributed uniforms, Books and stationery among the 200 children of brick kilns workers with collaboration of ILO in Mouza-Noon Islamabad. Awareness campaign is also started for implementation of minimum wage and abolition of child labor in ICT.

The Labour Welfare Department drafted two bills: "The ICT Prohibition of Employment of Children Bill 2025" & "The ICT Prohibition of Child Labour at Brick Kilns Bill 2024" forwarded to the Ministry of Interior for onward submission to the National Assembly.

- (a) PIACL had scheduled flights for operation between Islamabad and Chitral but had to suspend due to poor loads. PAICL understands that the development of road infrastructure has reduced the distances and travel time and passengers prefer to travel by road due to economical mode of transportation. Based on these parameters, there is a limited demand for flight operation.
- (b) It may be added here that wherever a commercial opportunity arises, PIACL operates flights to facilitate its valued customers.

It is important to highlight that PIACL is currently experiencing an acute shortage of aircraft, particularly for ATR operations. At present, the airline has only two ATR aircraft in service—one based in the North and one in the South. However, on availability of aircraft and subject to market demand, PIACL will mount flights to Chitral.

**Syed Mohsin Raza Naqvi:**

The Simly Dam and Khanpur Dam are the two major surface water resources from where water is being supplied to Islamabad.

The Simly Dam is owned and operated by the Capital Development Authority (CDA) the reservoir of which is capable of supplying water maximum up to 39 Million Gallons per Day (MGD). Water is supplied from Simly Dam after proper treatment at Simly Water Treatment Plant (WTP) and the quality of raw water as well as treated water is monitored. The raw water quality data indicates that there is no any appreciable change in the water quality parameters of the Simly Dam Reservoir during the last three years and the raw water is satisfactorily treated through conventional means of Coagulation, Flocculation, Sedimentation/Clarification, Filtration and Disinfection at the Simly WTP.

As far as the Khanpur Dam is concerned, it is owned and operated by WAPDA. The CDA only procures raw water from Khanpur Dam, WAPDA authorities for its treatment at Sangjnai, WTP (having capacity of 51 MGD) and onwards supply to the twin cities of Islamabad and Rawalpindi as per share approved by the ECNEC. The quality of water is also monitored at Sangjani WTP which has indicated satisfactory results. However reportedly, the raw water quality of Khanpur Dam Reservoir is under continuous threat due to the ongoing recreational activities, rapid urbanization, encroachments etc. around its reservoir rim. Accordingly, the concerned WAPDA authorities have taken various measures for protection of the reservoir and have even filed a Constitutional Petition in the Honorable Peshawar High Court in this regard.

However, in the case of Germany, Pakistan has dual nationality agreement with Germany for a specific group i.e. *"children of Pakistani Parents who have grown up in Germany and who have due to their birth in Germany acquired German nationality in addition to their parents' nationality from the other state"*

Therefore, only the aforesaid specific group may resume citizenship of Pakistan.

- (b) Except the specific group of children stated above, Pakistani citizens who obtained German citizenship without renouncing citizenship of Pakistan, their nationality will be ceased from the date of acquiring German citizenship under Section 14 (1) of Pakistan Citizenship Act, 1951.

Therefore, they are not entitled for issuance of Pakistani Passport.

Therefore, such individuals are issued NICOP without renouncing their Pakistani citizenship.


