Will the Minister for Interior and Narcotics Control be pleased to state the details of accused escaped from the police custody in ICT during the last three years indicating also the date of escape, nature of offence, stage of prosecution and action taken against negligent officials in each case with police station wise break up?

Syed Mohsin Raza Naqvi: It is submitted that reports/record regarding the accused escaped from police custody during the last three years have been sought from police stations of Islamabad and Police Station Record Management System (PSRMS) of ICT Police. As per reports/record total of 19 accused escaped from police custody during the last 03 years. 15 escaped accused were re-arrested and were sent to judicial custody. Challans against the arrested accused were duly submitted before the learned courts and are facing trial in the concerned court of law. All out efforts are underway for the arrest of the remaining 04 accused, who will be arrested at the earliest.

As far as action against delinquent police officials is concerned, 32 police officials were proceeded against departmentally. 13 criminal cases were also registered against the delinquent officials. The detail is attached at **Annex-A**.

Will the Minister for Inter-Provincial Coordination be pleased to state the criteria adopted for shortlisting / selection of players to be inducted in Pakistan National Football Team indicating also the number of players inducted from Sindh during the last five years?

Minister for Inter-Provincial Coordination:

The selection criteria for the national team is solely determined by the Head Coach of the Pakistan Football Team and the panel of coaches, as approved by the Pakistan Football Federation (PFF) Executive Committee from time to time. Player selection is based purely on merit, following a rigorous eligibility assessment conducted by the Head Coach through open trials. Mr. Nolberto Solano, a former esteemed football player of Peru, has been appointed as the Head Coach of the Pakistan Football Team, and his expertise and professional judgment guide the selection process. No expenditure of Government is incurred on the hiring of services of foreign coach.

Regarding the representation of players from Sindh in the Pakistan Senior Men's National Team, the PFF has submitted that the number of players from Sindh inducted after 27 May 2025, the date of PFF elections, is 5. The corresponding representation from other regions is: Balochistan 4, Punjab 5, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa 4, and Islamabad 3.

It is also worth mentioning that the PFF faced a period of turbulence from March 2021 until 1 July 2025 due to suspension, transitional governance, and the appointment of a Normalization Committee. With the efforts of the present Government, elections of the Pakistan Football Federation were held on 27 May 2025, and an elected leadership is now in place.

Will the Minister for Interior and Narcotics Control be pleased to state whether it is a fact that CDA has allotted land to foreigners in ICT, if so, the details and advantage accrued from said allotment?

Syed Mohsin Raza Naqvi:

As per record of Estate Management-II(Commercial),CDA following properties are hold by the foreigners:

- 1. POT NO.A-26, PARK ROAD, CHACK SHAHZAD.**
 - Plot No.A-26, Park Road, Chack Shahzad, Islamabad was initially allotted to Mr.Mubashir Ahmed Choudhry on 24.12.1970.
 - The Said property purchased by Mrs.Nuzhat Waheed from initial allottee and transferred letter issued on 15.09.1981.
 - Mrs.Nuzhat Waheed sold the property. Transfer letter issued in favour of Mr.Muhammad Nadeem Naik and Muhammad Tasneem Naik vide transfer letter dated 23.10.1985.
 - Purchased by Sardar Muhammad Aminud Din Khan and Mrs.Benazir Aminud Din Khan vide transfer letter dated 12.11.1989.
 - Ministry of Interior Government of Pakistan, issued NOC in favour of H.E. Mr.Rashid Sultan Al.Mkjawi former Ambassador of UAE to Pakistan vide office memorandum dated 02.10.1994 for purchase of said property.
 - Transfer letter issued in fvoir of Mr.Rashid Sultan Al-Mukhawi, former Ambassdar of UAE to Pakistan on 20.11.1994.
 - Said property then transferred to the legal heirs of Late Rashid Sultan Al-Mukhawi, former Ambassador of UAE to Pakistan w.e.f 15.02.2003.
 - Recently the said property has been transferred to the name of Mr.Hamad Ali Saeed Salmoon Alberi.

2. Land measuring 20,000 sq yards in diplomatic enclave was allotted to His Excellency Sheikh Al-Ahmad Al Jabar Al-Sabah, the Ameer of Kuwait who was then the Ambassador of Kuwait in Pakistan for construction of residential villas in 1980. Will the Minister for Interior and Narcotics Control be pleased to state the steps taken or being taken by NACTA during the last 2 years to promote counter-narratives against extremist ideologies through media and academia?

Syed Mohsin Raza Naqvi:

- a. NACTA introduced and disseminated **Pakistan's National Narrative Against Terrorism and Extremism (PNNATE)**, promoting a peaceful, inclusive national identity.
- b. Dissemination of counter narratives including Paigham-e-Pakistan through different websites, print/electronic media, social media accounts and radio channels is regularly done by the organization.

- c. Further, outreach activities including radio programs, podcasts, and video messages in regional languages, promoting peacebuilding and community awareness are also carried out.
- d. NACTA regularly organizes peace conferences and seminars inviting subject experts, practitioners, policy makers and students to carry out informed discussions and propagation of narratives of peace.
- e. **Public awareness programs** such as youth awareness sessions and National Poster Contests are also conducted with the aim to detect early signs of extremism.
- f. To promote interfaith harmony among masses, the authority conducted an Ulema Conference in June 2024, promoting narratives of peace.

Will the Minister for Religious Affairs and Inter-Faith Harmony be pleased to state:

- (a) *whether it is a fact that the lands of the Evacuee Trust Property Board, owned by the Federal Government, in the province of Punjab have been transferred to unauthorized person through implementation of the Punjab Conferment of Propriety Rights on Occupancy Tenants and Muqarraridars Act, 2012 if so, the details thereof;*
- (b) *whether it is also a fact that the Chairman, Evacuee Trust Property Board has declared these transfers invalid in April, 2021 under Article 143 of the Constitution and that decision has been upheld by the Secretary, Ministry of Religious Affairs and Inter-Faith Harmony, if so, the details thereof;*
- (c) *whether it is further a fact that despite the decisions by the Chairman of the said Board and the Secretary of the Ministry, the ownership of the Federal Government of those lands has not been restored in the Revenue record of the Punjab Province, if so, the reason thereof; and*

- (d) *whether any action has been taken against those officials who misapplied the said Act of the Punjab Government upon the Federal Government owned lands ,if so, the details thereof?*

Sardar Muhammad Yousaf:

- (a) Yes, it is true that under the umbrella of Act passed by the Punjab Government ownership of precious Evacuee Trust Land measuring 1907-Kanal situated at Mouza Neeka and 1275-Kanal & 12-Marla situated in Mouza Ameer Khan, Tehsil Fateh Jang, District Attock was unlawfully, unauthorizedly transferred only in Tehsil Fateh Jhang District Attock, in entire Punjab the illegal occupants of the Evacuee Trust Land get succeeded for the transfer of ownership rights under this act 2012 with the connivance of local revenue office. Detail of transferred ET land alongwith present occupant may be perused at **“Annexure-A”**.
- (b) Yes, it is true. Chairman, Evacuee Trust Property Board vide order dated 15.04.2021 declared these transfers invalid under Section 8 of Evacuee Trust Property (Management & Disposal Act No. XIII of 1975) and same was upheld by the Additional Secretary (Incharge), MoRA vide order dated 05.10.2022. Decision of both authorities may be perused at **“Annexure-B & C”** respectively.
- (c) Yes, it is true, despite of hectic efforts by the field formation of ETPB Hassanabdal / Attock, the ownership of these land has not been restored in favour of ETPB / Federal Government in revenue record due to noncooperation by the local revenue office despite several written requests **“Annexure – D”**.
- (d) There is no involvement of the officials of Evacuee Trust Property Board, only the fact is that occupants of these Evacuee Trust land get succeeded transfer of ownership rights in their favour with the connivance of local revenue staff.

***Question No. 3 Senator Jan Muhammad:**

(Notice Received on 5/12/2025 at 4:30 PM) QID: 43943

Will the Minister for Interior and Narcotics Control be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that financial irregularity of approximately Rs. 1.5 billion has surfaced in the Capital Development Authority (CDA) in connection with the Built-Up Property (BUP) award of Sector C-16, wherein hundreds of non-local individuals were allegedly included in the beneficiary list despite having no legitimate link with the affected land; if so, the details thereof;*
- (b) whether any inquiry or investigation is currently underway to examine the same and if so, the expected timeframe for completion of such inquiry;*
- (c) the reasons for the non-implementation of CDA's policy mandating the use of SUPARCO's imaging services for transparent land demarcation in Sector C-16; and*
- (d) steps taken or being taken by Government to ensure strict compliance and accountability in future land-sharing and BUP award processes?*

Syed Mohsin Raza Naqvi:

(a) The BUPs award of Sector C-16 was announced on 10-11-2025 by DC, CDA on the basis of satellite imagery 2008 (Prior to land award) which was provided by the SUPARCO to maintain transparency in BUP award. This procedure has been introduced first time in CDA. Till to-date no benefits in lieu of acquired BUPs has issued to any affectee / person, so no loss of Authority is occurred. It is pertinent to mention here that at present for more transparency, CDA & SUPARCO Wing are still working and benefits will be released only to the genuine affectee.

It is brought into your kind notice that as per Land & Rehabilitation Policy 2007, this award announced for the land less affectee and at the time of survey each & every structure existing on site included in the survey list, but it doesn't mean that all the included persons will get the rehabilitation benefits. Thereafter, at the time of releasing of rehabilitation benefits strict scrutiny procedure is adopted by the L&R Directorate in which there is no chance for any outsider to get financial benefits without verification of his documents. As per survey / stance of SUPARCO, no haveli entered which included after the land award 2008.

(b) That CDA & SUPARCO are working on rightful and legitimate affectees and its outcome will be shared after completion of task.

(c) Land Award of this area was announced by the CDA in the year 2008 and the BUPs award was not announced by CDA due to hurdles created by the locals. In the year 2025, CDA negotiated with locals and successfully completed the survey. For transparency, CDA has used the latest technology tools and surveyed the structures through SUPARCO, just to deliver benefits to the genuine affectees of the area.

d) For transparency, L&R Directorate has started the verification of each affectee through NADRA & SUPARCO which will be helpful to release benefits to the genuine affectee.

Note:- All above steps will be assured before issuance of any rehabilitation benefits or other benefits to the affectees of Sector C-16 & other sectors acquired by CDA. As per CDA Ordinance 1960 award of any land / BUPs can be reviewed within 05-years as well as affectee can file appeal before Competent Court of law.

The proposed track alignment for linking the Gwadar Port berths to Zero Point, Gwadar has already been finalized in consultation with the Gwadar Port Authority (GPA) and its consultant, M/s COPHC, in accordance with the Gwadar Smart Port City Master Plan (GSPCMP). The plan has been submitted to GPA after addressing all the observations of the consultants and GPA. Pakistan Railways through Divisional Superintendent, Quetta is coordinating for early approval of the plan. The map/plan of the agreed route and berthing station/yard is attached as Annexure-A .

- The Pakistan National Centre was established as a medium of communication, with its modus operandi focused on interpersonal, face-to-face communication, operating under the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting
- The Pakistan National Centre had been a department of the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting since 1975. It used to operate through 28 regional offices across the country all of which were administered by Directorate General of Pakistan National Centre.
- The Federal Cabinet in its meeting held on 27.01.1997 decided to abolish the Directorate General of Pakistan National Centres. In pursuance of decision of the Cabinet, the Directorate General, Pakistan National Centres ceased to function w.e.f 15.01.1999 and officers and staff of the Directorate were declared surplus and placed at the disposal of Surplus Pool of the Establishment Division vide this Ministry's Notification No.1(4)/97-E.III, dated 15.1.1999 **(Annex-I)**. Most of officers/ officials had been absorbed in different Ministries/Divisions/Departments by Establishment Division, whereas some of them were retained in this Ministry.
- Now as on 01.01.2026 all the employees who were retained to various Departments of this Ministry on attachment basis had retired from Government Service **(Annex-II)**.

- (b) For regional traffic transshipment of goods are carried out with change of gauge between different railways. Pakistan has three connecting points. For regional traffic with India requires no transshipment due to same gauge. One with Iran where transshipment is carried out at Zahidan (Iran) due to different gauge.

Will the Minister for Information and Broadcasting be pleased to state the details of the action taken on violations of PEMRA Rules regarding Code of Programmes and advertisements against private TV Channels during the last 3 years?

Mr. Attaullah Tarar:

- PEMRA was established through an Ordinance to facilitate the growth of Electronic Media and to regulate its operation in the country by private sector.
- It is pertinent to mention here that all PEMRA licensed satellite TV channels are independent in their editorial policies. However, they are obligated to ensure compliance of prevailing PEMRA laws in letter and spirit including Electronic Media (Programmes and Advertisements) Code of Conduct 2015.
- Furthermore, it is pertinent to mention here that forum of PEMRA, Council of Complaints, under section 26 of the PEMRA Ordinance 2002 as amended by PEMRA (Amendment) Act, 2023, is also available to the general public for lodging complaints regarding any aspect of programmes /content being aired on satellite TV Channels. These Councils comprise members of eminence with diversified experience and fields. It is a neutral and quasi-judicial forum for hearing complaints and subsequently giving appropriate recommendations to the Authority. Councils can recommend fine against an individual upto One Million Rupees and can recommend appropriate action of censure, fine up to ten million rupees in respect of a licensee. Council of Complaints are governed through the PEMRA (Councils of Complaints) Rules 2010.
- PEMRA take cognizance, on violation observed during the monitoring or reported by the viewers through PEMRA Complaints Call Centre, PEMRA Complaints Mobile

Application, twitter handle “@reportpemra” and Pakistan Citizen Portal (PCP) under Section 27, 29, 29-A, 30 and 33 of PEMRA (Amendment) Act 2023. Moreover, Section 29-A, empowers the Chairman PEMRA to impose fine upto One Million rupees on a licensee.

- Relevantly, in last 3 years, 720 numbers of show cause notices have been issued against various TV Channels on violation of Electronic Media (Programmes and Advertisements) Code of Conduct 2015, Accordingly, Fine amounting to Rs. 47.65 Million has been imposed on various TV Channels on violation of Electronic Media (Programmes and Advertisements) Code of Conduct 2015.

- (a) *the steps being taken by the Government to control smuggling to and from Pakistan; and*
- (b) *whether it is a fact that smuggling badly affects the economy of the country, if so, the steps being taken by the Government in this regard?*

Syed Mohsin Raza Naqvi:

- a. The Federal Board of Revenue has introduced Transformation Plan to revamp anti-smuggling activities. Detail is as under:-
 - i. Powers of anti-smuggling operations have been shifted from Directorate of Intelligence and Investigation to the Enforcement Collectorates.
 - ii. Unified chain of commands for all Collectorates of Enforcement of the country has been established under the office of the Chief Collector Enforcement.
 - iii. Digital Enforcement Stations (DESS) are being established along the Indus River to monitor the smuggling routes, by use of the state of the art modern technology.

- iv. Establishment of Joint Check Post (JCPs) along with LEAs all over the country to monitor major smuggling routes along the borders of the provinces.
- v. Human resource shortage has been addressed, and recruitment drive is in process to induct Sub-Inspectors and Sepoys, which will strength the anti-smuggling activities.
- vi. Legal Framework has been amended to damage the transportation network of smuggled goods. Permanent confiscation of offending vehicles has been introduced vide SRO-1619(I)/2024 dated 03.10.2024 read with SRO-499(I)/2009 dated 13.06.2009.
- vii. In compliance of the directions of Pivot-committee meeting under the chairmanship of Hon'ble prime Minister of Pakistan, retail outlets selling smuggled goods in markets have been raided to hit the demand side of foreign origin luxury items, edibles, vapes, tyres etc.

- (b) Yes, it is fact that smuggling adversely affects the national economy by undermining local industry and causing revenue loss. To mitigate this, a significant strategic shift has been made towards Intelligence Based Operations and collaboration with police, CTD, Excise, IB, and ANF, raids are being conducted targeting the core infrastructure of smuggling networks such as godowns, factories, and warehouses rather than just transport carriers. A considerable number of seizure cases during the last three fiscal years resulted from raids at godowns railways stations, cigarettes factories, betel nut warehouses and mobile markets. Detail of seizure cases is tabulated as under:-

Similarly, in order to curb the menace of smuggled POL products, Pakistan Customs identified 1576 illegal petrol pumps and shared data with provincial authorities. As on 31.12.2025, 1348 filling stations have been sealed.

The Coordination with provinces has also been strengthened through District Coordination Committees (DCCs), which serve as executive bodies at the grass-root level. A key outcome of coordination is the targeted crackdown against illicit trade.

- (a) whether there are limited flight operations to hard and remote areas of Pakistan, including Gilgit-Baltistan, Balochistan and other underserved regions, if so, details and reasons thereof; and*
- (b) whether the Government intends to revise the aviation policy to rationalize the high airfares on these routes and to ensure regular, affordable and reliable air services for the public, if so, the details thereof?*

Khawaja Muhammad Asif:

- (a) Under the National Aviation Policy - 2023, scheduled airlines are required to operate a minimum of 02 Primary Routes from the designated list of eight primary Routes. Airlines are also required to deploy at least 05% of the capacity offered of Primary Routes onto at least 01 Secondary Route from the designated list of 25 Secondary Routes.**

At present PIA and AirBlue are scheduled to operate for Gwadar, Turbat, Skardu and Gilgit, while PIACL and Fly Jinnah are operating to/from Quetta. Enforcement actions have been initiated against non-compliant airlines for failure to meet domestic capacity requirements or non-operation on designated secondary routes as applicable.

A major constraint affecting air connectivity to hard and remote areas is the mismatch between existing airport infrastructure and the aircraft types available in airline fleets. At present, PIA remains the only operator with a limited number of smaller aircraft suitable for operations into certain hard and remote airports. Other domestic airlines primarily operate narrow body jet aircraft. These aircraft are not operationally or economically compatible with several of these airports without significant infrastructure enhancement or fleet diversification.

- (b) It is submitted that the airfares are determined by market forces of supply and demand, which is in accordance with the international best practices. This approach is expressly endorsed by the National Aviation Policy - 2023 under Para 1.6.1, clause (7), which stipulates that "airfares will be determined through market forces of supply and demand."

Globally, airlines employ Revenue Management Systems (RMS), which dynamically calculate airfares in real time by factoring in demand, capacity, operating costs, competitive environment, booking time, and other commercial variables. The same airfare system is used by Pakistani Airlines.

MoD through PCAA is encouraging operations by smaller operators using turbo-prop aircraft. The case is under process and expected to commence operations soon which will address connectivity with unserved / underserved airports.

Syed Mohsin Raza Naqvi:

Comments

- a) Security forces and LEAs are taking range of countermeasures including Intelligence-Based Operations (IBOs) and search and strike operations on routine basis and dismantling of terror facilitation and support networks.
- b) Recently, HVTs and Terrorist leadership were targeted during ongoing CT actions as well as cross-border CT actions have caused panic among militants.
- c) Implementation of all points of the revised **National Action Plan** in provinces, coupled with sustained **coordination on security matters and intelligence-sharing** among LEAs is instrumental in combating terrorism and achieving long-lasting peace in the country.
- d) Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) were formulated and disseminated among stakeholders for enhanced implementation of National Action Plan (NAP).
- e) For intelligence sharing, a state-of-the-art **National Intelligence Fusion and Threat Assessment Center (NIFTAC)** was established in 2024, unifying CT efforts among LEAs and intelligence agencies in the country.
- f) Similarly, **Provincial Intelligence Fusions and Threat Assessment Centers (PIFTACs)** are also operationalized to facilitate provincial CT coordination.
- g) **NIFTAC** regularly shares *CT Threat Assessments and predictive analysis* with all stakeholders (CTDs, LEAs, Intelligence agencies) to facilitate CT operations and response.
- h) A **comprehensive monitoring regime** has been established at NIFTAC, NACTA for monitoring and tracing of wanted terrorists and swift sharing of actionable intelligence with LEAs / CTDs / intelligence agencies for conducting operations and counter-measures. Efforts are also underway for integration of **Integrated Border Management System and Safe cities** for effective monitoring of wanted individuals and terrorists crossing borders.
- i) Similarly, **Pakistan Land Port Authority (PALPA)** was established to improve efficiency and coordination of land border crossings, along with streamlining trade and economic growth.
- j) Continued **training sessions** in collaboration with UNODC are underway for capacity building of LEAs, provincial prosecution departments, CTDs and police.

1. The last Drug Survey in Pakistan was conducted by UNODC Pakistan in 2012, which got published in 2013. According to the survey, 15-64 years, were using illicit drugs. It included the misuse of prescription drugs, as well. To conduct a national survey was planned in 2022 by MoI&NC. The survey was to be conducted by National Institute of Population and Family Welfare (NIPFW) UNODC & INL-P. It was to be completed by Dec 2023. However, the same could not be conducted, due to capacity constraints.
2. Provision of Treatment and Rehabilitation Services is primarily the responsibility of Health Departments and the same may be approached for province wise data on number of addicts admitted in Government and private rehabilitation centers.
3. However, ANF Pakistan is running 7x Model Addiction Treatment Rehabilitation and Reintegration Centers (MATR²C) of Cost treatment boarding and lodging facilities to substance dependent patients including female and juveniles. MATR²C and patients treated are as under:

(b) This exercise of offloading is not conducted in an abrupt and unanticipated manner. However, FIA Headquarters has established a Risk Analysis Unit (RAU) that continuously monitors travel patterns and analyzes data related to human smuggling and trafficking trends. Such Data is obtained from Anti Human Trafficking Cells (AHTCs) after thorough scrutiny & verification. FIA Immigration also maintains close liaison with Pakistan's foreign missions to ensure the safety, legality, and welfare of Pakistani nationals abroad. Based on comprehensive data analysis, clear criteria, profiling guidelines, and assessment frameworks have been developed. Only those passengers exhibiting clear indicators of unlawful intent are offloaded, while genuine travelers are facilitated with respect and dignity.

Furthermore, Refusal of Departure Rules providing statutory cover for off-loading high-risk passengers have been submitted to the Ministry of Interior and Narcotics Control and are currently under consideration for approval.

(c) A total of **45,356** passengers were offloaded on technical grounds during the year 2025. The technical reasons include flight cancellation, self-offload, flight technical, offloaded by airline, bad weather, flight delay, cancelled on airline request, etc

Moreover, MOI with collaboration of NADRA is developing an online verification system and integrating all the arms licenses with NADRA PAK-ID.
- c) Renewal & reprint category are being carried online through Pak-ID Mobile Application. Where MOI&NC has been requested for individual online verification of Arms Licenses issued by MOI&NC through Pak-ID Mobile Application vide letter no. NADRA/PMO/15/DEEP dated 25th July. 2025.

Will the Minister Interior and Narcotics Control be pleased to state whether it is a fact that water table is going very low due to water boring in Islamabad Capital Territory, is it also a fact that water shortage due to climate change and above phenomenon could develop into a crisis in future, and what steps are being taken by the Government to overcome this issue?

Syed Mohsin Raza Naqvi:

Yes, the ground water table in Islamabad is declining day by day due to extensive extraction of water through borings and rapid reduction in water percolation due to massive development activities. The said percolation enables rain water to move

downward through soil and porous materials, driven by gravity, to replenish groundwater, with the rate depending on soil type to recharge the aquifers but most of the surface is becoming covered with roads, footpaths and building structures. However, CDA in the first instance with the collaboration of PCRWR constructed 100 recharging bores at proposed locations by PCRWR through which 230 MG Water has been injected in the ground table which will help to recharge the ground water.

It is further added that the climate change impact also plays a pivotal role in declining of ground water table as less rains are being observed in Islamabad during last few years which has further aggravated the ground water scarcity. The present situation due to non-availability of a perennial source of water in Islamabad may convert into water crises keeping in view the rapid increase in development and influx of population from other provinces. Which can be addressed by bringing Indus water from Tarbela.

CDA is also working on construction of 100 Nos. Recharging Wells and 20 Nos. rainwater storage tanks for preservation of rain water, ground water recharging and save the residents in southern parts of Islamabad and residents of Rawalpindi residing near the Nala Lai besides utilization of rain water for other than drinking purposes. Feasibility Study and demarcation of sites has already been carried out whereas; tendering is under process.

Syed Mohsin Raza Naqvi:

It is clarified that WhatsApp is an Over-The-Top (OTT) application operated by a foreign service provider, and the numbers used on such platforms are neither controlled nor allocated by PTA or local telecom operators. Consequently, blocking individual WhatsApp numbers at the national network level is not technically feasible, as WhatsApp operates through end-to-end encryption and application-level identifiers that remain outside the operational control of telecom networks.

It is further pertinent to note that the blocking or suspension of specific accounts or numbers on OTT platforms falls exclusively within the domain of the respective service provider. In such cases, the appropriate course of action is to approach the concerned platform, i.e., WhatsApp/Meta, through established Mutual Legal Assistance (MLA) channels, lawful data request mechanisms, or platform-specific law enforcement portals, duly supported by requisite legal authorization and admissible evidence.

NCCIA, as a law enforcement agency, plays its role in combating criminal and terrorist activities in the cyber domain of Pakistan strictly within its legal and technical mandate. However, the issuance of instructions for blocking WhatsApp numbers lies beyond the scope of NCCIA's statutory authority

- a. It is submitted that, Excise & Taxation Department, ICT is empowered under Islamabad Capital Territory (Seizure & Disposal of Motor Vehicle) Rules, 2014 to impound and confiscate the vehicles having Cut & Weld or tampered Chassis number place.

The aforementioned rules provide the complete procedure of taking the vehicle into possession and later on its disposal under the law.

The list of vehicles confiscated so far and which are allocated to other Government Departments is attached at "**Annex-A**".

- b. It is submitted that, currently 78 vehicles are currently parked at the warehouse of department which is under the administrative process of disposal under the Islamabad Capital Territory (Seizure & Disposal of Motor Vehicle) Rules, 2014.

A Task Force comprising representatives from SECP, PTA, and PSEB has been constituted with the mandate to devise a mechanism for real-time information sharing.

The objective is to:

- Enhance compliance with regulatory frameworks;
- Strengthen enforcement measures against illegal digital/telecom activities; and promote stakeholder awareness regarding regulatory obligations and best practices

- (a) *whether it is a fact that the recently constituted Board of Directors of the Pakistan Television Corporation (PTVC) has been appointed for a period of three years including independent members from various provinces and regions, however, no member from the Province of Balochistan has been appointed, if so, the reason thereof; and*
- (b) *steps taken or being taken by the Government to include an individual from Balochistan as an independent director in the future?*

Mr. Attaullah Tarar:

- a & b • In compliance with **Section 12 (1)** of the *State-Owned Enterprises (Governance and Operations) Act* and **Para 24 (m) (n)** of the *State-Owned Enterprises (SOEs) Ownership and Management Policy, 2023*, the PTVC's Board of Directors (BoD) is under the process of reconstitution, comprising three ex officio members and six independent directors, with a total of nine members. Recently, five independent directors have been notified for a period of three (03) years. It is pertinent to mention that there was no requirement/compulsion in the SOEs Act, 2023, for the SOEs, in this case, PTVC, to ensure provincial/regional representation in the PTVC Board. However, since this Ministry strongly believes in the representation of Federation, it was decided to maintain provincial representation on the PTVC Board. Accordingly, it has been decided to select the sixth independent director from Balochistan to ensure equal provincial/regional representation. In this regard, the Board Nomination Committee (BNC), under the chair of Minister for Information and Broadcasting, has recommended the nomination of independent member from Balochistan and the same has been forwarded to the Federal Cabinet for approval. It is worth mentioning that this sixth independent director from Balochistan will be a part of the same/current PTVC Board for a period of three (03) years.

Khawaja Muhammad Asif:

It is informed that during the recent outsourcing process of Islamabad International Airport, initially effort was made for outsourcing on public private partnership basis through open competitive bidding. However, the same was not materialized due to single bid being rejected as it did not meet reserve price criteria. Thereafter, outsourcing on Government to Government (G2G) basis based on inter-Governmental Commercial Transaction Act, 2022 which was not successful. Currently, the task has now been assigned to Ministry of Privatization.

Will the Minister for Railways be pleased to state:

Mr. Muhammad Hanif Abbasi:

- (a) Pakistan Railways has allotted a total of 870 residential accommodations to its employees in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP) Province. The location-wise breakup of the said accommodations, along with the names and designations of the officers/officials to whom these have been allotted, is enclosed as Annexure-A.
- (b) It is not a fact that any of the said quarters/accommodations have been illegally occupied by non-entitled officials of Pakistan Railways or by outsiders. Allotments are made strictly to eligible employees in accordance with the priority list and their official postings.

Will the Minister for Interior and Narcotics Control be pleased to state the details of criteria laid down by Government to determine the age of juveniles in absence of the required documentation?

Syed Mohsin Raza Naqvi:

NADRA considers the age of juvenility up to 18 years of age in light of Section 9 of the NADRA Ordinance, 2000 read with Rule 18 of the NADRA (NIC) Rules, 2002 and the determination of the age of juvenility is carried out strict in accordance with the prescribed legal framework.

NADRA registers citizens and issues identity documents on the basis of verified information and admissible documentary evidence i.e. Computerized Birth Registration Certificate issued by the relevant departments.

In addition, according to section 8 of the Juvenile Justice System Ordinance 2018, when a person claims to be juvenile but lacks required document like birth certificate or educational documents the age to the such person may be determined on the basis of medical examination (ossification test) report issued by medical officer.

***Question No. 31-E Senator Zeeshan Khanzada:**

Will the Minister for Interior and Narcotics Control be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that 10.7 percent of households in the bottom quintile do not have a CNIC, if so, the reasons thereof; and*
- (b) the step taken or being taken, by the Government to include the said households in the National Database?*

Syed Mohsin Raza Naqvi:

a. NADRA carries out registration in accordance with the Pakistan Citizenship Act, 1951, which defines citizen eligibility and empowers NADRA to document all citizens regardless of their socio-economic status. In this regard, it is submitted that NADRA does not classify or maintain registration statistics on the basis of economic condition.

As per Census 2023 record, total population is 241.50 million.

NADRA has registered almost 213.17 million citizens (excluding GB and AJK). Based on 2025 projections, the main discrepancy between registration and census data lies among minors, with approximately 34 million minors remaining unregistered.

NADRA is facing numerous challenges in registration of leftover population. Following are the main challenges: -

- i. **Insufficient Documentation:** Child Birth Registration Certificate (CBRC) is the breeder document and serves as the primary basis for CNIC issuance as per section 4 of Pakistan Citizenship Act 1951. Due to lack of Local Government infrastructure and non-issuance of breeding document, citizens face difficulties in processing and getting national identity card.
- ii. **Socio-Economic Factors:** Poverty, illiteracy and lack of transportation also contribute to delay in obtaining registration documents.

- iii. **Security Concerns:** Specific areas particularly in Balochistan and tribal areas (merged districts) of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa are facing security challenges, which also disrupt administrative operation and hinder registration process.
 - iv. **Lack of Awareness:** A significant challenge in registration is the lack of awareness among citizens particularly in rural and marginalized communities regarding the importance of identity documents. It often results in delayed or non-registration.
 - v. **Poor Infrastructure of Civil Registration:** Due to challenges related to infrastructure, human resources and equipment at the UCs, the issuance of vital event certificates is delayed. These delays also lead to an increase in associated costs for the general public.
- b. NADRA maintains strong coordination with Benazir Income Support Programme (BISP) under the framework of the National Socio-Economic Registry (NSER). Through this collaboration, BISP is able to utilize NADRA's comprehensive data infrastructure to effectively identify and support eligible beneficiaries, ensuring that poverty-focused initiatives are accurately targeted and efficiently implemented across the country. Furthermore, NADRA ensures nationwide service delivery through a network of more than 1300 registration units, which include NADRA Registration Centres (NRCs), Mobile Registration Vans (MRVs), Manpacks, Biker service and NADRA UC counters. NADRA is making targeted and sustained efforts to register all the population including low-income groups.
- i. **First Time Free of Cost CNIC:** NADRA facilitates all citizens and in specific low-income households by issuing the first CNIC free of cost, ensuring that no citizen is deprived of identity due to financial constraints.
 - ii. **Mobile Registration Vans (MRVs) for Remote / Underserved Areas:** MRVs are routinely deployed to less privileged, remote and geographically challenged areas to serve vulnerable populations,

including women, elderly citizens and persons with disabilities. Additionally, MRVs are also deployed in collaboration with ECP and local administration to register citizens.

- iii. **Digital Transformation – Pak ID Mobile App:** NADRA has launched Pak ID Mobile app through which citizens can apply for ID cards, CRC, FRC, renewals and track applications while being at home.
- iv. **Targeted Drives and Campaigns for Marginalized / Unregistered Communities:** NADRA has been conducting various campaigns, including the minority registration drive and initiatives for the registration of persons with disabilities, etc.
- v. **Extending Services Down to Union Councils (UCs):** Pakistan comprises an estimated **11,932** UCs across its administrative divisions. NADRA has significantly expanded its outreach by extending services to the UC level and is actively establishing dedicated registration counters at UCs across the country to provide easier and more accessible services to the general public. NADRA has so far established **58** counters in UCs and plans to establish **1,000** more counters in UCs across Pakistan in 2026. These counters are being developed to ensure on the spot registration / updation of citizens' record seamlessly.
- vi. **Dedicated Female Registration Units and Female Counters:** NADRA has established **18** x dedicated female Registration centres to enhance women's access to identity services. NADRA has also ensured the availability of dedicated female counters at almost all NRCs to provide females with a safe, comfortable, and culturally appropriate environment for identity registration.
- vii. **SMS-based Enforcement and Awareness:** NADRA is actively using SMS-based enforcement and awareness messaging to encourage citizens to complete their identity registration. Targeted text messages are sent to parents of individuals who have attained the age of 18 years but have not yet obtained their ID card, to citizens

whose CNICs have expired and to individuals who have obtained CBRC but have not yet registered with NADRA.

- viii. **Collaboration Efforts:** NADRA is strengthening its outreach and registration efforts through collaboration with NGOs, human right bodies and civil-society organizations. These partnerships help identify and engage underserved groups such as women, persons with disabilities, and marginalized communities.
- ix. **Mega Centres (24/7) and Double Shift Operations:** NADRA operates 14 x Mega registration centres in major cities of Pakistan. Most of these Mega centres function 24/7 ensuring continuous access for all citizens. Additionally, NADRA has expanded service hours by running a significant number of NADRA centres in double shifts. By keeping centres operational for late hours, NADRA provides greater convenience for citizens who cannot visit during regular office hours, including workers, students, and women with household responsibilities.
- x. **Social Media Campaigns:** Continuous social media awareness campaigns are carried out emphasizing the importance of ID documents.
- xi. **Breeder Document for ID Card in Mobile App:** Option of CBRC has also been provided in Pak ID Mobile app for ease of general public.
- xii. **Prioritized Processing of Senior Citizens and Persons with Disabilities:** NADRA has implemented prioritized processing of senior citizens and persons with disabilities to ensure these groups can access registration services efficiently and with minimal inconvenience.
- xiii. **All-in-One Kits, Tablets and Kiosk Machines:** NADRA is in process of purchasing All-in-One Kits and Tablets which will serve as one-window solution. NADRA is also purchasing Kiosk machines which will enhance convenience by allowing citizens to independently access registration services. The above equipment has

been specifically developed to modernize and expand the delivery of identity registration services.

- xiv. **Strengthening CRVS:** NADRA is working to strengthen Civil Registration and Vital Statistics (CRVS) by signing agreements with provincial health departments and local government departments. This collaboration will ensure that vital events are recorded promptly, enabling the timely issuance and updating of identity records.
- xv. **National Registration and Biometric policy:** NADRA has developed a comprehensive NR&BP framework document, duly notified by the government on 1st January 2025 which aims to create a unified, secure and efficient registration eco system by updating the regulatory framework, integrating databases, and leveraging advanced technologies.
- xvi. NADRA has established **122** new NRCs across Pakistan in the last 2 years and further plans to establish **39 x** NRCs to increase its foot print nationally to facilitate the public.

E-Sahulat Franchises: NADRA is planning to extend its registration services in the future via its established network of more than **23,000** E-Sahulat franchises.

- (a) 1. ANF Pakistan is running 7 Model Addiction Treatment Rehabilitation and Reintegration Centers (MATR²Cs). These MATR²Cs provide free of cost treatment, boarding and lodging facilities to drug addicts including females and juveniles:-
2. **MATR²C Islamabad (45 bedded, Funded by Govt of Pakistan)**

3. **MATR²C Lyari, Karachi** (105 bedded including; 25 Female beds & 25 Children/ Juvenile beds, **Funded by Govt of Sindh**)
 4. **MATR²C Malir Karachi**, (100 bedded, **Funded by Govt of Sindh**)
 5. **MATR²C Mangopir, Karachi** (200 bedded, **Funded by Govt of Sindh**)
 6. **MATR²C Sukkur** (25 bedded, **Funded by Govt of Sindh**)
 7. **MATR²C Hyderabad** (50 bedded, **Funded by Govt of Sindh**)
 8. MATR2C Quetta (45 bedded, Funded by Govt of Pakistan)
- (b) Provision of Treatment and Rehabilitation Services is primarily the responsibility of Health Departments and same may be approached for requisite input. However ANF Pakistan is running 7 Model Addiction Treatment Rehabilitation and Reintegration Centers (MATR²Cs). Moreover, efforts for establishing MATR²Cs at Lahore and Peshawar are also in hand. The aim is to extend the treatment and rehabilitation services to maximum number of cities to accommodate as many drug addicts as possible. A total number of **31503** drug addict patients have been treated till date since the inception of 7 MATR²Cs located in 5 cities.
- (c)
1. Currently, 1x project is under construction with funding of PSDP, namely the Model Addiction Treatment & Rehabilitation Center (MATR2C) at Humak, Model Town, Islamabad. A total of 6 kanals of land, purchased by the ANF from its own resources, has been utilized for this project. The capital cost of the project is Rs. 456.378 million, and the civil works are nearing completion.
 2. 4 kanals of land have been acquired from the Capital Development Authority (CDA) at G-11/4, Islamabad, under the Federal PSDP, specifically for the establishment of a treatment center for women and

- juvenile drug addicts, along with a vocational training facility. However, no funds have yet been allocated for the establishment of this treatment center.
3. ANF has acquired a piece of land at Kasur from the Government of Punjab. The case for payment of the land cost from the National Fund for Control of Drug Abuse is held with the Federal Government. However, payment for the land has not yet been made to date.
 4. Regional Directorates of ANF have taken up the matter with the respective Provincial Governments for the allotment of suitable land for establishing treatment and rehabilitation centers. To date, no land has been allotted by the provinces for this purpose.

- (a) the official launch date and key findings of the National Drug Use Survey Pakistan 2022-24 (conducted by Ministry of Narcotics Control and UNODC); and*
- (b) the details of drug prevalence/ users in the country, along with province-wise and age-wise break-up?*

Syed Mohsin Raza Naqvi:

- (a) Drug use is a major health and social challenge in Pakistan, especially among youth. It negatively affects families, society, and the nation. To understand the extent and patterns of drug use, a national survey was planned in 2022 by MoI&NC. The survey was to be conducted by National Institute of Population Studies (NIPS) in collaboration with UNODC & INL-P and was to be completed by Dec 2023. However the same, could not be conducted, due to capacity constraints. In 2024, on the directions of the Prime Minister, a high-level committee approved a fresh national drug use survey to be conducted by Pakistan Bureau of Statistics (PBS) in collaboration with MoI&NC and ANF that is to be completed in 2026. Progress on the survey is underway, with modalities and questionnaires being finalized. The survey will cover households, high-risk groups, and educational institutions, providing reliable data to support effective national policy making.**
- (b) In view of non-availability of fresh drug survey on drug use, the data of previously conducted survey of 2013 in collaboration with UNODC, can only**

be shared as standard statistics / data for drug prevalence in the country.

- (2) **Age wise.** An estimated 5.8 percent of Pakistan's population aged 15 - 64 years was found affected by drug addiction as per Drug Use Survey 2013.
- (3) **Province wise.** The highest prevalence of drug use was observed in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, affecting 11% of the population. Sindh and Punjab reported lower rates at 6.5% and 4.8%, respectively. Limited data from Balochistan indicated that around 5.1% of the population there used drugs as per Drug Use Survey 2013.
