***(Def.) Question No. 22 Senator Rubina Qaim Khani:**

(Notice Received on 10/12/2025 at 10:38 AM) QID: 43762

Will the Minister for Law and Justice be pleased to state:-

(a) the names of Advocates and law Firms appointed on Retainership Basis since 2022 by the Ministry indicating also their dates of appointments and monthly remuneration;

(b) whether advertisements were published for such appointments, if not, the reasons thereof; and

(c) EPADS system of PPRA is not being used for the sake of transparency, competitiveness and fairness for appointing such lawyers / law firms?

Mr. Azam Nazeer Tarar: (a) The Ministry of Law and Justice has not appointed any individual lawyer or a law firms on the retainer-ship basis.

***Question No. 15 Senator Anusha Rahman Ahmad Khan:**
(Notice Received on 10/03/2026 at 11:28 AM) QID: 44337

Will the Minister for Parliamentary Affairs be pleased to state:-

- (a) whether it is a fact that the candidates contesting elections are required to submit an affidavit along with their nomination papers at the time of filing the same;*
- (b) the legal basis and reasons for requiring the said affidavit from the candidates;*
- (c) whether the requirement of submission of such an affidavit has been prescribed under any provision of the election laws, rules or regulations enforced by the Election Commission of Pakistan; if so, provide the relevant provisions thereof; and*
- (d) whether any order or judgment of the superior courts mandates the procurement or submission of the said affidavit from the candidates, if so, provide the detailed particulars of such court order or judgment, including its date and the relevant contents thereof and its applicability?*

Dr. Tariq Fazal Chudhary: (a) No. The candidates are not required to submit an affidavit along with their Nomination papers at the time of filing of Nomination papers.

(b), (c) & (d) The submission of an affidavit was not prescribed under the Elections Act, 2017 and Rules framed there under, However, during the General Elections-2018, the Hon'ble Supreme Court of Pakistan, vide Order dated 6th June, 2018 (**Annex-A & B**), directed all candidates of National and Provincial Assemblies to submit an affidavit along with their nomination papers. Accordingly, the Election Commission of Pakistan obtained the said affidavit from the contesting candidates during the said Elections and subsequent Elections. However, the Supreme Court in its judgement passed in C.P.L, As Nos. 210,211,212, 213 and 214 dated 30th January, 2024 (**Annex-C**) held that the contesting candidates are not required to file affidavits. Consequently, the practice of obtaining affidavit was discontinued by the Commission.

Will the Minister for Housing and Works be pleased to state:

- (a) the total number of No Objection Certificates (NOCs) has been issued by the Estate Office, Islamabad, during the last three years, i.e. 2023, 2024 and 2025, to Federal Government employees on their retirement who were allotted Government residential accommodation; and*
- (b) the details thereof, year-wise, including the name of the applicant, designation, department, date of retirement, date of issuance of NOC, house number for which the NOC was issued, and the date of vacation of the house, indicating in each case whether the residence has been vacated or not?*

Mian Riaz Hussain Pirzada: (a) A total of 894 (NO Objection Certificates) NOCs have been issued by the Estate Office, Islamabad, during the last three years, i.e. 2023, 2024 and 2025 to Federal Government Employees on their retirement who were allotted Government residential Accommodation.

(b) The year-wise details including the name of the applicant, designation, department, date of retirement, date of issuance of NOC, house number for which the NOC was issued and the date of the vacation of house indicating in each case are placed at **(Annex-A)**.

***Question No. 18 Senator Samina Mumtaz Zehri:**

(Notice Received on 16/03/2026 at 10:21 AM) QID: 44361

Will the Minister for Law and Justice be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that according to Rules of Business 1973, the subject of "Inheritance/Succession" relates to the Ministry of Law and Justice, if so, the details of statutory and rules based reforms, the Ministry launched during the last five years in strengthening the said laws; and*

- (b) *whether it is also a fact that the Ministry has enacted and amended the MFLO, 1961, Succession Act 1925, Letters of Administration and Succession Certificates Act 2020, if so the details of amendments made in these laws, indicating whether the subordinate legislation has also been finalized on the same?*

Mr. Azam Nazeer Tarar: (a) The subject of succession and inheritance in a provincial subject. To the extent of ICT, the Ministry of Law and Justice has been entrusted the subject of the succession. Whereas, the subject of inheritance is allocated to the Ministry of Interior and Narcotics Control to the extent of ICT. The Letters of Administration and Succession Certificates Act, 2020 (VI of 2020) and rules made thereunder *vide* S.R.O. No. 48(I)/2021 which are enforced in ICT and are uptodate.

(b) The details of amendment in the Muslim Family Laws Ordinance, 1961, through the Muslim Family Laws (Amendment) Act, 2021, no amendments made in the Succession Act, 1925 and Letters of Administration and Succession Certificates Act, 2020 and that the subordinate legislation i.e. Letters of Administration and Succession Certificates Rules, 2021 are in field.

***Question No. 19 Senator Jan Muhammad:**

Will the Minister for Energy (Petroleum Division) be pleased to state:

- (a) *whether it is a fact that SSGCL provided natural gas connections to Village Haji Chatha, Sakran, District Lasbella during the years 1992-1993, and a sufficient number of domestic gas connections were installed in the said village; if so, then explain that what are the reasons for the disconnection of gas supply to the said village from last 3-4 years;*
- (b) *why gas bills are being issued to the consumers despite the non-availability or discontinuation of gas supply; and*
- (c) *When the gas supply will be restored and made fully functional in the said village?*

Mr. Ali Pervaiz Malik: (a) It is a fact that Village Haji Chatha, Sakran, District Lasbella was gassified during 1993-94 with approximately 246 customers, however, currently only 48 customers are live/active and the rest have been disconnected mostly due to non-payment of bills.

Furthermore, this village falls at the tail end of TBS Sakran (which feeds approximately 4000 customers). The problem aggravates when customers near to the TBS compressors/suction machines, thus depriving the customers at the tail end from availability of gas. use

(b) As per the SSGCL's record, only the active/live customers are being issued gas bills, however, inactive/disconnected customers are not being billed at all.

(c) SSGC has already dispatched team to the affected adjoining areas to address the matter and educated the area resident to avoid using compressor / suction machines in order to maintain balance of availability of gas to all area residents.

***Question No. 22 Senator Bushra Anjum Butt:**

Will the Minister for Housing and Works be pleased to state:-

- (a) *whether it is fact that Federal Government has not revamped Government accommodations in Islamabad and others stations for a number of years, if so, the detail thereof, if not, reasons thereof; and*
- (b) *is there any mechanism to repair and carryout work on yearly basis maintenance along with backup of transparent allotment system keeping in view the number of employees on General Waiting List?*

Mian Riaz Hussain Pirzada: (a) Federal Government imposed a ban on the revamping of Government accommodations on dated January 14, 1995. Since the imposition of the said ban, revamping works have generally not been undertaken in Islamabad and other stations.

(b) Maintenance of Government accommodations in Islamabad is the responsibility of the Capital Development Authority (CDA). Furthermore, Estate Office has taken the following steps for transparent allotment.

- The Automation and Up-gradation of I.T infrastructure / Creation of Web Portal of Estate Office has allowed the Federal Government Servants to apply, track and monitor their applications online.
- Establishment of Web based application using the latest web technologies (MEARN Stack) along with interlinking other stations and establishing a central database to improve coordination with other stations.
- Through Automation the Up-dation of record is being done on day to day basis.
- Up-dation of House tracking record on day to day basis.
- Cell phone alerts on registration in GWL and on issuance of allotment.
- Digitization of Government Accommodation files.

***Question No. 24 Senator Muhammad Talha Mahmood:**
(Notice Received on 7/04/2026 at 9:56 AM) QID: 44153

Will the Minister for Law and Justice be pleased to state:-

- (a) the details of cases under consideration/pending in the National Accountability Bureau at present indicating also the names of the persons and amount involved in each case; and*
- (b) the steps being taken by the said bureau for early disposal of the said cases?*

Mr. Azam Nazeer Tarar: (a) In view of the confidentiality and sensitivity of cases under process in NAB, the names of defendants / accused and the amounts involved cannot be disclosed. However, the number under process cases in NAB as on 31st December 2025 is given below.

Inquiries:	745
Investigations:	226

It is pertinent to mention here that all the complaints received are regularly processed. Furthermore, NAB is making all possible efforts to conclude the Inquiries / Investigations but due to complex nature of the cases, time frame for conclusion cannot be given / ascertained.

(b) Following strategic measures have been taken by NAB during the last about three years for disposal of the cases:

- a. Introduced internal reforms and updated guidelines to ensure fair and expeditious handling of complaints, inquiries, and investigations. To curb fake and frivolous complaints, a new SOP for Complaint Verification has been introduced requiring complete identity details and an affidavit from complainants affirming the veracity of their allegations.
- b. NAB has recently revised its SOPs in line with the latest amendments in NAO, 1999 to enhance transparency and accountability. Additionally, a new E-Investigation SOP has been introduced, enabling the Combined Investigation Team

(CIT) to record witnesses' statements through video link and Zoom, facilitating witnesses and optimizing the Bureau's time and resources

- c. The concept of CIT has been introduced for utilization of collective wisdom and experience of senior investigators and law officers to improve quality of inquiry / investigation. Furthermore, time limit has been fixed for completion of the cases.
- d. NAB has introduced the E-Office system to enhance institutional efficiency by ensuring smooth internal functioning, expediting decision-making processes, and promoting transparency, accountability, and improved record management.
- e. The concept of High-Level Committee has been introduced to review the case at any stage and correct any short comings.
- f. Monitoring and Evaluation System has been implemented to track case progress across all phases - complaint entry, inquiry, investigation, and prosecution. This has several key benefits:
 - It visually tracks delays when a case exceeds standard durations.
 - Generates regular reports to help management intervene where progress lags.
 - Improves transparency and supports faster decision-making.
- g. The Prosecution Division has been restructured with experienced legal consultants and special prosecutors.

Mian Riaz Hussain Pirzada: (a) Total 959 Government Accommodations have been allotted to Government employees during the last 5 years. Detail is placed at **(Annex-A)**.

(b) No Government accommodation has been allotted to Government employees above their entitlement in Islamabad during the last five years.

(c) On the directions of the Federal Cabinet conveyed on 26-04-2024, the Estate Office has initiated a comprehensive survey of all Government accommodations in collaboration with the Intelligence Bureau. In cases, where any house is reported to be under illegal occupation, the same is vacated on an immediate basis. As a result, a total of 1,107 houses have been cancelled from illegal occupants and subsequently allotted to eligible allottees from the General Waiting List (GWL).

Question No. 4 **Senator Haji Hidayatullah Khan:**
(Notice Received on 16/03/2026 at 2:32 PM) QID: 44366

Will the Minister for Housing and Works be pleased to state:

- (a) *the details of officials in grade 16 and above appointed on deputation and absorbed permanently in attached departments/ organizations of the Ministry since 2013; and*
- (b) *the details of action, if any, taken in compliance of the orders of the Supreme Court Judgment 2013 SCMR 1752?*

Mian Riaz Hussain Pirzada: (a) The requisite information regarding details of officials in grade 16 and above appointed on deputation and absorbed permanently in attached departments/organizations of the Ministry since 2013 is given below:

i. **Estate Office:** -

Since 2013, the services of twelve (12) officials in grade 16 and above were placed in Estate Office on deputation basis and one (01) official was absorbed thereafter.

ii. **PAK PWD.**

No officials in BPS-16 & above appointed on deputation basis or thereafter, absorbed in Pak PWD since 2013.

iii. **PHA-F:-**

Initially the services of Mr. Khurram Mumtaz Azeem, Business Promotion Officer, an employee of National Construction Limited were hired by PHA Foundation on deputation basis *w.e.f.* 30-01-2022 to 05-03-2013. However, later-on, by adopting the due procedure and upon the recommendation of the then Cabinet Sub-Committee, the said officer was inducted / regularized in PHA Foundation on permanent basis against the post of Assistant Director (BS-17) on 06-03-2013.

iv. **FGEHA: -**

Total 111 officers in BS-16 and above has been appointed on deputation basis. No officer has been absorbed in FGEHA since 2013.

v. **PIDCL: -**

Pakistan Infrastructure Development Company Limited (PIDCL) is a State-Owned Enterprise (SoE) operating under the administrative control of the M/o H&W. PIDCL underwent a significant restructuring in accordance with a Cabinet Decision, resulting in the amalgamation of NCL and PEPAC into PIDCL. At present 42 employees are working in PIDCL on deputation basis.

(b)i. **Estate Office:**

This judgement is not applicable in this case.

ii. **PAK PWD: -**

No action taken in compliance of Supreme Court Judgement 2013 SCMR 1752 as no officer/official in BPS-16 and above appointed on deputation basis.

iii. **PHA-F: -**

In compliance with the Supreme Court judgement, no such case exists on record under the citation “2013 SCMR 17857.”

iv. **FGEHA: -**

No such case exists on record.

Minister Incharge of the Prime Minister's Office: FDI statistics for the period FY 2022-23 to FY 2024-25 as reported by State Bank of Pakistan are provided as follows:

As per corresponding issues of Pakistan Economic Survey, this trend is largely attributable to broader macroeconomic conditions and global factors:

- In FY 2023, foreign investment declined to USD 1,627 million (net FDI) due to exceptional shocks, including devastating floods, global supply disruptions and balance of payments pressures, which led to exchange rate volatility and inflation peaking at 38% (May 2023), adversely impacting investor sentiment.
- In FY 2024, as macroeconomic stabilization was observed with GDP growth of 2.38%, inflation declining to 11.8% and the current account deficit narrowing to USD 0.2 billion, as a result foreign investment increased significantly, with net FDI rising to USD 2,347 million (44% increase).
- The recovery continued into FY 2025, with net FDI further increasing to USD 2,490 million, alongside improved macroeconomic indicators, including GDP growth of 2.68%, a current account surplus of USD 1.9 billion and foreign exchange reserves reaching USD 16.64 billion.
