



RESOLUTION NO.25

After a comprehensive review of the current situation in the Gulf,
this House:

1. Supports fully the principled stand of the Pakistan Government that no country should be allowed to occupy another country by force;
2. Reiterates that the withdrawal of Iraq from Kuwait should be secured through peaceful, political and diplomatic means, and not through a brutal war employing the most savage and sophisticated technology;
3. Condemns the indiscriminate bombing of Iraq, and particularly of its civilian population, and demands an immediate end to this carnage;
4. Warns that Israel's entry into the Gulf war will invoke the collective struggle of the entire Muslim Ummah to repulse the Israeli aggression;
5. Proposes that Pakistan should keep a constant watch over the unfolding events and organise a peace initiative in consultation with other Muslim and like-minded countries along the following lines:

- a) Immediate cease-fire and cessation of all hostilities in the Gulf;
- b) Simultaneous withdrawal of Iraqi forces from Kuwait and of all multinational forces from Saudi Arabia and the Gulf under the supervision of the United Nations;
- c) Termination of the economic sanctions against Iraq by the United Nations after its ^withdrawal from Kuwait.
- d) Restoration of the state of Kuwait and its legitimate government;
- e) Setting up of an appropriate mechanism by the United Nations to settle any territorial or other disputes between Iraq and Kuwait;
- f) Establishment of peace ~~keeping~~ force in Kuwait under the auspices of the United Nations and O.I.C., drawn from other Muslim countries;
- g) Commitment by the United Nations that the issues of Palestine and Kashmir will be immediately taken up in the Security Council to implement the earlier U.N. resolutions on these issues.

5. Requests the Prime Minister of Pakistan to evolve a consensus on these peace proposals during his current peace mission and to initiate the mechanisms for the implementation of these propolals.
