



RESOLUTION NO.36

"The Senate of Pakistan strongly condemns the deportation of 415 Palestinian Muslims by the occupation Israeli authorities from Palestine. It is extremely shocking that they are living in sub-human conditions trapped between Israeli-Lebanese border, freezing in below zero temperature. They are short of food, water, and adequate clothing for the last two weeks. They have been denied by the Israeli government even the basic humanitarian aid offered by the International Red Cross. It is blatant violation of the Security Council Resolution of December 18, 1992 which termed the expulsion of civilians from occupied lands as a breach of the Fourth Geneva Convention of 1949. It is also surprising that the Israeli government has committed this outrageous act of expulsion at the time when the United States of America is holding the so-called peace parleys on the Palestinian issue.

The Senate of Pakistan strongly condemns this brutal action of the Israeli government and urges the United Nations not only to look into this latest Israeli act of cruelty, but also to resolve the long standing Palestinian dispute in accordance with the several UN Resolutions passed on the Palestinian issue.
