



RESOLUTION NO.123

The Senate of Pakistan expresses its deep concern over the brutal acts of violence and systematic barbarous genocide being perpetuated against Rohingya Muslim population of Myanmar, which has sent a wave of shock, indignation and outrage throughout Pakistan.

Greatly distressed over reports of continuing mistreatment of, and discrimination against, Muslims in Myanmar in violation of the principles of the UN Charter / Universal Declaration of Human Rights, the Senate of Pakistan calls upon the Government of Myanmar to immediately restore normalcy, take all measures necessary to safeguard the lives, properties and places of worship of the Muslim Community in the country, and ensure that those displaced are able to return to their homes and live in peace without fear or a sense of insecurity.

The Senate of Pakistan further expresses the hope that the recent transition to democracy in Myanmar would help various communities coexist peacefully and in harmony, and contribute effectively towards strengthening the process of democratic dispensation, ensuring the sustained growth, stability and prosperity of the country.

The Senate of Pakistan expresses the hope that a prompt investigation will be conducted and deterrent action taken against those found responsible for the cruel and reprehensible acts of genocide and crimes against humanity.
